Raised Beds Benefit Flowers, Vegetables

Many people are interested in having home vegetable and flower gardens, but many urban homes have small lots. Home gardeners in this situation may not think they have enough room. Others, especially inexperienced gardeners, may be discouraged by the amount of time and work required to build a new garden bed.

A good solution to this problem is to grow vegetables and flowers in compact, raised beds. By using an intensively cultivated area, you need less time and space to produce vegetables that taste great and flowers that feed the soul.

A raised bed is exactly what the name suggests -- a landscape or garden bed that is higher than the surrounding grade. Raised beds offer many advantages for gardening in Mississippi:

Research suggests plant growth is enhanced, primarily due to the much improved drainage of the raised bed compared to in-ground gardening.

They aid gardeners who have sore backs and achy knees by bringing the garden up a little closer, which I particularly appreciate.

Growing in raised beds allows the gardener to reach into the bed from both sides.

The first planning step is deciding where to put your garden. Most vegetables prefer full sun all day, but they can get by with at least six hours of sun. If all-day sun is not possible, select a site that receives morning rather than afternoon sun.

Another very important factor to consider is how close your bed is to the water faucet. Successful gardens must have easy access to irrigation.

And don't forget to call 811 and have any underground utilities located. This really is a must for any garden and landscape project.

You can raise the planting bed by



simply piling up growing mix and making walkways on either side. But using hardscape materials to build sides will keep your garden looking tidy.

The choice of materials is the gar-

dener's decision. If you don't want to use treated lumber, then cedar and redwood have natural resistance to decay. These woods are more expensive but will last much longer than untreated pine. Other options include using block, recycled concrete or recycled plastic boards.

The construction parameters of raised beds are quite simple. You can make the raised bed as long as you want, but don't make it over 4 feet wide. This width allows you to reach plants in the middle from either side without walking in the bed.

Your new raised bed is really just a large container, so use a growing mix made for containers. And because the raised bed is contained with side walls, no one walks through it to compact the growing mix. That means the soil will stay light and fluffy and ready for any season.

To calculate the volume of grow-

ing mix you need for your raised bed, just multiply the length by width by depth, using feet for all the dimensions.

Bagged, premixed potting soil or soilless mixes are readily available from garden supply stores. This is a quick way to fill your bed, but it is the most expensive. So here's an alternative mix recipe that will give the same great results: use equal volumes of peat moss, compost and pine bark. To make measuring easier, remember that a 5-gallon bucket hold two-thirds of a cubic foot.

Constructing raised beds and growing vegetables and flowers in them is one way to help new and old gardeners have greater success in the garden and landscape.

Delicetable Springtime Desserts



Lemon Cheesecake Tarts

2 sheets refrigerated pie crust
1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 10-ounce jar lemon curd, divided
1 8-ounce container frozen whipped topping, thawed
1 cup fresh blueberries
Confectioners' sugar, optional

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. On a work surface, unroll crusts. Cut 24 circles with a floured three-inch scalloped round cookie cutter, rerolling scraps as necessary. Press circles onto bottoms and partway up sides of ungreased muffin cups, smoothing the edges. Prick bottoms generously with a fork. Bake until light golden brown, five to seven minutes. Remove tarts from pans to wire racks to cool completely. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and vanilla until blended; beat in 1/4 cup lemon curd, fold in a third of the whipped topping, and then fold in the remaining topping. Spoon two tablespoons cream cheese mixture into each tart shell; top each with one teaspoon lemon curd. Top with blueberries; refrigerate until serving. If desired, dust with confectioners' sugar.

Raspberry Cream Sugar Cookies

1/2 cup white baking chips
1/4 cup heavy whipping cream
6 ounces cream cheese, softened
1/4 cup red raspberry preserves
1 package sugar cookie mix
1/2 cup butter, softened
1 large egg

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a microwave, melt baking chips with cream; stir until smooth. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and preserves until blended. Add melted baking chip mixture; beat until smooth. Refrigerate until ready to assemble. In another large bowl, combine cookie mix, butter and egg and mix until blended. Shape into one-inch balls; place two inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake seven to nine minutes or until edges are light brown. Cool on pans for five minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool completely. Spread one tablespoon filling on the bottoms of half of the cookies; cover with remaining cookies. Refrigerate in an airtight container.

Grapefruit, Lime & Mint Yogurt Parfait

4 large red grapefruit
4 cups reduced-fat plain yogurt
2 teaspoons grated lime zest
2 tablespoons lime juice
3 tablespoons honey
Torn fresh mint leaves

Cut a thin slice from the top and bottom of each grapefruit; stand fruit upright on a cutting board. With a knife, cut off peel and outer membrane from grapefruit. Cut along the membrane of each segment to remove fruit. In a large bowl, mix yogurt, lime zest and juice. Layer half of the grapefruit and half of the yogurt mixture into six parfait glasses. Repeat layers. Drizzle with honey; top with mint.

Orange Dream Angel Food Cake

12 large egg whites
1 cup all-purpose flour
1 3/4 cups sugar, divided
1 1/2 teaspoons cream of tartar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon almond extract
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 teaspoon grated orange zest
1 teaspoon orange extract
6 drops red food coloring, optional
6 drops yellow food coloring, optional

Place egg whites in a large bowl; let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes. Sift flour and 3/4 cup sugar together twice; set aside. Add the cream of tartar, salt, almond and vanilla extracts to egg whites; beat on medium speed until soft peaks form. Gradually add remaining sugar, about two tablespoons at a time, beating on high until stiff glossy peaks form and sugar is dissolved. Gradually fold in flour mixture, about 1/2 cup at a time. Gently spoon half of batter into an ungreased 10-inch tube pan. To the remaining batter, stir in the orange zest, orange extract and, if desired food colorings. Gently spoon orange batter over white batter. Cut through both layers with a knife to swirl the orange and remove air pockets. Bake cake on the lowest oven rack at 375 degrees for 30-35 minutes or until lightly browned and entire top appears dry. Immediately invert pan; cool completely, about one hour. Run a knife around and side and center of the tube pan. Remove the cake to a serving plate.

Slow Cooker Rhubarb Strawberry Sauce

4 cups sliced fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed (about 10 stalks)
4 cups fresh strawberries, halved
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/4 cup water
3 tablespoons butter
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/4 cup cornstarch
3 tablespoons cold water
Vanilla ice cream

In a three-quart slow cooker, combine the rhubarb, strawberries, sugar, water, butter and vanilla extract. Cook, covered, on low four to five hours or until rhubarb is tender. In a small bowl, mix cornstarch and cold water until smooth; gradually stir into sauce. Cover and cook the sauce on low 30 minutes longer or until thickened. Serve over vanilla ice cream.



Grow Your Own Vegetables

There are many good reasons for growing a vegetable garden in Mississippi. A garden offers the opportunity to enjoy vegetables at their freshest. Sometimes only minutes elapse between harvest, preparation, and eating. On the other hand, most fresh vegetables available at the grocery store travel about 1,800 miles between producer and consumer, and this travel often occurs over a period of several days. There's a lot to be said for "homegrown" freshness.

Vegetable gardens are traditional in Mississippi. When the state was more rural, most of the family's food was grown at home. Today, vegetable gardens are often thought of as a form of family recreation. Many older Mississippians grow gardens that are much too large for their own use just to have fresh vegetables for family, friends, and others who are unable to garden.

Here is what some of today's Mississippi gardeners have to say about their gardens and why they garden:

"We have enough for our family, plus some to share; what more could you ask?"

"There's no way to keep count of the people who stop to visit my garden and talk awhile since it is on the side of a field road that leads to a catfish pond. I was so proud when I was told it was the prettiest garden they had seen. I have filled three freezers and canned more than 300 jars of vegetables."

"I have always had a love for gardening. I have helped in caring for the family garden ever since I was large enough to help plant and work in a garden."

"I enjoy giving vegetables to the elderly, shut-ins, neighbors, and friends."

"I enjoy people visiting my garden. Some come just to enjoy seeing it, others to learn better ways to garden."

"I have gardened over 50 years and still do my own work. The hard work and good food keep me healthy. I save some money, but I receive other benefits that are greater and that cannot be bought."

"We give more vegetables away than we keep. We have a large family, five children, 13 grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren, so you see we really enjoy a garden."

"There is a great difference in cooking fresh food from that which has been picked for several days. Watching your food grow gives you something to look forward to each week."

Decide What You Want to Plant

Select vegetables and the amount to plant by looking forward to harvest and how you will use the vegetables. There's no sense in planting



something that won't be used.

When selecting vegetables to grow, consider your available garden space. Some vegetables take a lot of garden space for a long time, while others are planted and harvested in a short time period, producing a lot in a little space. Melons, pumpkins, vining types of squash, and sweet potatoes are in the garden for a long time, yet the harvest period is relatively short. Okra, tomatoes, peppers, eggplant, and pole beans are also in the garden a long time, but these produce a continuous supply of food.

Sweet corn is one of those vegetables you just have to plant despite how much space it takes (expect to harvest one ear per plant) because it is so good.

Vegetables to consider for small gardens (because of the space they need and the amount they produce) are bush snap and lima beans; leafy greens like lettuce, spinach, mustard, and turnips; green onions; tomatoes; sweet peppers; and eggplant. As space permits, add broccoli, cabbage, hot peppers, okra, summer squash, southern peas, and pole beans. Cucumbers, which normally take a lot of ground space, can be trellised.

Irish and sweet potatoes are productive for the amount of garden space required but present a storage problem when harvested.

Plant varieties recommended for growing in Mississippi. Don't continue to use old vegetable varieties when there are new varieties available that resist disease and give higher yields and quality. For example, fusarium wilt is still a major disease problem on tomatoes in some Mississippi gardens where the older varieties are planted. All recommended tomato varieties are resistant to this disease.

The amount of sunlight the garden receives can help you determine which vegetables to grow. Ideally, the garden site should receive full sun all day. This is not always possible, especially when the garden is located on a small residential lot where shade trees block the sun for part of the day.

Where there is no full sun space, plant vegetables in various spots around the house. All vegetables

grown for their fruits or seeds, such as corn, tomatoes, squash, cucumbers, eggplant, peppers, beans, and peas, should have the sunniest spots.

Vegetables grown for their leaves or roots, such as beets, cabbage, lettuce, mustard, chard, spinach, and turnips, can grow in partial shade but do better in direct sunlight.

Choose a Great Location for Your Garden

The ideal garden site is close to the house but out in the open where it receives full sun and is not shaded by trees or buildings. Choose a place that is near a water supply and has loose, fertile, well-drained soil.

Few gardeners are fortunate enough to have the ideal garden site or soil. This does not mean growing a successful garden is impossible. If you select the right vegetables and carefully manage the soil, some vegetables can be produced in almost any location.

Select a site free of serious weed problems. Nutsedge, torpedograss, bermudagrass, cocklebur, and morningglory are just a few of the weeds that are difficult to control in a garden.

Fence the garden site to keep out children and animals. A two-strand, low-voltage electric fence may be the only way to keep small animals like rabbits and raccoons out of the garden.

Remove low tree limbs that hang over the garden and give animals access.

Decide What Size Garden You Need

To determine what size garden you need, consider your family size, the amount of vegetables you need, and whether you will preserve or use the vegetables fresh.

Most important in determining garden size are the gardener's physical ability, available time and equipment, and genuine interest in gardening. Even though the rewards of gardening are great, the work is hard.

It is better to start small and build on success than to become discouraged and abandon the garden because it was too large or too much work.





Use the map and chart in this section to determine dates for planting vegetables in your area. Use the map to identify the zone (1, 2, 3, 4, or 5) in which you farm. Some Mississippi counties are in only one zone, while others are in more than one.

The zones are based on weather data for the median (most frequent) dates of last freezes (temperature of 32 or less) in spring. In some years the last freeze occurs earlier, and in some years later, than the median dates. The zones are listed at the top of the chart. The cool- and warm-season vegetables are listed on the left, and the recommended planting dates make up the body of information in the chart.

Beets, for example, are recommended for planting in zone 1 from February 1 to March 1. The starting dates are 4 and 6 weeks before the last median frost date for the zone for cool-season vegetables, and 2 and 4 weeks after the last median frost date for warm-season vegetables.

The cut-off date for planting cool-season vegetables is to provide sufficient time for the vegetables to mature before the heat of summer. The cut-off date for planting warm-season vegetables is to permit maturity and harvest before disease, insect, and weather pressures become too great and before cold temperatures in the fall.

Most cool-season vegetables can be planted in both spring and fall. This gives two opportunities for successful harvests. Most warm-season vegetables can be planted over a period of several weeks ranging from mid-spring to mid-summer. Multiple plantings at 10-day intervals of beans, corn, peas, radish, and leafy greens within the recommended planting intervals provide for successive harvests.

Some of the cool-season vegetables; such as broccoli, cabbage, Chinese cabbage, cauliflower, collards, kale, spinach, and rutabaga produce better when grown in the fall. These plants mature as the weather is getting cooler, and they are of better quality and produce over a longer period of time.

Congress Can Support Our Farmers by Ratifying the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Trade Deal

As Mississippi's Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, I've invested a great deal of time traveling across our great State listening to the concerns of our farmers and ranchers. One of the recurring themes of large and small farmers over the past year has been the need for certainty in the marketplace. Our farmers' ability to grow the highest quality agriculture products is unquestioned. However, before the first seed is put in the ground, a farmer must be able to justify how they will be able to turn a profit come harvest time. That can be challenging with fluctuating prices and market accessibility. After all, farming is unique in that no matter how high input costs may rise, farmers do not get the privilege of setting the price for their crops. A farmer takes what the market dictates. Tough weather conditions only add to the uncertainty. Presently, 500,000 acres of the Mississippi Delta is underwater, much of this being cropland. Historic floods are also devastating farms and livelihoods of our friends in the Midwest, especially Nebraska. These times demand action to support our farmers,

the people who drive our greatest industry, agriculture.

I appreciate and applaud the work of President Trump and his Administration in reaching a positive new trade agreement with Mexico and Canada so that we can continue the regional trade relationship established with our neighboring countries. I urge Congress to support our farmers and quickly seal this deal. By ratifying the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Trade Agreement (USMCA), Congress will help restore a level of certainty in the markets for U.S. producers including our Mississippi farmers.

Agriculture is the backbone of this country. If we want our farmers to continue providing safe, affordable, and abundant food and fiber to the world, we must ensure the doors are open that will allow them to do so. That's why we must get this deal done. Canada and Mexico are not just our closest neighbors; they are our closest trading partners. These two countries presently make up the largest global market for U.S. farm and food exports.

Farmers, ranchers, and the citizens of the State of Mississippi will directly benefit from the implementation of the USMCA. Mississippi produces nearly \$8 billion in farm commodities each year, making it

the state's largest industry and a significant economic driver. It is crucial that we have international markets available for these commodities, as Mississippi exports \$2 billion of agricultural goods each year. These exports alone directly support 16,200 jobs in the state.

The USMCA modernizes our trade relationships and increases market opportunities for U.S. agricultural goods, including those produced in Mississippi. Mississippi's \$3 billion poultry industry - our largest ag sector and the State's single largest industry - will benefit from the USMCA with our poultry producers gaining new access to Canada for Mississippi chicken and eggs.

Mexico is the largest importer of U.S. corn and the second largest importer of U.S. soybeans. USMCA will allow U.S. producers to maintain access to the market in Mexico, which will benefit our Mississippi growers of these commodities, two of the top crops produced in our State.

The time to take action on behalf of our farmers and ranchers is now. The course of action is clear. I urge Congress to quickly ratify the USMCA, a viable trade agreement that will immediately serve the best interests of our farmers, ranchers, and agribusinesses.



Wet Conditions May Delay Planting Efforts

Recent rainfall in north Mississippi has flooded many areas and made much Delta farmland unworkable as the time approaches for planting and other traditional tasks.

Mike Brown, state climatologist and Mississippi State University professor, said the area around Interstate 20 has had normal rainfall since January, while areas farther south have been slightly below normal.

"The greatest amount of rain fell on the northern one-third of the state," Brown said. "From January 1 to March 12, Tupelo had 22.84 inches of rain, the wettest on record; Starkville had 20.03 inches, the fifth wettest on record; and Greenwood had 17.53 inches, the sixth wettest on record."

Larry Oldham, soil specialist with the MSU Extension Service, said using heavy equipment too soon after it has flooded can compact soil below the surface.

"This creates a zone that is resistant to root growth and water infiltration, and that decreases the ability of your crop to thrive, as it limits the plants' access to nutrients and water," Oldham said.

In addition to the Mississippi River, several important rivers drain the Delta. Frequent, heavy rains are raising river levels across the state. Standing water is found in large areas around the Sunflower and Yazoo rivers and farther north in the Friars Point area.

John Mark Looney of Tribbett said his farmland in Washington County is not flooded, but it is saturated.

"If the sun came out and we had temperatures of 65 to 70 degrees, we could get out in the field to plant in a week to 10 days," Looney said. "It

will probably be the first of April before we plant anything this year."

Corn is typically the first row crop planted in Mississippi each year, with some fields being planted as early as mid-March. Erick Larson, Extension corn specialist, said it is too early to know what impact recent wet weather will have on the crop.

"We are in a precarious situation entering planting season," Larson said. "We had a wet fall and late harvest last year, and many of the fields were rutted up when they were harvested. With rain through the fall and winter, many producers did not have a chance to perform any tillage to repair or prepare fields for spring planting."

Larson said this situation makes crop planting progress more dependent than normal on an extended period of sunny, dry weather to dry soils this spring.

When rivers flood onto farmland, they often wash in debris that

is left after waters recede. Flooded river bottoms displace wildlife such as deer, snakes and alligators, and the water itself often carries contaminants such as pesticides, other chemicals and waste from flooded septic systems.

Anne-Howard Hilbun-Benoit, Extension instructor, urged caution when entering flooded areas.

"Stepping into flood waters or trying to drive through it is a bad idea since you don't know how high the water is or how swiftly the water is moving under the surface," Hilbun-Benoit said. "It only takes a few inches of water to sweep away a vehicle. The best practice is to wait until the waters recede and follow the directions of local authorities."
