The Mississippi State Fairgrounds Hosts the 164th State Fair

The Mississippi State Fair is a time-honored tradition that showcases all the best livestock exhibitions, local artists and attractions, exciting shows and southern-style foods that our state has to offer. For 10 days, the Mississippi State Fairgrounds becomes a hub for shows, concerts, rides, games and the famous buttermilk biscuits, provided by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce. Families and friends travel far and wide to enjoy the endless entertainment offered at this annual event.

“Under the leadership of Mississippi State Fairgrounds Director Michael Lasseter, our fairgrounds

staff has worked tirelessly to ensure the 164th State Fair will be bigger and better than ever,” said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. “This safe and family-friendly environment offers an array of activities that everyone will enjoy. I encourage the public to go ahead and purchase their concert tickets in advance, since all online concert tickets purchased in advance include same-day general admission to the fairgrounds.”

In addition to all the usual fan-favorite attractions, this year’s State Fair will feature an all-new ‘Taste of the Dixie National’ exhibition and American Idol® Auditions. Several Taste of Dixie National shows will run throughout the duration of the State Fair and will include bull riding, calf scrambles, bucking broncs, live entertainment and rodeo clowns.

Taste of Dixie National shows will start at 6:30 p.m. every weekday and at 2:30 and 6:30 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays. Special guest, Forrie J. Smith, will also make an appearance at the Taste of Dixie National to meet and greet fans on Saturday, October 7, and Sunday, October 8, at 2:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

For the first time ever, the Mississippi State Fair will host a competition to recruit talent for the hit singing competition series, American Idol®, beginning with a semi-finals competition on Monday, October 9, inside the Mississippi Coliseum. The final five contestants selected through this process will have the chance to win a VIP Executive Producer Audition. The singing competition will be open to the public with fair admission and a ticket, which will be available for purchase at the Coliseum Box Office.

Commissioner's Policy Corner

*Reporting Conditions and Contacting USDA
are Crucial Drought Responses*

As many of you are experiencing, our farmers and ranchers are facing one of the harshest droughts they have faced in many years. What began as a year with a late frost has turned into a summer with extreme heat and little to no rainfall leaving our farmers and ranchers hurting. At the time of writing, three-fourths of the state of Mississippi is experiencing drought conditions. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, 75 percent of the state is experiencing dry conditions, with 43 percent experiencing severe to exceptional drought conditions.

It's the worst drought we've seen in a long, long time. At the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, we are monitoring the conditions and keeping in close contact with our partners at USDA to evaluate the situation and determine which programs will be made available to those in affected areas.

USDA has continued to add primary and contiguous counties to the Secretarial Disaster Declaration. Farmers and ranchers in the declared counties are eligible to be considered for USDA emergency loan assistance. Producers in a number of southwest



counties and some centrally located counties are eligible to apply for USDA's Livestock Forage Disaster Program. This program assists producers suffering grazing losses on native or improved pastureland due to a qualifying drought. The number of counties eligible for emergency loan assistance and the Livestock Forage Disaster Program are expected to increase. I urge you to contact your local USDA offices for additional in-

formation on these programs, including eligible counties. If you are not registered with USDA, you should begin that process as soon as possible so you don't miss important deadline dates. If you have crop insurance, I encourage you to reach out to your provider for further guidance.

Having timely and accurate information on how this drought is impacting our farmers is crucial and can make a difference in the avail-

ability of assistance programs. I urge all farmers and ranchers affected to please contact your local USDA county office to report drought impacts and crop damage as well as reporting to the U.S. Drought Monitor.

For those in need of hay, the Mississippi State University Extension Service has made the Mississippi Hay Directory available for those needing to purchasing hay. The Hay Directory is available online at <https://extension.msstate.edu/content/mississippi-hay-directory>.

The drought is not only impacting crop production; it is causing the Mississippi River water levels to drop which is expected to make it difficult to transport agricultural commodities. We are hearing reports of barges reducing loads to get down the River. We will continue to monitor this situation.

Pizza On a Stick

8 ounces Italian turkey sausage links
2 cups whole fresh mushrooms
2 cups cherry tomatoes
1 medium onion, cut into 1-inch pieces
1 large green pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces
30 slices turkey pepperoni (2 ounces)
1 tube (13.8 ounces) refrigerated pizza crust
1 1/2 cups shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
1 1/4 cups pizza sauce, warmed

Preheat oven to 400°. In a large nonstick skillet, cook sausage over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. When cool enough to handle, cut sausage into 20 pieces. On 10 metal or wooden skewers, (if using wooden skewers, soak them first so they will not burn) alternately thread sausage, vegetables and pepperoni. Unroll pizza dough onto a lightly floured surface; cut widthwise into 1-inch wide strips. Starting at the pointed end of a prepared skewer, pierce skewer through one end of the dough strip. Spiral-wrap dough strip around skewer, allowing vegetables and meats to peek through. Wrap the remaining end of dough strip around the skewer above the first ingredient. Repeat with remaining dough strips and prepared skewers. Arrange kabobs on a baking sheet coated with cooking spray. Bake until vegetables are tender and pizza crust is golden, 10-12 minutes. Immediately sprinkle with cheese. Serve with warmed pizza sauce for dipping.

Caramel Corn

6 quarts popped popcorn
2 cups packed brown sugar
1 cup butter, cubed
1/2 cup corn syrup
1 teaspoon salt
3 teaspoons vanilla extract
1/2 teaspoon baking soda

Place popcorn in a large bowl and set aside. In a large saucepan, combine the brown sugar, butter, corn syrup and salt; bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Boil for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from the heat, stir in vanilla and baking soda; mix well. Pour over popcorn and stir until well coated. Pour into 2 greased 13x9-inch baking pans. Bake, uncovered, at 250° for 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes. Cool completely. Store in airtight containers.

Bacon-Wrapped Hot Dogs

12 bacon strips
8 cheese beef hot dogs
8 bakery hot dog buns, split and toasted
1/4 cup chopped red onion
2 cups sauerkraut, rinsed and well drained
Optional condiments: mayonnaise, ketchup or Dijon mustard

Mini Nutella Doughnuts

1 large egg, room temperature
1 tablespoon water
1 tube (16.3 ounces) large refrigerated flaky biscuits (8 count)
2/3 cup Nutella
Oil for frying
Confectioners' sugar

Whisk egg with water. On a lightly floured surface, roll each biscuit into a 6-inch circle; cut each into 4 wedges. Brush lightly with the egg wash; top each wedge with one teaspoon Nutella. Bring up corners over filling, pinch edges firmly to seal. In a large cast-iron or electric skillet, heat oil to 350°. In small batches, place doughnuts in hot oil, seam side down; fry until golden brown, 1-2 minutes per side. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar; serve warm.

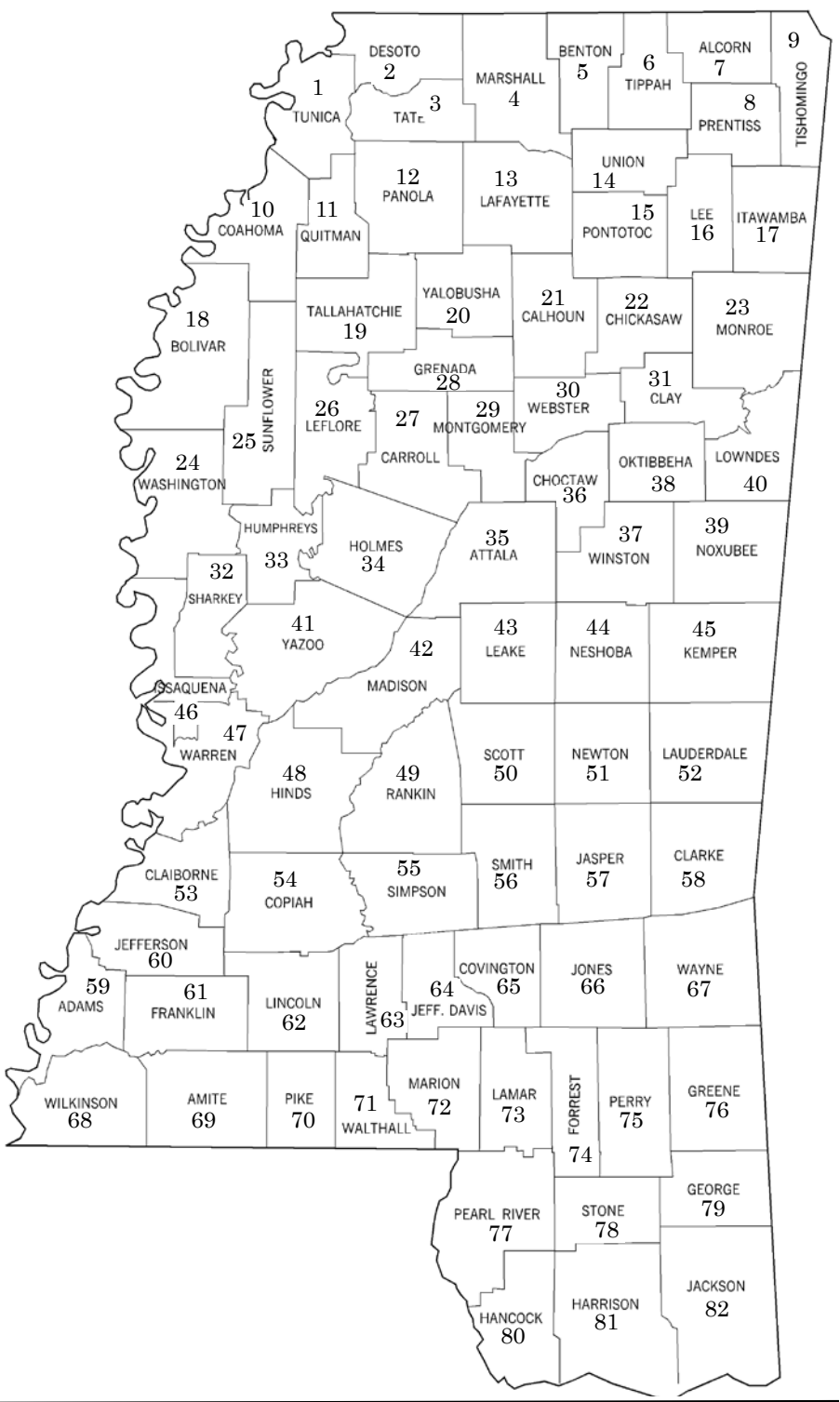

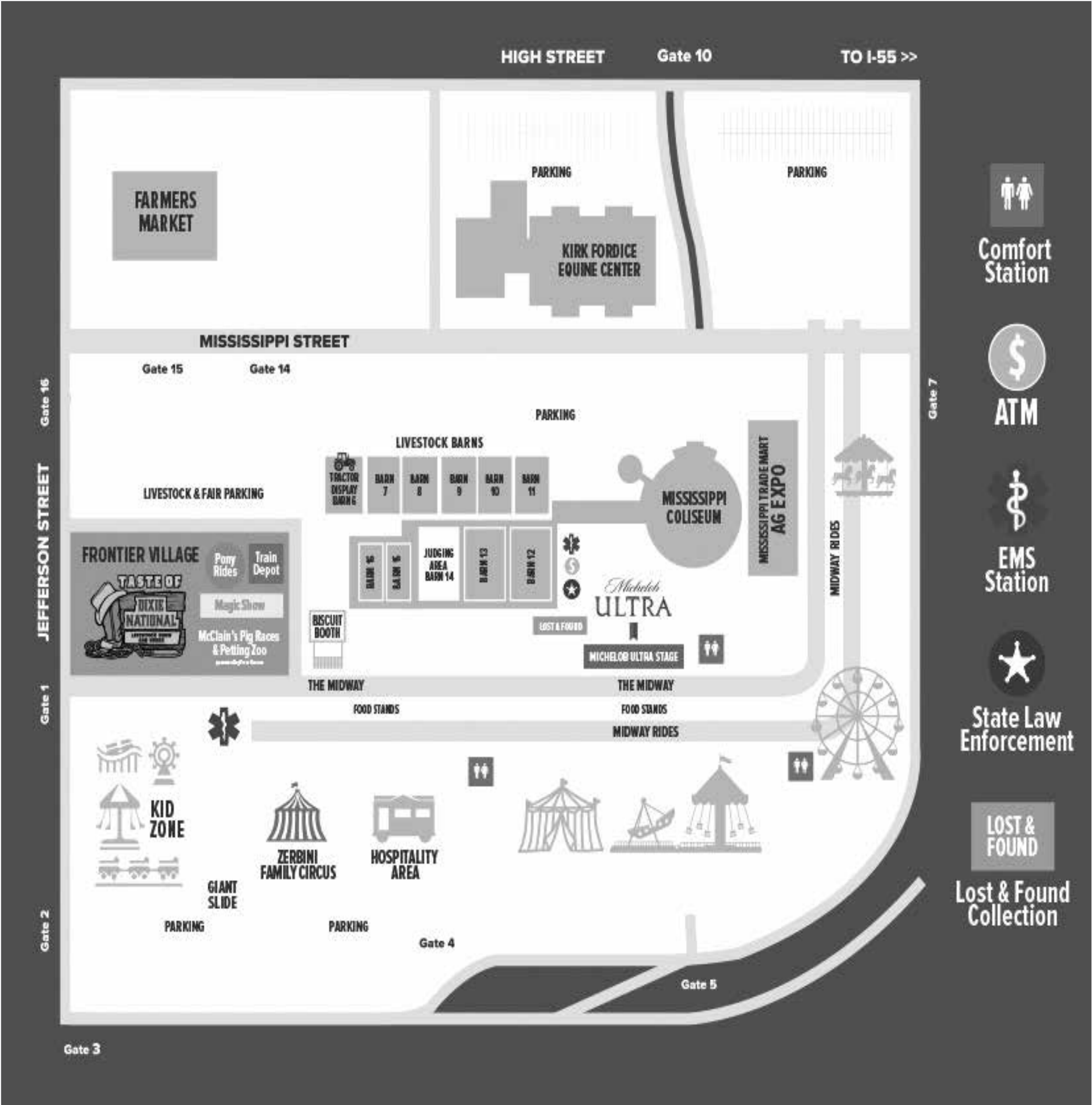

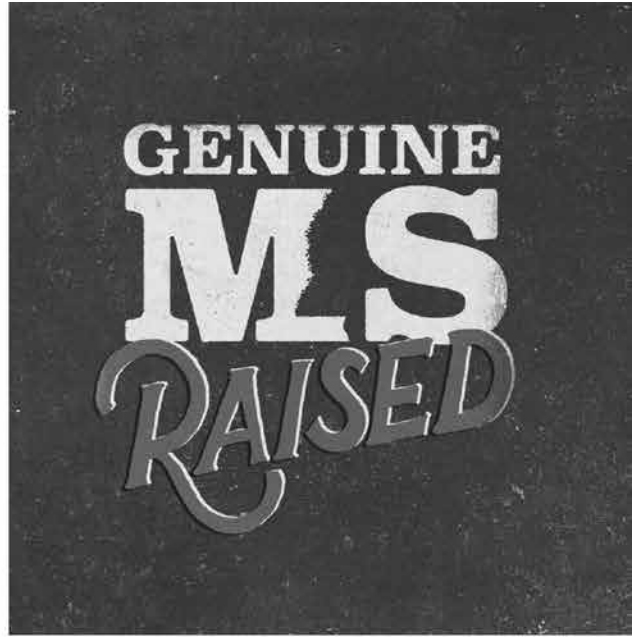

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Commissioner Andy Gipson Cuts Ribbon at the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum's 40th Birthday Celebration

On September 9, 2023, Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson cut the ceremonial ribbon commemorating the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum's 40 years of educating the public on the importance of agriculture. He, along with other museum officials, replicated the grand opening ceremony lead by former Agriculture Commissioner Jim Buck Ross on the opening day of the museum, on September 20, 1983.

"This is a historic moment as we gather today to celebrate the 40th birthday of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. Forty years ago, when I was in kindergarten, I walked across the bridge for the very first time when the museum opened in 1983," said Commissioner Gipson. "This museum is and will continue to be a great testament and legacy for Mississippi's agricultural and forestry industries. This museum would not exist if it weren't for the vision of former Commissioner Jim Buck Ross. Millions of people have walked through the gates being a part of the great experience of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum since its opening."

Commissioner Gipson addressed upcoming plans for museum improvements. "I am proud to announce today that the next phase of our renovations will include upgrading, renovating and preserving the 1897 Church in Small Town, Mississippi. The public can support this and other efforts by becoming a member of the museum," said Commissioner Gipson.

Commissioner Gipson was joined by Theresa Love, executive director of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum; Dr. Bill Herndon, chairman of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum Foundation; Mike Massey, member of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum Foundation and Glenn Holloway, representative of the National Agricultural Aviation Museum. In addition to all the unique exhibits at the museum, visitors were treated to 40 experiences throughout the museum grounds.

The thirty-nine acres of the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum grounds make up forty-four exhibits with eight annual events giving visitors a glimpse into past rural life and the opportunity to see how agriculture has shaped Mississippi over time. The Heritage Center Gallery exhibits 500 years of Mississippi's agricultural history, from the early contributions to agriculture of the Choctaw population, to turn of the century forest conservation, to modern catfish farming. The Heritage Center is home to the National Agricultural Aviation Museum featuring over 5,000 square feet of informational videos, colorful photographs and actual planes.

The Fortenberry-Parkman Farmstead, a designated Mississippi Landmark dating back to 1860, includes many of the original buildings from a farmstead once located in Jefferson Davis County. Another popular attraction visitors enjoy is Small Town, Mississippi, a true-to-size replica 1920s crossroad town featuring a working cotton gin, print shop, filling station, blacksmith shop, church, schoolhouse, doctor's office and general store stocked with local

Mississippi products. The Children's Barnyard houses a variety of farm animals. The Fitzgerald Collection, located off the beaten path on the museum grounds, is a museum-quality collection of antiques featuring Native American and Americana artifacts.

The Ag Museum hosts numerous events throughout the year for school groups, tour groups and families including Spring Farm Days, Easter at the Ag Museum, Mississippi Science Fest, Pumpkin Adventure, Harvest Fest and Homestead for the Holidays. At these special events, visitors enjoy live demonstrations throughout the grounds, cooking demonstrations, gardening tips, tasty treats, and wagon, carousel and train rides. Pickle Fest was awarded 'Small Festival Event of the Year' in 2022. Thousands of attendees flock to the museum for the summer event to enjoy live music, food and craft vendors and the fan-favorite Pickle Eating and Pickle Jar Packing Contests.

The museum has several educational opportunities available for children including Story time with Uncle Story followed by crafting the second Tuesday of each month at 10:00 a.m., field trip arrangements and summer camps.
