Research Shows Positive Effects of Human-Horse Interactions

Although much of civilization is intertwined with the use of horses, these animals are much more than beasts of burden, and research today continues to look at the bond between horses and humans.

Clay Cavinder, Mississippi State University Extension Service equine specialist, said one of the reasons equine-assisted therapies are so effective is that horses have the ability to physically and emotionally interact with people.

"Research has found that horses have the capacity to feel emotions as well as perceive human emotions," Cavinder said. "Because of this and

their sensitivity to body language, they can perceive emotions at a level most humans do not and react accordingly."

Horses react to situations in a raw, instinctive manner, and they react to the emotions of the people they interact with.

"Especially with the help of properly accredited mental health professionals, this often causes humans to recognize the physical presence of emotions they are unaware they are projecting and work to resolve these emotions," he said.

Cavinder and Molly Nicodemus, an MSU associate professor of animal and dairy sciences, are among the researchers exploring aspects of this bond, particularly in the way it improves the lives of the people who work with horses.

One study looked at including equine interaction for young adults during the COVID-19 pandemic who were in psychotherapy at a residential treatment facility. Another examines human-horse interactions when psychotherapy participants are undergo-

ing substance withdrawal.

"Psychotherapy incorporating equine interaction, known as PIE, is emerging as an effective treatment for substance use disorder; however, re-

search concerning physiological impacts of PIE during substance withdrawal is lacking," Nicodemus said.

The research investigated the impacts of PIE on salivary cortisol concentrations and heart rates in both human patients in withdrawal and the horses they interacted with. The study found that by week two, human heart rates and rates of cortisol, a stress hormone, were lower, but horses had higher cortisol levels.

"Results indicate equine interaction during psychotherapy is effective at mitigating stress for patients in withdrawal in the treatment program, even if they do not interact with horses but are in an equine environment," Nicodemus said.

Some of the work is being done at the MSU-operated Elizabeth A. Howard Therapeutic Riding and Activity Center in West Point. Other work is being done at the Dogwood Wellness Group in Starkville and at the Oxford Treatment Center in Oxford.

For the last several semesters,

MSU has offered an equine stress and wellness event before finals, allowing students to take a break from the stress of studying and interact with horses to improve their mental well-being.

The event had a few simple parts. After learning a little about our horses, students spend time grooming, petting and feeding the horses. Then they lead their assigned horse through several obstacles, asking them to perform different maneuvers.

"Horses live in a hierarchal herd, meaning they need a confident leader," Nicodemus said. "Students took on this role and worked together to complete several tasks in the arena."

The event ended with students spending quiet time with their horse while it grazed, which is a relaxing activity for horses.

Commissioner's Policy Corner

Agriculture Holds Key to Mississippi Workforce Challenges

Most everyone seems to understand that workforce development is crucial in addressing Mississippi's labor challenges. Most everyone accepts that reaching our youth, training them and keeping them in Mississippi is key to our success when it comes to workforce development. As Ag Commissioner, I believe that Mississippi's existing 4-H and FFA programs, including our junior livestock programs, hold huge potential to tackle the workforce development needs of Mississippi. These ag-based programs represent the very best youth development and workforce development programs we have in Mississippi.

In a recent opinion column, Lt. Governor Hosemann addressed the critical need to raise the labor force participation rate in Mississippi. I wholeheartedly agree with the Lt. Governor's assessment. I also agree with his sentiment that the best investment we can make is in the brain of a child. The benefits of this type of investment reach much further than the individuals themselves because the youth of today are our future leaders and they will be the backbone of tomorrow's workforce.

Today's labor challenges are nothing new in the world of Agriculture. Agriculture is the number one industry in the state with a farm gate value of more than \$8.7 billion in 2023. With agriculture employing 17 percent of our state's workforce either directly or indirectly, it makes sense we tackle the labor challenges with a

focus on the agriculture workforce in the state.

As the Dixie National Jr. Round-Up Livestock Shows managed by the MSU Extension Service illustrate, thousands of 4-H and FFA youths from every corner of the state participate in one of the many livestock shows. Preparing for this competition is a year-long process, and it is not for the faint of heart. Our young people learn the true spirit of hard work, sacrifice and determination. They are often early to rise and late to bed caring for their animals through the summer heat and the cold of winter.

The values instilled in our Junior Livestock participants during their time in the barns and show arena cannot be matched. From an early age, they learn about the wise investment of time and commitment to seeing the job through until it's done – of actually doing the work and bringing the project to fruition. These same skills are the skills taught by 4-H and FFA. They are not only raising animals; they are also building a resume stacked with a variety of soft and technical skills.

The Livestock Shows are the reason our Dixie National Rodeo exists today. One of the most coveted honors for Mississippi's youth livestock exhibitors is participating in the Junior Sale of Champions. The hard work and dedication required to compete far surpasses that required for a number of other youth activities. I will say it again: these youth are our future leaders. The skills and lessons learned will not just impact their generation; it will impact Mississippi's future generations to come.

The time has come to demonstrate

our support by investing in the types of programs and facilities that will continue to grow the excellent workforce development initiative that is Mississippi 4-H and FFA. How do we do that?

First, your Department of Agriculture and Commerce has already invested by initiating youth internships through our MS Ag Works program to help connect young people to actual work experience and job opportunities in the private and public sectors. For upcoming youth internship opportunities, visit www.mdac.ms.gov/ms-agworks/.

A second way is by investing in upgraded facilities at our county and State level to provide our young people the workforce facilities that will spur youth involvement and grow interest in the 4-H and FFA programs. Originally geared toward large farm animals like cattle, hogs and horses, the programs today also provide plenty of avenues for kids in suburban, or even urban areas, to participate with the addition of our Rabbit and Chicken Shows. Now every young person in Mississippi can get involved, learn basic workforce skills and experience this excellent youth development opportunity. We also need to rebuild our State livestock facilities constructed on the State Fairgrounds over 75 years ago which are quickly becoming unsafe and in desperate need of replacement.

Third, in addition to workforce facility investments, an emphasis on careers in agriculture should be brought back to our schools. Our extension agents and agriculture teachers work tirelessly, committed to growing the next generation of agriculture lead-

ers. Agriculture education should be made a priority at the school level with dedicated funding support through the State Department of Education. We know through experience such as our MDAC Wild Hog Youth Trapping Corps that youth who are taught about agricultural work opportunities are eager to get involved. When they get involved, they learn workforce skills.

There was a time not that long ago that almost every kid was a "farm kid" with hard work and ethics instilled from farm life. That is not the case today, but in Mississippi, every kid can have the opportunity to be a farm kid through 4-H and FFA. When they plug in, they learn core values taught on the farm that will take them far in life no matter their chosen career path. I encourage our Mississippi Legislature to support our youth and the longstanding traditions of the 4-H and FFA by making these strategic investments that will enhance workforce development and labor participation and will truly serve the people of Mississippi for the next 100 years.

Cozy Winter Casseroles!!

Tater Taco Casserole

1/4 cup chopped onion
1 envelope taco seasoning
2/3 cup water
1 can (11 ounces) whole kernel corn, drained
1 can (10.75 ounces) condensed fiesta nacho cheese soup, undiluted
1 package (32 ounces) frozen Tater Tots
Optional: Fresh cilantro leaves, diced tomatoes, sour cream


Preheat oven to 350°. In a large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in taco seasoning and water. Simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes. Stir in corn and soup. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Arrange Tater Tots in a single layer over the top. Bake, uncovered, until potatoes are crispy and golden brown, 30-35 minutes. If desired, top with cilantro, tomatoes and sour cream.

Loaded Red Potato Casserole

16 small red potatoes (about 1-3/4 pounds)
1/2 cup 2% milk
1/4 cup butter, cubed
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/8 teaspoon salt
1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided
1/2 cup crumbled cooked bacon
1 cup sour cream
2 tablespoons minced fresh chives

Preheat oven to 350°. Place potatoes in a 6-qt. stock-pot; add water to cover. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cook, uncovered, until tender, 15-20 minutes. Drain; return to pot. Mash potatoes, gradually adding milk, butter, pepper and salt. Spread into a greased 3-qt. baking dish and sprinkle with 1 cup cheese and bacon. Dollop with sour cream; sprinkle with chives and remaining cheese. Bake, uncovered, until heated through and cheese is melted, 20-25 minutes.

Pineapple Chicken Casserole

2 cups cubed cooked chicken
1 can (10-1/2 ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
1 cup pineapple tidbits
2 celery ribs, chopped
1 tablespoon chopped green onion
1 tablespoon reduced-sodium soy sauce
1 can (3 ounces) chow mein noodles, divided

Preheat oven to 350°. In a large bowl, combine the first 6 ingredients. Fold in 1 cup chow mein noodles. Transfer to a greased shallow 2-qt. baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining noodles. Bake, uncovered, until heated through, 20-25 minutes. If desired, top with additional green onions. Source: *TasteofHome.com*.

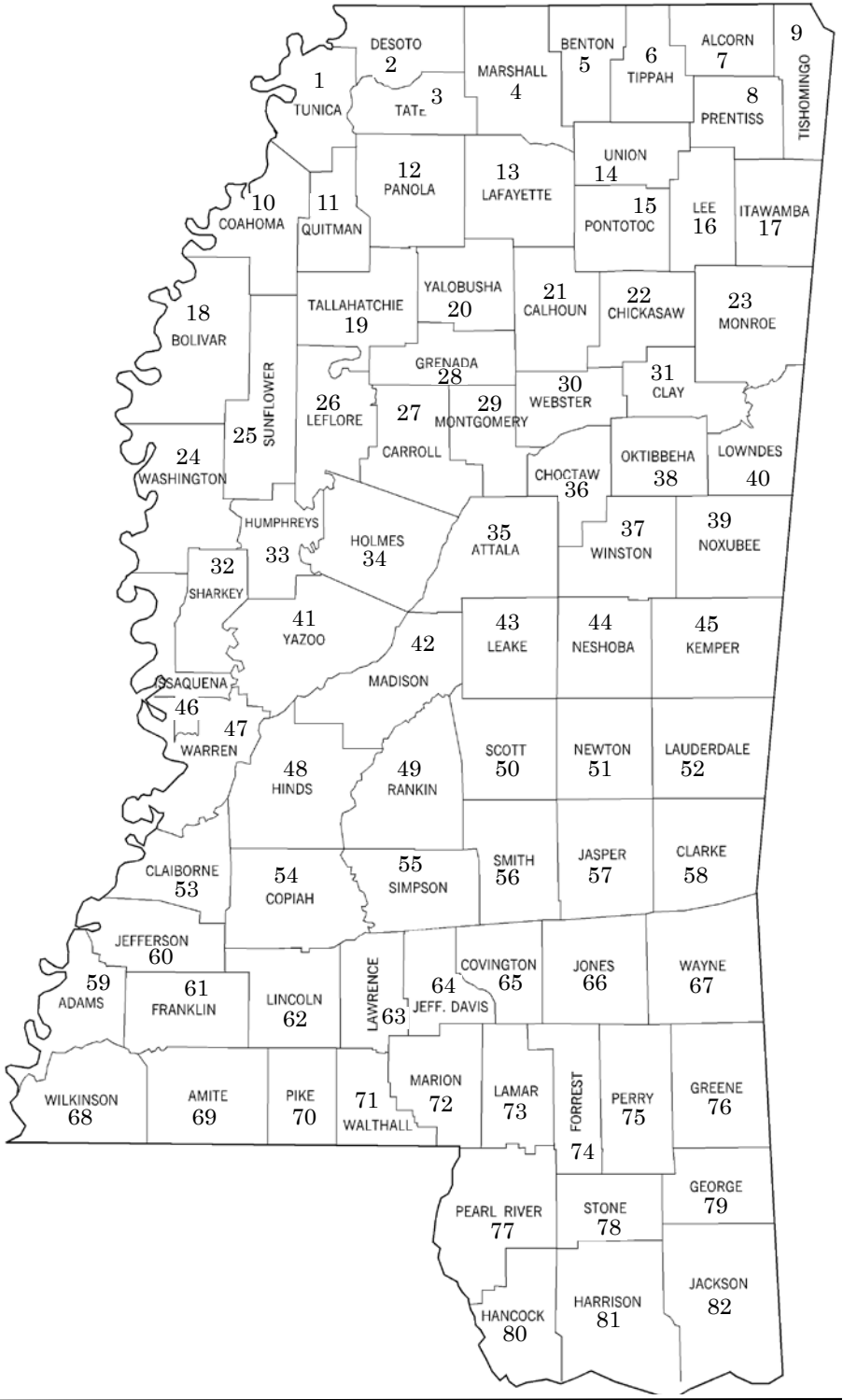

Making Things New Again

Cast iron cookware brings to mind all sorts of wonderful memories. Memories that have a life of their own. We can hear grandma's cornbread sizzle to a perfect crunch, as it is poured into the hot oil. We can smell the rich creamy smell of the chicken and veggies as we stir the dumpling pot sitting atop the stove. We can feel the heat from the black handle through the rag as we lift the skillet of biscuits from the hot oven. We see the aged hands carefully wiping the crumbs from the cornbread skillet, then smoothing the oil over the surface until it shines.

Even with all the care and love that grandma's skillet is shown, it too can fall to the wayside. Many times, we walk through a flea market or yard sale and see an old rusted piece of cookware that looks as it has seen its better days. So many people look down at the piece; they may even pick it up, lamenting to themselves what a shame it is for this to be ruined like this. They see the dirt, the rust, the years of use caked on the surface, but don't look beyond. We live in a throw away society where folks are conditioned for short term use. They fail to see past the grime into the depths of the value. They would rather hang it up for decoration or plant a pot of petunias in the front yard than take the time and effort to restore and reuse this piece.

The wonderful thing about cast iron cookware is it is very resilient.

With effort, life can be breathed back into the worn-out pieces. It can be restored and reused for the next generation to be graced by the wonderful dishes that mean so much to families.

Here at the Ag Museum, we use our cast iron to cook over the hearth on a regular basis. That means we go the extra mile to keep it seasoned and cared for. Saturday, February 3, we will be filling our cook shed firepit

with pieces of cast iron cookware in various states of disrepair. Our education team will clean and season these pieces and get them ready to be used during the upcoming event season. We would love to have you come visit the museum and see how we continue to use and care for these memorable pieces of history.

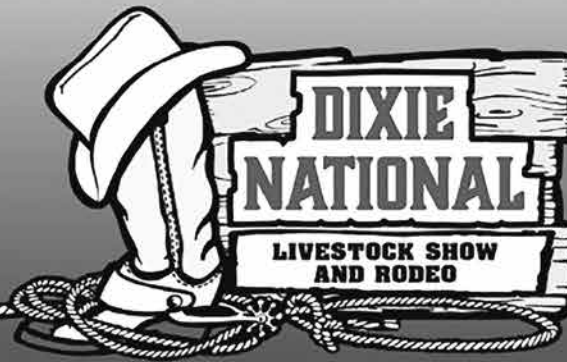

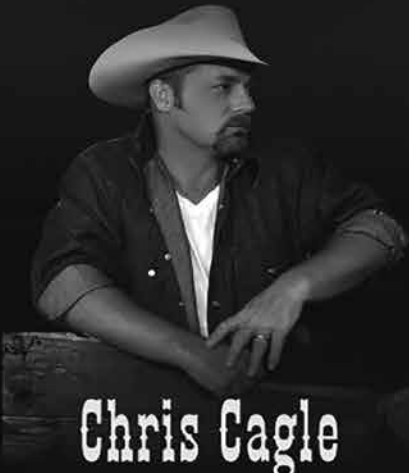

Congress Mulls Bills Meant to Help Ranchers Defend Calves From Vultures

Congress is mulling a pair of bills aimed at helping livestock producers protect their calves, kids and lambs from predatory vultures.

The bills, one in the U.S. House and the other in the Senate, target *Coragyps atratus*, the black vulture, a bird protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918. The law enacts treaties between the United States and Canada, in 1916; Mexico in 1936, Japan in 1972, and Russia in 1976. The law prohibits the “take” — killing, capturing, selling, trading, and transport — of protected migratory bird species without prior authorization by the Department of Interior U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

Black vultures are the subject of two bills filed in Congress.

Vultures are known to be carrion-eaters, cleaning up roadkill or other carcasses. However, black vultures also hunt. Among its targets are newborn cattle, goats and sheep.

The species is found in North and South America and is listed by the International Union for Conservation of Nature as a species of “least concern.” While estimates suggest that black vultures are responsible for the loss of thousands of calves every year, as a protected species, the bird may not be killed without a permit.

Because of the complexities of the treaties, obtaining a permit is not a simple process and permits are limited. Arkansas producers, permits are available through an agreement with the Arkansas Farm Bureau. What once required a minimum of two or three weeks has been reduced to a couple of days.

The aim of the bills, HR1437 and S3358, both named the Black Vulture Relief Act of 2023, is to allow livestock producers to “take” black vultures without a permit so long as the take is necessary to protect livestock, said Brigit Rollins, staff attorney for the National Agricultural Law Center.

In November, Sen. Markwayne Mullin of Oklahoma introduced the Black Vulture Relief Act which would allow livestock producers to take black vultures without a permit so long as the take is necessary to protect livestock. A similar bill was introduced in the House last March by Rep. John Rose of Tennessee.

“It’s an issue that’s been gaining prominence over the last few years, so the fact that a bill has been introduced in Congress specifically addressing it speaks to how quickly this issue has risen in importance,” Rollins said.

Cattle losses

Dana Martin Stewart of Martin Cattle Company in Judsonia has lost calves to vultures through the years.

“It is extremely frustrating to see



our calves hunted by vultures and to have very little recourse,” she said. “We spend a lot of extra time during calving season checking pastures, making sure they are up and able to nurse before the vultures get to them first.

“Losing a calf because of vultures is not only an economic loss, but also a loss of genetics that have been years in the making,” Stewart said.

In the fall of 2023, representatives from the National Cattlemen’s Beef Association and the United States Cattlemen’s Association testified to Congress about the costs of vulture predation.

“They were reporting that the number of producers affected by black vultures could range anywhere from 15 percent per state to as high as 33 percent of producers in heavily impacted areas such as Florida,” said Maggie Justice, extension beef production specialist for the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Wildlife Services reported “that black vulture attacks on cattle increased by almost 25 percent between 2020 to 2022, based on the cases in which they were called to assist,” Justice said.

“Oftentimes the vultures are going after calves as they are being born and the loss of a newborn calf can cost a producer on average, \$2,000 or higher,” Justice said. “And that number only increases if the dam is harmed at this time as well.”

Quantifying attacks is difficult. Cows often calve out of sight of humans and humans often don’t catch the birds in the act of killing livestock.

“Some livestock producers might assume the loss was to a coyote. Other times it could be a stillborn calf,” said Becky McPeake, extension wildlife specialist for the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture. “By the time the producer arrives, they might see the vultures cleaning up the carcass, not knowing whether the birds caused the death or not.”

Vulture behavior

There are two vulture species in

Arkansas. Turkey vultures are characterized by their red heads, and black vultures, with black heads. Both are year-round residents.

“Turkey vultures typically are solitary and seek carcasses by smell and sight. As a single bird, they are not known to take live animals and are relatively unaggressive,” McPeake said. “Black vultures are aggressive, as they work in groups and attack vulnerable animals. Black vultures are also known to follow a turkey vulture and rob them of their carcass.”

McPeake said that “some attribute climate change to their spread from their southern range into the U.S. As they have spread northward, more producers have been impacted.”

USDA, in its publication “Vultures,” also suggests that a ban on the pesticide DDT in 1972 may have also helped vulture populations.

“Also, vultures have benefited from fragmentation of the landscape by humans, which creates mosaics of forested and open areas for roosting, nesting and foraging,” the USDA publication states. “Vultures have clearly adapted and thrived in the presence of human activity.”

Helping ranchers

Justice said if a producer does not have a permit, there are some ways to help protect their herd:

Making sure that cattle calve in areas near human activity. “This will not only help in case of emergencies during calving but can also help to keep an eye out for vultures taking an interest in your group.”

Scare off black vultures with loud noises so they won’t return to your pasture.

Consider adding guard animals to the herd such as guardian dogs or donkeys.

“The biggest piece of advice would be that as soon as you see a black vulture near your property reach out to your Wildlife Service and your county extension agent for assistance looking into the correct depredation permits, as well as reimbursement for animal losses through the Livestock Indemnity Program,” Justice said.

The Cooperative Extension Service has additional information on black vultures.

Weather, Drought Impact Waterfowl Migration

“Where are all the ducks?” It’s a question James Callicutt fields with more frequency and urgency from hunters and birders in Mississippi by the year.

Callicutt, a Mississippi State University Extension Service instructor specializing in waterfowl and wetlands ecology, said aerial waterfowl survey data show duck abundance in the southeastern U.S. is well below average.

“Earlier this year, forecasts for an El Nino year producing a cold and wet winter had waterfowl hunters and watchers optimistic for the coming season,” he said. “Up to early January, this has been a heartbreaking year to be a duck hunter in Mississippi. Milder winter weather or dry conditions have been experienced from time to time over the years, but in the 2023-24 season we have experienced both at great extremes.”

Wetlands are popular stopping points for early- and late-migrating birds alike, but drought conditions along the flyway have left those sources of habitat drier than normal. Houston Havens, waterfowl program coordinator with the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks (MDWFP), said the complete drying of many wetlands has already taken place.

“Drought conditions have prevented many seasonal wetlands from filling due to rainfall or from groundwater well pumping,” Havens said. “Winter rains have not yet been sufficient to rebound moisture levels in many low-lying areas that would typically be flooded during winter across the state. However, some larger wetlands like lakes, cypress brakes and sloughs were able to maintain enough water through the summer and fall.”

Weather patterns and habitat availability play pivotal roles in determining whether ducks arrive in big numbers, Callicutt said.

“The drought-like conditions may have stalled early migrant ducks at northern latitudes as well,” he said.

“If it appears dry to ducks to the north of us, then it might be drier south, making an energetically costly migration a risky endeavor.”

In Mississippi, waterfowl numbers typically peak in mid- to late January, but some ducks and geese begin arriving here as early as late October and early November. For those populations, the resources found in wetlands — particularly forage — are sometimes in shorter supply, unless sufficient rainfall or water-pumping efforts occur to make these resources available to foraging waterfowl.

“Many early migrants move south in the absence of severe winter weather,” Callicutt said. “Early fall is typically one of the driest times of the year, so this makes managed flooded and naturally flooded wetlands very important for these birds.”

Colder weather events in the northern U.S. had also been lacking until mid-January, he said, which drove waterfowl abundance down more.

“Research suggests that in addition to colder temperatures, factors such as snow cover are highly influential in pushing birds south, particularly mallards,” Callicutt said. “Snow cover and depth at this time of year in northern latitudes are much less than in recent years. Additionally, waterfowl surveys conducted at mid-latitudes in the Mississippi Flyway report much greater than average waterfowl abundance compared to recent years.”

A single, large-scale weather event like the winter storm that brought ice to Mississippi in mid-January can push more southbound waterfowl into the state. Havens said MDWFP is conducting an aerial waterfowl survey in late January, and biologists expect to observe increased numbers during the flights.

“Many of Mississippi’s quality-managed, shallow wetlands, which produce a lot of waterfowl forage sources, froze during the extreme cold temperatures,” he noted, “so ducks will likely become concentrated on large, deep, or flowing water bodies until shallow wetlands thaw.”
