Mississippi's Dairy Farms Rely on Rich Heritage

Everyone knows that "milk does a body good." Dairy foods contain nine essential nutrients that are important for building strong bones and healthy bodies. Dairy foods are great sources of protein and calcium for people in all walks of life, including adults, seniors and athletes. Just one 8-ounce serving of milk has 8 grams of protein, which builds and repairs muscle tissue.

Mississippi's dairy farmers are some of the hardest working farmers. They have definitely faced many challenges through the years in maintaining the industry here in the Magnolia State. We currently



have 65 dairy farms in the state that supply schools, restaurants hospitals and grocery stores with milk, cheeses, ice cream, yogurt and other essentials to our dairy food intake.

Doug Popwell and Larry Martin from Tylertown are Genuine MS members. They are third and fourth generation dairy farmers. Tylertown is in Walthall County, better known as the "cream pitcher of Mississippi." They talk positively about revitalizing the dairy industry. Their hope is that the younger generations will take an interest.

Popwell states, that it's hard to get the supplies needed to meet the demands of the farm at times. Mike Ferguson, vice-chair of the Dairy Alliance also has stated that during these times that farmers have to plan ahead and schedule products to

be delivered in advance to keep the farm running smoothly.

Katie Mauthe from McComb owns Mauthe's Farm and she is the fourth generation dairy farmer. As Genuine MS members, they strive to deliver fresh wholesome dairy products to businesses and consumers in Mississippi. Their milk is only pasteurized not homogenized (meaning less processed), and comes from cows that are grass-grazed.

Grazing improves the cow's health, physical fitness, and fertility. Milk from grass grazed cows is higher in Omega-3 fatty acids and conjugated linoleic acid (CLA), which have wonderful health benefits for humans. They offer other dairy products such as; butter, cream, cheese cakes, and cream cheese.

Pat Ard and Julie Ard James from

Ruth, MS are members of the Genuine MS program. They are third and fourth generation farmers. Their journey started way back in 1894 with Julie's great grandfather farming cotton. Their dairy business started in the 1940s. Ard's Dairy Farm is one of the first to open its doors to the public for agritourism in the dairy industry. They feel that it is important for the public to see the farming process. Ard's offers spring and fall fun for the family.

At the onset of the COVID-19 crisis many stores began limiting the amount of milk that shoppers were allowed to purchase. Although this increased the demand for milk at the time, the supply of milk remained strong with no shortage. The purchasing limitation, coupled with the impact from the loss of markets for milk due to school and restaurant closures, led to an oversupply of milk.

In addition, Covid-19 struck so quickly it has taken some time to re-tool storage and packaging of this

perishable commodity. Milk processors are not capable of processing the excess supply leading many farmers with no choice but to dump their milk. Cows continue to produce, even in times of oversupply, and unlike many other agricultural commodities, milk is highly perishable and can't be frozen or stored.

With new health trends of 2020 being brain food with Omega-3 fatty acids, less sugar, and simple home-cooking, we can achieve all of these healthy habits in one glass of milk. As we move forward in this uncharted time, the message from the farmer is this, "don't forget the local family-run farm."

Mississippi is proud of the dairy farmers and the on-farm bottling plants selling direct to the consumer. The next time that you go to the store or pick-up milk off of the shelf or even call your local dairyman, remember "milk is the most wholesome product that you can put in your body."

USACE Accepting Public Comments on Yazoo Area Pump Project

On April 16, 2020, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Vicksburg District announced that it will prepare a supplemental environmental impact statement (SEIS) for the Yazoo Area Pump Project in the Yazoo Backwater Area of Mississippi. The public is invited to review the notice of intent for the SEIS and provide comments. The notice of intent can be viewed at <https://www.federalregister.gov/documents/2020/04/16/2020-07966/notice-of-intent-to-prepare-supplemental-environmental-impact-statement-for-the-yazoo-area-pump>. Public comments can be submitted by email to YazooBackwater@usace.army.mil. The deadline to submit

comments is June 15, 2020. The Yazoo Backwater Area has experienced significant flooding 9 out of the last 10 years. The SEIS is in response to historical flooding that continues in the Yazoo Backwater Area. This area is once again experiencing a monumental flood during 2020. This event immediately follows the historic flood of 2019 that lasted approximately eight months. During 2019, over 550,000 acres, of which more than 225,000 acres were agricultural cropland, were flooded. Most of this cropland was not planted due to the flood. The economic and environmental impact to the South Delta was devastating. The 2019 flood continues to negatively impact local economies that exist because of agriculture, natural resources, and outdoor recreation in the area. Unfortunately, substantial flooding

in the Yazoo Backwater Area began once again in January 2020, with approximately 500,000 acres flooded at its peak in April. Of those acres, 202,000 acres were cropland. The backwater floods of 2019 and 2020 are the two highest backwater flood events since the completion of the Yazoo Backwater Levee and Drainage Structures in 1978. Much of the devastation that South Delta residents are facing now could have been prevented if construction of the Yazoo Backwater Area Pump Project had been completed. The Yazoo Backwater Area Pump Project was designed and authorized to alleviate backwater flooding and protect the livelihood of area residents. However, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) vetoed the project in 2008, even though it was a federally-

authorized USACE Civil Works project. The USACE and EPA are now considering a new project plan to complete the Yazoo Area Pump Project. The SEIS as described previously is one of the first steps in moving forward to complete the project.

Several Issues are on the forefront as the Mississippi Legislature Reconvenes

The action at the Capitol has picked up substantially since our last update. Legislators spent the end of February and beginning of March taking up a large amount of bills in committees in order to meet the March 3rd deadline. In order to survive this deadline, a general bill must have been reported out of the committee or committees in the house that it originated in. All bills that did

not make it out of committee by the end of March 3rd are considered dead. In the House of Representatives, a total of 1,590 bills were filed. Only 465 of these bills, or 29.5%, survived the deadline. In the Senate, 327 of the 907 (36%) bills filed made it through. Both houses will now begin to take up and debate these bills that made it through committee on the floor. If a bill passes on the floor, it will be sent over to the other house and go through the same

process as it did in the house it originated in. Six bills related to agriculture and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) made it out of both the House Agriculture Committee and Senate Agriculture Committee. One of these bills worth monitoring is HB 1566, the “Future of Mississippi Agriculture Act of 2020.” This bill would authorize MDAC to develop marketing and education materials for promot-

ing Genuine MS products, create an agricultural entrepreneurial center and/or Genuine MS agriculture marketplace, allow other state agencies to pay MDAC for using its facilities, create a nuisance wildlife program to provide technical guidance to farmers on private agricultural and forestry lands, expand the Ag Theft division to help with an increased caseload, and extend an exemption to Ag Theft law.

Cheesy Potato Casserole

3 pounds russet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1-inch pieces
1 tablespoon plus 2 tsp. salt, divided
6 egg yolks, at room temperature
1 cup heavy cream, at room temperature
1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted
8 ounces white Cheddar cheese, shredded
2 ounces Parmesan cheese, grated
1/2 teaspoon ground white pepper

Place potatoes and 1 tablespoon of salt in a Dutch oven with water to cover by 1 inch. Bring to a boil and cook until potatoes can be pierced easily with knife, about 15 minutes. Remove from heat. Drain well and return potatoes to Dutch oven. Mash potatoes until very smooth. Stir in egg yolks, 1 at a time. Stir in cream, butter, both cheeses, white pepper and remaining 2 teaspoons salt until smooth. Transfer mixture to a lightly greased baking dish and let cool to room temperature, about 1 hour. Cover with aluminum foil and chill until ready to bake, up to 1 day ahead. Bake, covered, at 350° until heated through, about 45 minutes. Uncover and bake 15 more minutes. Increase oven temperature to broil on HIGH, and broil until topping is browned, 3-4 minutes. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Cheddar Cornbread Squares

1 package corn muffin mix, plus ingredients to make mix
1 small onion, thinly sliced
1/2 cup red pepper, thinly sliced
1/2 cup green pepper, thinly sliced
1 teaspoon oregano
1 1/2 cups shredded reduced-fat mild cheddar cheese, divided
Nonstick cooking spray

Preheat oven to 400° F. Prepare corn muffin mix batter as directed on package. Spray an 8-inch square or round pan with nonstick cooking spray. Pour batter into pan; bake 15 minutes, or until lightly browned. Do not remove cornbread from the pan. While bread is baking, heat a skillet with nonstick cooking spray. Add onion and peppers; sauté until soft. Stir in oregano; set aside. Sprinkle one cup of the cheese over baked bread; top with vegetable mixture and remaining 1/2 cup of cheese. Bake five minutes or until cheese is melted. Cut into 2-inch squares to serve. *Source: Thedairyalliance.com.*

Cream Cheese Squares

2 cans refrigerated crescent roll dough
2 packages cream cheese
1 cup white sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 cup margarine, melted
1/4 cup white sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Grease pan and press one can of the crescent rolls into the bottom. In a medium bowl, mix together the cream cheese, 1 cup of sugar and vanilla until smooth and creamy. Spread over the crescent layer. Unroll the second can of crescent rolls and lay them on top of the cream cheese layer. Do not press down. Pour the melted margarine over the entire pan. Combine the remaining 1/4 cup of sugar and cinnamon; sprinkle over the top. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes, or until the top is crisp and golden. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

Homemade Chocolate Ice Cream

1 (14 ounces) can sweetened condensed milk
1 (5 ounces) can evaporated milk
2 cups whole chocolate milk
2/3 cup chocolate syrup

Whisk all ingredients in a pitcher or large bowl until blended. Cover and chill 30 minutes. Pour milk mixture into freezer container of a 1-quart electric ice cream maker and freeze according to manufacturer's instructions. Remove container with ice cream from ice cream maker, and place in freezer 15 minutes. Transfer to an airtight container; freeze until firm, about 1-1 1/2 hours. *Source: MyRecipes.com.*

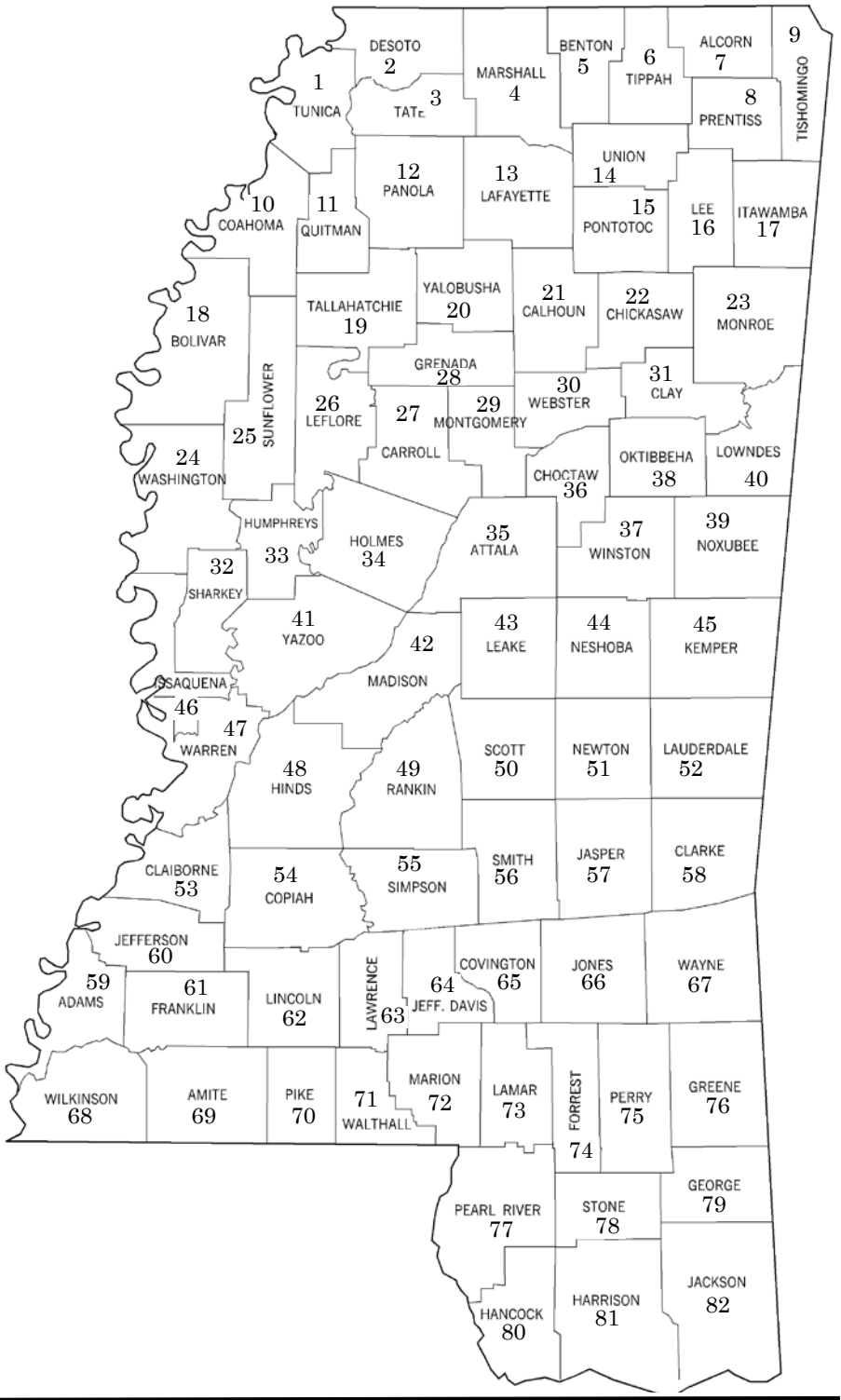





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Survey of 2019 MS Backwater Flood Helps Reveal 2020 Losses

A sharper focus on the economic impact of the lower Delta backwater flood of 2019 helps predict the implications of continued flooding this year.

Mississippi State University Extension Service researchers compiled data on the overlooked costs of the backwater flood that affected the Yazoo Mississippi Delta in 2019. They surveyed residents in the five affected counties in an attempt to quantify losses.

"These findings show a terrible cost, which can be repeated each time the area floods," said Nicolas Quintana-Ashwell, an economist at the National Center for Alluvial Aquifer Research and a researcher with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station who is based at the MSU Delta Research and Extension Center in Stoneville.

At its peak in May 2019, the Backwater Flood of 2019 flooded 548,000 acres, damaged hundreds of homes and closed three highways. The affected area includes all or part of Warren, Yazoo, Issaquena, Sharkey and Humphreys counties, and flooding impacted an estimated 20,000 people.

"We found a \$42,160 self-assessed loss per household in costs associated with the flood not covered by insurance or any assistance programs," Quintana-Ashwell said. "Additionally, 69% of workers reported a reduction in work productivity due to stress and fatigue associated with the flood."

The flood measured and quantified in 2019 continues in many places, so its economic impact is still growing. As of early May 2020, water accumulations in portions of the state's Delta region were again causing rivers to overflow, spilling over into an estimated 200,000 acres of farmland.

"Several thousand acres have been under water for over a year and a half in places," said Ben Lawrence, an agronomist with the MSU Extension Service.

sion Service. "In the areas affected by the continuous flooding, people are reliving 2019, which would have been unimaginable for two years in a row."

That means the economic impact numbers of the backwater flood that began in 2019 are growing with each month the flood persists.

The study of the 2019 backwater flood calculated an increased cost of \$3,217 per resident due to extra commuting distance and time, plus an average loss of \$5,183 per worker in missed time on the job.

Sandy Havard, Extension agent in Warren County, commented on the ongoing struggle with flooding in areas such as the highly populated area around Eagle Lake.

"A lot of people still live there, and if they did go back to their home, they had to get a permit to rebuild, and the house had to be at a certain elevation," said Havard, who is involved with the Warren County Long Term Recovery Committee. "That helped a lot in that area when the backwater flood came again this year."

"But some of those who moved away because of the flood in 2019

have not been able to move back because they don't have the money to rebuild," she said.

Emily Carter, Extension coordinator for Sharkey and Issaquena counties, said the intangible losses to the flood are harder to measure.

"Many people who had to move out of their homes for most of 2019 were just completing renovations and getting back into their homes when they were displaced again this year," Carter said. "That caused a sense of hopelessness in some residents, but it also has drawn our community closer together as neighbor helps neighbor."

This sense of caring is combined with resilience.

"Many families in the South Delta have been here for generations, and they will stay here, persevering through the hard times like their ancestors," Carter said.

Blueberry Growers Expect High Quality, Average Yield

The COVID-19 pandemic presented a new obstacle for Mississippi blueberry growers in 2020, impacting the labor force for the early-season varieties.

"A lot of growers are working through how to deal with harvest, packing and sales because of COVID-19," said Eric Stafne, Mississippi State University Extension Service fruit and nut specialist. "Labor was short for the Southern highbush hand harvest, but there seems to be adequate labor now that we are moving into rabbiteye harvest, which began the week of May 4."

Jeremy Edwards, co-owner of his family farm Great Southern Farms in Richton, is one of those growers. His crop is harvested by hand and with machinery. Unable to get enough people to hand-pick berries for the Southern highbush harvest, he mechanically harvested his 50-acre crop. He was hopeful he would have a full hand-harvest crew by mid-May for the 100 acres of rabbiteye bushes on the farm.

"Securing harvest labor has been our biggest obstacle this year," Edwards said. "We did start an online application process to cut down on exposure from and to other people. We still have walk-in customers to buy blueberries, but we're not sure yet whether it is more or less than usual. We also will pack call-in orders that can be picked up."

Edwards, who packs his berries and berries from several other area growers in an on-site facility, said applications for those positions are coming in slower than usual. However, he has adequate staff. With strict food safety and infection control policies already in place, the

farm has made minimal changes to the packing operation.

Edwards said he expects to have a high-quality, average harvest crop, which is what Stafne expects across the state.

"The crop condition and fruit quality are very good," said Stafne, who is also a researcher with the Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station in Poplarville. "Harvest started about 10 days earlier than last year, which seems to be a developing trend. But the recent rains and slightly cooler weather will slow down harvest to some extent."

Disease incidence has been low so far. Mummy berry and exobasidium occur every year at some level, and growers have already seen them. Growers also have noticed some insects, such as Blueberry gall midges, Stafne said.

"Spotted wing drosophila has not been a substantial problem yet this year, but we usually see more of that in June," he said.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture National Agricultural Statistics Service stopped reporting data on estimated Mississippi blueberry grower prices in 2018. Prices fluctuated between 2006 and 2017, but the trend remained relatively flat, said Alba Collart, an Extension agricultural economist.

Prices for fresh and processed berries ranged from \$1.31 per pound in 2006 to \$1.67 per pound in 2017 with a peak of \$1.98 per pound in 2008.

Stafne said he is unsure how COVID-19 will affect markets and prices.

"I suspect we may see more attempts at local sales, but there is still strong demand for the fruit," he said.
