Groundbreaking Held for the New Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Complex in Rankin County

Recently, Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson, along with Rankin County and City of Brandon officials, broke ground on the new Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex, located off Highway 18 in Brandon. Commissioner Gipson was joined by Pastor Gene Henderson; Supervisor Steve Gaines, President of the Rankin County Board of Supervisors; Noel Daniels, President of Rankin First; and Mayor Butch Lee, City of Brandon. In conjunction with celebrating Na-

tional Agriculture Day and recognizing the importance of agriculture to the State of Mississippi, Commissioner Gipson discussed the vision to support local farmers emphasizing the groundbreaking was about having a vision – a vision for the State of Mississippi to become the epicenter of food production, storage and distribution in the southeastern United States. The Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex is Phase 1 of the Mississippi Strategic Agriculture Facilities Expansion (S.A.F.E.) Plan announced in July 2023. The Complex will be Mississippi's first-ever local food supply, storage and distribution hub.

"Today is a day we will always remember as a state and as a country when we had the vision to plan ahead for our local food supply. Food security is national security. America's strength internationally is driven in large measure by our strength to produce not only food for our people here in Mississippi but also for people around the world," said Commissioner Gipson. "This vision is about growing markets for our local farmers, making new opportunities for our local farmers at the same time as we bring new opportunities for local consumers who want fresh local food."

Defining vision as 'the ability to see the invisible,' Commissioner Gipson challenged attendees to see the vision for the Market Complex by 'seeing' the challenges, solutions and opportunities. Commissioner Gipson outlined the challenges of the local food supply chain including the supply chain shortages resulting from the Covid pandemic; fewer number of farmers today; foreign interests in purchasing farmland; weather-related events such as storms and drought; and federal regulation overreach. Emphasizing farmers being the an-

swer to the challenges, Commissioner Gipson offered solutions including supporting and strengthening local food supply systems, growing markets for local farmers, enhancing existing markets and the innovative creation of new markets for local food through programs such as Genuine MS®.

Commissioner Gipson highlighted four economic development opportunities: expanding workforce development opportunities for 4-H and FFA students; the opportunity for Mississippi to become the epicenter of food production with the predicted shift of food production from the west to the southeast U.S. due to water shortages; the ability for the Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex to become a destination for consumers to experience Mississippi's agricultural products and for farmers to market their products; and growing international trade opportunities.

Commissioner Gipson thanked partners Rankin County Board of Supervisors, Rankin First, and the City of Brandon for their leadership and support of this project.

"No one can question the commitment of the Rankin County Board of

Supervisors to support and promote agriculture and the well-being of the farm families of Rankin County and our region. Commissioner Gipson's desire to bring an agriculture-focused, economic development and tourism project to the heart of Rankin County is a testimony to the leadership of this great county who have made every effort to prepare Rankin County for success. I am excited most of all for the next generations of farm families who will call Rankin County home. The Genuine Mississippi Agricultural Market Complex will afford our families with any number of opportunities not currently available to them. We are grateful for this opportunity to partner with Commissioner Gipson, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and the City of Brandon in this great effort," said Supervisor Gaines.

"Rankin First is pleased to participate in the Genuine Mississippi Market Complex project. It will be a wonderful addition to our County and spur additional economic and tourism development. We look forward to welcoming visitors from all over our great State and the United States as they come to this unique one-of-

a-kind marketplace complex," said President Daniels.

The Market Complex will be located on Mississippi Highway 18 near the front door of future economic development for Rankin County. It will feature the full farm-to-table experience for retail consumers whether shopping for fresh farm-raised produce in season, high quality meat products such as beef, chicken, pork and catfish, or frozen or dried products for cooking at home. Visitors will also be able to enjoy a delicious fresh-cooked meal of Genuine MS® products.

"We are encouraged by the continued growth and development of the Hwy 18 corridor in the City of Brandon," said Mayor Lee. "Commissioner Gipson's vision and dedication to locate the Genuine MS Agricultural Complex closer to Rankin County consumers is greatly appreciated. Along with benefiting our area farmers, the benefits of convenient access to farm fresh foods positively effects the health and wellness of all residents in Brandon and Rankin County."

The Genuine Mississippi Market Complex will include commercial wholesale food storage and processing components operated by the private sector for distribution to other retail locations including local grocery stores, restaurants and farmers markets. The overall site development will be overseen by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce with input and private investments from the agricultural industry and private sector partners.

Officials expect the first phase of the development to be initiated by the private sector within the year and anticipate completion of the project over the next two to four years.

Recipes as Sweet as Honey!



Balsamic Honey BBQ Chicken

For Balsamic Honey BBQ Sauce:
1 cup - store bought BBQ Sauce
1/2 cup - honey
3 T - Sriracha sauce
2 T - balsamic vinegar
3 T - butter
2 tsp. - garlic paste or minced fresh garlic

For BBQ Chicken:
1 tsp. - salt
1 tsp. - garlic powder
1 tsp. - paprika
1/2 tsp. - ground black pepper
1 tsp. - sugar
6 - boneless chicken breasts
2 T - olive oil

Preheat oven to 375°F. Combine all the BBQ sauce ingredients and simmer for 25-30 minutes. Combine the salt, garlic powder, paprika, black pepper and sugar. Lay out the chicken breast on a sheet pan, drizzle with the olive oil and sprinkle with the spice mixture. Bake for 20 minutes. Baste the chicken with the Balsamic Honey BBQ sauce and continue to bake for another 12-15 minutes until the sauce begins to caramelize and the juices run clear when the chicken is pierced with a fork. Serve alongside the remainder of the sauce.

Honey Lemon Bars

1 cup - all-purpose flour
1/4 cup - powdered sugar
3/4 cup - butter or margarine, cut up
3/4 cup - honey
3 - eggs
2 T - all-purpose flour
3 T - fresh lemon juice
zest from one lemon
1/2 tsp. - baking powder
1/4 tsp. - salt

In small bowl, combine flour and powdered sugar; mix well. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Press mixture into lightly greased 8 x 8-inch baking pan. Bake at 350°F 12 to 15 minutes or until lightly browned; remove from oven. Meanwhile, prepare filling. In large bowl, whisk together honey and eggs. Add remaining ingredients; whisk until well blended. Pour over baked crust. Bake at 350°F 25 to 30 minutes or until filling is set. Cool completely on wire rack. Cut into bars

Honey Bronzed Brisket

4 lbs. - center-cut beef brisket, trimmed
Salt and pepper, to taste
4 medium - onions, thinly sliced
2 cloves - garlic, thinly sliced
1/2 cup - honey
1/4 cup - Dijon mustard
1/4 cup - dry white wine
1/2 tsp. - dried thyme leaves, crushed

Sprinkle both sides of brisket with salt and pepper. Heat large Dutch oven or covered pan on stove top. Add brisket and brown on all sides. Remove to platter. Add onions and garlic to pan; cook until golden and slightly softened, about 5 minutes. Meanwhile, in small bowl, whisk together honey, mustard, wine and thyme. Return brisket to pan, placing on top of onions. Pour juices from brisket platter and about 3/4 of honey-wine mixture over brisket. Add 1 cup of water to pan. Bring to a boil. Cover and transfer to oven; bake at 350°F for 2-1/2 hours, basting with pan juices every 20 to 30 minutes. Uncover and pour remaining honey-wine mixture over brisket. (Onion mixture will be a dark bronze color at this point.) Bake uncovered for another 20 minutes. Remove brisket to platter, cover and let sit about 15 minutes. Remove fat from pan juices and season with salt and pepper. To serve, slice brisket across grain. Serve with onions and drizzle with pan juices.

Honey Oatmeal Cookies

1/2 cup - hot water, or hot black tea
1 cup - raisins
2 cups - flour
1 1/2 cups - quick cooking rolled oats
1 tsp. - baking soda
1 tsp. - ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp. - salt
1/2 tsp. - ground nutmeg
1 cup - butter
3/4 cup - honey
1 - egg
1 tsp. - vanilla
1/2 to 1 cup - chopped walnuts
1 package (6 oz.) - chocolate chips, optional

Pour hot water/tea over raisins; let stand at least 15 minutes. Combine flour, oats, baking soda, cinnamon, salt and nutmeg. Mix thoroughly; set aside. Cream butter; gradually add honey until light and fluffy. Beat in egg and vanilla. Drain raisins; reserve 1/4 cup liquid. Alternately add flour mixture and reserved raisin liquid. Stir in nuts, raisins and chocolate chips. Chill dough for at least one hour. Drop by rounded teaspoonfuls 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 350°F about 12 minutes or until browned. Let stand one minute on cookie sheet; remove and cool on rack.

Honeyed Party Mix

4 cups - rice, corn or wheat cereal squares
4 cups - small pretzel twists or sticks
2 cups - roasted mixed nuts
1/2 cup - butter or margarine, melted
1/2 cup - honey

Combine cereal, pretzels, and nuts in 9x13x2-inch baking pan. Combine butter and honey. Pour over all, tossing lightly to coat evenly. Bake at 350°F 45-50 minutes, stirring frequently, or until crispy and caramelized. Store tightly covered.

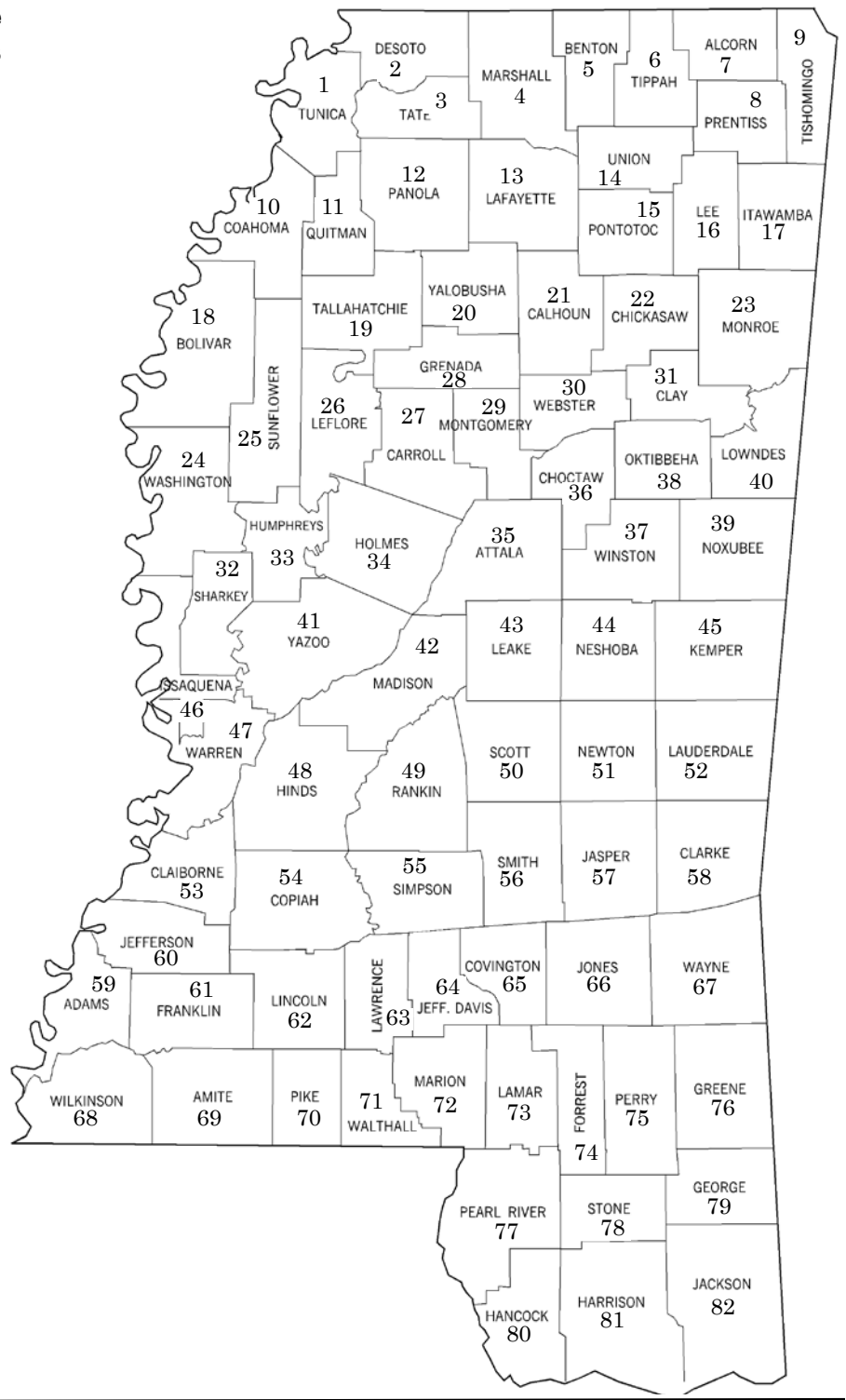

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Honeybee Researcher at MSU Works to Understand Disease Threatening Pollinators, Specialty Crops

Tiny but mighty, the humble honeybee carries the weight of the world's enormous agricultural system on its delicate wings. However, the bacterium *Melissococcus plutonius*, commonly known as the causative agent for the European foulbrood disease, or EFB, threatens the lives of these industrious insects and health of the crops they pollinate-most notably blueberries.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, honeybees pollinate \$15 billion worth of crops in the U.S. each year, including more than 130 types of fruits, nuts and vegetables.

Priyadarshini "Priya" Chakrabarti Basu, assistant professor in Mississippi State's Department of Biochemistry, Molecular Biology, Entomology and Plant Pathology, is investigating the causes of and proposing solutions to mitigate EFB's spread and impacts.

"Surveys reported that nearly half of commercial honeybee colonies in the U.S. died last year," said Basu, who is also a scientist in the university's Mississippi Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station. "Although EFB is just one of many factors that threaten our colonies, its impact on beekeepers and crop producers is keenly felt as pollination and production costs rise, and those increases are passed on to consumers. The health of our bees affects all of us."

She explained that for many years, beekeepers across the U.S. and Canada have reported EFB in their colonies, specifically those going to blueberry pollination, and they've become increasingly hesitant to send their bees to blueberry production.

The four-year, \$4.2 million study-part of a USDA Specialty Crop Research Initiative to support these specialized ag industries-is led by Ramesh Sagili, associate professor of apiculture at Oregon State University. Scientists from Washington and California are joining Sagili and

Basu to conduct a two-year field study seasonally rotating a series of honeybee colonies among blueberries and other crops in each participating state. During each rotation, the team will investigate the effects of crops, weather conditions, nutritional landscape, fungicides and other environmental factors contributing to EFB. They also will study the effectiveness of probiotics as a treatment.

Following the field work, the team will conduct an economic impact study of EFB on the blueberry production industry, providing a larger context to their discoveries about the nature of the disease. By the end of the four-year period, their findings and management strategies will be published in a variety of scientific journals, stakeholder publications and media outlets.

To begin, the bee colonies in the Western states will start their journey in the early spring from California almond tree groves. From there, they will travel to blueberry farms and then rotate to later-season crops such as fruit trees for the remainder of the year. In Mississippi, the colonies are taking a slightly different path that complements the different climate and growing seasons in the South. All colonies will replicate their rotations for a second year.

"We're conducting the study this way because EFB can be very unpre-

dictable-some years are very bad, but there are also years where cases are very low," said Basu.

Her part in the study deals with a different blueberry variety and slightly different rotational schedule. While the Western states are looking at northern highbush blueberries, Mississippi's most prevalent variety is rabbiteye, which is more conducive to a warmer, humid climate and blooms earlier in the year. The Mississippi bees will rotate to honey production for the rest of the year instead of moving on to pollinate other production crops.

Assisting with the project are Bound's Blueberry Farm in Wiggins, which operates a large production of rabbiteye blueberries, and three Mississippi beekeepers who have donated colonies to the project: Austin Smith of Petal and Steven and Richard Coy of Stone County.

"As a commercial beekeeper, I am very interested in this research and collaborating with Dr. Basu and her team," said Richard Coy. "Beekeepers work hard to maintain our colonies, and we all benefit from research that gives us more knowledge and tools to keep our bees healthy."

In addition to the site work, Basu is guiding her graduate student Mckaela Whilden of Bryan, Texas, in conducting molecular work-evaluating the nutritional quality of the pollen samples collected from the cropping systems across all four states and examining the nutritional physiology of the honeybees from all experimental colonies across all states.

"We want to learn whether nutritional stress, or not getting enough nutrients from the landscape, is a factor in contracting EFB," she said. "We're also studying the expression of some key genes, which may tell us more about the nutritional physiology of the colonies."

The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau Investigators Recovered Stolen Property

The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau (MALTB) investigation assisted the Santa Rosa County Sheriff's Office (SRSO) in the arrest of 52-year-old suspect Mike Cosse in Santa Rosa County, Florida. Cosse is a suspect in the thefts of agriculture equipment across Mississippi.

An investigation of multiple thefts of John Deere tractors and skid steers throughout the state of Mississippi led to a suspect named Mike Cosse in Florida. MALTB investigators contacted the SRSO to inform them of a Milton, Florida, resident who is a suspect in an ongoing investigation in Mississippi.



On March 1, 2024, the SRSO arrested Cosse after conducting an investigation into the suspected crimes. Cosse is thought to have made over \$100,000 selling stolen equipment since late 2023. Cosse was released from Santa Rosa County Jail on a \$182,000 bond. This is an open and ongoing investigation with additional arrests and charges expected in Mississippi.

The MALTB recovered a racehorse stolen from Mississippi in Todd County, Kentucky.

On February 23, 2024, the Terry Police Department took an initial report of a stolen racehorse, worth \$7,000. On February 28, 2024, the Mississippi Agriculture & Livestock Theft Bureau was asked to assist in the investigation. The MALTB took



the lead on the investigation.

During the investigation, it was learned the racehorse may have been stolen by fraudulent means. Additional information surfaced that led MALTB to Todd County, Kentucky. The horse was later located in Kentucky and identified as the stolen racehorse.

With the help of the Todd County Sheriff, MALTB was able to recover the stolen racehorse and have it returned to Mississippi.

MALTB recovered a stolen 32-foot trailer February 1 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, during an ongoing investigation that began in December.

The Jackson Police Department took a report of a stolen 32-foot gooseneck equipment trailer December 26, 2023. The equipment trailer was stolen from a closed business in Jackson during the Christmas holidays. The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau was asked to assist in the investigation due to the possibility of being tied to an out-of-state theft ring. Two suspects were identified during the investigation.



As the investigation continued, the equipment trailer was determined to be located outside of the state, most likely in Louisiana. MALTB investigators reached out to Louisiana authorities for assistance and were able to locate and recover the stolen gooseneck equipment trailer.

The Mississippi Agriculture and Livestock Theft Bureau, the law enforcement division of the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, enforces state laws pertaining to the theft of cattle, horses, swine, poultry, fish, farm equipment, chemicals, timber and all other farm or agriculture-related crimes.
