

# Roots and Predictions: The Legacy of Superstitions in Agriculture and *The Old Farmer's Almanac*

Whether it is forecasting the weather or determining the optimal planting time, many agricultural traditions are rooted in superstition. Since superstitions often arise from experiences, forming correlations between seemingly unrelated elements to anticipate future events is tried and true in a long-term practice such as agriculture. Before modern technological advancements, farmers relied on the natural elements—



the soil, trees, animals and sky—to predict the future. For those whose livelihood depends on the success of each year's harvest, leveraging any available information, such as *The Old Farmer's Almanac*, could mean the difference between life and death for themselves and their families.

Since its publication, *The Old Farmer's Almanac* has employed a diverse range of methods to predict crucial information for farmers, spanning from planting to harvesting. Its first editor, Robert B. Thomas, produced and sold the Almanac's first issue in 1792 during George Washington's first term as president for the price of sixpence or about nine cents.

Based on his observations, Thomas used a complex series of natural cycles to devise a secret weather forecasting formula, that has been proven to be 80% accurate. Even in the age of advanced technology, superstition continues to influence the Almanac's editors and their predictions that are believed by current farmers across the country. Below are tips Mississippi farmers follow

taken from *The Old Farmer's Almanac* over its over 200-year tenure.

#### Open the Windows

All doors and windows must be open at the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve to allow the old year to escape. The superstition is this also allows good luck for the New Year to enter. (from a farmer in George County).

#### **Predict the Rain**

If you want to know if it's about to rain, check the exterior of your ag equipment. The superstition is if the metal is accumulating condensation, rain is on the way. (from a farmer in Bolivar County)

#### Planting

Place rusty nails or iron items in the garden when seeds are planted. The superstition is this will help the plants grow. (from a farmer in Union County)

#### Hatchet in the Soil Stops the Storm

When there is a threat of perilous weather, stick a double bit axe in the

ground facing the storm clouds. The superstition is the axe will "split the cloud" and prevent the downpour. (from a farmer in Rankin County)

#### Livestock

Beware when farm animals with fur grow thicker coats. The superstition is that winter season is going to be harsher than normal. (from a farmer in Jasper County)

#### Plant North to South

It is a long-held belief that crops sown from North to South will produce a healthier harvest than those planted East to West. (from a farmer in Wayne County)

#### **Cows Forecast Weather**

When cattle lie down in the pasture, it indicates early rain. The superstition is cows become restless when stormy weather approaches and may lie down in a dry spot. (from a farmer in Pearl River County)

#### **Digging Fence Post Holes**

If you dig a post hole during the phase of a new moon and fill it back up, there won't be enough dirt to fill the hole. But under a full moon, there will be too much dirt left over. (from a farmer in Simpson County)

As we navigate the modern landscape of agriculture, it is essential to recognize the enduring influence of superstitions and traditional wisdom. The Old Farmer's Almanac stands as a testament to the harmony of old beliefs and contemporary methods, with a high prediction accuracy rate over the past century. In the words and practices of farmers, the seeds of belief continue to thrive, ensuring a connection between the past and future of agriculture.

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New Year's Day Recipes!



## **Buttermilk Cornbread**

2 cups white or yellow cornmeal

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

3/4 teaspoon salt

1 1/4 cups buttermilk

1 large egg

3 tablespoons melted shortening plus more for the skillet

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Position the rack in the center of the oven. Put about one tablespoon of shortening in a 9-to-10inch cast iron skillet and place the skillet in the oven. In a large bowl, combine the cornmeal, flour, baking powder, soda and salt. Whisk to blend thoroughly. In another bowl, whisk together the buttermilk, egg and shortening. Add the buttermilk mixture to the dry mixture and stir just until blended. Carefully remove the hot cast iron pan from the oven and set it on a metal rack. Pour the batter into the sizzling shortening in the hot skillet. Return the skillet to the oven, reduce the temperature to 375 degrees F, and bake for about 20 to 24 minutes, until golden brown. #### **Southern-Style Collard Greens**

12 hickory-smoked bacon slices, finely chopped

2 medium-size sweet onion, finely chopped

3/4 pound smoked ham, chopped

6 garlic cloves, finely chopped

3 32-ounce containers chicken broth

3 1-pound packages fresh collard greens, washed & trimmed

1/3 cup apple cider vinegar

1 tablespoon sugar

1 teaspoon salt

3/4 teaspoon pepper

Cook bacon in a 10-quart stockpot over medium heat for 10 to 12 minutes, or until it is almost crisp. Add onion and sauté 8 minutes; add ham and garlic, and sauté one minute. Stir in broth and remaining ingredients. Cook two hours or to desired degree of tenderness. Source: www.southernliving.com

#### New Year's Day Black-Eyed Peas

1 pound dried black-eyed peas

1/2 pound bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

1 tablespoon butter

1 large onion, chopped

1 garlic clove, minced

1/2 teaspoon dried thyme

Salt to taste

Fresh thyme leaves and additional cooked and crumbled bacon,

Rinse and sort black-eyed peas. Place peas and bacon in a Dutch oven; add water to cover. Bring to a boil; boil 2 minutes. Remove from heat; let soak, covered, 1 hour. Do not drain. In a cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat butter over medium-high heat. Add onion; cook and stir until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in thyme. Stir into pea mixture. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, until peas are tender, stirring occasionally, 30-40 minutes. Sprinkle with salt to taste. If desired, garnish with fresh thyme leaves and additional crumbled bacon. Source: www. tasteofhome.com

#### **Baked Ham with Pineapple**

1 fully cooked bone-in ham (6 to 8 pounds) Whole cloves

1 can (20 ounces) sliced pineapple

Place ham in roasting pan. Score the surface with shallow diagonal cuts, making diamond shapes; insert cloves into diamonds. Cover and bake at 325° for 1-1/2 hours. Drain pineapple, reserving 1/4 cup of the juice. Combine brown sugar and reserved pineapple juice; pour over ham. Arrange pineapple slices and cherries on ham. Bake, uncovered, 30-45 minutes longer or until a thermometer reads 140° and the ham is heated through. Source: www. tasteofhome com

#### **New York Italian-Style Cheesecake**

1 pound cream cheese, softened

1 pound ricotta cheese

1 1/2 cups white sugar

1/4 cup butter, melted and cooled

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour


3 tablespoons cornstarch

2 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups sour cream

Beat the cream cheese, ricotta cheese, and sugar in a large mixing bowl with an electric mixer until well combined. Beat in the eggs, one at a time. Add the butter, flour, cornstarch, and vanilla extract; mix until well combined. Fold in the sour cream and lemon juice. Pour the mixture into an ungreased 10-inch springform pan. Bake at 325° for 1 hour. Turn off the oven and leave the cheesecake in the oven for 2 more hours. Remove from oven and let cool completely. Run a thin spatula around the edge of the cheesecake before springing open the pan to remove. Serve at room temperature or cold; refrigerate leftovers. Source: AllRecipes.com.



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## MFC Southern Pine Beetle Activity Observation Outlook for Winter Months



To monitor forest health issues, such as the southern pine beetle, the Mississippi Forestry Commission (MFC) sends out flights statewide each year in the spring and fall. The MFC actively monitors pine activity and conducts aerial land surveys. Due to increased activity due to the drought, MFC staff ramped up additional flights to assess the situation.

In several parts of the state, the MFC has heard from residents alarmed by the number of dying trees in their area. Some trees are stressed from the extreme drought conditions in recent months, but some issues could be due to forest pests native to Mississippi. MFC did observe a slight uptick in Southern Pine Beetle infestations in certain parts of the state, especially in the late summer/early fall.

The southern pine beetle (Dendroctonus frontalis), the most destructive forest insect in the South, targets weakened trees caused by flooding, windstorms, and especially drought. The good news is that the MFC Forest Health division has begun to see the number of new infestations level off. A decrease in activity is normal during late fall/winter and is most likely due to a change in the weather patterns where the state is experiencing cooler temperatures and an increase in rain.

Mississippi has two main types of forest pest beetles: Southern Pine Beetles and Ips beetles. It is important to differentiate between the southern pine beetles and the less aggressive Ips engraver beetles, which can be easily confused. The adult southern pine beetle is brown to black, approximately 1/8 inch long, and lacks



spines on its posterior end, unlike Ips beetles. Female southern pine beetles lay small white eggs along the edges of galleries under the bark. The larvae, which are white with a reddish-brown head, reside beneath the bark of infested pines.

To help landowners identify and respond to infestations and outbreaks, the MFC advises the public to be aware of the signs. The first visible sign is typically the yellowing or browning of needles. Additionally, the trunk may exhibit white, yellow, or red-brown pitch tubes, approximately the size of a wad of gum. During droughts, pitch tubes may be very small or absent. Removing the bark will expose the distinctive winding "S" shaped gallery pattern.

If someone suspects a pine beetle infestation on their property, MFC urges them to contact their local forester for assistance. They can find the

contact information for their local forester on the Mississippi Forestry Commission's website. MFC also has a Southern Pine Beetle Prevention Program, which provides cost-share funds to encourage private forest landowners to thin their dense pine stand before the next southern pine beetle outbreak.

## MALTB Investigators Recover Stolen Tractor in Yazoo County

The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau (MALTB) recovered a stolen tractor, with an estimated value of \$78,334, in Yazoo County last week.

In March of 2021, the Yazoo City Police Department took an initial report of a stolen John Deere 6100 series tractor in Yazoo County. MALTB was asked to assist in the case. On November 26, 2023, MALTB received information that led investigators to Yazoo County. Based on the information received, MALTB investigators located and recovered the John Deere tractor in a rural area in Yazoo County on November 30, 2023. This is an open and ongoing criminal investigation.

MALTB Director Dean Barnard would like to commend the MALTB investigators who worked this case for their continued efforts to recover stolen equipment, as well as the anonymous caller who provided the information that led to this recovery.

"I am proud of the work our agency's investigators have accomplished under Director Barnard," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. "Equipment like this tractor is an absolute necessity on a working farm. The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau continues to protect and serve Mississippi's ag community. I encourage all our farmers, ranchers and producers across the state to take precautions



to prevent the theft of personal livestock and equipment."

The MALTB recommends:

- Never leaving keys inside equipment or machinery;
- Parking equipment so that it is not visible from the road;
- Taking pictures and recording the serial numbers of all equipment;
- Registering your livestock brand with the MALTB and branding livestock;
  - Keeping gates locked; and
- Installing cameras around your property.

The Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft Bureau, the law enforcement division of the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, enforces state laws pertaining to the theft of cattle, horses, swine, poultry, fish, farm equipment, chemicals, timber and all other farm or agriculture-related crimes.
