### State's Cotton Crop Less Than in 2024

Rains wreaked havoc with Mississippi's crop planting this spring, leaving cotton and all the state's row crops in various stages of crop maturity and condition.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated 6% of Mississippi's cotton to be in excellent condition, with 35% good and 49% just rated as fair as of Aug. 24, 2025. Mississippi growers planted an estimated 330,000 acres of cotton this year, which is down from the 520,000 acres state producers harvested in 2024.

Brian Pieralisi, cotton specialist with the Mississippi State Univer-

sity Extension Service, said a lot of the state's cotton looks promising at this late point in the season.

"Cotton that was planted early on well-drained soil looks good, and most of that is in the central to north Delta," Pieralisi said. "There were a few planting windows near April 20 and early May, and cotton planted then looks good."

The cotton planted June 1-5 also looks promising at this point, he added, but yield will depend on the amount of heat accumulation units the plants will receive in September.

"But cotton planted mid-June or slightly later does not look good at all, from what I've seen," Pieralisi said.

An extremely wet May hindered the crop the most, as repeated rain events kept growers out of the field and unable to plant during the optimum window. This prevented some of the planned cotton acres from being planted and resulted in late planting for other cotton acres. Most of these acres were found in the Black Prairie and northeast Mississippi areas, but some were scattered elsewhere.

"Every year has challenges with flooded bottomland, off-target herbicide injury and escaped weeds, but by far this year, we have been challenged with the effects associated with not planting at the desired time," he said. "Poor market prices and high inputs costs have only compounded the issue."

July was a good month for cotton, and that provided a bright spot for the season to date. Cotton must accumulate enough heat units to mature, and July provided many days of heat. Although it was dry, Pieralisi said most places received

a little rainfall when it counted.

"August has been hot enough for proper heat unit accumulation but not too oppressive compared to years past," he said.

Cotton defoliation began in late August on the earliest planted cotton. Most defoliation will begin by the second week of September.

Will Maples, Extension agricultural economist, said USDA has projected yields of 1,255 pounds of cotton per acre with the state's total production at 850,000 bales. This compares to 1.241 million bales Mississippi growers produced in 2024

Compounding low overall production is continued weakness in the cotton market.

"USDA projects the 2025 av-

erage farm price for cotton at 64 cents per pound, compared to 63 cents last year," Maples said. "The U.S. is expected to see lower production this year at 13.21 million bales, compared to 14.41 million bales last year, due to lower acres and yields."

Maples said weak demand continues to be the story of the cotton market.

"China bought very little U.S. cotton last year, but we were able to pick up some additional sales to countries like Vietnam and Pakistan," he said. "With a smaller crop this year, the balance sheet is tightening, which could provide future price support."

Growing Healthier Together: The MMSHA Farm Tour Continues Across Mississippi

The Make Mississippi Healthy Again (MMSHA) initiative continues to build momentum as we travel across the state highlighting Mississippi's farmers, ranchers and agribusinesses along our MMSHA Farm Tour. MMSHA is all about expanding Mississippians' access to local, healthy food options while supporting those who grow, raise and produce it. By shining a light on our local producers, we not only promote healthier food choices but also strengthen our state's agricultural economy.

This campaign effectively demonstrates how farmers are the solution to offering safe, abundant, healthy and affordable food. Many of these farms and ag operations are part of the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce's (MDAC) Genuine MS® Program, which certifies products that are grown, raised, crafted and made right here in Mississippi.

As part of the MMSHA Farm Tour, our MDAC team has had the privilege of touring farms and agribusinesses across Mississippi. We have visited Banks Farm in Brandon; Sandy Run Farm in Purvis; The Midtowner Restaurant in Hattiesburg; Clyde Magee's Farm in Mize; Nature's Gourmet Farm in Petal; Home Place Pastures in Como; Eubanks Produce in Lucedale; Nature Crest Farm in Mendenhall; Two Crackers Oyster Company in Biloxi; and Water Valley Farmers Market in Water Valley. Each visit showcases the incredible diversity of Mississippi agriculture — from row crops and produce, to livestock and dairy products, and everything in between.

Most recently, Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson and our MDAC team made multiple stops in the Mississippi Delta. We began with tours of Consolidated Catfish LLC in Isola and Freshwater Farms in Belzoni, both timely stops as we recently celebrated National Catfish Month in August and recognized Mississippi's role as the nation's leading catfish producer. The tour continued with Delta Western in Indianola, a vital feed mill serving farmers across the Delta. The team also enjoyed a Delta-style lunch at Fratesi Grocery in Leland, a longtime community favorite for locals to gather. Commissioner Gipson held discussions with several farmers from the area, listening to their concerns and taking notes on the issues most important to them.

"Every new stop along this Farm

Tour gives me the chance to listen and connect directly with our farmers," said Commissioner Gipson. "Their voices guide the work we do at the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, and their input is helping us build a stronger agriculture industry for today and for the future generations to come."

The day concluded with a stop at Six Mile Farms in Tribbett, where locally grown popping corn is harvested and bagged for consumers to enjoy gourmet, stove top popcorn. This unique, Genuine MS® operation, also known as "Crop to Pop," is the state's only popcorn farm. Each visit underscored the importance of Mississippi's farmers in bringing healthy, affordable food to our tables.

We are consistently adding farms to our 2025 Farm Tour. Of course, the Make Mississippi Healthy Again Initiative is more than just a Farm Tour. MDAC is working closely with other organizations to provide accurate, helpful information to the public. The MMSHA website is continuously being updated with additional resources, nutrition tips for commodities, local farm spotlights and health tools—making it easier than ever for Mississippians to lead healthier, ac-

### From Our Kitchen To Yours

Tasty Tailgating - Southern Style!



#### Slow-Cooker Grape Jelly Meatballs

1 1/2 cups grape jelly (such as Smucker's)

1 cup chili sauce (such as Heinz)

1/2 cup barbecue sauce

1 tsp. Dijon mustard

1 tsp. Sriracha chili sauce

1/2 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 tsp. black pepper

Cooking spray

2 lbs. frozen meatballs

2 Tbsp. finely chopped chives

Whisk together grape jelly, chili sauce, barbecue sauce, mustard, Sriracha, salt, and pepper in a medium bowl. Lightly coat slow cooker with cooking spray. Place frozen meatballs in slow cooker. Pour jelly sauce over meatballs, and toss to coat. Cover and cook on HIGH until sauce is thickened, 2 to 2 1/2 hours, stirring halfway through. Top with chives, and serve immediately.

#### **Homemade Corn Dogs**

1 qt. canola oil

8 all-beef franks, or hotdog of choice

8 8-inch skewers

1 cup plain yellow cornmeal

1 cup all-purpose flour

2 Tbsp. granulated sugar

2 Tbsp. cornstarch

1 Tbsp. baking powder

3/4 tsp. kosher salt

1 1/2 cups whole buttermilk

1 large egg

Heat oil in a large Dutch oven to 350°F over medium heat. Meanwhile, insert skewers into franks, so that at least 2 inches are still exposed on one end. Whisk together cornmeal, flour, sugar, cornstarch, baking powder, and salt in a medium bowl. Add buttermilk, and egg and whisk until smooth. Transfer batter to a tall quart-sized glass. Dip hotdogs, 1 at a time, in batter. Immediately place dipped hotdogs in hot oil. Fry in batches of 2 until golden and crisp, about 2 minutes, turning constantly to help with even browning. Transfer to a wire rack set over a baking sheet to drip excess oil while you continue with remaining batter and hotdogs.

#### **Million Dollar Dip**

4 thick-cut bacon slices, chopped

1 cup mayonnaise

1 (7 1/2-oz.) pkg. chive-and-onion cream cheese, at room temperature

8 oz. extra-sharp Cheddar cheese, shredded

1 cup slivered almonds, toasted

1/4 cup thinly sliced scallions

Heat a large nonstick skillet over medium. Add bacon;

cook, stirring occasionally, until browned and crisp, about 8 minutes. Remove from heat. Using a slotted spoon, transfer bacon to a paper towel-lined plate. Stir together mayonnaise and cream cheese in a medium bowl until fully combined. Fold in bacon, Cheddar, almonds, and scallions. Serve immediately, or cover and refrigerate up to 3 days.

#### **Brownie Cookies**

1 (18-oz.) pkg. double chocolate brownie mix

1/2 cup (4 oz.) salted butter, melted

1 large egg

1/2 cup bittersweet chocolate baking chunks 1/2 cup chopped toasted walnuts

Preheat oven to 350°F. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Beat brownie mix, melted butter, and egg together with an electric mixer on medium speed until just combined, about 1 minute. Stir in chocolate chunks and walnuts. Using a 1 1/2-inch scoop, scoop cookie dough, and place 1 1/2 inches apart onto prepared baking sheets. Working in batches if necessary, place cookie sheets in freezer until cookies are thoroughly chilled, about 15 minutes. Bake chilled cookies in preheated oven until centers are just set, 10 to 11 minutes. Remove from oven, and let cool on baking sheets 5 minutes; transfer to wire racks to cool completely, about 20 minutes.







# Wildlife Food Plots: Planting with a Purpose!

We are about a month away from the official start of Fall, which is a great time to begin preparing food plots for the upcoming hunting seasons. Food plots not only increase the chances of success for hunters but also benefit wildlife. There are many ways to go about this task but, I will outline the steps that I believe have the greatest return on investment, both time and money.

Site selection is the most important step in establishing productive plots. Selecting sites that have adequate soil texture and drainage. Avoiding wet, bottomland areas will allow you to get the most out of your soil amendments and improve plant performance. Consider sunlight exposure. Long narrow plots are popular due to their increased edge habitat but can also have limited sunlight. These types of plots are best when oriented from east to west to leverage maximum sun exposure. Next, select a food plot location in close proximity to natural wildlife habitats such as cutovers and other bedding grounds, as well as travel corridors. Food plots come in all shapes and sizes and should be determined on a case-by-case basis. It is recommended to plant plots at least one acre in size with easy equipment access to the site for fertilization, planting, and other needed maintenance.

Once you have selected your food plot location the next steps are choosing forage varieties to plant, soil testing, and site preparation. It's helpful to know which plant varieties you are going to utilize when completing the soil testing process, since soil test recommen-

dations are based on plant species' individual nutrient requirements. You will need to select plant varieties that are adapted to your area and are desirable for the species of wildlife you wish to attract. Clover and cereal grain varieties are among the most popular plant species utilized in Mississippi. One of the most common mistakes I see clients make is not soil testing and applying 13-13-13 at some random rate with their food plot seed mix. To optimize soil fertility and plant performance follow the lime and fertilizer recommendations from the soil test

Site preparation involves clearing the plot site of any undesirable vegetation commonly achieved through the application of herbicides or by using mechanical methods such as discing or tillage. Having a well prepared seedbed is paramount to seed germination and plant performance. Remember that seeding rates are based on pure live seed, so make sure to take that into account when planting your plot. Planting depths and seed coverage are equally as important as every other step so make sure you follow the planting guidelines for your chosen plant species.

Planting time is crucial for success. It is imperative that you plant when soil moisture and temperature is favorable for seed germination. For most seeds the ideal soil temp is between 65-80 degrees. Watch the weather forecast and try to plant when there is at least a half of an inch of rain expected. Good luck and happy hunting, or watching, whichever you prefer!

### **Soil Testing**

As the end of our warm season lawn's growing season begins to wind down as the days become shorter and temperatures begin to drop, even though it doesn't really feel like it right now, and we look toward the dormant period for our lawn, now is a great time to take a soil test to determine what deficiencies our soil may have so we can make adjustments or plans for the upcoming year. Depending upon the species of turfgrass you are growing, lime may need to be applied to raise the pH of your soil. This is typically recommended to be done over the dormant period as it can take time to adjust the pH and this allows for the adjustment to be completed by the time the turf begins growing in the Spring.

When submitting a sample for testing, it is best to take multiple, small samples compiled together to get a representation of the area being tested rather than one large sample from the area. This helps even out any irregularities within the sample and represents the area better that may have small differences in soil type, drainage, or man- agement practices. It is recommended that if there are major, known differences in any of these, then separate samples be submitted for those areas. The more samples you submit the more detailed you can make your management practices. This can be a good first step

in helping identify possible differences in plants that are healthy and thriving vs those that may be struggling a bit.

A good sample depth is typically within the rootzone of the crop being grown (Ex. 3-5 inches for lawns). Submitting your test now gives you the ability to lay out and organize a plan for next year so you aren't caught off guard by a possibly early spring. You can get any needed fertilizer materials over the coming months as opposed to rushing to get them at the last minute once the growing season begins.

Each performance will also spotlight the 2026 Dixie National Pageant contestants, adding tradition, beauty, and pageantry to the arena.



### Accidental Needlesticks Possible in Farm Work

Of all the dangers imagined existing on the farm, accidental needlesticks are probably not high on most people's lists.

But Leslie Woolington, safety specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said the reality is that needlestick injuries can happen when working around livestock.

"Needlestick injuries are usually minor, but they can be serious," said Woolington, who is also risk manager with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station. "The most common injuries are skin infections and allergic reactions, but they can cause deep tissue wounds that require surgery."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that more than 80% of farm workers vaccinating animals have accidentally stuck themselves. That makes vaccines the most common type of drug involved in needlestick injuries.

If accidentally stuck with a needle on the farm, the first step is to wash the area immediately with soap and water. Report the injury to a supervisor and call a healthcare provider with information about the substance involved. Poison Control can provide specific help when calling 800-222-1222.

Certain products require extra care when handling. Information

provided by the Upper Midwest Agricultural Safety and Health Center state that these include sedatives, oil-based products or vaccines and modified live vaccines. Other specific products that require extra care are the antibiotic Tilmicosin, Brucella abortus Strain RB51 vaccine and Johne's vaccine.

"Anyone who is pregnant should be especially careful around injectable hormones, and anyone with a known antibiotic allergy should be careful around those products," Woolington said.

Ways to avoid getting stuck with a needle start with restraining animals properly and not rushing when giving an injection.

"Don't recap needles, but immediately dispose of them in approved sharps containers," she said. "Don't store needles or syringes in your pocket or hold caps in your mouth. And always discard bent or dull needles."

Mary Nelson Robertson, MSU Extension health specialist, said a person who has been accidentally stuck with a needle may show symptoms such as swelling or itching within a few minutes.

"Other times, it may take hours or even days for signs to appear, such as a fever or redness from a bacterial infection that starts slow but builds over time," Robertson said. "It really depends on what was in the syringe and the person's own bodily response to what was accidentally injected."

She said anyone in this case who feels a bit off and is possibly lightheaded or nauseated, or one who notices the affected area getting warm or puffy should act early rather than wait and see what happens

"It is important to clean the area with soap and water, report it and get checked out by a healthcare provider after an accidental needlestick," she said. "Even if it seems small, taking action early can make a big difference."

Robertson said there is still a risk even if the syringe was empty when the needlestick happened.

"An empty syringe can still carry bacteria or medication residue, so it is not risk-free," she said. "Always take needlesticks seriously. There is no such thing as a 'safe' needlestick."

Jessica Halfen, Extension dairy specialist, said taking blood samples for experimental trials presents another opportunity for accidental needlesticks.

"Often, we are in a hurry to collect samples and get them to the lab, and in those situations, needles sometimes end up in pockets, which can later cause injuries," Halfen said. "In some cases, needles have even remained in farm coverall pockets for months, creating an even more dangerous situation as they can become rusty."

### Native Elderberries Have Multiple Landscape Uses

Elderberry is a plant native to North America that has received a lot of attention lately from people who claim health benefits from drinking its berry juice.

American elderberries have been growing wild across the South for centuries, as they are naturally adapted to our climate and soils. They thrive in full sun, love consistent moisture, and grow best in our rich, loamy soils without needing much fuss.

With my interest piqued in this plant, I recently took a visit to Veteran Berries in Decatur, Mississippi, to see these plants growing for myself. There, I met Dewayne Hamrick, who has been growing cultivars like Hamilton, Pocahontas and several other selections that perform well here in Mississippi.

Elderberries are deciduous shrubs that typically grow between 6 and 12 feet tall, spreading by both seeds and root suckers. Each spring, new canes emerge from the base of the plant. The canes grow quickly, leafing out with opposite, compound leaves that give the plant a soft, feathery look.

Elderberries flower on new growth, and the clusters of blooms appear in late spring to early summer.

While visiting Dewayne's elderberry patch, these blooms were the first thing that caught my attention. They form in large, flat-topped clusters that can measure 6 to 10 inches across. Their delicate beauty and fragrance can easily stop you in your tracks.

Just as impressive is the life they attract. Pollinators swarm the blossoms, and later, the berries become a valuable food source for birds and other forms of wildlife.

After flowering, clusters of small green berries appear, and these slowly swell and ripen over several weeks. By mid-to-late summer, those clusters transform into heavy, drooping bunches of deep purple to nearly black berries.

Once harvested, the canes that produced fruit gradually die back over the year so that new canes can take their place and produce the next season's crop. This cycle of renewal is what makes elderberries such a productive and sustainable shrub

Elderberries are versatile in the kitchen, but the berries must be cooked before eating.

Raw elderberries, along with the leaves and stems, contain small amounts of naturally occurring compounds that can cause nausea or stomach upset if consumed. Cooking breaks down these compounds, making the berries safe and delicious to enjoy.

Dewayne said he has seen elderberries turned into syrup, jelly, tea and even wine.

Planting elderberries in your landscape will give you beautiful blooms to enjoy, they will attract pollinators and birds, and you will have a steady harvest of berries to use in the kitchen year after year.

### **Used Farm Equipment Swindle Alert**

A recent nationwide used equipment scam resulted in nearly a quarter million dollars being lost to online scammers for farm machinery that was never delivered to buyers in seven states. Find out how you can stay safe when buying equipment online.

The Better Business Bureau (BBB) is warning used equipment buyers nationwide about another sophisticated scam involving used farm equipment.

This particular grift, according to a press release from BBB, involved a fake online heavy equipment retailer impersonating a legitimate Missouri dealership, Cook Equipment & Trucking (Marble Hill, Mo.).

Buyers from across the U.S., some even from as far away as California and Arizona, reported losing a total of \$223,000 after attempting to purchase heavy equipment and farm machinery through fraudulent websites and Facebook Marketplace ads.

Victims say they were "ghosted" after wiring money for equipment that never arrived. The BBB does not say whether the victims were able to dispute the fraudulent charges and claw back the proceeds from the scammers.

The reported fraudulent transactions include:

- \$45,000 for a skid steer loader from a buyer in Oak Hills, Calif.
- \$32,000 for an excavator from a buyer in Hancock, Mich.
- \$29,500 for a trailer from a buyer in Amanda, Ohio
- \$29,000 for a trailer from a buyer in Greenville, N.C.
- \$28,000 for a skid steer loader from a buyer in Eastman, Wis.
- \$31,000 for an excavator from a buyer in Des Moines, Iowa.
- \$29,000 for a skid steer from a buyer in Blue, Ariz.

BBB says the real Cook Equipment & Trucking, a small business operating since 2010, confirmed it has no website and is not affiliated with any online sales. The impersonators registered three fake websites, the most recent on July 14, and continue to run deceptive ads on social media.

"Those shopping for heavy equipment and farm machinery

online should do their due diligence so they don't fall victim to a virtual vehicle vendor scam," says Michelle L. Corey, president and CEO, BBB St. Louis. "If an item is priced well below market value, that's a red flag."

To avoid getting swept up in an online virtual vehicle vendor scam the Better Business Bureau offers these tips:

- Research the business at bbb. org or call 888-996-3887
- Be skeptical of deals that seem too good to be true
- Verify the website and contact the business directly
- Read all terms and understand refund policies
- Use a credit card for added protection
- Report scams to BBB Scam Tracker, your state attorney general, the FTC, and the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center, and notify the social media platform where the fraud was discovered





### Remembering Hurricane Katrina 20 Years Later...

As Mississippi commemorated the 20th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina on August 29, 2025, officials and citizens from across the state paused to remember the lives lost and the resilience shown in the face of one of the most devastating natural disasters in our history.

"As we reflect today on 20 years since Hurricane Katrina struck our beloved Mississippi Gulf Coast, we remember and mourn the 238 Mississippians who lost their lives," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. Gipson went on to thank former Governor Haley Barbour and First Lady Marsha Barbour for their leadership during those dark days. "The Mississippi Gulf Coast was ground zero for Hurricane Katrina and the devastation will be forever etched in our minds, as well as the resulting and inspiring resilience of our people who prayed, got up the next day, went to work and set about rebuilding our lives."

In the immediate aftermath of the storm, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) quickly mobilized to aid in the recovery process. With power outages crippling critical infrastructure, the department helped purchase and distribute 30,000 gallons of fuel to poultry and dairy farms, ensuring that vital operations could continue. More than \$11 million in federal disaster assistance funds were dispersed, helping agricultural producers get back on their feet.

Public health was another major concern following the storm. In a collaborative effort with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 20 inspectors from MDAC's Bureau of Plant Industry placed more than 20,000 mosquito larvicide "dunks" in ditches and abandoned pools to reduce the risk of mosquito-borne illnesses.

To address rising transportation

costs for dairy producers, MDAC secured the Milk Producers Transportation Cost Assistance Loan. The department also created a website to coordinate requests for livestock supplies and monetary donations. MDAC's Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Investigators assisted in recovering lost and stolen equipment, while other MDAC staff collaborated with the Mississippi Board of Animal Health to respond to numerous animal health issues.

Moreover, the Mississippi State Fairgrounds became a became a refuge and lifeline for recovery efforts. The Coliseum served as the largest American Red Cross shelter, housing 3,000 displaced men, women and children from multiple states. The Trade Mart was temporarily transformed into a functioning clinic and pharmacy, while the livestock barns sheltered household pets and served as a donation distribution center

"We remember and honor those who lost their lives, but we also recognize the Mississippi National Guard, law enforcement officers, first responders and volunteers who poured into our state to help Mississippians begin again," Gipson said. "By God's grace — and with the help of our neighbors — we stand together today in unity, grateful for the renewal and rebuilding that has taken place along the Mississippi Gulf Coast and throughout our state in the wake of Hurricane Katrina."

As the state paused to commemorate this historic storm, we were reminded of the spirit of perseverance and community that carried Mississippi through those difficult days and continues to define our culture 20 years later. Neighbor helping neighbor — that's what makes Mississippi so strong.

"May God continue to bless the Mississippi Gulf Coast, the State of Mississippi and our beloved United States of America," said Gipson.
