Peanut Yield, Prices Look Strong for 2021

Mississippi's peanut crop is well on its way to a strong finish for 2021.

"The crop is in good condition," said Brendan Zurweller, peanut specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "Although our acreage is down from last year, we should have close to the same average yield as last year."

Zurweller said he expects the state will average between 4,000 and 4,200 pounds per acre this

year. That is down slightly from the 2020 average of 4,400 pounds per acre, which was the best average yield on record for Mississippi peanut growers.

Mississippi growers planted 17,340 acres of peanuts, which is about 20% less than the acreage in 2020. Improved markets for other commodities and a late planting window contributed to the decrease in acreage.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture National Agricultural Statistics Service, 82% of peanuts are pegging -- or beginning to produce fruit -- and 5% have been dug as of Aug. 15. The report shows 62% of the crop is in good condition, 24% is in fair condition, and 8% is in poor condition. The remaining

6% is in excellent condition.

"In addition to later plantings and cool temperatures this year, wet weather throughout the early and middle part of the growing season slowed crop development in many areas of the state," Zurweller said.

In other areas of the state, fields could use a little rain, said Malcolm Broome, Mississippi Peanut Growers Association executive director. Peanut plants should completely cover the rows and row middles. Some fields have not reached this stage yet.

"Believe it or not, we have a spot or two in the state that is now dry," he said. "A half-inch to an inch of rain could make a lot of difference. We don't want it too wet. We don't need the rain to set in and stay, but a few show-



ers would help."

As harvest gets closer, growers need warm weather to keep maturity on track.

"One of the main management issues from here on out is to keep

disease pressure low," Zurweller said. "Also, cool weather in September could delay harvest maturity, and we're already running a little late. Maintaining late-season canopy health by reducing foliar disease will help prevent peanuts from having to be dug too early."

A strong yield is necessary to keep prices at their current projections, said Will Maples, Extension agricultural economist.

"Peanuts are currently facing strong, healthy demand, and we need a good-yielding crop to maintain pace," Maples said. "In the peanut market, the carryforward from year to year, or how many peanuts we have in storage, is an important economic indicator. Current carryforward projections for the 2021-2022 marketing year from the USDA are 1.13 million tons, which is up slightly from 1.08 million tons last year."

The projected national average farm price for peanuts is \$415 per ton, according to the USDA.

Commissioner Andy Gipson Announces Organic Certification Cost-Share Program

Commissioner Andy Gipson announced that the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) is currently offering a cost-share program for Mississippi organic producers and handlers receiving certification or continuation of certification by a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)

accredited certifying agent.

"This is a great opportunity for farmers that have received the USDA Organic Certification in the past year to help offset some of the costs associated with this certification," said Commissioner Gipson, "I am glad that we are able to offer this program again for 2021, and I encourage our farmers to take advantage of this opportunity."

Funding is available for those that received the certification between October 1, 2020, and

September 30, 2021. Individual organic operators are eligible for reimbursement of 50 percent of their fiscal year 2021 certification costs up to a maximum of \$500 per certification scope. The National Organic Certification Cost-Share Program currently recognizes the following certification scopes eligible for reimbursement: crops, wild crops, livestock, and handling (i.e., processing).

To be eligible for reimbursement, the following must be

provided to MDAC by applicants: proof of valid certification issued by a USDA accredited certifying agent, a reimbursement application form, an itemized receipt that identifies allowable costs paid within the qualification period, and an IRS W-9 form. Applicants must be Mississippi organic producers and handlers located within the State of Mississippi. Funds are available on a first-come, first-serve basis until the funds are depleted. Operations may receive one reimbursement per year. The deadline to submit applications is November 1, 2021.

Tasty Peanut Recipes



Peanut Butter Ball

1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened
1 1/2 cups powdered sugar
1 cup creamy peanut butter
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon (optional)

Coating:

1/2 cup mini chocolate chips
1/2 cup peanut butter chips
1/2 cup butterscotch chips

Add cream cheese to a large mixing bowl and with a handheld mixer until fluffy. Beat in peanut butter, powdered sugar, vanilla and cinnamon until very smooth. Drop mixture onto a large piece of plastic wrap, cover tightly and shape into a ball. Place in a freezer safe bowl and chill in the freezer for 1 1/2 hours, until firm enough to keep its shape. Add coating chips to a cutting board/parchment lined counter and give them a stir to mix then spread in an even layer. Remove cheese ball from freezer and roll in coating, pressing to adhere, until evenly coated. Place on desired serving dish, cover and freeze for 30 minutes or until ready to serve. If peanut butter cheese ball has been frozen for more than an hour, you'll need to thaw for about 30 minutes before serving. Serve with graham crackers. *Source: National Peanut Board.*

Peanut Butter Shortbread

1/4 cup creamy peanut butter
1/4 cup canola oil
1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
1 cup all-purpose flour

Lightly grease one round cake pans with spray. Set aside. In a medium-sized bowl, beat together the peanut butter, oil, sugar and vanilla; beat in the flour. The mixture may seem a little dry at first; keep beating till it comes together. If it absolutely won't come together, dribble in up to 1 tablespoon of water, until it does. Place in pan and press out dough. Use a fork to prick the dough all over; this allows any steam to escape, and prevents the shortbread from bubbling as it bakes. Bake at 300° until it's a light golden brown across the top, and a deeper golden brown around the edges, about 35 minutes. Remove from the oven, and immediately turn out onto a clean work surface. Using a pizza wheel or sharp knife, cut each round into 6 wedges. *Source: National Peanut Board.*

Peanut Butter Apple Oatmeal Muffins

2 cups old fashioned rolled oats
1 teaspoon baking powder

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 large eggs
1 1/2 cups milk of your choice
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
1/4 cup pure maple syrup
3/4 cup peanut butter
1 cup finely diced green apple (peeled)

Line muffin tin with 12 liners or grease 12 cups with coconut oil or butter. In a large bowl, combine the oats, baking powder, cinnamon and salt. Set aside. In a separate bowl, lightly beat the eggs. Add the milk, vanilla and maple syrup and whisk to combine. Add the peanut butter and whisk until combined. Add the apple and stir in. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ingredients and whisk until everything is well combined. Fill muffin liners evenly with the mixture. Bake at 375° for 30-40 minutes, or until browned and fully cooked. *Source: National Peanut Board.*

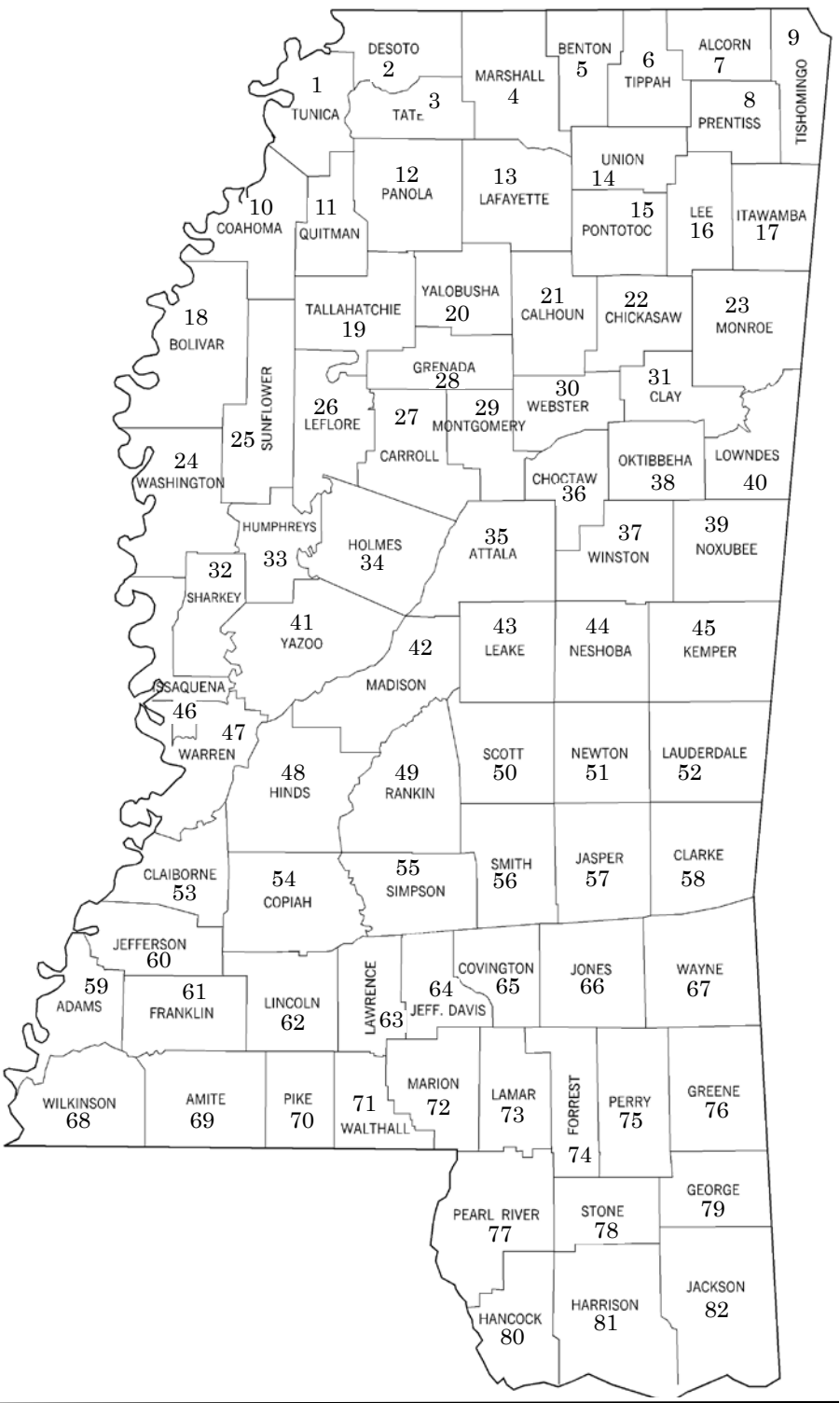

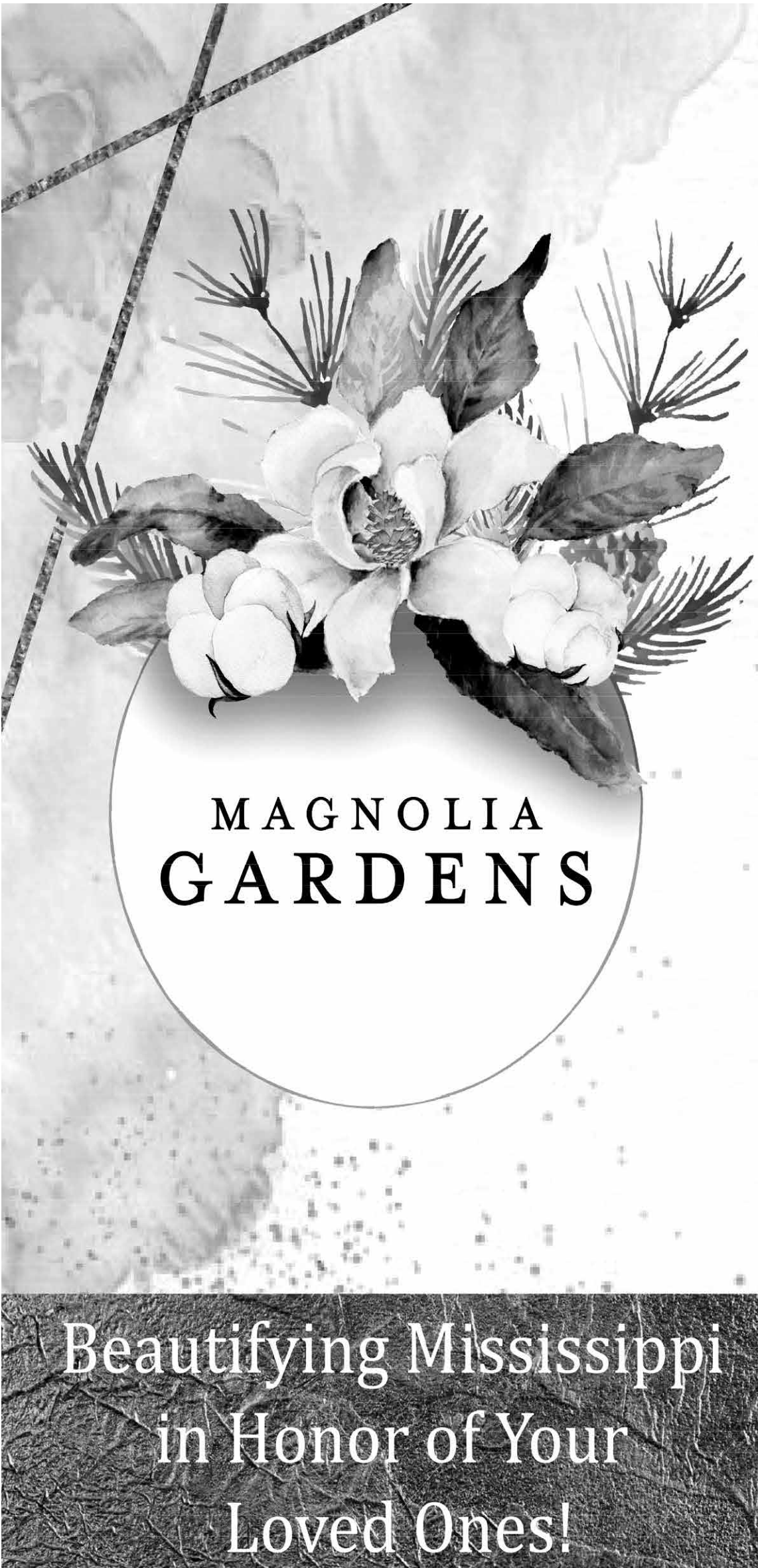

The Importance of Breakfast for Students

School is back in session, and whether your student is distance learning or in-person, a balanced breakfast sets them up for academic success. When students eat a healthy breakfast, they have improved concentration, better test scores, and fewer behavior issues. Studies show that students who eat breakfast the morning of a standardized test have significantly higher spelling, reading, and math scores than those who skip it. Breakfast is vital for preschool and elementary students. Younger children, whose brains are quickly developing, use about half their body's energy every day. Allowing them time to eat a morning meal ensures they have the nutrients needed to learn and thrive.

The benefits of breakfast are for parents, too. Breakfast is considered 'the most important meal of the day,' and for a good reason. As the name implies, breakfast breaks the overnight fasting period. Eating a balanced meal within ninety minutes of waking replenishes glucose supply to boost energy levels and alertness while also providing other essential nutrients required for good health. But, in our fast-paced culture, breakfast is the most skipped meal of the day by adults and children.

Your first meal of the day should nourish your mind and body by including three of the five food groups to offer lasting energy that keeps you satisfied. Foods that strengthen mental stamina include whole grains, fruits, vegetables, and real milk, essential for living well with 13 nutrients in every glass. Foods that fight against mid-morning hunger include lean proteins, nuts, seeds, calcium-rich yogurt, and cheese. A balanced breakfast may sound like something hard to achieve on a school morning, but it doesn't require a made-to-order, hot meal.

Make breakfast nutritious and straightforward by serving Greek yogurt parfaits, homemade smoothies, or peanut butter on whole-wheat toast with a banana. Good ole' cheese toast or a toasted English muffin with breakfast ham and cheese is always a crowd-pleaser. Pair pre-packaged granola bars, trail mix, or muffins with a glass of real milk which provides multiple benefits in every 8-oz serving. On the weekend, prepare a variety of heat and go, morning meal options. The whole family will enjoy easy-to-make and take breakfast burritos, breakfast power muffins, or Blueberry Buttermilk Muffins.

Blueberry Buttermilk Muffins

Ingredients

2 cups whole-wheat flour
 1/4 cup ground flax meal
 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 4 tablespoons unsalted butter (at room temperature)
 1/2 cup light brown sugar
 2 large eggs
 3/4 cup buttermilk
 1/2 cup plain Greek yogurt
 1 tablespoon vanilla
 1 tablespoon lemon zest
 1 1/2 cups fresh blueberries

Instructions

1. Pre-heat oven to 350°.
2. Mix together first five dry ingredients and set the mixture aside. In a separate bowl, beat 4 tablespoons room-temperature butter with brown sugar until creamy. Add 2 large eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add buttermilk, yogurt, vanilla and lemon zest. Mix again until well blended. It's alright if the batter looks a bit curdled. Add the flour mixture, beating on low speed just until the batter is smooth.
3. Gently fold in blueberries by hand until well mixed. Grease a muffin tin or use liners. Scoop the batter into the prepared muffin cups, using a heaping 1/4 cup for each; a muffin scoop works well here. Sprinkle each muffin with a bit of coarse sugar, such as raw/turbinado, if desired.
4. Bake at 350° for 20-25 minutes, or until a cake tester/toothpick comes out clean when inserted into the center.
5. Remove from the tin and place on cooling rack to avoid steaming the bottoms of the muffins.
