Meanwhile, from the most recent *Topsoil & Tractor Review* (imagined), having “good taste”



means that farmers markets across Mississippi are full of good stuff that “taste good!” There is just something so reassuring about eating food that comes from right here in Mississippi. Maybe it’s the freshly shucked corn, the long-awaited vine ripened tomatoes, plump blueberries, juicy watermelons, and a kaleidoscope of peppers, peas and potatoes. It might be the sweet and savory of honey and dairy products that are so abundant across the state. Or, possibly, it is the comforting enjoyment of a loaf of just baked bread with sweet butter and freshly made jam. And then there’s that jar of pickles tangy enough to make your eyes water! These offerings and more of this great state’s bounty are easy to find at your local farmers market.

“Now more than ever, it’s im-

portant to support our Mississippi farmers and producers. As the world faces shortages, consumers are looking for fresh produce and groceries that are locally sourced, and there’s no better place than a local farmers market,” said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. “Find a market near you on our website at www.mdac.ms.gov/farmers-market and support our farmers as they continue to provide for us all.”

So, what constitutes a farmers market? *A market or group of stalls and booths where farmers and sometimes other vendors sell their products directly to consumers*; this is the definition of a farmers market, according to *Random House* dictionary. But to those who shop at a farmers market and to the growers who

provide the fresh fruits and vegetables, a farmers market is much more than tables and open space. It’s a place where consumers can establish a relationship with their local growers; a place where you can be sure that the food you are buying and serving is safe—how it was grown and where it was grown. For the growers, a farmers market provides an important supplemental source of farm income and a satisfying alternative for selling their wares...and they get to see the smiling and appreciative faces of those who buy from them.

Most Mississippi Farmers Markets offer more than fresh, just-picked produce, so make sure your excursion to goodness includes the whole market. You just never know what treasure you might discover! Shoppers can regularly

find delectable baked goods, eggs, milk and cheese, beautifully golden honey, and specialty foods such as jellies, jams and salsas. Many markets have vendors who offer gulf-caught shrimp, and meat products such as beef and pork. Look for an array of colorful fresh flowers and plants, and don’t forget the charming and interesting works from local artisans.

Whether you formulate a plan of action for your trip to the market and strictly adhere to it, or if you would rather stroll happily from stall to stall, please keep in mind a few tips:

Know what is in season so you are not looking for watermelons in February.

Try new things – that curious kohlrabi is delicious, plus in its pure form, it makes an outstanding centerpiece. Get to know your farmers as well as the other vendors – ask questions. Go early for goods before they sell out or go late for the best deals.

Take a big sturdy bag to hold all your goodies, but above all, just enjoy your visit at your local farmers market!

Currently, there are more than 8,600 farmers markets in the United States. Of that total, Mississippi is home to approximately 100 across the state.

Big or small, new or long established, housed inside a structure or set up outside, Mississippians embrace their farmers markets. Why not include an exploration of your local farmers market on your next outing? Mississippi Farmers Markets have Good Taste!

Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund Passes Legislature

Mississippi House Bill 606, creating the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Trust Fund, was signed into law in April 2022. This historic conservation program paves the way for Mississippi to take advantage of tens of millions of dollars in additional investments for our great outdoors.

The House and Senate agreed to provide \$10 million for the Trust Fund's initial first year of implementation. While future funding of the program is uncertain, this initial funding will help draw down additional federal dollars that will help improve outdoor recreational areas across the state, support access to public lands and waters, restore habitat for wildlife, provide clean water for surrounding communities, and increase conservation on working farms and forests.

President of the Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Coalition, Ed Penny, said "Passing this legislation is a monumental achievement for Mississippi. It took Georgia nearly 10 years to get a similar program enacted, but in Mississippi, we were able to get it done inside of two years. I think that speaks to the passion of our state's leadership and their understanding of the importance of our great outdoors and the economic driver that that it is. We are pleased with the



program's establishment, and we look forward to getting started on conservation work that preserves state's special places for the next generation."

An independent board comprised of professional experts in conservation will develop a competitive project selection system to prioritize investments throughout the state to achieve the greatest conservation return. This program will also promote innovative public-private partnerships by allowing local governments, state & federal agencies, and charitable conservation organizations to participate in collaborative project proposals.

"Ask anyone that's using public land, whether that's Mathews Brake, Holly Springs National Forest, or the Pascagoula River WMA

– they'll tell you that there are needed investments on those lands that will improve the property, the wildlife habitat it provides and the overall experience for the visitor. The same goes for our communities that would love a park, walking trail or natural area but might not have all the resources needed to see that become a reality. It is going to be exciting to see Mississippi begin to tackle those very opportunities across the state, which will prove to be beneficial to our natural resources and outdoor recreation. We've called Mississippi the capitol of the outdoors for a reason. Now we can begin to show exactly why, said Alex Littlejohn, State Director of The Nature Conservancy."

The next step in the process is to establish the Board of Trustees of the Mississippi Outdoor Stew-

ardship Trust Fund which is expected to happen sometime in the next few weeks. Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson will serve as an ex officio member of the board.

This historic legislation is a huge win for all Mississippians and will secure the future of Mississippi's outdoors. The Mississippi Outdoor Stewardship Coalition and its numerous partners and supporters will continue their efforts in the next legislative session to continue to promote and secure dedicated funding for conservation and outdoor recreation.

Fresh Farmers Market Recipes!



Oven-Fried Okra

1 quart fresh okra, sliced 1/4 - 1/2-inch thick
1 cup cornmeal
Butter-flavored nonstick cooking spray
Salt and pepper, to taste

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a large bowl, sprinkle okra with cornmeal, tossing to coat. Spread on a baking sheet that has been coated with nonstick spray. Lightly coat okra with nonstick spray, and season with salt and pepper. Bake for 45-50 minutes, stirring occasionally, until golden brown. *Source: FarmFlavor.com.*

Zucchini Fritters

1 1/2 lbs. zucchini
1 tsp salt
1/2 cup chopped scallions
1/2 cup chopped fresh dill
1/2 cup crumbled feta
1 large egg
1/2 cup all-purpose flour
1/2 tsp baking powder
1/4 tsp fresh nutmeg
2 tablespoons olive oil

Place salted zucchini in a strainer, and using your hand or a spatula, press down firmly to remove as much water as possible. Pat dry with a few paper towels. To make the batter: Place the grated zucchini in a bowl, adding dill, scallions, feta, nutmeg and one

egg. Mix well. In a separate bowl mix flour and baking powder together. Add flour mixture to zucchini, incorporating all. In skillet, heat 1-2 T olive oil or butter over medium heat. When the oil is hot, spoon ping-pong sized balls of the batter. Lightly sear each side until golden brown about 3 minutes each side, and place in a warm oven. Make these in batches, letting fritters finish at least 10 minutes in the oven, or until they puff slightly. *Source: FeastingatHome.com.*

Country Potato Salad

2 pounds small potatoes, preferably heirloom
1 cup celery, chopped
2 ounces smoked ham, sliced into strips
1/4 cup parsley, chopped fresh
2 tablespoons chives or scallions, chopped fresh
2 tablespoons mint or dill, chopped fresh
3/4 cup nonfat buttermilk
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 tablespoon peanut or canola oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 large eggs, hard-boiled, peeled & coarsely chopped
Freshly ground pepper, to taste

Place potatoes in a large saucepan, cover with water and bring to a simmer over medium-high heat. Reduce heat to medium and cook, partially covered, until just tender, 12-20 minutes, depending on their size. Drain and let cool for about 15 minutes. Once the potatoes are cool enough to handle, taste a bit of potato skin; if it is bitter or tough, peel the potatoes. Otherwise, leave the skins on. Cut the potatoes into

bite-size pieces and put them in a large salad bowl. Add celery, ham, parsley, chives or scallions, and mint or dill to the potatoes. Toss to combine. Add buttermilk, lemon juice, oil, salt and pepper; stir to combine. Gently stir in chopped egg. Serve at room temperature or chilled. *Source: WebMD.*

Old-Fashioned Blueberry Fruit Crumble

2 1/2 cups fresh blueberries
1 tablespoon granulated sugar
3 tablespoons whole-wheat or all-purpose flour, divided
1 tablespoon orange juice
1/2 cup rolled oats
1/4 cup almonds or pecans, chopped
3 tablespoons brown sugar
1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
2 tablespoons canola oil

Preheat oven to 400° F. Combine blueberries with granulated sugar, 1 tablespoon flour and orange juice. Divide among four 6-oz. ovenproof ramekins. Combine oats, nuts, brown sugar, the remaining 2 tablespoons flour and cinnamon. Drizzle with oil and stir to combine. Sprinkle over the fruit mixture. Place ramekins on a baking sheet. Bake until the fruit is bubbling and the topping is golden, 20-25 minutes. Let stand for at least 10 minutes before serving. *Source: WebMD.*

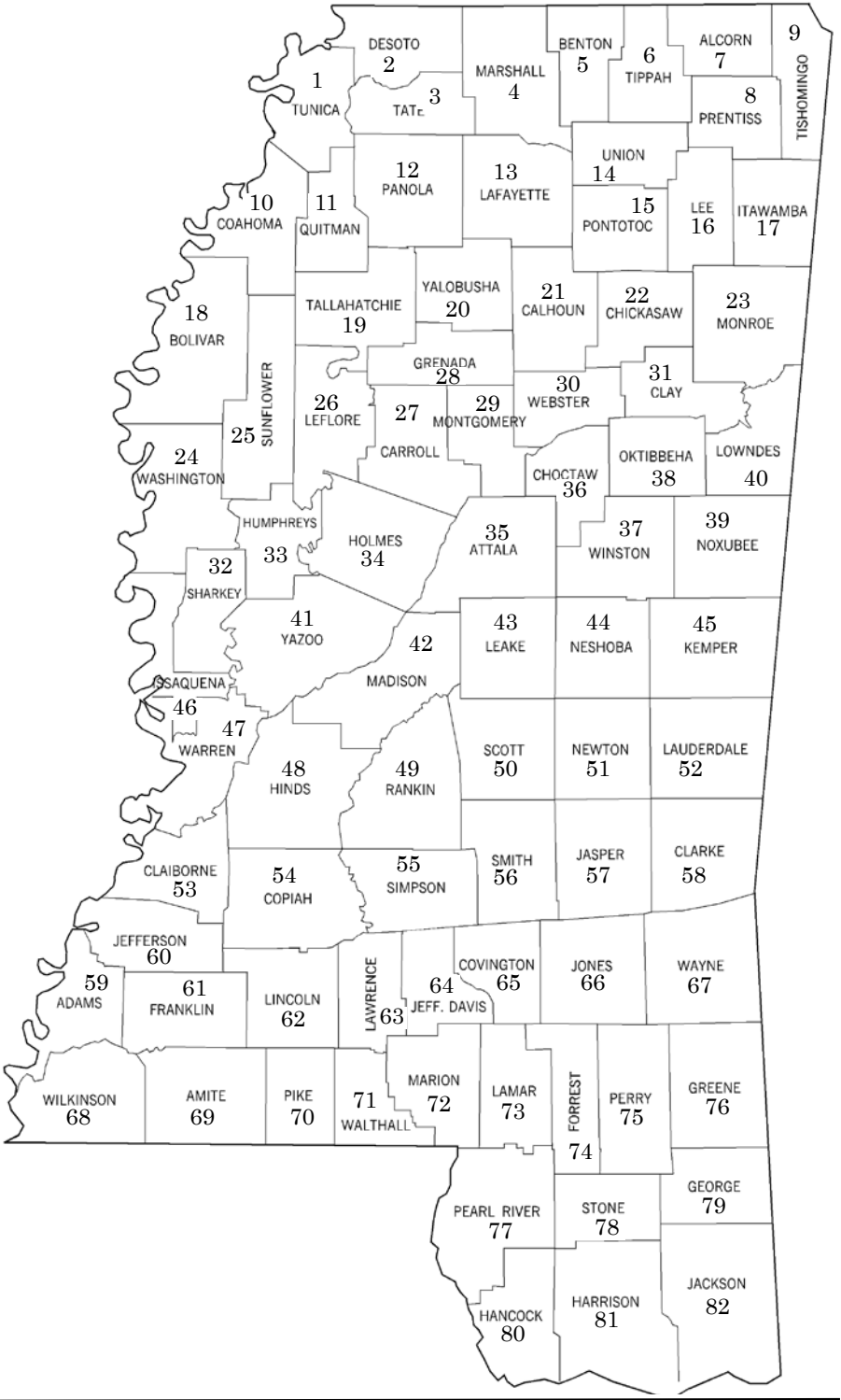



All livestock brands which are registered within the state **must be re-registered by June 30, 2022**, in order to be a valid brand. Anyone who has not received a Livestock Brand renewal notice should call Brandie Bairfield, the State Brands Registrar, at 601-359-1121 or 1-800-678-2660.
The registration fee for a five year period is \$5.00.

Mississippi Code 69-29-105 outlines the process for registering or transferring a livestock brand and the penalty for branding livestock with a brand which has not been registered.

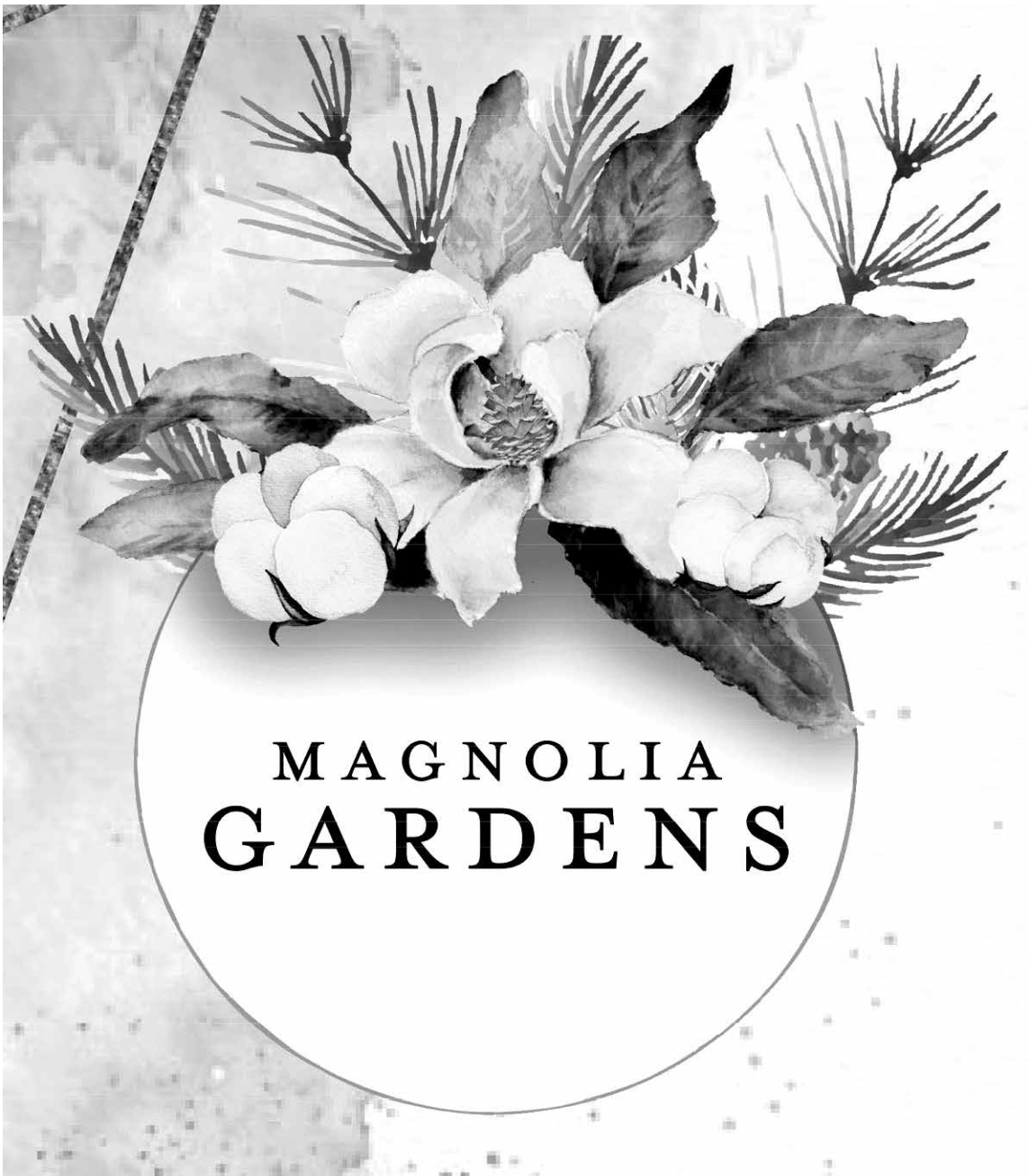

Mississippi Coliseum Turns 60 Years Old

The Mississippi Coliseum is one of the most recognizable and revered landmarks of our state. Sitting on 103 acres, the Mississippi Coliseum is located on the Mississippi State Fairgrounds in downtown Jackson between the State Capitol and the Pearl River. June 3, 2022, marks the 60-year anniversary of the dedication for the Mississippi Coliseum.

In the early 1960s, Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Si Corley wanted to achieve one of his goals of “Selling Mississippi to Mississippians,” and he was given the opportunity to do just that with

the opening of the Mississippi Coliseum. One way he wanted to achieve this goal was to build a venue in the capital city that was large enough to hold any statewide event.

Commissioner Corley, along with Mississippi Cattlemen’s Association President Dorris Ballew and other ag leaders, submitted a resolution for such a facility to be erected. It was brought before the state Senate, where it passed and was signed into law by Governor J.P. Coleman. This bill allocated \$2,750,000 in bonds for the Coliseum to be built. A bond issue was then passed by the city of Jackson, giving the Coliseum an additional \$1,500,000. The total cost of this project was an astronomical \$4,250,000, which is equivalent to

\$37,582,102.60 in today’s currency.

Since 1962, this towering landmark has been home to rodeos, livestock shows, concerts, comedy shows, circuses, monster truck rallies, wrestling matches, basketball games, contests, crusades, worship nights, conferences, and so much more. It was a gargantuan undertaking in Mississippi’s history, and eventually boasted of fully equipped livestock barns, equine stalls, multiple arenas, and trade halls.

The coliseum stands the height of a ten-story building and covers two and half acres of land. It has stood the test of time, as a place of refuge during hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, ice storms, and other natural disasters for the citizens of Missis-

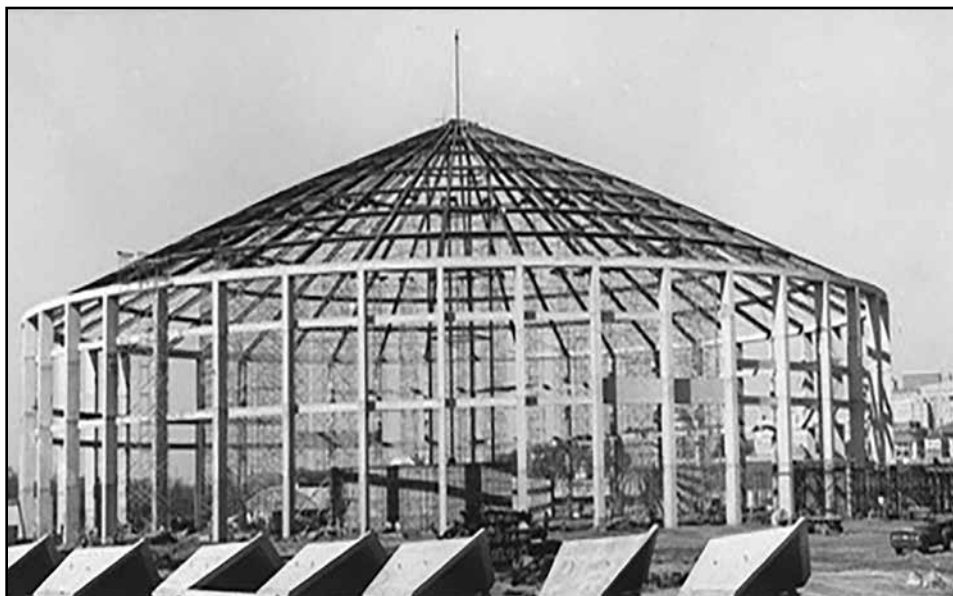
sippi.

“For 60 years, the Mississippi Coliseum has served as a hub for activities taking place at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds. The array of events held at this landmark over time has brought countless visitors to the Fairgrounds from all walks of life. The Coliseum is more than just an event center. For some people, the Coliseum brings back memories of attending a first rodeo or concert, and the Coliseum is a reminder of high school graduation day for many. The Coliseum served a place of refuge and shelter during and after Hurricane Katrina as evacuees from the coast were trying to figure out their next move. I am proud of the recent renovations to the Coliseum that will allow Missis-

sippians to continue using it,” said Commissioner Andy Gipson.

In July 2020, Commissioner Andy Gipson completed the renovation of the Mississippi Coliseum. This was a \$2.2 million project that included repairing and painting the floors, installing new seating, and adding handrails and reflectors. It has permanent seating for 6,500 people but has a maximum occupancy of 10,000 people. The updated Mississippi Coliseum flows seamlessly into the new Trade Mart building, which was completed in October 2020.

The updates to the Mississippi Coliseum do not take away from the history of the building. Instead, they add features of safety and conveniences, while improving the aesthetics.
