## 59th Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo

Rodeoing is America's oldest extreme sport, with roots tracing back to 1882 when Buffalo Bill Cody organized the first major rodeo in North Platte, Nebraska. However, it is believed that cowboys, ranchers and horsemen across the United States frontier competed in make-shift, western exhibitions that displayed the real-life skills of working cowboys long before Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show earned international fame.

Since its creation, the art of rodeoing has grown into a worldwide

competitive sport featuring fan-favorite events like bronc riding, barrel racing, calf roping, steer wrestling and bull riding. Today, the top cowboys and cowgirls compete in professional rodeos across the U.S. to earn the #1 rank in their particular field. And the annual Dixie National Rodeo, held in Jackson, Miss., is one of those established pro rodeos.

The Dixie National Rodeo, produced by Harper and Morgan Rodeo Company, is the largest pro rodeo east of the Mississippi River and was named Top 5 Medium Rodeo Finalist of the Year by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) in 2021. Over the years, the Dixie National Rodeo has been a stage for some of the biggest names in rodeo, including J.B. Mauney, Forrie J. Smith, Lecile Harris and Mike Mathis. The longtime friends and entertaining duo, Harris (rodeo clown) and Mathis (rodeo announcer), would perform together inside the Mississippi Coliseum for years before Harris' death in 2020. Then, in December of 2023, Mike Mathis,

announcer for the Dixie National Rodeo for over 25 years, also passed away.

In an interview with the Cowboy Channel, Mathis once said, "The community here, by that I'm talking about Jackson, of course, and the commissioner of agriculture and commerce, he has a great deal to do with this rodeo.... They've worked very hard since the first of the year to make sure that Jackson happens. They have been dedicated to do all the things that is has taken, no matter what those were, to be set up and ready. And they've done that. They've accomplished their goal, and we're lucky enough to get to be here and a part of this great rodeo."

In honor of the legacy of Mike Mathis, Harper and Morgan Rodeo Company and the Mississippi State Fairgrounds will memorialize Mathis and his incredible career during the upcoming 2024 Dixie National Rodeo. Nationally recognized music artists Colin Stough, Connor Smith, Tracy Byrd, Chris Cagle, Megan Moroney, Sammy Kershaw, Co-

rey Kent and Parmalee are all slated to perform following rodeo competitions. The rodeo is scheduled February 9-11 and 14-17, 2024.

In addition to the rodeo performances, visitors to the 59th Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo will experience livestock shows, equine competitions, agricultural expos and a parade. "We are thrilled to announce that Southern AgCredit has returned as the title sponsor for the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo," said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. "And with so many different shows and activities, this massive event is the perfect outing for the whole family to enjoy."

Also, hundreds of Mississippi FFA and 4-H students will exhibit their animals in the Dixie National Junior Livestock Round-up ahead of the Sale of Junior Champions. Last year alone, \$456,285 were raised at the Sale and 39 scholarships were awarded.

Two expos – Dixie National Ro-

deo Days and the Mississippi Ag and Outdoor Expo – will feature displays of farm equipment, fishing and hunting gear, the Genuine MS® Store and so much more. The Dixie National Parade, which includes an array of marching bands, car clubs, wagon trains, mounted groups and decorative floats, will be held Saturday, February 10.

## Wild West Cowboy Recipes!

### Cheesy Beef Taco Dip

2 pounds ground beef  
1 large onion, finely chopped  
1 medium green pepper, finely chopped  
1 pound Velveeta, cubed  
1 pound pepper jack cheese, cubed  
1 jar (16 ounces) taco sauce  
1 can (10 ounces) diced tomatoes and green chiles, drained  
1 can (4 ounces) mushroom stems and pieces, drained and chopped  
1 can (2-1/4 ounces) sliced ripe olives, drained  
Tortilla chips

In a large skillet, cook the beef, onion and green pepper over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in the cheeses, taco sauce, tomatoes, mushrooms and olives. Cook and stir over low heat until cheese is melted. Serve warm with tortilla chips.

### Ranch Potato Casserole

6 to 8 medium red potatoes (about 2 to 2-1/2 pounds), unpeeled and quartered  
1/2 cup sour cream  
1/2 cup prepared ranch-style dressing  
1/4 cup bacon bits or crumbled cooked bacon  
2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley  
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

### Tex-Mex Cheesesteak Sandwiches

1 package (15 ounces) refrigerated beef tips with gravy  
1 tablespoon canola oil  
1 medium onion, halved and thinly sliced  
1 banana pepper, cut into strips  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
1/8 teaspoon pepper

Preheat broiler. Heat beef tips with gravy according to package directions. Meanwhile, in a small skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add onion and pepper; cook and stir 4-6 minutes or until tender. Stir in salt and pepper. Place buns on a baking sheet, cut side up. Mix mayonnaise and, if desired, chili powder; spread on roll bottoms. Layer with beef tips, onion mixture

topping:  
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese  
2 cups coarsely crushed cornflakes  
1/4 cup butter, melted

Place potatoes in a large saucepan; add water to cover. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cook, uncovered, until tender, 10-20 minutes. Drain. Combine the sour cream, dressing, bacon, parsley and 1 cup cheese. Place potatoes in a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Pour sour cream mixture over potatoes and gently toss. Top with 1/2 cup of cheese. Combine cornflakes and butter; sprinkle over top. Bake at 350° for 40-45 minutes

### Cowboy Stew

2 pounds ground beef  
4 cans (16 ounces each) baked beans  
8 hot dogs, sliced  
1/2 cup barbecue sauce  
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a Dutch oven, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 4-6 minutes or until flavors are blended.

### Cowboy Cornbread

2 cups biscuit/baking mix  
1 cup yellow cornmeal  
3/4 cup sugar  
1/2 teaspoon baking soda  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 large eggs, room temperature  
1 cup butter, melted  
1 cup half-and-half cream

In a large bowl, combine the first 5 ingredients. In another bowl, combine the eggs, butter and cream; stir into the dry ingredients just until moistened. Spread into a greased 13x9-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, 25-30 minutes. *Source: www.tasteofhome.com.*

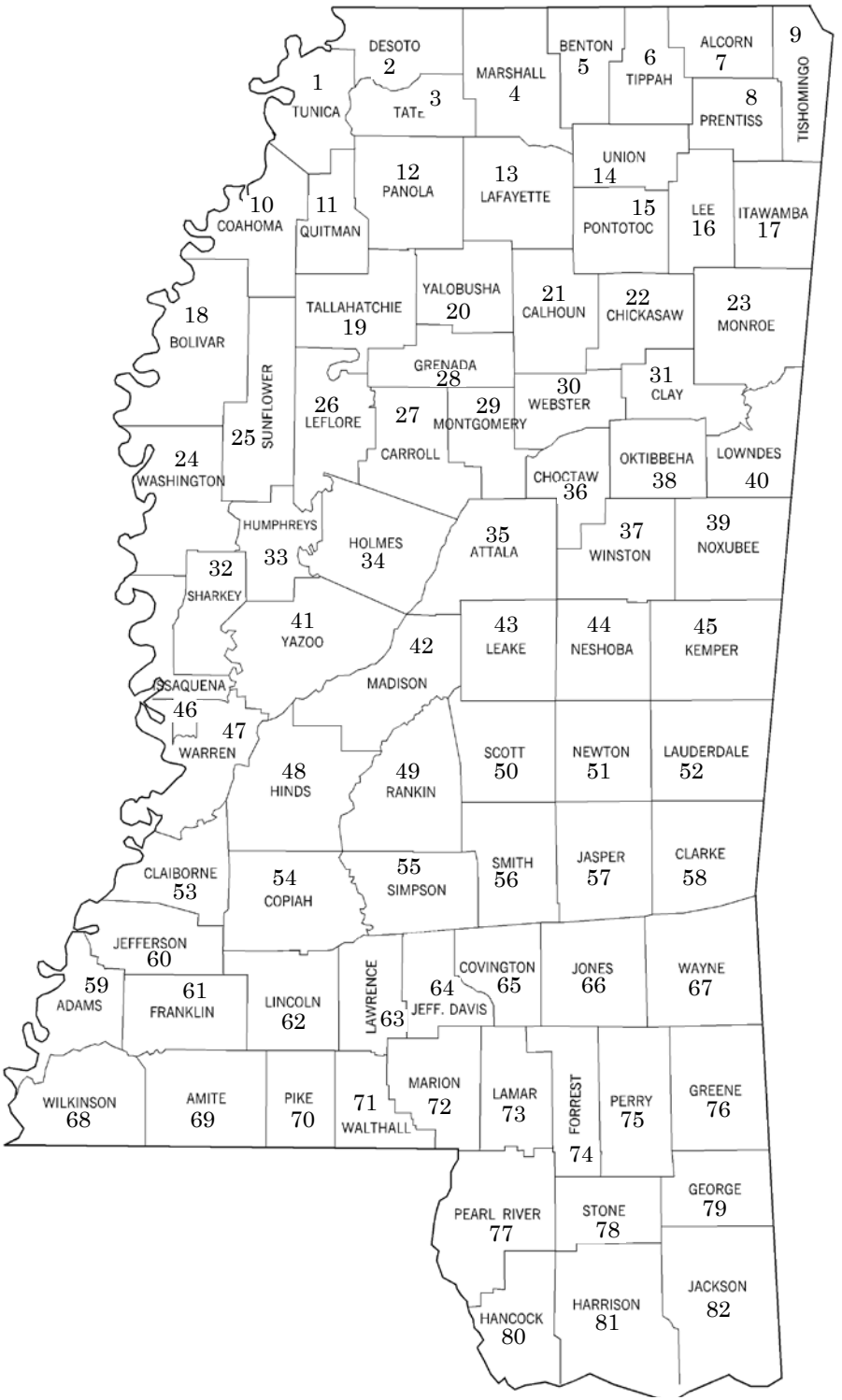

# Commissioner Andy Gipson Announces \$5.8 Million Available to Strengthen Local Food Supply Chain

Commissioner Andy Gipson announced the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) has entered into a cooperative agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to administer the Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure (RFSI) Program for the State of Mississippi. Through the RFSI Program, MDAC will make available more than \$5.8 million in funding from USDA to build resilience in the middle-of-the-supply-chain and strengthen local food systems.

“Having a strong, resilient food supply chain is crucial for our food security. This partnership with USDA will provide the State of Mississippi a strategic opportunity to strengthen our state’s food supply chain and increase marketing opportunities for our farmers while increasing consumers’ access to local foods,” said Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson.

The purpose of the RFSI Program is to assist states in building resilience in the middle-of-the-supply-chain and strengthening local food systems by creating new revenue streams for producers. The goal of the Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure Program is to create additional and better processing options for local producers across the state’s food supply chain.

“This partnership between USDA and Mississippi is allowing critical funding to reach areas of the supply chain that need it most,” said USDA Marketing and Regulatory Programs Under Secretary Jenny Lester Mofitt. “The projects funded through this program will create new opportunities for the region’s small and midsize producers to thrive, expand access to nutritious food options, and increase supply chain resiliency.”

MDAC will fund projects that expand capacity for processing, aggregation, and distribution of agricul-



tural products; construct and expand infrastructure facilities; modernize equipment; purchase refrigerated trucks; and implement new technology systems. Eligible foods under the USDA grant guidelines include specialty crops, dairy, grains for human consumption, aquaculture, and other food products. Meat and poultry, wild-caught seafood, exclusively animal feed and forage products, fiber, landscaping products, tobacco, and dietary supplements are excluded under the USDA grant guidelines.

RFSI funds will be awarded as Infrastructure Grants or Equipment-Only Grants. Infrastructure Grants will be awarded at the minimum of \$100,000 and a maximum of \$3,000,000. Equipment-Only Grants will be awarded at a minimum of \$10,000 and a maximum of \$100,000. Infrastructure Grants require a 50% match contribution to match federal funds. Historically underserved farmers and ranchers and other qualifying socially disadvantaged businesses are required to contribute a reduced 25% match. Equipment-Only Grants do not require a match.

Entities eligible to apply include agricultural producers or processors; institutions such as schools, universities or hospitals; and for-profit entities, nonprofit entities, local governments and tribal governments operating middle-of-the-supply-chain activities. Priority will be given to projects that benefit underserved

farmers and ranchers; new and beginning farmers or ranchers; veteran producers; and processors owned by socially disadvantaged individuals. All applicant businesses and organizations must be domestically owned, and applicants’ facilities must be physically located within Mississippi.

MDAC will conduct four meetings and one webinar to educate the public on this program opportunity. Meetings will be held January 23 in Cleveland, January 25 in Verona, January 30 in Jackson and February 1 in Hattiesburg. The webinar will be held February 2. “This is an exciting time for agriculture in Mississippi. The Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure Program provides a new opportunity for our food supply chain that has not been available in the past. I strongly encourage everyone eligible to submit an application before the March 15 deadline,” said Commissioner Gipson.

The deadline to apply for RFSI’s Infrastructure Grant or Equipment-Only Grant is March 15, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. CST.
