Sustainable Practices Can Extend to Gardens, Lawns

Many of the practices associated with sustainability, such as recycling, can be extended into the garden.

Composting is a way to help reduce organic waste that goes to the landfill and helps feed gardens. These organic materials, which include grass clippings, leaves and other yard wastes, account for about 30% of trash that goes to the landfill.

“By composting these organic waste materials, homeowners can produce beneficial material that can be used in the garden, lawn and landscape,” said Jeff Wilson, horticulture specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. “Re-

turning these organic waste materials to the land maintains natural biological cycles. It is an ecologically sensible and environmentally safe way to use organic waste materials.”

Compost creates the perfect conditioner to help soil maintain proper moisture content. It also reduces soil compaction, increases the presence of earthworms and beneficial microorganisms, and provides a slow release of nutrients into the soil.

Creating a compost pile is simple, but it does require some patience and know-how. Usable compost can take from 6 months to 2 years to generate depending on several factors. Pile placement and size is important to properly break down the contents. For more information about starting a compost pile, consult MSU Extension Publication 1782, “Composting for the Mississippi Gardener.”

Whether gardeners use compost or not, soil testing is an important step before planting. Soil test results provide recommendations for fertilizer

and lime. Lime helps increase soil pH.

While samples can be taken any time, it is best to send in soil samples 2 to 3 months before planting.

“Lime can take 2 to 3 months to neutralize soil acidity, so getting your soil testing results well ahead

of time allows for purchase, application and activation of the liming material,” said Keri Jones, MSU Soil Testing Laboratory manager. “Soil pH should be in an optimal zone for the plants you are trying to grow well before any application of fertilizer.”

Soil test results help gardeners apply accurate fertilizer amounts only when needed. The results are customized to specific plants and give gardeners target dates for application.

“Without an optimized application rate, growers are left to guess the amount the plant needs. If the guessed application rate is too low, the plants won’t reach full growth and/or yield potential,” Jones explained. “If the guessed application is too high, fertilizer is wasted because there is no advantage to the plant when you apply additional amounts. Excess fertilizer can also end up in waterways, which is bad for the environment.

“Commercial fertilizers are sold as salts,” she added. “If we overapply fertilizer salt to the soil, eventually the plants will have a difficult time accessing water from the soil.”

Sherry Surrette, associate Extension

professor of sustainable living, said gardeners can also incorporate products into their gardening chores that help protect natural resources. She recommends gardeners consider:

- Installing rain barrels. These vessels capture rainwater that can be used to water garden plants instead of using groundwater. They can be made from recycled materials or purchased. When choosing or making a rain barrel be sure to follow certain guidelines to ensure the water is clean. Learn more about rain barrels in MSU Extension Publication 3146, “Water Conservation in Your Landscape.”

- Using biodegradable peat pots. These pots can be planted directly into the ground when it is time to transfer seedlings to the garden.

- Installing nonplastic, biodegradable landscape fabric. This is available commercially. Newspapers can also be used as a weed barrier.

- Purchasing electric-powered lawn care equipment. Tools, such as mowers, weed eaters and leaf blowers, are more energy efficient, require less maintenance and produce less greenhouse gas emissions compared to gas-powered equipment.

Rankin County Major Economic Development Project to Enhance Local Food Supply, Storage and Distribution in Mississippi Announced

I recently announced an economic development project, which includes the first of its kind food supply, storage and distribution hub – the Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex. The Market Complex will be located in Brandon, Mississippi.

It has been said that ‘Food security is national security.’ We are excited to announce the first step in our Mississippi Strategic Agriculture Facilities Expansion (S.A.F.E.) Plan to create long-term food supply, storage and distribution resiliency for all the people of Mississippi. As I outlined at the 2023 Neshoba County Fair, I am convinced that rebuilding Mississippi’s local food supply, storage and distribution is the critical issue we must tackle as we move Mississippi into the future. Today, I am very pleased to announce the first major step toward that vision with a new economic development project to be located in Rankin County, Mississippi.

With unanimous support from the Rankin County Board of Supervisors, Rankin First and the City of Brandon, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce is launching a new type of Farmers Market featuring not only fresh local products such as poultry, beef, pork, blueberries, sweet potatoes, watermelons, peas and beans, tomatoes, muscadines, rice, peanuts, pecans, dairy, catfish and much more – but also frozen and dried products that can be stored and distributed and sold to consumers throughout the year. The Genuine Mississippi Market Complex will immediately result in new markets and business opportunities for all our Mississippi farmers and for all local

food products grown, raised, crafted and made right here in Mississippi. The Market Complex will also provide real world Training and Workforce Development opportunities for Mississippi’s 4-H and FFA youth interested in exploring available agricultural and commerce career paths.

Rankin County Board of Supervisors President Steve Gaines commented, “No one can question the commitment of the Rankin County Board of Supervisors to support and promote agriculture and the well-being of the farm families of Rankin County and our State. Commissioner Gipson’s desire to bring an agriculture-focused, economic development and tourism project to the heart of Rankin County is a testimony to the leadership of this great county who have made every effort to prepare Rankin County for success. I am excited most of all for the next generations of farm families who will call Rankin County home. The Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex will afford our families with any number of opportunities not currently available to them. We are grateful for this opportunity to partner with Commissioner Gipson, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce and the City of Brandon in this great effort.”

The Genuine Mississippi Market Complex will be located on approximately 153 undeveloped acres on Mississippi Highway 18 near the front door of future economic development for Rankin County. This Market Complex will be unlike any other existing development in the State of Mississippi. It will feature the full farm-to-table experience for retail consumers whether shopping for fresh farm-raised produce in season, high quality meat products such

as beef, chicken, pork and catfish, or frozen or dried products for cooking at home. Visitors will also be able to sit down at a table to enjoy a delicious fresh-cooked meal of Genuine MS® products.

“At the request of the Department of Agriculture and the Rankin County Board of Supervisors, we are pleased to participate in the Genuine Mississippi Market Complex project. It will be a wonderful addition to our county and spur additional economic and tourism development,” said Noel Daniels, President of Rankin First.

Seasonal agriculture-themed events will be held at the Market Complex throughout the year to highlight the great strength and variety of Mississippi’s agricultural products and commodities.

Additionally, the Genuine Mississippi Market Complex will include commercial wholesale food storage and processing components operated by the private sector for distribution to other retail locations including local grocery stores, restaurants and farmers markets. The overall site development will be overseen by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce with input and private investments from the agricultural industry and private sector partners.

This development will become a Mississippi agriculture-themed destination for thousands of visitors and customers that will spur additional tourism and private investment in and around Rankin County.

“The announcement of the Market Complex to be located on Hwy 18 in Brandon is an exciting addition to our area,” said Brandon Mayor Butch Lee. “Improving access to local, fresh meat, produce and other farm-raised products is a tremendous plus for

the quality of life for our residents. Clearly this will expand the production of produce and local food on small farms in the region, expanding their access to the consumer. Springtime Salads!!

Old-Fashioned Southern Chicken Salad

4 cups chopped cooked chicken
2 hard-cooked eggs, peeled and chopped
1 cup chopped celery
1/4 cup chopped onion
2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
3/4 teaspoon table salt
1/2 teaspoon celery salt
1/8 teaspoon ground white pepper
Dash of ground red pepper
3/4 cup mayonnaise
1/2 teaspoon paprika
Fresh parsley, for garnish

Gently toss together first 9 ingredients in a bowl. Fold in 1/2 cup of the mayonnaise; cover and chill 2 hours. Stir in remaining 1/4 cup mayonnaise. Spoon chicken salad into a serving dish; sprinkle with paprika. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Strawberry Spinach Salad

1 small Vidalia onion, chopped (1/2 cup)
1/2 cup light olive oil
3 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar
1 tablespoon plus 2 tsp. granulated sugar
1 tablespoon mayonnaise
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
1/4 teaspoon kosher salt

1 (10-oz.) pkg. fresh spinach
1 pound fresh strawberries, stemmed and halved (2 1/2 cups)
4 ounces blue cheese, crumbled (about 1 cup)
1 cup chopped candied pecans

Process onion, oil, vinegar, sugar, mayonnaise, mustard, and salt in a blender until creamy and smooth, about 50 seconds. Arrange spinach, strawberries, blue cheese, and pecans on a large platter. Drizzle with dressing. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Farmers Market Pasta Salad

2 cups halved baby heirloom tomatoes
2 small zucchini, thinly sliced into half moons
1 small red bell pepper, cut into thin strips
1 cup fresh corn kernels
1 cup diced firm, ripe fresh peaches (about 2 medium)
1/2 cup thinly sliced green onions
1 Parmesan Vinaigrette
2 (8-oz.) package penne pasta
1/3 cups shredded smoked chicken (about 10 oz.)
1/3 cup torn fresh basil
cup torn fresh cilantro

Toss together first 7 ingredients in a large bowl, and let stand 10 minutes. Meanwhile, prepare pasta according to package directions. Add hot cooked pasta and chicken to tomato mixture; toss gently to coat. Season

with salt and pepper to taste. Transfer to a serving platter, and top with basil and cilantro. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Spring Salad with Berries & Bacon

2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
1 tablespoon finely chopped shallot (from 1 shallot)
1 1/2 teaspoons honey
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
3 cups sliced strawberries (from 1 lb. fresh strawberries), divided
3/4 teaspoon kosher salt, divided
1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
5 cups baby spring mix (from 2 [5-oz.] pkg.)
1 (4-oz.) feta cheese block, crumbled
1 medium shallot, thinly sliced lengthwise
1 cup yellow cherry tomatoes, halved
8 bacon slices, cooked and coarsely chopped

Place red wine vinegar, finely chopped shallot, honey, Dijon mustard, 1 cup of the strawberries, and 1/4 teaspoon of the kosher salt in a blender. Process until smooth, about 30 seconds. With blender running, gradually drizzle in oil, processing until mixture is smooth and combined, about 30 seconds. Arrange spring mix on a large platter. Top with feta, sliced shallot, tomatoes, bacon, and remaining 2 cups strawberries and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Drizzle vinaigrette over salad, and serve immediately. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

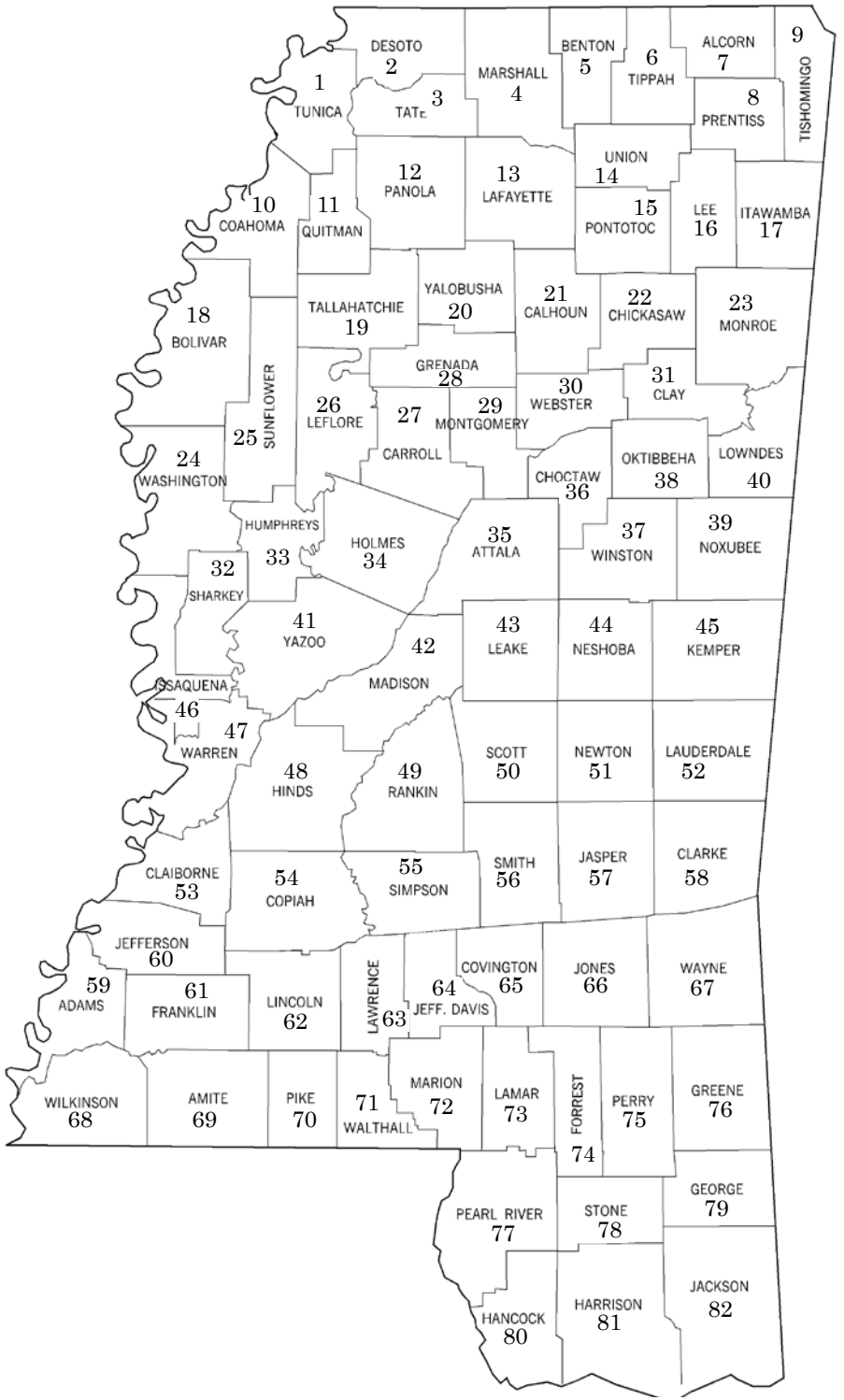

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Foresters Expect Bark Beetle Risk to Rise in Spring

As drought takes its toll on Mississippi's trees, foresters encourage landowners and homeowners to be on the lookout for pine bark beetles as spring arrives.

Butch Bailey, a forester with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said most of the tree death people are seeing across the state is a result of the ongoing drought that began last summer. However, activity by Ips beetles increased in late 2023, and conditions are right to have increased activity in 2024.

"Anyone who has pine trees, whether in a yard or a forest, is potentially at risk," Bailey said. "The beetles will seek out stressed trees, such as those that were struck by lightning, are overcrowded or stressed from lack of water."

In Mississippi, there are five species of pine bark beetles that attack pines. Three of these are Ips beetles. All five species are always present, but Ips are of special concern for drought-stressed trees.

"The good news is that while Ips can cause a lot of damage, they're not as bad as the southern pine beetle species. And we aren't seeing a huge amount of southern pine beetles," Bailey said.

Bailey recommends landowners and homeowners keep an eye on their pines going into spring.

Ips activity is typically highest in November and lessens as temperatures drop and available groundwater increases into the winter. Trap counts by the Mississippi Forestry Commission and the U.S. Forest Service will help give a clearer picture of what infestation levels landowners may see this year.

"All timberland owners can rest easy for now, but I'd be sure to watch my pine stands closely as temperatures warm up into the spring," Bailey said. "The drought is a compounding factor that is going to lead

to an increase in beetle activity."

Initial signs of Ips include pitch tubes, yellowing needles at the top of the tree or sawdust-like boring dust at the base of the tree. Pitch tubes are dried, white balls of sap that look like popcorn stuck to the bark of the tree.

"These tubes are where the beetles enter the tree. You have to be looking for them to see them," Bailey said. "Most landowners don't see the signs of attack until they notice the crown turning red and/or brown or the bark slipping off. Unfortunately, by this point, the damage is long done, and the tree is dead."

Curtis VanderSchaaf, Extension forestry specialist, said once Ips infest a tree little can be done. The best way to avoid an Ips beetle infestation is to keep trees healthy.

VanderSchaaf recommends that homeowners:

- Remove trees to prevent overcrowding. Pine trees in a home landscape need at least 15 to 20 feet of space.
- Remove underbrush and competing hardwoods.
- Apply mulch properly to help conserve moisture.
- Water valuable trees deeply during extreme drought.

In forests, thinning is the best method to keep trees healthy. Market conditions in some areas of the state do not support this option.

"In most cases, forested Ips infestations should be left alone to avoid further damage and attraction of beetles to other trees," VanderSchaaf said.

If there are no active beetles or brood present, dead trees pose no threat to the forest. Instead, these trees provide habitat for natural predators of Ips beetles, such as lizards, spiders, birds and other beetle species.

VanderSchaaf noted that landown-

ers and homeowners should take steps to help ensure trees stay healthy in certain situations or conditions, including hurricanes, tornadoes, wildfires, lightning strikes, ice storms, construction and extreme drought.

"When any of these things occur, you should begin regularly checking your trees for more definitive symptoms or signs of Ips infestation," VanderSchaaf said. "For example, when drought occurs for two weeks, I would begin checking my trees. In a yard setting, for highly valuable trees, I would consider beginning supplemental waterings."

Dead trees in home landscapes should always be removed if they pose a threat to humans, pets or structures.

"I tell homeowners who have a standing dead tree that they have only one decision to make," Bailey said. "They can let Mother Nature remove the tree at a random time and place and hope no one gets hurt, or they can pick the time and place to have it removed safely."

"It's a fact that having a tree removed by a professional can be expensive but remember that you're not paying for the tree to come down, that will happen anyway. What you're paying for is for it to come down safely," he said.

When having any work done, especially dangerous work such as tree removal, homeowners should look for a person or company that is licensed and insured. Bailey recommends using an arborist who is certified through the International Society of Arboriculture.

Think Twice Before Buying Online

Mississippi Agricultural & Livestock Theft Bureau (MALTB) is warning residents about online scams involving livestock and farm related items. MALTB has had several calls where Mississippians have been scammed from online horse purchases. Most recently, MALTB has had reports of online hay scams. These scammers may create fake listings, misrepresent the quality or quantity of the hay, or even take payment without delivering the product. When the buyer reaches out to the seller to discuss the issue, the seller does not return any phone calls or text messages. MALTB Director, Dean Barnard says "to avoid falling victim to such scams I recommend everyone to exercise caution when purchasing online. A few tips I have are:

- Verify the seller: always verify the legitimacy of the seller before making any payments. Check for reviews or ask for references from other buyers.
- Be aware of payment methods: Avoid sending money through wire transfers, cryptocurrency, or prepaid cards. These payment methods are often irreversible and favored by



scammers.

- Be wary of unrealistic offers: if an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is. Exercise caution and trust your instincts.

"We understand buying hay is an important investment for your farm, and we want to help protect your livelihood" says Director Dean Barnard.
