Dairy Has Many Health Benefits

June is National Dairy Month and a great time to think about the many health benefits of dairy. Milk and dairy products are a primary source of calcium in our diet and provide many health benefits for people of all ages. We most often associate milk with improved bone health. While milk certainly is important to bone health, the benefits of milk go well beyond our bones. Calcium is also needed for heart muscles to contract, nerves to work properly, and for blood to clot. Consider the following benefits of dairy foods:

Bone Health: Calcium and vitamin D are essential to bone health. Adequate calcium helps build bone mass in children and adolescents,



and it helps slow bone loss associated with aging. Vitamin D is necessary for calcium to be absorbed in the gut. Both calcium and vitamin D are considered "nutrients of concern" by the Dietary Guidelines for Americans because they are frequently under consumed in the American diet. Milk naturally contains calcium, is fortified with vitamin D, and is a convenient and economical source for both nutrients.

Chronic Disease: Scientific studies link consumption of dairy foods to a lower risk of several chronic health problems. Consumption of dairy products, especially milk, is

associated with a lower prevalence of metabolic syndrome. Metabolic syndrome is a cluster of conditions including abdominal obesity, insulin resistance, elevated blood glucose, abnormal blood lipids such as triglycerides and cholesterol, and high blood pressure. Metabolic syndrome increases a person's risk for type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. Dairy foods, and particularly vogurt. are associated with a reduced risk of type 2 diabetes in adults. The intake of the recommended servings of dairy are also linked to a reduced rate of overweight and obesity in children.

Probiotics: Consumer interest in probiotics has been growing. Probiotics are living microorganisms known to have health benefits. Probiotics we consume contribute to the trillions of microorganisms, also known as "good bacteria," that make up the microbiome of our gut and are considered essential to our health and immune system. Examples of dairy products that contain probiotics are aged cheeses, such as cheddar or gouda; kefir, a probiotic milk drink; and yogurt. The refrigeration of dairy products helps maintain these probiotics.

Protein: Dietary protein is essential for growth in children; for repairing and maintaining body tissues; building enzymes, hormones, and antibodies; and maintaining acid-base and fluid balances. Milk contains two types of high-quality proteins, whey and casein. The whey and casein proteins in milk contain all the essential amino acids in enough amounts to support the many roles that proteins play in our bodies. The combination of highquality protein, fluid, and carbohydrate in milk also makes it an effective recovery drink for athletes after strenuous workouts. In addition. milk has been shown to be a more effective rehydration drink than sports drinks post-exercise.

Nutrient Synergy: In the nutrition world, there is a term called nutrient synergy. Nutrient synergy refers to the increased health benefit when nutrients are combined as compared to the impact of individual nutrients. Nutrients work synergistically to improve each other's absorption and the physiological impact they have on our body. In other words, nutrients work best together, not in isolation. Although milk and dairy products are most commonly recognized for the calcium and vitamin D they contain to support bone health, dairy products also contain protein, manganese, zinc, vitamin K, phosphorus, and magnesium. All these nutrients work together to maintain bone and overall health.

We know that milk and dairy products are an important part of our daily diet. But, how much milk should we drink? Children between 1 and 2 years of age should consume 2 to 3 cups of whole milk each day. Children aged 2 and above, and adults should consume 2 to 3 cups of skim or low-fat milk each day. As we enter the summer season, think of the many ways you can incorporate dairy foods into your daily diet.

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Commissioner's Policy Corner

Commissioner Andy Gipson Hosts Agriculture Technology Roundtable

On May 18, Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson hosted an Agriculture Technology Roundtable discussion with farmers, university officials, legislators and industry stakeholders at Mississippi State University's (MSU) Delta Research and Extension Center (DREC) in Stoneville.

"The future of agriculture, Mississippi's top industry, is driven heavily by the introduction and adoptions of new technologies," said Commissioner Gipson. "This roundtable provided us the opportunity to bring together various

stakeholders to discuss the vital role technology plays in agriculture and its importance to the industry and farmers' bottom lines."

Dr. Steve Martin, associate director of the MSU Extension Service and interim head of the Delta Research and Extension Center, opened with a brief overview of DREC. Panelists included Pete Nelson, executive director of AgLaunch in Memphis, Tenn., who discussed the AgLauch's efforts to grow ag tech startups and build collaborative farmer networks across the surrounding region. Dee Boykin of the Southern Soil & Plant Lab, LLC, in Yazoo City, discussed various agriculture tech-

nology practices used by farmers including aerial imagery, drones and variable rate applications, as well as the challenges faced by farmers with inadequate broadband access.

Dr. Alex Thomasson, department head of MSU's Department of Agriculture and Biological Engineering, discussed the importance of various technologies including precision ag, drones and robots, plant phenomics, and traceability and block chain. Dr. Edmund Buckner, dean and director of Land Grant Programs at Alcorn State University, gave an overview of the research that the university is conducting, specifically in the area of

specialty crops to increase yields and the global food supply. Division Director and Bureau Manager Joe Donavon with the Mississippi Development Authority's (MDA) Entrepreneur Center presented MDA's V-Quad program, an initiative that links together research universities, non-profit organizations and government entities in Mississippi to develop systems to develop technologies quickly.

"We heard real world examples of how farmers implemented technology to increase both yields and efficiencies. That means more food is produced while increasing profits for farmers. I appreciate those who were part of the important discussions during this busy time for our farmers. This roundtable was just the beginning of many discussions to come regarding the importance of technology in agriculture and its future role within the industry," said Commissioner Gipson.

Maple Cinnamon Milk Tea

- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 2 cinnamon sticks
- 1 tablespoon maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 black tea bags
- 2 cups boiling water

ground cinnamon

Combine milk and cinnamon sticks in a heavy bottom saucepan, bring to a low simmer and let steep for 5 minutes, discard sticks. Meanwhile, bring 2 cups water to a boil and add tea bags. Let steep 2-3 minutes, discard bags, Add maple syrup and vanilla to the steeped milk, stir to combine. Add tea to milk mix, stir to combine. Divide evening among mugs, garnish with a sprinkle of ground cinnamon. Serve

No-Churn Milk and Cookies Ice Cream

2 cups heavy whipping cream

- 1 (14 ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 cup whole milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups crushed chocolate chip cookies

Place cream in large mixing bowl and whip on high speed until soft peaks form. Gradually add milk and mix on low until well combined, followed by the sweetened condensed milk. Stir in about a third of the cookie crumbles. Transfer a third of the mixture to a large freezer-safe container and sprinkle a layer of cookies on top. Repeat layers ending with a top layer of cookie. Cover tightly with lid or plastic wrap and place in freezer for at least 6 hours or overnight.

Grilled Cheese Harvest Sandwich

- 2 slices multigrain bread
- 2 slices white Cheddar cheese
- 2 slices yellow Cheddar cheese
- 2 slices Black Forest ham, thinly sliced
- 10-12 apple slices, very thinly sliced (about 1/4 of a medium apple)
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard, divided
- 1 tablespoon butter, softened

Heat a nonstick or cast-iron skillet over medium heat. Spread Dijon mustard evenly on each slice of bread, then place 2 slices of white Cheddar on one slice. Place ham on top of cheese, distributing evenly. Add apple slices on top of ham layer, then finish with yellow Cheddar and remaining slice of bread. Spread top of bread with softened butter and place that side down in heated pan. Cook for approximately 4 minutes (if necessary, turn the heat down so the bread doesn't burn). While sandwich is cooking, spread remaining softened butter on top of bread. Flip sandwich over and cook another 3-4 minutes or until lightly browned.

Cheesy BLT Pasta Salad

1 1/2 cups penne pasta, uncooked

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 cup light mayonnaise

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1/2 cup fresh basil, coarsely chopped

1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

4 cups torn romaine lettuce

- 4 thick bacon slices, cooked and crumbled
- 2 cups cherry tomatoes, halved
- 4 ounces (about 1 cup) shredded sharp cheddar cheese

1 cup large croutons

Cook pasta according to package directions; drain well and set aside to cool. Stir together sour cream and next six ingredients until well blended. Toss cooled pasta, lettuce, bacon, tomato and cheese in large bowl; add sour cream mixture and toss to coat. Sprinkle with croutons and serve immediately.





Cogongrass Control

Cogongrass ranks as the world's seventh worst noxious weed and has been detected in 66 of Mississippi 82 counties. Cogongrass quickly invades areas of low management like abandoned fields, highway rights of way, utility rights of way, and commercial forest plantations by means of seed disbursement and movement of rhizomes

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC)/Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) continues to assist landowners in combating this noxious weed through its Control Demonstration Program. Through this program, MDAC provides herbicide to landowners in Mississippi at no charge. MDAC also provides treatment guidelines and spray options on how and when to apply the herbicide. MDAC staff participates in local meetings, training landowners and the general public on the identification of Cogongrass.

Landowners detecting Cogongrass on their property can apply to participate by submitting an application to BPI. The application can be found on the MDAC website at http://www.mdac.ms.gov/wp-content/uploads/bpi_plant_cogongrass.pdf, at your local Mississippi State University Extension Service office or your local USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service office.



Mississippi Land, Water and Timber Resources Board Announces **Approval of \$3.1 Million to Expand Meat Processing Capacity** in the State; Doubles Mississippi Meat Processing Capacity


The Mississippi Land, Water and Timber Resources Board (LWTRB) approved \$3.1 million in financial assistance to seven livestock processing facilities to increase their capacity following interruptions in the food supply chain due to the COVID-19 pandemic.


The Board, co-chaired by Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson and Executive Director of the Mississippi Development Authority John Rounsaville, approved funding to expand currently operating USDA-inspected processing facilities and construct new USDA-inspected facilities.

"Last May, when the pandemic was still new, I announced steps toward making Mississippi's food supply chain more resilient. We removed limits on the number of owners allowed per animal for custom slaughter. We created MSFarm-Marketplace.com to connect directly farmers and consumers to enhance farm-to-table supply lines. We provided guidance to farmers markets across the state so if they chose to remain open, they could operate safely. And, we invited meat processors in the state to submit applications to expand their operations. A year later, we have approved \$3.1 million to effectively double Mississippi's domestic meat processing capacity," Commissioner Gipson said.

The Mississippi LWTRB approved applications from seven processors.

- Attala Frozen Foods in Attala County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$611,110 to expand its USDA-inspected processing facility. The grant allows for the building construction and the purchase of equipment.
- Homestead Farm and Packing in George County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$49,700 to nurchase new equipment to increase the processing capacity of its USDA-
- Panola County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$494,745.80 and a loan in the amount of \$329,897.20 to construct a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchase equipment.
- Cutting Edge Meat Co. in Greene County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$350,000 to assist with the cost of constructing a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchasing equipment.
- A Cut Above Meat Processing and Market, LLC in Hancock County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$529,560 and a loan in the amount of \$353,040 to construct a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchase new equipment.





• Blue Sky RE, LLC in Rankin County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$304,385 to purchase a



USDA-inspected mobile processing unit and modular cut and wrap facility. This innovative mobile facility providing USDA-inspected slaughter on-site at Mississippi farms is the first of its kind in the state.

• Juniper Creek Farms, LLC in Pearl River County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$70,000 to construct an on-farm USDA-inspected poultry processing facility.

"The past year has been difficult for many industries in Mississippi, and agriculture is no exception," said MDA Executive Director John Rounsaville. "The intent of these loans and grants is to enhance

market opportunities for livestock producers and processors while simultaneously strengthening our agricultural economy."

The number of USDA-inspected facilities that provide slaughtering and processing services to the public will double. A new mobile processing unit, the first of its kind in Mississippi, will bring the slaughtering component direct to the farm. The increased number of facilities will provide additional opportunities for farmers and will potentially decrease the number of miles cattle must be transported.

"Expanded capacity in processing is a game-changer for local consumers and the livestock industry, and another step toward increasing access to local food. We want to ensure Mississippi has the necessary local food infrastructure to meet growing local demand, as well as guard against supply and distribution interruptions due to workforce and plant capacity challenges in other states. Through the expansion of currently operating USDA-inspected facilities and the construction of new USDA-inspected processing facilities, we are on track to more than double the livestock processing capacity in Mississippi," said Commissioner Gipson.
