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Get Them Eating: The Importance of Getting Newly Weaned or Received Calves on Feed

Spring means weaning time for fall calving herds and can be a stressful time of year for both people and cattle. Starting new cattle, whether they be newly weaned or freshly received, into a stocker operation, can often be a challenge. An important goal during this time should be to get calves started on feed quickly and eating well. Management of their diets can have long-term impacts on performance.

The receiving phase offers unique



nutritional challenges as compared to other phases of a calf's life. Proper nutritional management during this phase is critical to ensuring success and profitability. These calves are often stressed upon arrival or after weaning and will likely have low feed and water intake for several days. Some calves may even be naïve to feed, hay, or even water troughs, and calves should be carefully observed during this time.

Due to their low feed intake, receiving diets should be formulated to be highly palatable, stimulate intake, and provide a more concentrated source of key nutrients.

Some guidelines to follow include:

1. Provide access to clean fresh water. Water is an essential nutrient and should be readily accessible. Be sure that water troughs are free of mold and algae growth. Consider the fact that calves may be accustomed to drinking from ponds or streams and may not immediately recognize an automatic waterer. Unless cattle have

been previously exposed, a ball waterer is not recommended for weaning or receiving.

2. Provide access to free choice hay. Calves will likely be able to easily recognize and consume hay. They should have access to good quality grass hay to stimulate proper rumen function.

3. Provide palatable feed with greater concentrations of nutrients. On average, feed intake of newly received calves is low. Because of this, diets for calves starting on feed should be formulated both to maximize intake and provide greater concentrations of required nutrients. Receiving diets must be highly palatable, stimulate intake, provide acceptable levels of critical nutrients and minimize the potential for nutritional disorders. Generally, receiving diets containing more than 55 percent concentrate can lead to digestive problems, resulting in higher medication costs.

4. Formulate diets based on age and size of calf. Diets should be for-

mulated so the calf receives at least maintenance requirements for protein, vitamins, and minerals when feed consumption is 1.0 to 1.5 percent of body weight. Lightweight (350 pounds or less) and early weaned (weaned at or before four months of age) calves may need more nutrient dense diets than larger, later-weaned calves. These lighter calves require a higher percentage of protein and a good source of digestible energy in their diets than do larger calves.

5. Be mindful of protein source. The source of protein is also critical in receiving diets. Non-protein nitrogen (NPN; such as urea) is not recommended in receiving diets for calves less than 600 pounds and should be avoided altogether for feeding lightweight calves. Plant protein sources such as soybean meal, cottonseed meal, and alfalfa are acceptable protein supplements for these calves.

6. Offer a good quality mineral. Providing proper mineral supplementation is an essential component of a

good nutritional program for calves. Phosphorus levels are typically low on forage-based diets, and in addition to sodium and chloride (NaCl or Salt), phosphorus is a key mineral to supplement to balance the diet. Trace minerals such as zinc and copper, along with vitamins A and E, are also important in meeting the nutritional needs of calves.

7. Place feed and water along the boundaries of pens. Calves initially walk the boundaries of their new pens searching for a way to escape. Placing feed bunks and water troughs along the fence lines of receiving pens as opposed to in the center of the pens increases the frequency of calves walking past the bunks and troughs.

8. Provide adequate feed bunk and water trough space. Timid calves may not receive sufficient shares of feed if bunk space is limiting. At least 12 linear inches of bunk space per head is recommended for incoming cattle. A good guideline is to provide 18 to 24 linear inches of bunk space per calf.

9. Be consistent with feed deliveries. Feed cattle approximately the same time each day to establish a routine, consistent eating time. Twice-a-day feedings can be worthwhile the first two to three weeks of the receiving period for highly stressed, young, or lightweight cattle. Sick calves may be slow to come to the feed bunk, so it is useful to observe feeding behavior to help identify potential health problems.

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Commissioner's Policy Corner

Highlighting Mississippi Products on the World Stage

We all depend on the American farmer for survival. We are blessed to live in Mississippi with a strong agricultural economy where our farmers produced a record \$9.7 billion in agricultural and forest products last year. While we continue to see an increase in local demand for agricultural products, access to global markets remains important for the growth of our state's largest industry, especially given that 96 percent of the world's population lives outside of the United States. In Mississippi, about one out of every three acres of production is bound for international markets which are critical for Mississippi farmers, ranchers, landowners, and for Mississippi's economy.

I recently promoted Mississippi's agricultural, food, and forest products in the Dutch, Scandinavian, and surrounding markets in Europe. It was my honor to represent Mississippi in the first USDA Agribusiness Trade Mission in the Netherlands led by USDA Under Secretary for Trade and Foreign Agricultural Affairs Alexis M. Taylor. We were joined by commissioners and secretaries of agriculture representing three other states, along with U.S. agribusinesses and farm organizations including the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation.

We met with key Dutch government officials and industry groups to discuss expanding economic part-

nerships between the U.S. and the Netherlands and markets throughout Europe. One highlight was the visit to the Port of Rotterdam, Europe's largest seaport. A variety of agricultural and forest products from Mississippi are shipped through the Port of Rotterdam including sustainable wood pellets for fuel from the Port of Pascagoula. Year-to-date Mississippi shipped more than six times the amount of wood pellets to the Netherlands as the entire year of 2022, due in part to increasing European demand for wood pellet fuel because of the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

The Dutch and Northern European importers, retailers, and consumers recognize U.S. agricultural, food, and forest products for quality, reliability, and sustainability. The Netherlands is already an important U.S. trading partner, and I foresee the Netherlands increasing as a trading partner for the State of Mississippi. Some specific products of interest are forest products, sweet potatoes, soybeans, beef, and poultry.

While the Netherlands is a small country, it is the largest importer within the European Union and considered the gateway for U.S. products. The top U.S. agricultural import into the Netherlands is sweet potatoes, and I was thrilled to learn some of the sweet potatoes in their retail markets were grown right here in Mississippi. Mississippi is the third-largest sweet potato producing state in the country, and we have an opportunity to expand that market through

exports.

Europe craves sustainable forest products for fuel and construction; but they oppose reduction of forests for development or other agricultural purposes. For us in Mississippi, sustainability is part of the business model. For each tree harvested in Mississippi, we replant at least three trees on average. We have more forested land today than forty years ago. We thin our forests to keep them healthy, and the products from thinning and harvesting our timber do not result in the loss of any forest acres. We're seeing export increases in part due to our sound forest management. In 2022, Mississippi only exported \$1.18 million of total agricultural products (mostly forest products) to the Netherlands. In the first two months of 2023 alone, Mississippi has already exported more than \$6 million of forest products to the Netherlands. We have an overabundance of southern yellow pine and hardwoods in Mississippi and this market will continue expansion.

I look forward to continuing our efforts and strengthening the relationships built during this trade mission for Mississippi's agricultural, food, and forest products. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce is partnering with the Southern US Trade Association (SUSTA) to host an inbound trade mission for forest products in 2024. Vetted, qualified buyers from multiple countries will visit Mississippi to learn about our timber industry and conduct

business-to-business meeting with producers. This follows the success of MDAC's 2022 Mississippi Timber International Trade Mission with buyers from Mexico, Dominican Republic, Great Britain, Spain, and Vietnam which resulted in sales of \$7 million the week of the event.

Mississippi's strong, diverse agriculture industry with proximity to ports on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, the Mississippi River, and the Gulf of Mexico create export opportunities for our producers. I encourage our farmers, food companies, and agribusinesses interested in new international markets to contact our office. Through our association with SUSTA, there are opportunities for qualified companies to participate in trade missions, trade shows, and product promotions. Just as we actively promote our products locally through the Genuine MS® program, we will continue to proudly highlight Mississippi's abundant and sustainable agricultural, food, and forest products on the world stage.

Beef – It's What's For Dinner!



Grilled Cowboy Steaks

2 beef Ribeye Steaks (about 1 pound)

Rub:

2 teaspoons sweet paprika
1-1/2 teaspoons dried thyme leaves
1 teaspoon garlic powder
1 teaspoon onion powder
1/2 teaspoon salt (optional)
1/2 teaspoon pepper

Combine Rub ingredients; press evenly onto beef Ribeye Steaks. Cook's Tip: Beef Top Sirloin, Top Loin (Strip) or Tenderloin Steaks, cut 1 inch thick; or 2 pounds beef Porterhouse or T-bone steaks, cut 1 inch thick may be used. Place steak(s) on grid over medium, ash-covered coals or over medium heat on preheated gas grill. Grill according to the chart for medium rare (145°F) to medium (160°F) doneness, turning occasionally.

Steak and Blue Cheese Wraps

1 pound beef Sirloin Tip Steaks, cut 1/8 to 1/4 inch thick
1-1/2 teaspoons seasoned pepper blend or garlic-pepper seasoning
2 teaspoons vegetable oil
Salt

4 tablespoons reduced-fat or fat-free blue cheese dressing
4 medium flour tortillas (8 to 10-inch diameter), warmed
4 romaine lettuce leaves

Toppings:

Sliced tomatoes, sliced red onion

Stack beef steaks; cut lengthwise in half, then crosswise into 1-inch wide strips. Combine beef and garlic-pepper in medium bowl; toss to coat. Heat 1 teaspoon oil in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add half of beef; stir-fry 1 to 3 minutes or until outside surface of beef is no longer pink. (Do not overcook.) Remove from skillet. Repeat with remaining beef and oil. Season with salt, as desired. Spread dressing evenly on tortillas; top with lettuce leaf. Divide beef and toppings, as desired, among tortillas. Roll up tightly.

Nacho Beef Dip

1 pound Ground Beef (93% lean or leaner)
1 jar (15 to 16 ounces) cheese dip with salsa (salsa con queso) or other cheese dip
1/2 cup thick-and-chunky mild or medium salsa
Toppings:
Blue, yellow and/or white corn tortilla chips (optional)
Diced red bell pepper, thinly sliced green onions, sliced ripe olives (optional)

Heat nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add Ground Beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 3/4-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Add cheese dip and salsa; cook and stir about 3 minutes or until mixture is heated through. Cook's Tip: Cooking times are for fresh or thoroughly thawed ground beef. Ground beef should be cooked to an internal temperature of 160°F. Color is not a reliable indicator of ground beef doneness. Pour beef mixture into shallow serving dish. Serve with tortilla chips for dipping. Garnish with toppings, if desired.

Beef and Cream Cheese Bagelwich

12 ounces cooked beef (such as steak, roast, pot roast or deli roast beef), thinly sliced
4 thin-style flavored bagels or regular bagels, split
1/3 cup reduced-fat cream cheese
2 tablespoons capers
8 thin slices tomato
4 thin slices red onion, separated into rings
Capers (optional)

Spread cream cheese evenly on cut sides of each bagel half. Evenly sprinkle capers over cream cheese. Evenly top with tomato slices and onion rings; top with beef. Garnish with additional capers, if desired. Serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to eat.

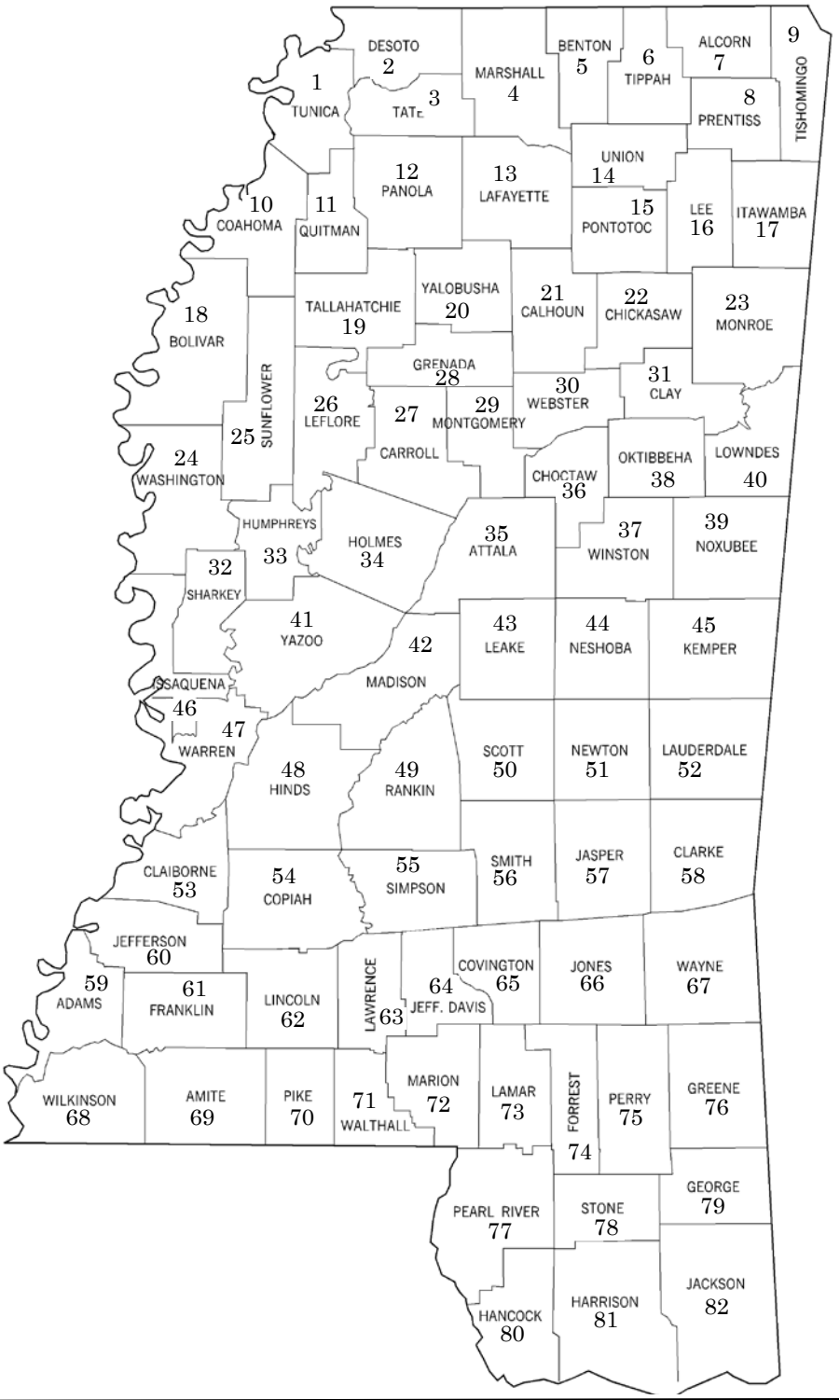

Trying to Salvage Timber? Call a Forestry Specialist

Managers of forestland that was damaged or destroyed during the March 24 tornado outbreak in Mississippi now face questions about the short- and long-term future of their property.

Timber loss was recorded in six of the state's counties after aerial surveys conducted by the Mississippi Forestry Commission estimated more than \$13 million in losses on 23,155 acres, of which 9,281 acres were on nonindustrial private forestland. Storms also battered Enviva's wood pellet production plant in Amory, suspending operations there.

"Damage from this round of tornadoes definitely seems to be greater than anything I've worked in north Mississippi in the last decade," said Brady Self, an associate Extension professor of forestry with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "From what I've seen, a lot of the timber downed in these storms is a total loss. Adding to the mix, we already had a multiyear surplus of timber supply that people were having trouble harvesting."

The estimation was based on average quarterly market prices by the ton for pine and hardwood pulpwood, as well as pine and hardwood sawtimber. The quarterly prices at the time of the report were \$26.58 per ton for pine sawtimber and \$33.73 per ton for hardwood sawtimber. The two counties suffering the most timber value loss were Monroe County with nearly \$6.1 million and Carroll County at nearly \$5.5 million.

"While acreage is simply acreage, value considers current market value. Monetarily speaking, \$10,000 worth of sawtimber a decade ago would have included fewer trees than \$10,000 worth in sawtimber now," Self said. "Calculations using our current lower values for products doesn't really paint an accurate picture. This is especially true for pine stumpage."

Many of the questions Self and other MSU Extension timber specialists are asked after tornadoes involve potential federal assistance, tree health and determining what can be salvaged.

"Just because downed timber looks sound does not mean it actually is," he said. "Depending on multiple factors, downed wood may be perfectly fine, or it may be completely worthless due to factors such as ring shake (internal cracking due to bending), splitting, location of breakage and other factors like drying and insect and fungal damage as time goes on."

"A logger will not come and haul away unprofitable wood, period,"

Self added. "Aside from the nature of the damage, remember that logging equipment is designed to cut standing, not fallen trees. Couple that with high insurance costs associated with hiring saw hands, and logging contractors have a tough go of it when salvaging timber."

Mississippi state forester Russell Bozeman said that, in many of the storm-damaged areas, forest industry analysis data show a high growth-to-drain ratio, meaning that more timber is being grown than harvested.

"Because of the abundance of timber, many private nonindustrial forest landowners face daily challenges of finding loggers and mill access," he said. "The salvage must be completed in a timely manner, and often finding a logger who is willing to complete this type of harvest and who has mill access can be a challenge. It speaks to the need to have healthy timber markets that can utilize thinning and damaged timber in a timely manner."

Landowners with profitable timber for a logger to salvage can ask around for contact information for any local logging contractors, or they can call the Mississippi Forestry Association for a list of contractors who might be able to help. MSU Extension also has multiple publications available that detail topics ranging from chainsaw and debris clearing safety to timber casualty loss tax considerations.

"Extension county agents and forestry specialists can go to look at a property and offer technical advice on whether a landowner should consider a tract as manageable or something that they should regenerate," Self said.
