


Celebrating 160 Years of Tradition

The sweet aroma of freshly-made funnel cakes and warm biscuits coupled with the taste of ice cold lemonade brings only one thing to mind. Fair season.

The 2019 Mississippi State Fair, located in Jackson, Mississippi, will be celebrating 160 years of tradition. Starting as a small gathering to show livestock in the early 1800s, the Mississippi State Fair has grown to encompass over 100 acres dedicated to carnival rides, art exhibits, concession stands, concerts and especially... livestock shows.

These legendary livestock shows continue to draw crowds of people from all walks of life. Every year, 4-H

and FFA students from across the state travel to Jackson to participate in the junior livestock shows. Likewise, the fair's petting zoo, famed pig races and dairy contests consistently bring in vast spectators. As Mississippi's number one industry, agriculture plays a major role in the structure of the state fair.

Another major aspect of Mississippi's culture and state fair is, of course, the food. Over 85 food and beverage vendors will be stationed along the mile-long Midway. From chicken-on-a-stick to fried Oreos, fairgoers will have the best refreshments Southern cuisine has to offer. As always, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) will provide homemade biscuits to the public at the Biscuit Booth near the kid zone. Fairgoers can drop by anytime between 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to meet their Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, Andy Gipson.

The Mississippi State Fair is the perfect blend of longstanding traditions and new, entertaining events. This year, the fairgrounds will boast

of several unique additions including the return of the horse and mule pull, a first-ever pony pull, an ice dome and a pumpkin contest.

"I'm very excited about the new attractions that will be at this year's fair," said chairman of the Mississippi Fair Commission and Agriculture Commissioner Andy Gipson. "In addition to the renowned livestock shows we have every year, fairgoers will have even more opportunities to enjoy wholesome, family fun."

The Ice Dome is an indoor ice skating rink that features 8,000 square feet of real ice inside the Mississippi Coliseum. It's the ideal place to cool off throughout the 13 days of the fair. Fairgoers can now experience all-day skating with a \$10 skate rental fee.

"The first time I brought an ice rink to Mississippi was at 'Christmas on Ice' in Madison," said Executive Director of the Mississippi Fair Commission Steve Hutton. "We had over 100,000 visitors our first year, and that pales in comparison to the annual crowds that attend the state fair. We are excited to see Mississip-

pians on Ice again!"

Another new attraction that will accompany this year's fair is the horse, mule and pony pull. This event will begin at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 5, with the horse pull. The mule pull will follow immediately after, and the pony pull is scheduled for 2:00 p.m. that same

day. Also happening on Saturday, October 5, is the "Great Pumpkin Search," the fair's largest pumpkin contest.

"This will be the first time our state fair has ever had a largest pumpkin contest," said Commissioner Gipson. "I am so looking forward to seeing our great state's biggest and tastiest pumpkins contend for that cherished 1st place blue ribbon."

Whether you're a thrill seeker out to find the fastest carnival ride, an animal lover attending the petting zoo and livestock shows, or a fair foods connoisseur just there for the funnel cake, you do not want to miss out on the 160th Mississippi State Fair!

The Mississippi State Fair runs Wednesday, October 2, through Monday, October 14, with a gate admission price of \$5.00 per person. Children under the age of 6 are admitted free of charge. Homemade Funnel Cake

2 eggs

1 cup milk

1 cup water

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 cups all-purpose flour

1/4 cup sugar

3 teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt

Oil for deep-fat frying

Confectioners' sugar

Toppings (optional)

In a large bowl, beat eggs. Add milk, water and vanilla until well blended. In another bowl, whisk flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; beat into egg mixture until smooth. In an electric skillet or deep-fat fryer, heat oil to 375°. Cover the bottom of a funnel spout with your finger; ladle 1/2 cup batter into the funnel. Holding the funnel several inches above the oil, release your finger and move the funnel in a spiral motion until all the batter is released, scraping with a rubber spatula if needed. Fry 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar; add toppings of strawberries, chocolate syrup, whip cream, etc. if desired. Serve warm. Roasted Corn on the Cob

4 large ears sweet corn in husks 1/4 cup butter, softened

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Carefully peel back husks from corn to within 1 inch of bottom; remove silk. Combine the butter and parsley; spread over corn. Rewrap corn in husks and secure with string. Soak in cold water for 20 minutes; drain. Grill corn, covered, over medium heat for 20-25 minutes or until tender, turning often. Serve with cheese. Source: TasteofHome.com.

Deep-Fried Oreos

18 Oreo cookies 18 wooden skewers

Oil for deep-fat frying

1 cup biscuit/baking mix 1 large egg

1/2 cup milk

Confectioners' sugar

Stick skewers into cookies, inserting pointed end of skewer into filling. Freeze until firm, about 1 hour. In a deep cast-iron skillet or deep fryer, heat oil to 375°. Place biscuit mix in a shallow bowl. In another bowl, combine egg and milk; whisk into biscuit mix just until moistened. Holding skewer, dip cookie into biscuit mixture to coat both sides; shake off excess. Fry cookies, a few at a time, until golden brown, 1-2 minutes on each side. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar before serving. Source: TasteofHome.com.

Fair-Favorite Corn Dogs

1 package (8 1/2 ounces) cornbread/muffin mix

2/3 cup all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon ground mustard

1/2 teaspoon onion powder

1/2 teaspoon chili powder

1/2 teaspoon paprika

1/8 teaspoon ground cumin

1 large egg

1 cup milk

10 hot dogs

10 wooden skewers

Oil for deep-fat frying

In a large bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. In another bowl, whisk milk and egg; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Let stand for 15 minutes. Pour batter into a tall Mason jar. Insert skewers into hot dogs; dip into Mason jar of batter. In an electric skillet or deep-fat fryer, heat oil to 375°. Fry corn dogs, a few at a time, until golden brown, 2-3 minutes, turning occasionally. Drain on paper towels. Source: TasteofHome.com.

Southern Buttermilk Biscuits

1/2 cup butter (1 stick), frozen

2 1/2 cups self-rising flour

1 cup chilled buttermilk

2 tablespoons butter, melted

Grate frozen butter using large holes of a box grater. Toss together grated butter and flour in a medium bowl. Chill 10 minutes. Add buttermilk, and stir 15 times. Dough will be sticky. Turn dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Lightly sprinkle flour over top of dough. Using a lightly floured rolling pin, roll dough into a thick rectangle. Fold dough in half so short ends meet. Repeat rolling and folding process 4 more times. Then, roll dough to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut with a 2 1/2-inch floured round cutter. Place dough rounds on a baking sheet. Bake at 475° for 15 minutes or until lightly browned. Brush with melted butter. Source: SouthernLiving.com.

Pork Chops on a Stick

8-6 ounces boneless pork loin chops, about 1 inch thick 1/2 cup bottled Italian salad dressing

Peanut oil

8 wooden skewers

Honey mustard or bottled barbecue sauce (optional)

Place chops in a resealable plastic bag set in a shallow dish. Pour salad dressing over chops; seal bag. Marinate in the refrigerator for 1 hour, turning bag occasionally. Preheat oil to 350°. Drain chops, discarding marinade. Insert a wooden skewer into a short side of each chop. Fry the chops, half at a time, for 5 to 8 minutes or until 160°. Maintain oil temperature around 350°. Remove chops from hot oil and drain on wire racks. Serve chops with honey mustard or barbecue sauce if desired. Source: BetterHomes&Gardens.com.



Mississippi FFA Association Sending 25 Teams to National Competition

Mississippi agricultural education students will be competing for national honors this fall at the 92nd National FFA Convention and Career Expo in Indianapolis, Indiana, the week of October 30-November 2, 2019.

The Mississippi FFA Association will send 25 teams and individuals to represent our state in the FFA's career development and leadership development events, competing against students from all 50 states, plus Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Career Development Events (CDEs) and Leadership Development Events (LDEs) are an outgrowth of instruction from the high school agricultural education classrooms. Participation in a CDE or LDE starts at the local school level where students begin to learn about the content area of the competition and develop skills such as problem solving, critical thinking, and teamwork and communication skills. After hours of instruction, practice, and preparation, local schools send the teams to State FFA Contest Day in early April to challenge their knowledge and expertise against similar teams from other schools. Once a team wins the first place honors, the real work begins preparing for national competition, a little over six months away.

CDE and LDE events are designed to meet the future needs of FFA members, while also intended to serve as a reflection of instruction

in the agricultural education classroom. Teams of students might compete in areas of Farm Business Management or Dairy Cattle Evaluation. Students may build a sales plan for an agricultural product in the Ag Sales CDE or discuss food safety issues in the Food Science and Technology CDE. Regardless of whether the students excel at forest measurement or conducting a meeting, the CDEs and LDEs are designed to help prepare FFA members for college and career readi-

There are 3,212 FFA members in 116 high school agricultural education programs in Mississippi's 145 public school districts. The National FFA Organization is a national youth organization of 669,989 student members as part of 8,573 local FFA chapters in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The organization is supported by 591,924 alumni members in 2,236 local FFA Alumni chapters throughout the U.S.
