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## Mississippi Agriculture Posts Second Highest Dollar Value

Mississippi agriculture's value of production fell 10.3% in 2023, but still posted its second highest result on record at \$8.8 billion.

Though the value of poultry production fell more than 22% from nearly \$4 billion in 2022, the agricultural commodity still dwarfs all others in the state with an estimated value of \$3.1 billion this year. The state's forestry industry took its usual place as the state's third most valuable agricultural product at \$1.5 billion, an increase of nearly 10% from \$1.4 billion in 2022.

Soybeans was the most produced of many Mississippi-grown row

crops, holding steady in second place. At \$1.6 billion, its production value decreased 9.4% from last year's \$1.72 billion.

Outside of row crops, catfish production was worth \$251.2 million this year, which is down nearly 10% from \$278 million in 2022. Livestock netted a total value of \$509 million, which is an increase of nearly 16 percent.

During the 2020s, corn and cotton have competed annually for the state's second most valuable row crop. Corn won a close battle in 2022 but grew its lead significantly this year. Its production was worth \$675.4 million compared to \$643.3 million last year.

Cotton saw a significant reduction both in planted acreage and estimated value. In 2023, the value was \$397.3 million, a 35% dip from \$615 million in 2022.

"The reduction in soybean values is mainly driven by lower prices, and cotton is a combination of lower

prices and reduced acreage," said Will Maples, a row crop economist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "Corn saw a 5% increase due to higher acreage, which helped offset lower corn prices."

Mississippi soybean growers harvested 2.15 million acres of soybeans this year despite almost the entire state being in various levels of drought. More than 122 million bushels were produced at an estimated 57 bushels per acre.

MSU Extension soybean specialist Trent Irby summed up the year as one of what might have been. Despite favorable setups for both early and later plantings, drought conditions settled in during key growth stages of the crop over the summer, causing some acres to be abandoned.

"Even in a dry year, we are currently estimated to average 57 bushels an acre. That would be a new high, so if we pass our previous record during a drought, we could've shattered it otherwise and possibly hit a state aver-

age above 60." Irby said. "It's easy to say your harvest quality depended on where you stood, especially when we have a couple million acres, but it's true now more than it has been at any other time in my career."

The worst of the loss, Irby said, was south of Miss. Highway 16, which runs west to east across the state between Issaquena and Kemper counties. The drought impact on soybeans was the most severe in south and central Mississippi.

"Both early and later plantings were mostly completed at good times, but the crop was half of what it should've been in the southern half of the state because of the drought and because later planted beans didn't produce," he said. "Irrigation capability in fields there is limited."

Corn was largely unaffected by the dry conditions, as producers harvested about 770,000 acres in Mississippi and yielded around 182 bushels per acre and more than 140 million total bushels. MSU Extension grain crops specialist Erick Larson said most of the crop had nearly matured before the extended dry spell.

"The most detrimental issue for our corn this year was not the drought, but the mid-June hailstorms that damaged plants across the Mississippi Delta and Noxubee County after corn plants were fully developed," Larson said. "The leaf defoliation and impact damage on young ears produced significant yield loss. Fortunately, most of the damage was rather isolated, but that will mean little to growers who lost most of their crop in a storm."

The overall statewide corn crop was up 5% despite the weather event, but cotton production values fell more than 35%, partially because growers did not plant it as much. About 520,000 acres of cotton were harvested in Mississippi last year, compared to 395,000 in 2023.

"Most of the cotton looked great pre-drought, but there were excep-

tions in south Mississippi where the drought was severe by mid-July," said Brian Peralisi, MSU Extension cotton specialist. "Conversely, the Black Prairie region was unusually wet for two weeks during mid- to peak bloom. Both events caused yield reductions."

Peralisi said dryland cotton in south Mississippi was almost zero yield in some cases and caused yields to be 100-200 pounds lighter per acre. The north Delta and northern central regions had strong yields in many cases, but that was the exception to the rule.

"The advantage to growing cotton is that it has an ability to compensate for hard times, whatever that may be due to its indeterminate nature," he said. "This year it happened to start off well and simply turn too dry late in the season, which is rare because cotton typically doesn't demand much water late. Obviously, the profile was just too dry going into September in many locations."

Of the state's other row crops, peanuts had the highest percentage increase in production value at 18% but only 18,000 acres were harvested. The value of rice production also spiked 29% over 2022. Its 2023 estimated total value is \$134.6 million with 118,000 acres harvested.

The production value of specialty crops rose slightly to nearly \$113 million this year. Hay's total was nearly \$180 million, up nearly 21% from 2022. Wheat production also saw a small increase in worth at just over \$36 million. Sweet potato production value was flat from 2022 at just over \$91.5 million.

Each year, growers in each state receive a variety of government payments through various ag safety net programs. This year, they received around \$256.6 million.

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# Commissioner's Policy Corner

## Meet Your Legislators!

As we enter 2024, I want to wish each of you a happy and blessed New Year! The New Year also brings us a brand new Legislature that convened on January 2, 2024, at Noon, consisting of 122 members of the House of Representatives and 52 members of the State Senate. While most of the members are returning following reelection, there are several new faces as well as a new leadership team taking the reins. This year in the House, Rep. Jason White (R-West) was elected by the House membership as Speaker of the House, and Rep. Manly Barton (R-Moss Point) was elected Speaker Pro Tempore. The State Senate will continue to be led by Lt. Gov. Delbert Hosemann and Senate Pro Tem Dean Kirby. At the time of printing this edition of the Market Bulletin, committee chairmanships and composition had not yet been named.

Because the Legislature shapes state policy that affects us all, we

thought it would be a good idea to feature your Legislative Branch in this edition of the *Mississippi Market Bulletin*. Historically, the Legislature has been generally supportive of your Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, and I am expecting that trend to continue the next four years. The last four years we were highly successful in working with the Legislature on several key initiatives. We have several more great opportunities we need to accomplish, such as rebuilding our food supply, livestock and equine facilities infrastructure. I am counting on our Legislators to support these efforts for the good of the people.

Each year following an election year, due to election of new members and selection of committees, the Legislature is scheduled to meet for up to an extra 35 days beyond its normal 90 day session. That means this year the Legislature is slated to conclude its work by May 5, 2024. The work includes passage of a host of new general laws, enactment of any new tax and spending provisions, and adoption of the annual State Budget that

includes the budget for your Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce.

This year, the deadline for members to request new general bills in their respective chamber, House or Senate, is February 14th. The introduction deadline is February 19th, and the passage deadline is March 14th. The first deadline for passage of tax and appropriations (spending) bills is March 27th. The opposite chamber is required to take action on all such bills by specific deadlines in April. On the day Speaker White assumed office, he announced his goal of having the state budget finished by April 15, Tax Day, despite the later deadline day.

A final State Budget is scheduled to be approved by April 29th. The Budget sets the maximum amount of funds each agency is authorized to expend during the State fiscal year which runs from July 1st to June 30th. Each year the Legislature's budget will include approval of both General Funds (your state tax dollars) and Special Funds (funds generated

by the agency from other sources).

At the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, we are proud that a great majority of this agency's budget is Special Funds generated at no tax dollar cost to you, the taxpayer. We are getting more done for Mississippi agriculture and commerce at less cost to the taxpayer. As one example, we are operating the entire State Fairgrounds on Special Funds, such that the State Fairgrounds is paying for its own operations through event revenues. Still, the Legislature must authorize the expenditure of those Special Funds as part of the State Budget. With an increase in Special Funds, we have been able to make many improvements. But we can do much more, which is why in 2024 we will be asking for increased Special Funds authority.

We hope you will take this opportunity to meet your Legislators and reach out to them. Thank them for their service. Pray for them. And, as the Session moves along, we may update you on matters that affect Mississippi Agriculture and Commerce. With your support and the support of our Legislature, we will continue doing more for Mississippi.

# Dixie National Horse and Mule Color Bonanza Show Kicks Off Thursday, January 18

The 59th Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo is officially underway at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds. Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson invites the public to attend the multiple livestock and equine shows scheduled to take place over the next several weeks, many of which are free to attend. The upcoming Dixie National Horse and Mule Color Bonanza begins Thursday, January 18, and runs through Sunday, January 21, inside the Kirk Fordice Equine Center. The show starts at 8:00 a.m. each day and features a variety of mules and long-eared donkeys, as well as Palomino and American Ranch horses. This is one of the largest mule shows in the nation and attracts participants from across the U.S.

"The Dixie National Horse and Mule Color Bonanza is an incredible event that displays the versatility and beauty of all equine," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. "So many of these competitors simply enjoy competing and sharing their knowledge with spectators. The rapidly growing Dixie National Color Bonanza features five different shows over a four-day period. Last year, the North American Saddle Mule and Donkey Association (NASMDA) and Pinto Horse Association (PtHA) shows alone brought in over 230 entries from nine different

states. Classes include Showmanship, Halter and Driving Classes, English Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Equitation, Western Pleasure, Mulemanship, Reining & Trail Classes, Ranch Riding, Ranch Pleasure, Ranch Reining, Barrel Racing, Flag Racing, Pole Bending, Working Hunter and Hunter Hack. In addition to the overall champions of each show, two Mississippi natives will win the Dixie National Mississippi Champion Mule and Mississippi Champion Jack awards this year.

"Animals are judged on the quality of gait and willingness to perform obstacles, in addition to criteria detailed in the rule books for each breed association," said Dianna Watson, show secretary of the Dixie National Mule Show. "Exhibitions require a significant amount of time and training at home for both exhibitor and animal to be successful in the show

arena."

Helen Fleming, show secretary of the Palomino Horse Breeders Association (PHBA), commented, "We want to invite all open show competitors as well as PHBA and American Ranch Horse Association (ARHA) exhibitors to come join in the fun. Belt buckles will be given for high point Open Horse, Palomino Bred Horse and ARHA Horse. High point mule and high point PHBA horse will receive a saddle."

Equine owners often find that mules and horses are very similar. Mules can show and be competitive in all of the same classes as their horse counterpart, and so many equine exhibitors enjoy traveling to Jackson to exhibit in their first show of the new show year. "We are very proud of this event and hope to continue to grow the Dixie National Color Bonanza for years to come," said Watson.
