Rice Approaches Harvest With Increased Prices

A crisis exemption that allowed Mississippi rice farmers to control fall armyworms helped them keep this year's crop in good condition as harvest approaches.

In late June and early July, farmers across the state growing multiple row crops, including rice, could not reach acceptable levels of control for fall armyworms with pyrethroids. This problem led Extension crop specialists to ask the Mississippi Bureau of Plant Industry to request a Section 18 crisis exemption from the Environmental Protection Agency for the insecticide Intrepid 2F. On July 28, it was granted.

"Fall armyworms have been much

worse this year than we have ever seen in rice, pastures, lawns and other crops, at least in my career," said Jeff Gore, Mississippi State University Extension entomologist and researcher, who is stationed at the Delta Research and Extension Center in Stoneville. "From a rice standpoint, we typically spray a small percentage -- less than 10% -- of the acres every year in Mississippi. This year we have probably already sprayed much more than 50% of rice acreage."

"Typically, we could get outstanding control of fall armyworms with a low to mid-rate of a pyrethroid insecticide. That is not happening this year. In most cases, even the highest labeled rate of a pyrethroid is not providing acceptable control," Gore said.

While some row crops have multiple alternative insecticide choices to treat fall armyworms, rice has only one: diflufenoxuron. With an 80-day preharvest interval, growers could

not use diflufenoxuron, as rice harvest begins in August.

The Specific Exemption is still under review, but growers can use Intrepid 2F until the EPA makes a final decision. If approved, growers can continue its use throughout the growing season. If a similar situation with fall armyworms occurs next year, the Bureau of Plant Industry will again need to apply for a Section 18 exemption.

Other farmers faced flooding.

"We are in relatively good shape outside the area impacted by flooding, despite the problems we had with armyworms" said Jason Bond, weed scientist with the MSU Extension Service and researcher with the Delta Research and Extension Center in Stoneville. "Our Extension specialists were able to get a pesticide exemption to help get them under control."

Flooding has impacted about 69,000 acres with estimated rice

crop damages of \$37.8 million, said Brian Mills, Extension agricultural economist in Stoneville. Bolivar County, the state's largest rice-producing county, accounted for 40,000 of those acres.

"The flooding caused some of the decrease in rice acres," Mills said. "Rice acres that were destroyed would likely not have been replanted to rice because it was so late in the year."

However, acreage was predicted to be down from 2020's 150,000 acres going into the planting season in March. High corn and soybean prices led farmers to plant these crops instead of rice, Mills said.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture National Agricultural Statistics Service estimated Mississippi rice growers would plant 110,000 acres, but Bond said he estimates acreage to be below 100,000 acres.

"That's just a windshield estimate from driving around the area looking at it. I don't think we have even 100,000 acres this year," he said, attributing the decreased acreage to flooding and citing the decision many farmers made to plant higher-priced crops.

Other than armyworms, rice growers have not had many issues with insects. Disease has not been a

major issue either, Bond said.

Crops are not quite ready for harvest, which takes place in August and September in Mississippi, Bond said.

According to USDA, by Aug. 9, 89% of rice is headed with just 5% mature. The report shows 70% of the crop is in good condition, 17% is in excellent condition, and 8% is in fair condition.

Will Maples, Extension agricultural economist, said farmers will see moderately better rice prices in 2021. For the week ending Aug. 6, the November rough rice futures contract was trading at \$13.66 compared to \$11.58 this time last year. USDA has projected the 2021 average farm long-grain rice price at \$12.80 per hundredweight compared to \$12.40 per hundredweight in 2020.

"Reduced supplies in 2021 due to an acreage reduction from last year are contributing to higher prices," Maples said. "Long-grain plantings were down 11% below last year primarily due to high corn and soybean prices we saw this spring."

Exports are forecast to be lower for the 2021-2022 marketing year because of reduced supply and less competitive U.S. prices, which may result in lowered prices, Maples said.

Savory Spinach & Rice Casserole

Vegetable cooking spray
3 cups cooked rice
2 cups Gruyere cheese, shredded
2 cups cooked ham, chopped
2 (12-oz.) packages frozen spinach soufflé, thawed
2 Roma tomatoes, thinly sliced

Coat a baking dish with cooking spray. In a large bowl, combine rice, cheese, ham, and spinach soufflé. Pour rice mixture into baking dish; top with tomato slices. Cover with foil and bake at 400° for 15 minutes; remove foil and bake an additional 15 minutes.

Chicken Rice Salad with Mangos & Cranberries

3 cups cooked medium grain rice
1 (6 oz.) package pre-cooked chicken strips cut into 1-inch pieces
3/4 cup dried cranberries
1 mango, chopped
3/4 cup chopped pecans, toasted
3/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
1/2 cup raspberry vinaigrette dressing
1/4 cup plus two tablespoons fresh chopped parsley, divided

In large bowl, combine rice, chicken, cranberries, mango, pecans, pepper, vinaigrette and 1/4 cup parsley. Toss well. Garnish with remaining parsley.

Creamy Country Vegetable Rice

1 cup long grain white rice, uncooked
1 can (14.5-oz) of chicken broth
1 can (12-oz) of evaporated milk
1 package (10-12-oz) of frozen mixed vegetables dried thyme
1 package (8-oz) of shredded sharp cheddar cheese
1/2 package (8-oz) of cream cheese, cut into small pieces
2 green onions, trimmed and finely chopped
salt (to taste)
pepper (to taste)

Combine the broth, milk, and frozen vegetables in a large saucepan. Bring to boil over high heat. Add the rice and sprinkle lightly with thyme. Return to a boil, reduce heat to low, cover and cook 15 to 18 minutes or until rice is tender. Remove from heat. Stir in the cream cheese, cheddar cheese, and onions. Gently stir until cheese has melted and well blended. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Makes 6 cups. Serves 6; 1 cup per serving.

2 cinnamon sticks
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

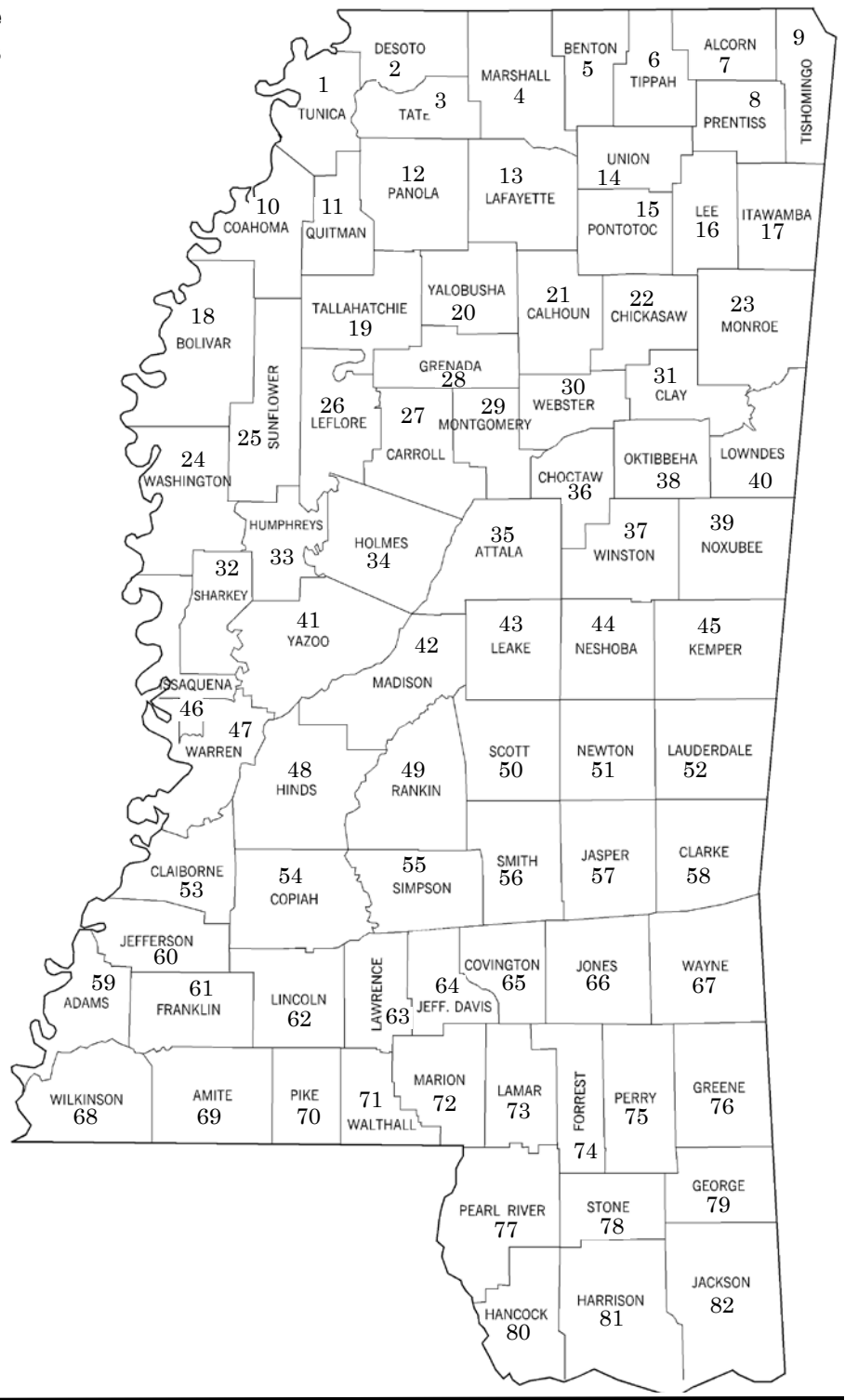

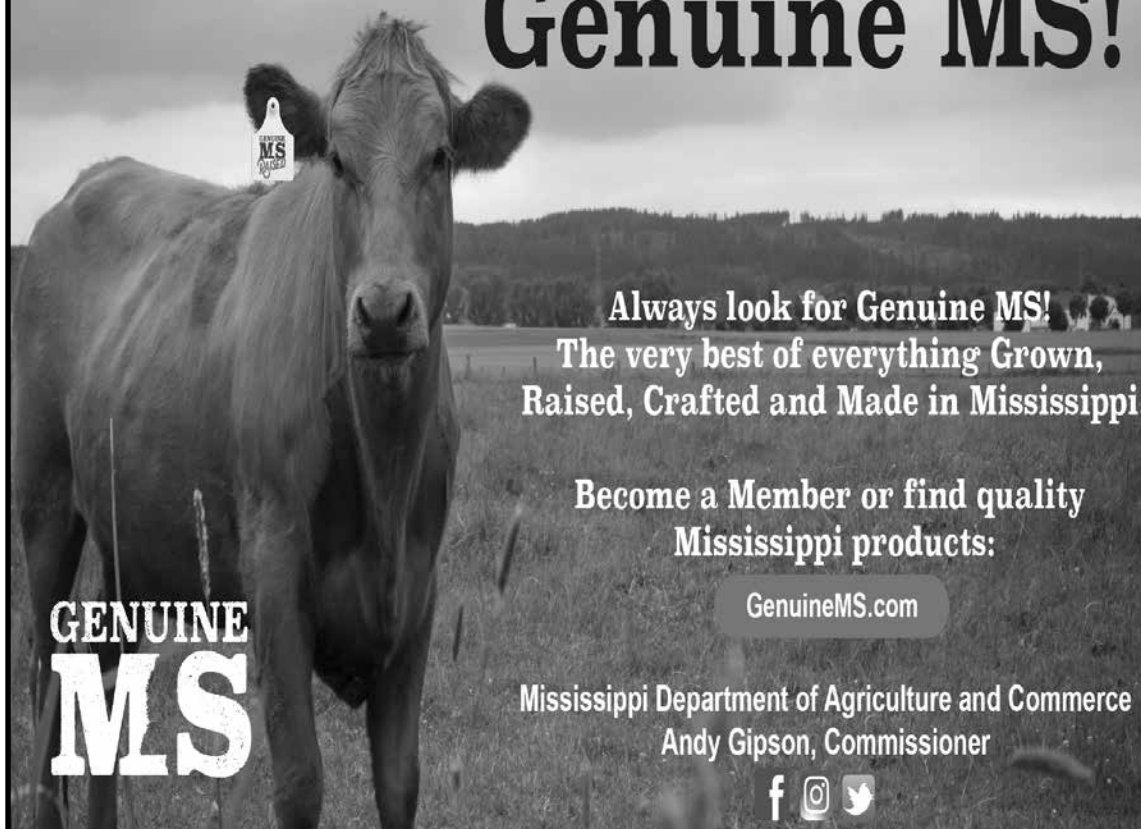

Healthy Deer Herds Start with Sound Science

For many landowners, leaseholders, and general deer enthusiasts, the pursuit of whitetails is more than pastime, it's a passion. Landowners and leaseholders concerned about the deer resource often find themselves simultaneously intrigued and frustrated by the same general question: am I doing the right thing to manage the deer herd where I hunt? Many hunters comb the internet and hunting magazines to satisfy their curiosity.

However, herd management questions on a specific tract of land can only be answered accurately and scientifically through the process of gathering local data and analyzing information. Fortunately, Mississippi hunters have an advantage. Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP) offers data analysis and management advice as a free service through the Deer Management Assistance Program (DMAP).

The model for DMAP was developed through a research partnership between MDWFP, Mississippi State University, and local hunting clubs in East Central Mississippi in the 1970s. Since that time the program expanded to include more than a thousand cooperators on over 3 million acres at its peak. The DMAP model initiated in Mississippi is currently



being used in more than a dozen other states.

DMAP is a partnership between cooperators, such as individual landowners or hunting clubs, and professional wildlife biologists. Cooperators collect data, such as deer antler measurements and body weights, from deer harvested during the hunting season. Biologists may also recommend other types of data collection such as deer observations while hunting or trail camera surveys. These data are analyzed in relation to other DMAP properties in a region or even across the state. Then biologists make recommendations to individual DMAP Cooperators based on their deer management goals and objectives.

DMAP is not intended to be a "big buck" program, though increasing antler quality is frequently a goal among DMAP cooperators. Rather it is intended to fit individual cooperators based on their specific goals and

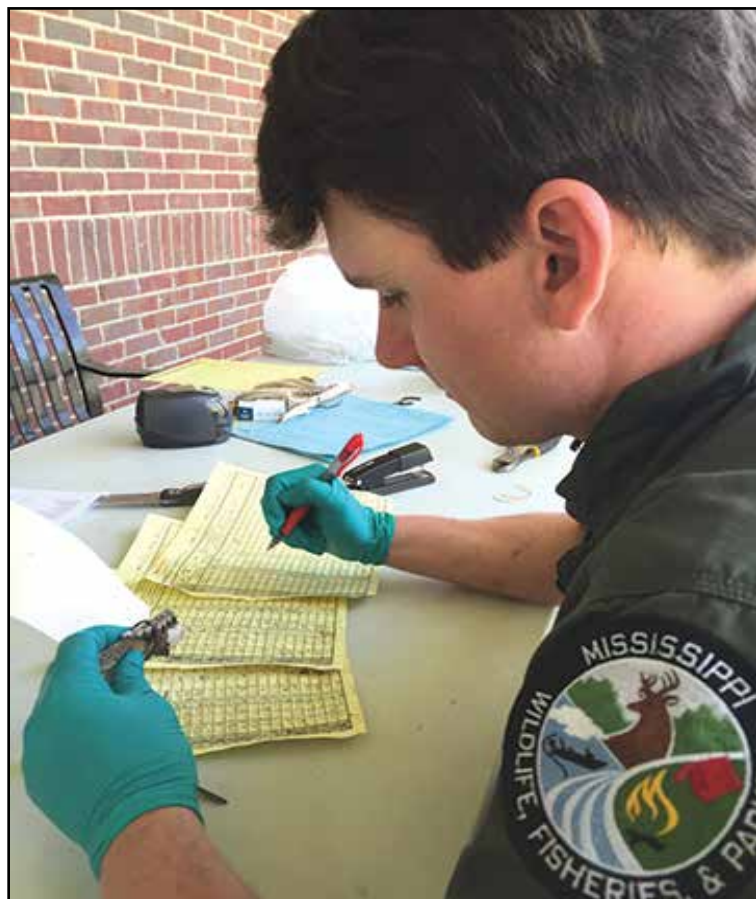
available resources.

Biologists commonly conduct field visits to discuss cooperator goals and objectives, evaluate habitat conditions, and make recommendations. Cooperators will receive reports and other services based on the quality of data they submit. Any size land holding may participate, though it can be difficult to analyze smaller datasets individually. As such, those with the ability to harvest at least 10 does per season tend to get the most benefits from harvest data collection. Those that harvest fewer deer may be encouraged to cooperate with nearby landowners to combine their harvest data for analysis. Regardless, cooperators often enjoy having biologists age their deer to help calibrate their ability to age bucks on the hoof. Most importantly DMAP can help refine how many does should be harvested each season to help balance herd density with the available habitat.

At a broader level MDWFP utilizes data collected by DMAP cooperators to assess the statewide deer herd. This data helps wildlife biologists follow population trends and make recommendations to other individual cooperators and may even influence the statewide deer season framework. To that end, MDWFP is actively seeking new DMAP cooperators across the state to help improve the extent of our dataset. "We need more clubs in North, Southeast, and East Central Mississippi," says William T. McKinley, Deer Program Coordinator.

McKinley notes, "We went through a period in Mississippi in the mid-1900s when deer were practically gone. Then, after the successful restoration efforts, we had a period of overabundant deer herds in many areas. Currently, we are to the point where we have a lot of regional variation in the statewide herd. We need a more extensive dataset now more than ever to help track that herd, and we can't do that without the support of hunters through DMAP."

Summer 2021 Seeing Large Advance of Fall Armyworms

Lawns, pastures and even winter food plots are at risk as an insect army advances across much of the state in higher than normal numbers.

Blake Layton, entomologist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said fall armyworms are the most damaging insect pests of bermudagrass hayfields and pastures. Armyworms attack golf courses and lawns, and they can defoliate an entire yard or field almost overnight.

"They are called fall armyworms because their numbers are highest in late summer and fall, and hay producers, cattlemen, turf managers and homeowners should expect to be dealing with this pest until frost," Layton said.

Armyworms do not overwinter in the state, and they arrive each summer when moths migrate back into the state from the Caribbean, Mexico and areas of South America.

"Severity and distribution of fall armyworm infestations depends on when moths arrive, how many moths arrive, where in the state they arrive and weather conditions they experience once they get here," Layton said. "In other words, it depends on how the wind blows."

Fall armyworms are caterpillars that reach about 1½ inches long at maturity. Their body color varies depending on their stage of development and diet. Most are green or tan, but some can be dark brown to almost black, especially late in the year. The body is punctuated with dark spots.

"Four spots at the rear of the body form a square. On larger specimens, there is a distinct white inverted 'Y' shape on the head," Layton said. "This 'Y' and the square of four spots on the rear are two of the best ways to identify fall armyworm caterpillars."

When they metamorphose into moths, they are about ¾ inch long when resting with their wings folded. Moths are active at night and spend the day resting in foliage.

Eggs hatch in two to five days, and the newly emerged larvae begin feeding on the underside of leaf blades. Their feeding habits result in tiny, white "windowpanes" in the leaf blades or a white frizzing of the leaf tips.

"Experienced cattle producers watch for this white frosting or frizzing of the leaf tips as an early warning of fall armyworm infestation," Layton said.

Damage caused by young caterpillars



is easy to overlook because fall armyworms do 80% to 90% of their feeding in the last two to three days of their life.

"By the time they are ¾ to 1 inch long, fall armyworm caterpillars are leaf-eating machines that rapidly consume large amounts of leaf area," Layton said. "Multiply the leaf consumption of a single caterpillar by the hundreds of thousands of caterpillars per acre that occur during heavy outbreaks, and it is easy to understand how fall armyworms can cause such rapid defoliation."

Rocky Lemus, Extension forage specialist, said a good hay field can produce a few hundred dollars' worth of hay per acre.

"Experienced cattlemen and hay producers learn to scout their fields every two to three days during periods when fall armyworms are a threat, and they have their spray equipment ready to go," Lemus said.

There are treatment options for lawns, pastures, fields and golf courses, but the key is vigilance and quick action when the pest is detected.

Lemus said that in hayfields and pastures, pyrethroids used alone often fail to control the caterpillars, but they are more successful when combined with a growth regulator. A better option may be to switch to a nonpyrethroid product.

"Producers need to pay attention to grazing and haying restrictions associated with the product used to treat their pasture and hayfields," Lemus said.

Well-established home lawns that are heavily damaged by fall armyworms will grow back, but homeowners can speed along the process with good watering, fertilizer and weed control. Both pyrethroids and nonpyrethroid products are available for lawns. Hose-end applicators work for small areas, while broadcast sprays work for large lawns.

"Granular treatments are not a good option for armyworms because the granules drop to the ground below the caterpillars," Layton said. "Use a spray."
