## Mississippi Farmers Face Harshest Drought in Years

It has been said that the farmer worries, not just for his own family, but for the fate of all. For no matter how hard he works, or how well he sows, cultivates and grows a crop, the farmer is still at the mercy of forces beyond his control. And when the farmer loses, so do we all.

Areas around Mississippi are currently experiencing severe drought conditions, like we haven't seen in years. Farmers in several of our southern counties are seeing cotton bolls dry up and fall to the parched earth beneath their feet; they watch as empty hulls, where peanuts and soybeans should be flourishing, shrivel up and die. Cattlemen watch their livestock compete for limited shade

in the heat of the day and grow thin in their dying pastures.

"This drought is the worst I've ever seen," said Trey Bullock, a crop consultant with Bullock's Ag Consulting in Hattiesburg. Bullock has 36 years' experience inspecting crops, since he first began checking cotton as a teenager. He went on to say that even those with crop insurance could take a devastating hit this year. "By the time you crank up that million-dollar cotton picker, and consider the thousands of dollars that go toward seed, chemicals, fuel and labor – whatever little harvest you're able to salvage will not make up that difference. It's almost not even worth harvesting."

Ordinarily, cotton bolls open later in the season. However, the intense heat and severe drought conditions we've been experiencing has caused the cotton plant leaves to fall off, leaving the bolls exposed to the sun for 8 to 10 hours a day without any relief or

rest at night. Due to this, Bullock said the growing process, which is similar for all row crops, was sped up so much that countless cotton, soybean, corn and peanut farmers have lost this year's harvest.

Mississippi Agriculture and Commerce Commissioner Andy Gipson said, "It's the worst drought we've seen in a long, long time especially south of interstate 20. I don't think it's an exaggeration to say every crop south of I-20 is gonna die due to this drought."

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, much of the southwestern region of Mississippi is currently under D3, or extreme drought, conditions. However, many experts believe this map does not accurately represent the extent of the current drought because the data is outdated. Therefore, Commissioner Gipson, longtime cattleman and timber owner, is encouraging farmers

and ranchers to complete a drought report for their county online at <https://bit.ly/Drought2023> to update the U.S. Drought Monitor map for the state of Mississippi. This will, in turn, ensure an accurate picture of what our farmers and ranchers are facing.

"Now, a drought for a cattle farmer is different than for a row crop farmer," said Bullock. "A guy running winter calves that has experienced severe drought conditions, along with extreme triple-digit heat for 45 to 60 days going into October, can be devastating because he can't plant his grass."

Mississippi Cattlemen's Association Executive Director Andy Berry pointed out that the recent extreme heat and lack of rainfall has caused hay production to be down. Many producers began feeding hay in late July to early August because pastures dried up so quickly.

"While a large portion of Mississippi has experienced some level of drought conditions this summer, areas south of Interstate 20 have been hit the hardest. Most cattle farmers in this part of the state were already

lacking hay for winter feeding, many with less than half of what is typically needed to winter their herds. These producers are currently faced with the dire situation of selling part or all of their herds, or feeding the already scarce hay crop. As this drought continues we are running out of time for any hope of grass growth should it start raining to make up our hay production and rebound our pasture forages ahead of winter. It is just plain tough conditions in south-central Mississippi. Thankfully for those producers having to sell, prices are at historically high levels. I encourage those that do reduce their herds to not walk away from the cattle business and to get back in when the weather is more favorable," Berry said.

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# Commissioner's Policy Corner

## Foreign Purchase of Farmland Study Committee Holds First Meeting

The Study Committee on Foreign Purchase of Farmland in Mississippi held its first meeting on August 24, 2023 at the State Capitol. The Mississippi Legislature created this Study Committee through House Bill 280, 2023 Legislative Session, for the purpose of studying the purchasing, acquiring, leasing or holding an interest in agricultural land by foreign governments.

"Food security is national security. America is strong because of our food, fiber, and shelter production

capabilities; we must protect our farmland against adversarial foreign interest," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. "We have found that some 757,000 acres, over two percent of Mississippi's agricultural land is controlled by foreign interests. As the Study Committee further explores the issue of foreign purchases of farmland, we will consider a number of factors including national security, food security, landowners' property rights and in-

ternational trade. The Study Committee looks forward to submitting a report of findings to the Legislature by December 1."

The Study Committee is composed of the following nine members: Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson; Whitney Lipscomb, Designee of the Attorney General; Representative Angela Cockerham, Chairman of House Judiciary A Committee; Senator Brice Wiggins, Chairman of the Senate Judiciary A Com-

mittee; Bill Pigott, Chairman of the House Agriculture Committee; Senator Chuck Younger, Chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee; David Bradley Hall, Appointee of the Governor; Meredith Allen, Appointee of the Lieutenant Governor; and Ted Kendall, IV, Appointee of the Speaker of the House.

At its first meeting, the Study Committee elected Commissioner Andy Gipson as Chairman, Representative Bill Pigott as Vice Chairman and Representative Angela Cockerham as Secretary. The Study Committee also approved its procedures and future meeting dates with further details to be announced later.

### Loaded Baked Potato Dip

2 cups reduced-fat sour cream  
2 cups shredded reduced-fat cheddar cheese  
8 center-cut bacon or turkey bacon strips, chopped and cooked  
1/3 cup minced fresh chives  
2 teaspoons hot sauce  
Hot cooked waffle-cut fries

In a small bowl, mix the first 5 ingredients until blended; refrigerate until serving. Serve with waffle fries.

### Baked Goat Cheese Spread with Pepper Jelly

2 8-ounce packages cream cheese, softened  
10 ounces goat cheese, softened  
1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt  
1 teaspoon black pepper  
2 garlic cloves, grated (about 1 teaspoon)  
1/4 cup chopped fresh chives, plus more for garnish  
3/4 cup red pepper jelly  
Crudites and bread for serving

Preheat oven to 350° F. Combine cream cheese, goat cheese, salt, black pepper and garlic in a food processor. Process until mixture is smooth, about one min-

ute, stopping to scrape down sides as needed. Transfer mixture to a medium bowl and stir in 1/4 cup chives. Spoon mixture evenly into a shallow 1 1/2 -quart baking dish. Bake in preheated oven until heated through, 15 to 18 minutes. Place pepper jelly in a medium bowl and whisk vigorously to loosen. Spread pepper jelly over hot dip, garnish with additional chives. Serve immediately with crudites and bread.

### Ground Beef Taco Dip

1 pound lean ground beef  
3/4 cup water  
2 envelopes taco seasoning, divided  
2 cups fat-free sour cream  
1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened  
2 cups shredded iceberg lettuce  
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese  
3 medium tomatoes, finely chopped  
1 medium green pepper, finely chopped  
1 can sliced ripe black olives, drained  
Tortilla or corn chips

In a large skillet, cook and crumble beef over medium heat until no longer pink, 4-6 minutes; drain. Add water and one envelope of taco seasoning; cook until thickened. Cool slightly. Beat sour cream, cream cheese and remaining taco seasoning until blended. Spread in a 3-quart dish; add ground beef. Top with lettuce, cheddar, tomatoes and olives. Serve with tortilla chips.

### Muddy Buddy Mix

2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips (about 1 12-ounce package)  
1 cup creamy peanut butter  
6 tablespoons salted butter  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract  
1 (12-ounce) package rice cereal squares, corn cereal squares or wheat squares (12 cups)  
2 cups powdered sugar  
1 cup unsweetened cocoa

Place chocolate chips, peanut butter, and butter in a large microwavable bowl. Microwave on high until smooth and melted, about 3 minutes, stirring every 30 seconds. Stir in vanilla. Pour cereal into a large bowl. Pour warm chocolate mixture over cereal and toss gently until coated. Whisk together powdered sugar and cocoa in a medium bowl. Sprinkle powdered sugar mixture over cereal and gently toss to coat.

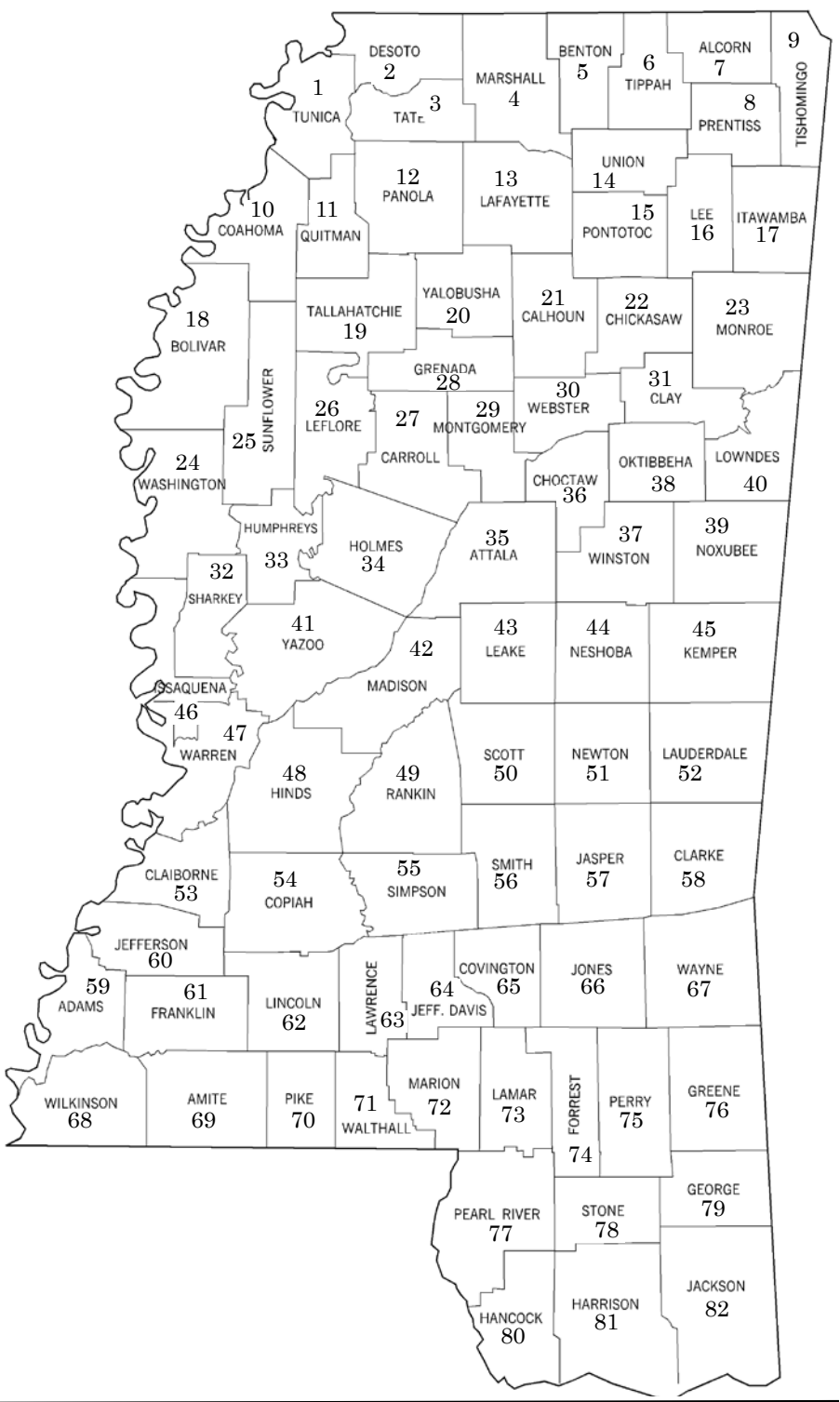

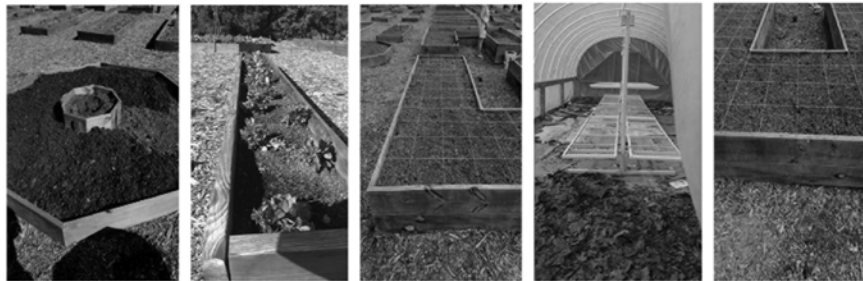

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# Highly Variable Cotton Crop Reaching Harvest

High temperatures and drought since early July left some cotton acreage not worth harvesting, while others with irrigation may still make an excellent crop in Mississippi.

"Statewide, cotton yields are highly variable depending on where you're standing," said Brian Pieralisi, cotton specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service.

This year, Mississippi growers planted 380,000 acres of cotton. The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimated on Aug. 27, 2023, that the crop was a bit ahead of the five-year average rate of open bolls. But it estimated 7% of the crop was poor and 6% excellent, with the rest in fair or good condition.

Pieralisi said the acres in bad shape are in multiple counties in south-central Mississippi below Interstate 20.

"It is a disaster down there," he said. "There is some irrigated cotton that will make a decent crop, but the dryland cotton had absolutely no moisture to make any kind of yield."

Trey Bullock of Bullock's Ag Consulting in Seminary said the area usually harvests 1,200-1,500 pounds of cotton an acre without irrigation. The area benefits from its proximity to the Gulf Coast, which typically brings summer afternoon thunderstorms.

"Since July 9 until August 29 when it was too late, we had about three-tenths an inch of rain, and that wasn't in one rain," Bullock said.

Compounding the lack of rain were very high temperatures. Bullock said the last full week of August had five days of temperatures between 105 and 109 degrees. Nighttime tem-

peratures above 85 degrees meant the crop never had a chance to rest.

"The cotton crashed," Bullock said. "The leaves drooped down so much each day from lack of moisture that they exposed the bolls to sunburn, and the bolls split."

Growers may harvest about 1,000 pounds an acre of that cotton, a loss of about 500 pounds from what was expected.

About 14,000 acres of cotton were planted in the region affected by the severe drought and high heat. Bullock said the cotton crop is devastated in Smith, Covington, Jones, Forrest and Perry counties.

"About 50% of the crop is not worth putting a picker in, and if you do run it, you might get 200 pounds of cotton an acre at the most," he said.

Most of the cotton grown in the

Delta is irrigated, and Pieralisi said most of that looks good or even very good.

Cotton in north and northeast Mississippi got more moderate weather, including occasional rain. Some cotton in the hills and parts of north Mississippi around Batesville and Senatobia are seeing a strong crop.

Areas around Macon got a bad hailstorm followed by about three weeks of very wet weather. That cotton will only have a top crop, meaning it was able to mature cotton bolls only on the upper branches of the cotton plants.

Even cotton in areas with irrigation suffered from the high nighttime temperatures that came when the crop was at particularly vulnerable, reproductive stages.

"When the cotton plant is trying to set fruit, fruit retention suffers from high heat at night, especially when there's no water," Pieralisi said.

Some cotton in Mississippi experienced cavitation, a rare phenomenon that happens when an air bubble forms in plant stems because of a lack of water. Stems bend over and die at this air pocket, limiting fruit set on those branches.

Despite the challenges and variability in crop conditions across the state, harvest is very near.

"A few Delta acres will start harvest about Sept. 10, with harvest beginning on the vast majority of acres around Sept. 15-20 and later the farther east and north you go," Pieralisi said.

Very few cotton acres would benefit at this point from rain, so growers are now hoping hurricanes stay away and dry weather continues, allowing them to get the crop in safely.

# MDAC'S Produce Safety Division Upholds Produce Standards

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce's (MDAC) Produce Safety Division was created in 2018 to establish a proactive response to food safety. The Produce Safety Division works very closely with many farmers markets around the state. The Hernando Farmers Market in DeSoto County is one of the largest farmers markets in the state and works very closely with the Produce Safety Division. Hernando Farmers Market Manager, Gia Matheny, works hard to make sure her vendors have everything they need to follow all of MDAC's rules and regulations to protect consumers in the market.

MDAC Produce Safety Division Outreach Coordinator Davis Edwards recently made a visit to the Hernando Farmers Market in July. Davis was able to meet all the growers in person to see all their produce and watch them interact with their loyal customers. "It's obvious that this community loves this farmers market. This is a great example of what the Produce Safety Division is working to establish – positive relationships with market managers and growers across the state. This will help them ensure safe produce for the community to enjoy," said Edwards.

In addition to partnering with local farmers markets, the Produce Safety

Division hosts several workshops throughout the year, which are open to the public. Most recently, this division partnered with Mississippi State University Extension, Alabama Department of Agriculture and Industries and Alabama Universities Extension to host a hybrid Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Cleaning and Sanitizing Workshop. The first part of the workshop consisted of an online self-paced course including six modules that covered Food Safety, Cleaning, Sanitizing, The Produce Safety Rule, Identification and Evaluation of Hazards, and Establishing a Cleaning and Sanitizing Program. The second part of the workshop was held in-person at the Forrest County Extension Office where participants were able to put into place what they learned in the modules through different hands-on activities. Fourteen participants representing regions around the state attended the workshop.

Edwards said MDAC continues to receive positive feedback on these workshops from the attendees, as well as FDA. "MDAC's Produce Safety Division is privileged to have a great team of extension agents to assist with the education and outreach efforts. We are also thankful to have a close working relationship with Alabama's Produce Safety Division and Extension as well, and we look forward to continuing in our vision to educate our communities in produce safety," said Edwards.
