

Flex Fuel labeling 16 CFR 306.12

For ethanol flex fuels containing more than 10% and not greater than 50% the numerical value representing the volume % of ethanol followed by “ETHANOL”

For ethanol flex fuels containing more than 50% and not greater than 83% the numerical value representing the volume % of ethanol followed by ETHANOL or “51%-83% ETHANOL”
