Dixie National Sales Surpass \$9 Million

Hinds County 4-H'er Mason Williams had already represented Mississippi in a national competition less than a year ago, so showing animals in a statewide event was no sweat.

"Those experiences make it a little bit easier to be in front of all those people," Williams said. "It doesn't take all the pressure away, but it makes it easier to manage, so when you walk out there and see everybody, you don't get stage fright."

Williams' hard work paid off when he placed a goat in the Dixie National Sale of Junior Champions and the highest bid was \$8,000. More than 2,500 animals across the state com-

peted in the Dixie National Junior Round-Up leading up to the sale. Of those, only 53 advanced.

A high school sophomore, Williams has been showing animals since he was 8 years old. Last year, he was one of only four Mississippi 4-H'ers to compete in the National 4-H Livestock Skillathon Contest. He attributes his social development to the opportunities 4-H membership has given him.

"I think it's helped me get out of my shell a little," he said. "I've always been kind of an introvert, but I enjoy competing and the feeling of winning and all that hard work paying off."

This year's sale, the 55th consecutive one, marked several milestones. It surpassed the \$9 million mark in total sales, broke the record for the total number of champion market animals featured with 53, and set a new record sale total, \$484,010.

Another record was also set: the highest price paid for a steer in sale history. The grand champion steer shown by Tripp McGee of Jones 4-H was sold for \$30,000 to the highest bidding group.

Held February 8 at the Mississippi

Trade Mart, the Sale of Junior Champions included eight steers, 17 hogs, 12 lambs, 12 goats, and four hair sheep. The shows featured 1,225 members of 4-H and FFA showing 2,084 animals. **For photos of the 2024 Sale of Junior Champions see pages 18-25.**

Dean Jousan, 4-H livestock specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said events like Dixie National help young people build life skills that will serve them now and into adulthood.

"The exhibitors with champion market animals began a lengthy process of raising them many months ago," he said. "Getting any animal show-ready is challenging, but having one reach the sale should be a source of pride for these young people because they've gone the extra mile."

The Sale of Junior Champions Promotion Committee awarded 25 \$1,500 scholarships to exhibitors who are high school seniors, six \$2,000 scholarships to premier exhibitors and eight \$1,500 scholarships to owners of supreme champion livestock. In total, the committee awarded \$61,500 in scholarships.

From Farm to Table, Transportation Infrastructure Requires Dedicated Funding

Fresh farm-raised food from the garden usually follows a simple and inexpensive path, and often the farmer is also the cook and the consumer. On the larger and more common commercial scale, farm-to-table food is a bit more complicated: traveling over local roads, state highways, and federal interstates; multiplied tons of poultry, soybeans, livestock and corn requiring reliable bridges and safe roadways. From the farm to a processor or packager, to a wholesaler, to your grocery store (or a grocery store across the world), Mississippi’s agricultural industry – food, fiber, fuel – requires reliable transportation infrastructure. Our State must invest in our own transportation infrastructure, and I believe we can do it without additional taxes.

For many years, budget restrictions had forced the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) to focus on routine maintenance and paving and forego new projects. But fortunately, thanks to one-time funding from the Mississippi Legislature

and Federal Aid Highway Program funds, MDOT has restarted its “Capacity Program” including major new construction projects in 2021.

Mississippi needs to keep that transportation momentum. Currently, much of the state funded portion of the MDOT budget comes from a fuel tax diversion. When we fill up at the gas station, for every gallon of gas we purchase at the pump we pay 18 cents, the vast majority of which is diverted by the state to MDOT. Rather than increasing taxes on gasoline at the pump, in a recent column Transportation Commission Chairman Willie Simmons and MDOT Executive Director Brad White shared another solution I read with great interest as Ag Commissioner.

They urge a more diversified funding approach with the Legislature combining “unobligated portions of revenue streams such as the use tax and gaming revenue” with the current fuel tax to provide for the maintenance and future development of our transportation system. This approach would actually fill the gap in funding without raising anyone’s taxes.

Assigning these taxes already be-

ing collected toward MDOT (rather than creating new taxes or raising current taxes) provides a predictable, consistent, and diverse funding stream which allows for long term planning and enhances the state’s ability to maximize federal highway funds. Importantly, it doesn’t increase the cost burden on Mississippians at the pump. In a largely rural state like Mississippi in which long mileage daily commutes are common, fuel costs significantly impact our workers, farmers, and families. And when it comes to moving the agricultural commodities that fuel our economy, good roads and safe bridges don’t help if you can’t afford to fill the gas tank of the transport truck.

I support this idea of assigning existing revenue to MDOT’s budget to fund new construction and perform maintenance in a way that does not raise taxes. I encourage the Legislature to find permanent dedicated streams of revenue as requested by the Mississippi Department of Transportation.

Safe and reliable transportation infrastructure is required for Mississippi’s agriculture and commerce.

Enhancing our infrastructure takes time and money so we can continue to be competitive in our country and in the global economy. Part of planning for the future is planning for future budgets, and I believe Willie Simmons and Brad White are on target with their recommendation that avoids tax increases.


Agriculture, our State’s largest industry, depends on roadways and bridges to move products from the field for shipment to market – from the farm gate to our dinner plate. Transportation delays can cost farmers and agribusinesses time and money. Responsible decisions that don’t raise taxes will help keep our Mississippi food supply abundant and affordable.

Honey Pulled Pork Subs

1 small onion, finely chopped
1 boneless pork shoulder butt roast (2-1/2 pounds)
1 bottle (18 ounces) barbecue sauce
1/2 cup water
1/4 cup honey
6 garlic cloves, minced
1 teaspoon seasoned salt
1 teaspoon ground ginger
8 submarine buns, split

Place onion and roast in a 5-qt. slow cooker. In a small bowl, combine the barbecue sauce, water, honey, garlic, seasoned salt and ginger; pour over meat. Cover and cook on high 5-6 hours or until meat is tender. Remove meat; cool slightly. Shred meat with 2 forks and return to the slow cooker; heat through. Serve on buns. Cut sandwiches in half.

Open-Faced Egg Sandwiches

4 large egg whites
2 large eggs
2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
2 teaspoons butter, softened
2 slices whole wheat bread, toasted
1/8 teaspoon dried rosemary, crushed
1/8 teaspoon pepper

Sweet and Spicy Peanut Butter-Bacon Sandwiches

1/4 cup peanut butter
4 slices cinnamon-raisin bread
1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
4 crisp cooked bacon strips
2 teaspoons honey

Spread peanut butter on 2 bread slices; sprinkle with cayenne. Top with bacon and drizzle with honey. Top with remaining bread.

Loaded Avocado BLT


1/2 small ripe avocado, peeled
2 tablespoons mayonnaise
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice
2 tablespoons crumbled Gorgonzola cheese
4 slices Italian bread, toasted
1-1/2 cups fresh baby spinach
4 tomato slices
4 thick-sliced applewood smoked bacon strips, cooked

Turkey Dijon Melts

4 slices whole wheat bread
4 teaspoons mayonnaise
1/4 pound thinly sliced cooked turkey
2 slices Monterey Jack cheese
1/4 cup thinly sliced onion
Dash salt and pepper
1 tablespoon honey Dijon salad dressing
1 tablespoon butter, softened

Spread 2 slices of bread with mayonnaise. Layer with turkey, cheese and onion; sprinkle with salt and pepper. Spread remaining slices of bread with salad dressing; place over onion. Spread the outsides of sandwiches with butter. In a large skillet, toast sandwiches over medium heat until golden brown and cheese is melted, 4-5 minutes per side.

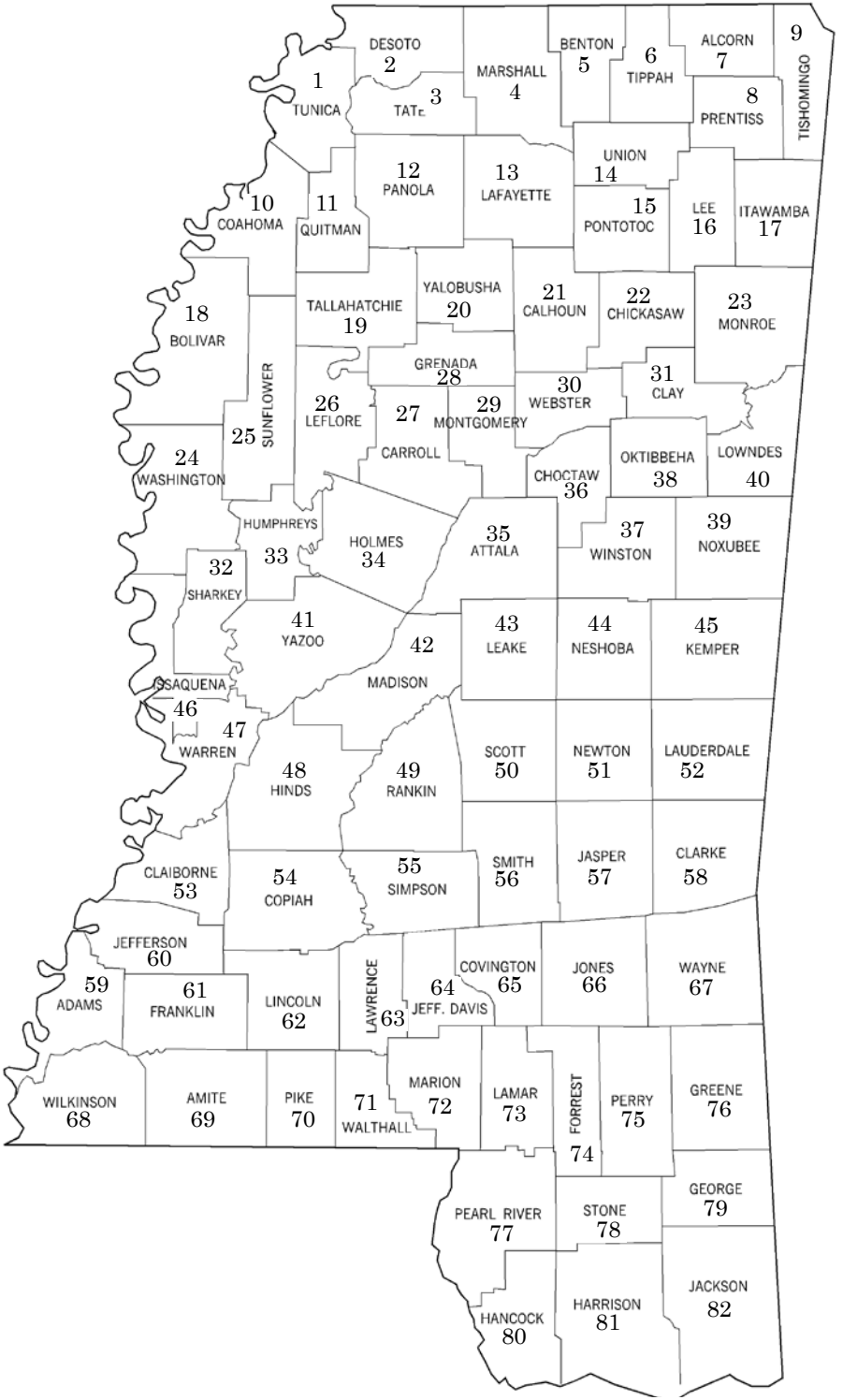

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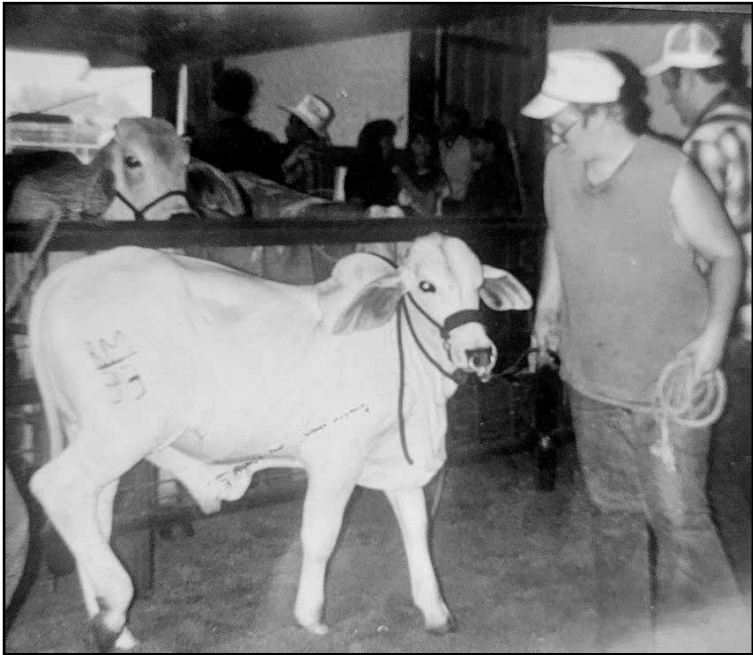

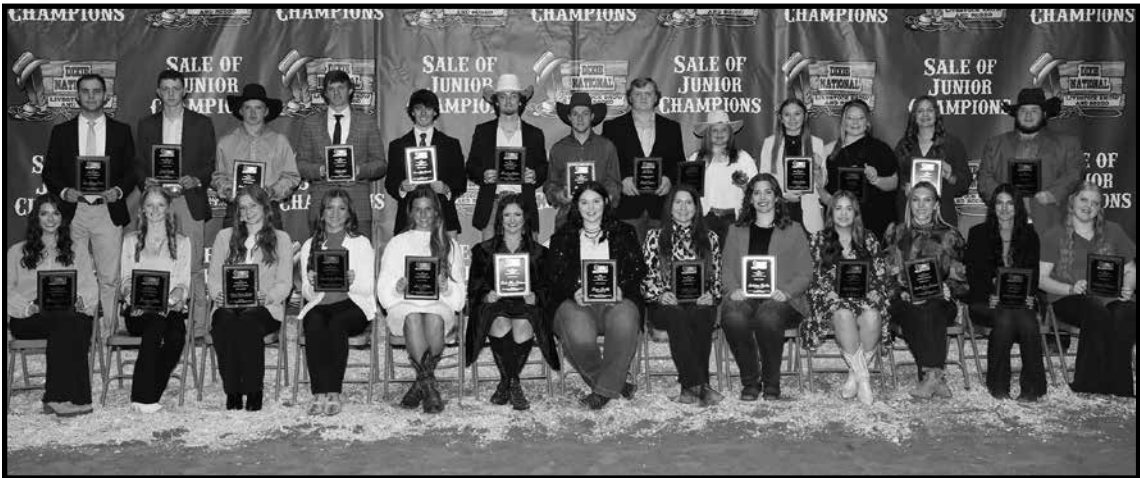

MDAC Now Accepting Applications for Specialty Crop Block Grant

Commissioner Andy Gipson announced the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) is now accepting proposals for the 2024 Specialty Crop Block Grant Program.

The Specialty Crop Block Grant Program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and authorized by the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (Farm Bill). The purpose of the program is to enhance the competitiveness of Mississippi's specialty crop industry by leveraging efforts to market and promote specialty crops; assisting producers with research and development relevant to specialty crops; expanding availability and access to specialty crops; and addressing local, regional and national challenges confronting specialty crop producers.

Specialty crops are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture and nursery crops, including floriculture. Specialty crops are an important part of Mississippi's agriculture, accounting for more than \$205 million of our state's agriculture industry last year.

Past project examples include increasing awareness and consumption of specialty crops to school-aged children through garden grants; developing and implementing promotional and marketing campaigns to educate the public on the benefits of buying and consuming locally-grown specialty crops; improving food safety through Good Agricultural Practices; evaluating management strategies to improve health of honey bee colonies; evaluating potential new crops for viable production in the state; grower training and educational workshops on improving specialty crop production and increasing marketing opportunities; evaluating grafting techniques in toma-

toes for improving plant disease resistance, productivity and quality; evaluating native Christmas trees for increased production in Mississippi; and high tunnel research trials on a variety of fruits, vegetables and herbs.

Eligible applicants include producer groups and associations, non-profits, colleges and universities. Funding will not be awarded to projects that solely benefit a particular commercial product or provide a profit to a single organization, institution or individual. Single organizations, institutions and individuals are encouraged to participate as project partners. Applications must be submitted to MDAC by Wednesday, March 20, 2024. For best decorative floats, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce's Genuine MS® Program, based out of Hinds County, received first place and the Mystic Wind Choctaw Dancers of Neshoba County received second place. In best riding clubs, Deviney Equipment and Massey Cattle Company of Hinds County were awarded first place, and the Chula Homa

Hounds of Madison County took home second.

Eight individual wagon trains from around the state of Mississippi make up the famous Dixie National Wagon Train. This year, Mississippi's Miss Hospitality Abney Grace Pittman awarded third place to the North Wagon Train, second place went to the Smith County Wagon Train, and the Mt. Olive Wagon Train took home first place.

In addition, one group in particular stood out and was determined to be the best overall participant by the parade judges. This year, the Mt. Olive Wagon Train was also awarded the 2024 Commissioner's Award.
