## Late Season Heat and Dry Weather Aided State Cotton

Parts of Mississippi's landscape are turning white, but unlike some northern areas, this coloration is caused by cotton bolls opening for harvest, not snow accumulation.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated that nearly a quarter of Mississippi's cotton crop had been harvested by Sept. 29. To date, 45% of the crop is rated in good condition and 39% fair. Cotton should be completely out of the fields by the end of October.

Darrin Dodds, cotton specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said about 30% of the state's cotton crop was

planted before May 20 and the rest planted later. Growers planted about 700,000 acres of cotton in Mississippi in 2019.

"Early reports on the harvest yield have been outstanding, but it is the earlier planted cotton that is being harvested," Dodds said. "There is concern that yields may decrease a bit in some of the later planted cotton."

Mississippi producers have harvested average yields of more than 1,000 pounds of cotton per acre for each of the past eight years. In three of those years, average yields have topped 1,200 pounds. USDA has estimated average yields of 1,115 pounds per acre in Mississippi this year.

"We have entered a new era in terms of cotton yields," Dodds said. "Prior to 2012, we averaged over 1,000 pounds of cotton per acre only one time."

Cotton requires a significant number of hot days to grow and mature. Recent hot, dry weather

has been exactly what the crop needed to finish out, but the crop faced some challenges getting to that point.

"Excessive rain last fall and this spring prevented any field work, which made the spring very challenging," Dodds said. "The majority of the crop was planted after May 20, which is later than we are comfortable with. Fortunately, the weather remained very warm for the entire month of September, and rainfall was minimal during that time."

"While we could have possibly used one more rain in September, it is hard to complain about the weather over the past six weeks as it pertains to our cotton crop," he said.

Cotton Leaf Roll Dwarf Virus is a new threat to the state's cotton that was confirmed in many cotton-producing counties this year. It was only recently identified, and MSU plant pathologists and virologists are attempting to determine the effect it may have on the state's cot-

ton crop.

"Plants tend to take on a multitude of appearances when they are infected, which can make visual

identification difficult," Dodds said. "We are also unsure of the effects it will have on yield, if any, and how that may vary from field to field."

Will Maples, MSU Extension agricultural economist, said Mississippi is ranked third nationally in total cotton production.

"State production is projected to account for 7.5% of U.S. cotton production in 2019," Maples said. "Texas is by far the biggest U.S. cotton producer, usually followed by Georgia. Mississippi historically is in the third or fourth spot."

Current cotton prices are weaker than they were at this time in 2018.

"Mississippi spot prices are currently around 60 cents a pound as compared to over 70 cents a pound at this time last year," Maples said. "Ongoing trade disputes have had an impact on cotton prices and caused some uncertainty around demand."

### Mini Chili Cheese Dog Bites

8 hot dogs  
8 hot dog buns  
Chili  
2 cups shredded cheddar cheese  
1 cup shredded Monterey jack cheese  
2 cups chopped tomatoes  
2 avocados, chopped  
2 cups chopped green onions

Cook the hot dogs on a grill or boil them in water. Put each hot dog in a bun. Cut each hot dog (and bun) in thirds. Top each hot dog with hot chili either right out of the oven or reheated before use. Add the cheese over the hot chili. Top with the tomatoes, avocado and green onions. *Source: Sheknows.com.*

### Honey Barbecue Chicken

Vegetable cooking spray  
Bone-in chicken breasts  
Chicken drumsticks  
Honey Barbecue Sauce

Coat food grate with cooking spray; place on grill over medium-high heat (350° to 400°). Place chicken on grate, and grill, covered, 5 to 10 minutes on each side. Reduce heat to low (under 300°); grill, covered, 40 to 50 minutes for breasts and 30 to 40 minutes for drumsticks or until done. Brush with 1 cup Honey Barbecue Sauce during last 10 minutes of grilling. Serve with remaining 1 cup sauce. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

### Football Whoopie Pies

1 box chocolate cake mix  
Vanilla Icing  
3 eggs  
1/2 cup of water  
1/2 cup of vegetable oil  
2 sticks of butter, softened  
3-4 cups of powdered sugar

In a mixer, combine cake mix, eggs, water and oil. Whip together for 2 - 3 minutes. On a baking sheet, scoop out batter into round mounds. Use the back of a spoon to round out scoops of batter into football shapes. Bake for 8 minutes. Cool. For the icing, in your mixer, whip together butter and sugar (start with 3 cups of powdered sugar, then add more if necessary for thickness). Whip for 5 minutes until light and fluffy. Scoop into a pastry bag with the end cut with a 1/2 inch opening. Then, pipe icing onto the bottom cookie (wrong side up), then top with another cookie (right side up). Use a little vanilla icing to draw football laces on top. *Source: JSH.com.*

### Spiced Boiled Peanuts

2 pounds raw peanuts in the shell  
1/3 cup salt  
3/4 cup hot sauce  
1 (3-inch) piece fresh ginger, sliced  
1 tablespoon black peppercorns  
2 teaspoons coriander seeds

Bring all ingredients and water to a boil over high heat. Cover, reduce heat to medium-low, and cook, stirring occasionally, 4 hours or until peanuts are tender. Add water as needed to keep peanuts covered. Remove from heat; let stand 1 hour. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

### Corn and Jalapeno Dip

2 (8-oz.) packages cream cheese, softened and cubed  
2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese  
2 cups frozen corn kernels, thawed  
3/4 cup half-and-half  
1/3 cup chopped green onions  
2 teaspoons minced garlic  
1 jalapeño chile, seeded and minced  
8 thick-cut bacon slices, cooked until crisp and chopped  
Corn chips of your choice

Stir together cream cheese, cheddar cheese, corn, half-and-half, scallions, garlic, and jalapeño in a slow cooker. Cover and cook on Low 3 1/2 - 4 hours or on High 1 1/2 - 2 hours until creamy and bubbling, stirring halfway through. Stir in bacon. Garnish with green onions, if desired. ### So Good Brownies

4 (1-oz.) unsweetened chocolate baking squares  
3/4 cup butter  
1 1/2 cups granulated sugar  
1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar  
3 large eggs  
1 cup all-purpose flour  
1 teaspoon vanilla extract  
1/8 teaspoon salt

Line bottom and sides of pan with aluminum foil, lightly grease foil. Microwave chocolate squares and butter in a large microwave-safe bowl at High 1 1/2 - 2 minutes or until melted and smooth, stirring at 30-second intervals. Whisk in granulated and brown sugars. Add eggs, 1 at a time, whisking just until blended after each addition. Whisk in flour, vanilla, and salt. Pour mixture into prepared pan. Bake at 350° for 40 - 44 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out with a few moist crumbs. Cool completely (about 1 hour). Lift brownies from pan. Gently remove foil, and cut brownies into squares. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

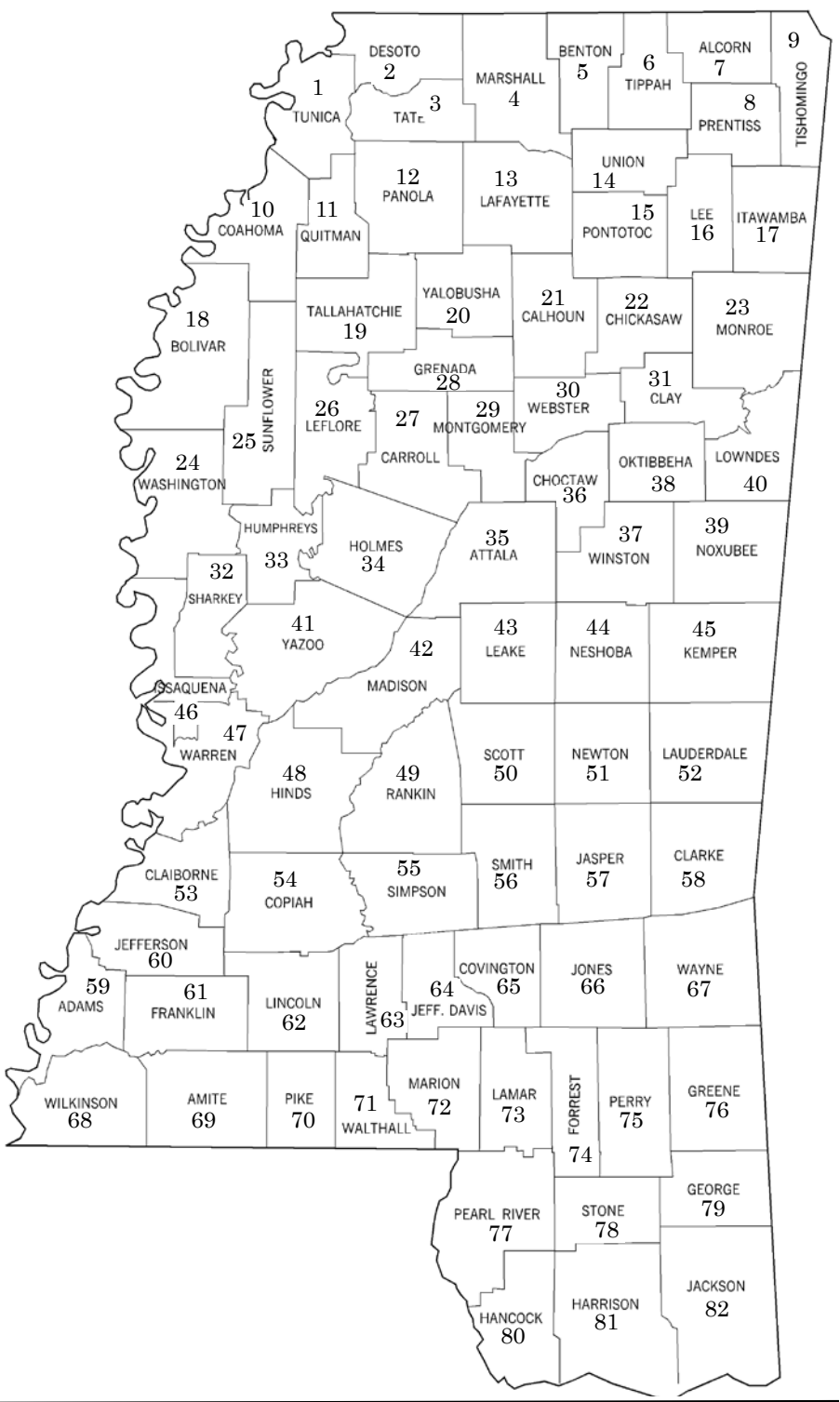

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# For the Love of Teaching & Growing: Master Gardener Malanchak Brings the Future of Food to the Grounds of the Mississippi Ag Museum

*Seeing kids smile. Seeing kids learn. Making things better. Making things more nutritious.* These are the responses I received from Master Gardener John Malanchak as he explained to me why he does what he does. "God put me on this track," he emphasized.

As a person striving to maintain the small succulent resting on the window sill of my office, it was definitely an honor to meet and speak with someone with 30 years of gardening experience. Master Gardener John Malanchak has served as a volunteer at the Mississippi Agriculture & Forestry Museum in Jackson since the Spring Farm Day event in early spring of this year. On April 13, a full trial garden opportunity from the Mississippi State University Extension Service presented itself. Malanchak enthusiastically accepted the museum as a trial garden location when then-museum director Aaron Rodgers offered available land for the project. Since then—as the only volunteer dedicated solely to this project at the museum—Malanchak has been there daily, passionately putting his decades of experience and skilled hands to work in the soil of the museum's grounds.

The garden at the Mississippi Agriculture & Forestry Museum serves as an educational tool during the summer for children, according to Malanchak. While the garden is used for research and demonstration purposes, its value extends so much farther. In fact, the Mississippi State University Extension Service's trial gardens have a purpose to serve by "identifying, evaluating, and promoting plants that excel in Mississippi landscapes and appeal to southern gardeners."

Some current crops in Malanchak's trial garden include two varieties each—for experimental purposes—of cucumbers (for pickling), cucumbers (for slicing), zucchini squash, yellow squash, sweet corn, whole beans, jalapeno peppers, sweet peppers, cantaloupes, watermelons, okra, and snap beans. Botanically, these are all fruits.

"Knowledge is knowing that a tomato is a fruit. Wisdom is knowing not to put it in a fruit salad," he jokingly remarked after explaining the 1893 Supreme Court ruling in *Nix vs. Hedden* that declared tomatoes be legally deemed as a vegetable instead of a fruit when imported, while accompanying a 10-percent tariff requirement.

With innovative medicine and advanced technology, people are living longer. According to Malanchak, by 2050, about 9 billion people will need to be fed. Agriculture plays a major role in securing food choices for people. Resultantly, Malanchak wants to contribute his extensive knowledge of gardening to help solve world hunger. Studying new varieties of plants could potentially lead to the discovery of a way to alter plants in order to make them drought-tolerant or richer in nutrients. "Making things better and more nutritious" is his ultimate goal.

Malanchak grew up in Pittsburgh to a family of farmers—meat, potatoes, carrots, and celery. Depending on how far back he wants to go in his chapters of life, Malanchak's gardening story could begin with his Polish grandfather's gardening in Pennsylvania or his wife's telling him that he needs to learn the difference between grass and flowers when he would accidentally mow her flowers with his lawn mower. Ironically, Malanchak studied geology at the University of Southern Mississippi in Hattiesburg, where he met his wife of 48 years, Betty. If he could start all over again though, he said that he would have attended Mississippi State Univer-

sity to study horticulture. Outside of his Ag Museum efforts, Malanchak also invests time and knowledge into several other gardens. Particularly, he takes advantage of opportunities to teach and interact with children and adults with special needs and adults with dementia. By collaborating with teachers and speech-language professionals, he creates curricula for these children and adults according to their level of understanding and capabilities. Malanchak explains that gardening is therapeutic and is a form of physical and mental rehabilitation—keeping the hands moving, helping with balance, and building confidence. It is also spiritually therapeutic, he explains. "You're so engrossed in tasks that it consumes you," he said, describing the reasoning of gardening's therapeutic effects.

Malanchak is not only a Master Gardener. He is a storyteller, a teacher, and a role model for many people who come into contact with him. From the stories he shared with me about some of these children and adults touching soil for the first time, admiring its "coolness and textural sensations" to the stories he shared about the Seedsters—in reference to enrollees at the Mustard Seed, Inc. of Brandon, a Christian charitable organization founded in 1981 for adults with developmental disabilities—get-

ting excited about seeing "growth" and emailing him promptly when "the tomatoes died." He has so many colorful stories to share with anyone who crosses his path. His core values and work ethic revolve around independence, education, and ambition.

The best teachers are also open to learning. Malanchak takes great pride in being a student. He enjoys hearing people's stories, learning about them and their way of thinking.

Needless to say, when I asked Malanchak what is his goal, his response was "to touch people's souls. To learn their dreams."

In Mississippi, a Master Gardener is someone highly trained in gardening and is expected to use such title only when doing unpaid educational work. Meanwhile, you do not have to be a Master Gardener to be supportive of gardening and the benefits associated with it. You can support and advocate for school garden programs and school junior master gardener programs in your area. Although the world could definitely use more John Malanchaks, you, too, can help make your corner of the world a better place.



Mackenzie and Coach Billups also visited SuperTalk Mississippi studios in Jackson to discuss their sport with radio host Mary Wieden. Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson announced Shane Cochran of George County as the winner of the Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge during the Mississippi State Fair. Cochran won a wild hog trapping system, valued at \$6,000, donated by HogEye.

The Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge is a new initiative to help protect Mississippi's agriculture from wild hogs. It was initiated to

raise awareness of wild hogs and their significant negative impact to agriculture.

"Wild hogs cause over \$60 million in property damage every year in our state," said Commissioner Gipson. "I am proud to be a part of the efforts to reverse the negative impact these animals have on agriculture, and I am so appreciative to all those that participated in helping combat this nuisance animal."

The Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge had over 180 entries across 36 counties in the state. An estimated 730 wild hogs were harvested and 96,744 acres of crops

protected.

In addition to Cochran winning the HogEye trapping system, Commissioner Gipson also announced Jerry Williams of Stone County as the winner of the firearm donated by the Central Mississippi Friends of the NRA. By harvesting the heaviest wild hog, Williams will receive a Diamondback 300 Blackout.
