Select, Care Well For Christmas Poinsettias

It's that time of year again for shopping, eating, delivery trucks and poinsettias. Yep—it's the Christmas season.

Now is a great time to get the best selection of poinsettias. They're plentiful in a wide variety of sizes and colors sure to fit into any holiday decorating scheme.

The range of available poinsettia colors is truly remarkable. Poinsettia is no longer just that red Christmas plant. We can purchase them in white, pink, maroon, speckled and marbled selections. This year, I noticed a resurgence in plants painted and dyed in totally nontraditional

poinsettia colors.

I'm always amazed at the beautiful colors, but my favorite has to be the traditional red.

The colors we enjoy are not flowers but modified leaves called bracts. The true flowers are those little pealike structures called cyathia.

Take your time when shopping for poinsettias. Don't just grab the first pretty plant you find.

Remember that not all poinsettias are the same, especially when they are displayed tightly packed on racks or benches. Look for plants that are compact with good branching. Don't be afraid to carefully pick plants out of the crowd and look at them.

But don't be rough, especially if the plants are really crowded. Poinsettia branches can easily break, and you know the old adage, "You break it, you buy it."

Look for signs of stem and branch breakage before you purchase them; the sleeves that protect many poinsettias can hide these defects. I like to buy poinsettias that are not sleeved and then have a protective sleeve put on at the check-out counter.

Pay particular attention when removing these paper or plastic sleeves. Never try to slide the shipping sleeves off because this has the potential to damage the plant. Always tear or cut the sleeve off your plants.

If you're going to be on an allday shopping trek, plan to buy your poinsettias last. Don't leave them in a cold or hot car all day.

Here are some care tips to help you keep your poinsettia looking good for the entire holiday season.


Poinsettias need at least six hours of indirect sunlight and comfortable room temperatures. If you're comfortable, then the poinsettias will be happy. That poinsettia might look great by the front door when guests arrive, but the sudden temperature changes from drafts, either cold or warm, will cause the leaves and bracts to drop.

Poinsettias are sensitive to wet feet, and root rot sets in very quickly, so don't overwater. It's easy to tell if your plant needs water. Either feel the top of the potting mix for dryness or pick the pot up to get a sense of the weight. Light pots need water.

To water, remove the decorative sleeve and set the pot in a pan of water in the kitchen sink. Lift it out of the water, and when it has finished draining, replace the decorative sleeve. I also like to use a saucer to protect my furniture from any moisture.

Despite the alarming information folks share on social media, poinsettias are not poisonous to our pets.

According to the ASPCA Animal Poison Control, eating poinsettia leaves will induce only GI tract irritation. A more likely scenario would be you getting a skin rash or contact dermatitis from handling poinsettias, so always wash your hands after handling your poinsettia.

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From Our Kitchen To Yours

Christmas Dinner Ideas



Christmas Sunrise

1 1/2 cups granulated sugar

3/4 cup water

1 1/2 cups cranberry juice cocktail

1/4 cup (2 ounces) grenadine

4 cups tangerine juice

2 cups chilled lime flavored sparkling water, club soda, or Prosecco Thin tangerine slices

Cook sugar and water in a saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, until sugar dissolves and mixture comes to a boil, two to three minutes. Boil, stirring occasionally, two minutes. Remove syrup from heat; let cool about 30 minutes. Stir together cooled syrup, cranberry juice, and grenadine until incorporated. Cover and refrigerate until well chilled, four hours or overnight. Fill eight tall 12-ounce glasses with ice cubes, and pour 1/3 cup cranberry syrup mixture in each glass. Slowly pour about 1/2 cup tangerine juice over the back side of a spoon into each glass. Do not stir. Slowly pour 1/4 cup chilled sparkling water into each glass. Garnish with tangerine slices.

Orange-Glazed Ham

1 (7 to 8 pound) smoked fully cooked ham

1 cup orange juice

1 cup ginger ale

1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 tablespoon white vinegar

2 teaspoons dry mustard

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

Trim skin away from ham, leaving no more than a 1/4-inch border of fat. Place ham in a large roasting bag. Combine remaining ingredients, and pour over ham. Tie bag tightly. Place in a large bowl, and refrigerate for eight hours, turning occasionally. Remove ham from marinade, and reserve the marinade. Place ham on a rack in a shallow roasting pan; insert meat thermometer, making sure it does not touch fat or bone. Bake at 325 degrees for two to two and a half hours or until meat thermometer registers 140 degrees (18 to 24 minutes per pound), basting with reserved marinade every 20 minutes.

Root Vegetable Gratin

1 large rutabaga, peeled and cut into 1/8 –inch thick slices

2 large russet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/8 –inch thick slices

3 large parsnips, peeled and cut into 1/8 –inch thick slices

 $1\ 1/2$ teaspoons kosher salt

1 1/2 cups heavy cream, divided

8 ounces Gruyere cheese, shredded (about 2 cups), divided

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Toss together rutabaga, potatoes, parsnips, salt and 3/4 cup of the cream in a large bowl. Spread 1/3 of the mixture evenly in a lightly greased 11 x 7–inch baking dish; top with 3/4 cup of the Gruyere, and remaining rutabaga mixture and 3/4 cup cream. Top with remaining 1/2 cup Gruyere. Cover loosely with aluminum foil. Bake in preheated oven 45 minutes. Uncover and bake until vegetables are tender and cheese is golden brown, 20 to 25 minutes. Transfer to a wire rack; cool five minutes.

Christmas Salad

8 ounces thick bacon, coarsely chopped

1 cup sliced red onion

1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt, divided

3/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, divided

1/2 cup red wine vinegar

2 tablespoons honey

1 bunch kale, stemmed and coarsely chopped (about 7 cups loosely packed)

1 bunch red Swiss chard, stemmed and coarsely chopped (about 8 cups loosely packed)

2 small beets, thinly sliced

1/2 cup toasted pumpkin seeds

1/2 cup dried cherries

1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese

Cook bacon in a large skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, six to eight minutes or until crisp; remove bacon, using a slotted spoon, and drain on paper towels. Reserve six tablespoons drippings in skillet. Add onion, 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper, and sauté two minutes. Remove from heat. Add red wine vinegar to skillet, and stir to loosen browned bits from bottom of skillet. Whisk in honey. Toss together chopped kale, Swiss chard, onion mixture, and remaining one teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper in a large bowl. Transfer to a serving platter. Top with cooked bacon, beet slices, pumpkin seeds, dried cherries, and feta cheese. Serve immediately.

Red Velvet Fudge

12 ounces cream cheese, softened

1 tablespoon milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/4 teaspoon table salt

1 pound powdered sugar

1 cup white chocolate morsels

2/3 cup milk chocolate morsels

1 (1 –ounce) bottle red liquid food coloring

1 cup toasted chopped walnuts

Line an eight-inch square pan with parchment paper, extending over sides; coat with cooking spray. Beat cream cheese, milk, vanilla extract and salt with an electric mixer until creamy. Beat in powdered sugar, one cup at a time. Beat on high speed three minutes. Melt white chocolate according to package directions; beat into cream cheese mixture. Reserve one-third of cream cheese mixture. Melt milk chocolate according to package directions. Stir milk chocolate and food coloring into remaining two-thirds of cream cheese mixture. Fold in walnuts. Pour into prepared pan; top on counter to remove air bubbles. Freeze 10 minutes. Spread reserved cream cheese mixture over fudge; chill four to twenty four hours. Remove fudge from pan. Cut into rectangles, rinsing and wiping knife clean between each slice. Chill until ready to serve.







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Winter Conditions Improve Wild Hog Trapping Results

Wild hogs are a tremendous problem for farmers and landowners throughout the state of Mississippi.

Wild hogs have a growth rate that exceeds any other large mammal in North America. An adult sow typically produces four to eight piglets per litter -- at least double that of white-tailed deer.

Currently, the best way to reduce hog populations is through trapping. Hunting and shooting have their place, but a well-organized trapping program will yield the best results relative to time and effort. The key to getting a hog in a trap is through its stomach.

Wild hogs are classified as omnivores, which means they eat both plant and animal matter. About 90 percent of a hog's diet is plant matter, including roots, fruits, acorns and -- much to the chagrin of our Mississippi farmers -- crops like corn, soybeans, rice, peanuts and sweet potatoes. The remaining 10 percent of a hog's diet is meat, which it acquires opportunistically. This essentially means it eats any meat it can find, such as mice, salamanders, frogs, snakes, rabbits and deer fawns.

Winter is the best season for hog trapping because most of the foods that hogs relish are limited in cold months. Summer crops that hogs demolish have not yet been planted, and their favorite naturally occurring foods, such as blackberries, persimmons and muscadines, have already been eaten. Probably the most sought-after wintertime food is acorns, which is unfortunate for our native wildlife species, including deer, turkey and squirrels. When acorns are available, trapping can be difficult simply because hogs aren't nearly as attracted to bait when Mother Nature's candy is abundant on the forest floor.

It may be best to wait until deer season has closed to minimize activ-

ity in the woods and to reduce any legal constraints when using grain-based foods for hog bait. Always check with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks at http://www.mdwfp.com for hog trapping regulations.

Here are a few tips for effectively trapping hogs.

The bigger the trap, the better. Small box traps are occasionally used to catch an individual hog, but that is not our goal. Instead, choose a corral-style trap to catch several hogs each time the trap is triggered. Also, because corral traps do not have a top or roof, nontarget animals that may get trapped can escape without harm.

Do your homework. Pick a trapping location that has plenty of evidence that hogs routinely visit the area. Then, start the baiting process. Use a trail camera so you can determine how many hogs are routinely visiting the site and consuming the bait.

Construct the trap. It may take several days to convince the hogs to enter the corral to consume the bait. Trail-camera information becomes critically important. Don't set the trap or engage the triggered trap door until you have photographic evidence that all the hogs are entering and feeding in the trap. When you determine that all the hogs feel secure entering the trap, it's time to set the trap door trigger.

Technology is making this process even more efficient -- a camera at the trap site will send photographs to your cell phone. What's even cooler is that you can send a signal back to the camera to tell it to close the trap door! This technology improves trapping efficiency. Of course, this technology will cost more, so you will have to determine if this newer technology is right for your situation

Commissioner Andy Gipson Supports Expanding Rural Broadband Availability

At the beginning of the 2018/19 school year, one of my boys came home from school with a teacher's message. The message was that this year, all homework would be completed and turned in exclusively online by way of the internet. My initial thought was that this is definitely a sign of the times! No more scratching out homework with a pencil on a lined piece of crumpled paper. No more could any child be given the excuse to claim, "The dog ate my homework!"

As promising as this new era appeared, it didn't work out at the Gipson household. We live on our small farm in rural Simpson County, and we only received DSL service a few years back. While we are very thankful for the little internet we have, it was just not enough to get the homework job done. The first afternoon of "online homework" was a nightmare for my son as he struggled to complete his work at a snail's pace. The slow pace was not his fault, but it was the fault of crawling and unreliable internet service. The next day I had to send the well-intentioned teacher a message: "Online homework cannot work this far out in the country." My boy was granted special approval to keep doing his homework the same way folks did it 100 years ago.

This is more than a true story. It is an illustration of the reality that high speed broadband is no longer a luxury for rural Mississippians like us; it is absolutely critical to the future of our farms, our families, and our way of life in rural Mississippi. According to the Federal Communications Commission, 24 million American households do not have reliable affordable high-speed internet, with an overwhelming amount of those being located in rural areas. Twenty-eight percent of Mississippians lack access to 25 Mbps/3 Mbps service. Fifty-one percent of rural Mississippians lack access, compared to only five percent of those located in urban areas. The ability



to connect to reliable, high speed broadband can mean a higher quality of life. This access can expand healthcare options, such as the ability to use telemedicine rather than driving long distances to be seen by a healthcare provider. Just as the case with my family, access to broadband increases educational opportunities not just for students like my son, but also for adults who are seeking online professional certifications and college degrees.

The United States Department of Agriculture reports that 29 percent of U.S. farms have no access to the internet. As farming and the agriculture industry become more technologically advanced, farmers are relying more heavily on the internet in their day-to-day operations to remain competitive. Farmers and ranchers are utilizing broadband for using precision agriculture practices, managing crops, and monitoring markets, crop conditions and yields. The lack of internet access can mean that the time needed to repair equipment can go from hours to days, which can be costly for farmers especially during critical times such as harvest.

Modern technology that already exists in our homes, in our shops, and on our tractors cannot be fully utilized without high speed, reliable broadband internet services. The ability to live and work on the farm will be increasingly tied to the availability and affordability of these services. That is why as your Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, I fully support each and every available method of deploying high speed broadband in the rural areas of Mississippi. Let's join together and support more and faster broadband out here in the country!





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
