Bees Can Thrive in Both City and Countryside

Believe it or not, urban landscapes can provide enough plant diversity to sustain honeybee colonies, making beekeeping a suitable hobby for both city and country dwellers.

Jeff Harris, beekeeping specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said both locales have their pros and cons when it comes to growing healthy hives.

"Many urban landscapes contain ornamentals and other flowering plants that provide a better and more diverse diet than monoculture crops," Harris said. "Just like humans, bees are healthier when

their food comes from many different sources, not just cheeseburgers -- or in the bees' case, 3,000 acres of corn."

Beekeeping should begin with research.

"Before getting started, potential beekeepers need to ask about local and state laws governing the number of colonies an individual can have," Harris said. "Some municipalities may restrict the number of colonies that can be kept in a suburban yard. Some states have laws that govern the registration of hives. There are no universal rules."

Harris advised potential beekeepers to ask more experienced local beekeepers for help in placing new hives, identifying food plants that bloom March through October, and figuring out if the density of food plants available will support the hives. He also stressed the need for a water supply, such as drips, ornamental garden ponds or other water features that allow bees to drink

without drowning.

"Lily pads or shallow dishes with gravel or sand give bees something to stand upon while they drink, which helps prevent drowning," he said. "If an urban beekeeper does not supply water close to the hives, the bees will find the next closest source, and real problems ensue if that source is a neighbor's swimming pool."

Beekeeping in any environment is not without its challenges. In some cities, beekeepers place their colonies on rooftops or balconies high above the people on sidewalks below because of a lack of space. Even then, greater numbers of people mean an increased likelihood for interactions between bees and humans.

While city bees are not typically exposed to agricultural chemicals, many city dwellers use chemicals for gardening and lawn maintenance. City bees are also more at risk for traffic mortality, so placement of hives should consider local vehicle

traffic.

Despite the potential issues, beekeeping is booming, and not just because people love honey.

"Some beekeepers desire to get back to nature or help pollinators that seem to be in declining numbers. Some want to provide pollinators for gardens," Harris said. "Beekeeping is a complex activity, but it is also a family friendly activity. The family that keeps bees together stays together and has fresh honey on their biscuits."

For 12 years, Tammy Carlisle has kept bees on the outskirts of Starkville. She owns a small farm with fruit and pecan orchards, along with raised beds for growing herbs and vegetables.

"I started keeping bees because everything works together," Carlisle said. "Bees do a valuable job, and I became a beekeeper to continue that cycle, to be a steward for the bees and give them a safe place."

Carlisle stressed the importance of education, reading books, attending Extension courses and learning

through trial and error.

"If I were going to give advice, I would tell people not to go into beekeeping with too many expectations," she said. "Be patient, let them do what they do. Don't expect massive quantities of honey and a fast process. Be considerate of your neighbors; you don't want to harm the bees but you don't want to harm people either. You have a responsibility to the bees and the community."

Carlisle harvests each hive separately to maintain the different varieties of honey. She usually gives the honey as gifts rather than offering it for sale, but that may change when she opens an on-farm market this spring to sell locally grown produce.

"Being a beekeeper is a gift to me," she said. "It's not an easy thing to do; it's expensive. It's a lot of work, but it's worth it. In turn, I give my honey as gifts. It's a karma thing."

2019 Mississippi Honey Production Up 1 Percent

Honey production during 2019 from Mississippi producers with five or more colonies totaled 1.76 million pounds, up 1 percent from 2018. There were 22,000 honey producing colonies in 2019, up 2,000 colonies from previous year.

Yield per colony averaged 80 pounds of honey, down 8 percent from 2018. Honey stocks held by producers on December 15, 2019, were 141,000 pounds, up 101 percent from a year earlier. The average price for honey decreased from \$2.07 per pound in 2018 to \$1.85 per pound in 2019. The total value of honey production totaled \$3.26 million, down 10 percent from the previous year.

Commissioner Andy Gipson Recognizes National Ag Day and Announces Second Wild Hog Challenge

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson recognized hard working farmers and ranchers in celebration of National Ag Day. To coincide with National Ag Day, he kicked-off the 2020 Spring Commissioner's

Wild Hog Challenge to help protect Mississippi agriculture from nuisance wild hogs.

"There is no better time than the present to take a moment to recognize our farmers and ranchers for their hard work and to thank them for supplying food, fiber, and shelter, not only for our

families right here at home but also for the entire world," said Commissioner Gipson. "Farmers are critical to our food supply chain. Simply put, without farmers, we don't have food. Up until the last few weeks, we have taken for granted seeing full shelves at the grocery stores. The good news during the COVID-19 emergency is that our food supply is plentiful – all thanks to our American farmers and ranchers."

In addition to recognizing the importance of farmers and ranchers, Commissioner Gipson took the opportunity to invite the public to participate in the second Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge. In 2019, the Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge was initiated to raise awareness regarding these destructive animals. It proved to be successful with 730 wild hogs trapped or harvested in 36 counties across Mississippi.

Commissioner Gipson is issuing the Challenge once again to coincide with the spring 2020 row crop planting season. Wild hogs are non-native, nuisance animals that cause more than \$60 million in property damage in Mississippi each year, with substantial damage caused to row crops, pastures and forestlands. Wild hogs cause signifi-

cant damage to corn, soybeans, peanuts and other row crops.

Commissioner Gipson wants to see results of the public's efforts in protecting crops from these nuisance animals. The winner of the 2020 Spring Commissioner's Wild Hog Challenge will receive a wild hog trapping system donated by HogEye and the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation. To participate in the Challenge, simply upload photos of wild hogs that you harvest and/or trap between March 24 and May 31 to <https://www.mdac.ms.gov/wildhogchallenge> and supply the required information related to the harvest. The harvest must take place on Mississippi agricultural lands such as row crops, pasture and working timberland.

Honey Peanut Butter Bites

- 1 1/4 cups old fashioned oats
- 3 teaspoons shredded coconut
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1/2 cup dried apricots, chopped
- 1/2 cup peanut butter

In a bowl add the oats, coconut and almonds. Stir until well distributed. Add the honey, apricots and peanut butter and stir well. Put mixing bowl in refrigerator for about 20-30 minutes. Then roll into rounded balls and serve. *Source: Honey.com.*

Grilled Corn with Spiced Honey Butter

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1/3 cup honey
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 8 ears fresh corn
- 8 lime wedges
- 1/4 cup cilantro, chopped

In a small bowl stir together the butter, honey and chili powder; set aside. Fold back husks and remove silk from corn; pull husks back up over corn. Place corn in a large bowl of ice water and soak for 15 min-

utes. Remove and shake off excess water. Place on grill over medium hot coals and cook for 15-20 minutes, turning frequently. Remove husks and spread each ear with seasoned butter. Sprinkle with cilantro and serve with lime wedges. *Source: Honey.com.*

Honey BBQ Chicken & Biscuits

- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon Cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 chicken legs
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 4 cups honey BBQ sauce, divided
- 8 buttermilk biscuits

Combine flour with spices and salt in a shallow bowl; dredge chicken in flour mixture. Heat cast iron skillet on medium-high heat; add oil. Place chicken in skillet, skin-side down, and brown well. Turn and cook 2-3 minutes on flesh side. Place skillet in oven at 375° for about 15 minutes. While chicken is cooking, heat a stove-top grill. Remove chicken from skillet; place in a large mixing bowl and toss with 3 cups honey BBQ sauce until well coated. Place chicken on

grill, skin-side down, and cook 3-4 minutes or until chicken is crisp and sauce is sticky. Refrigerate until cold. With a fork or your hands, pull chicken meat from bones. Mix chicken with 1 cup honey BBQ sauce, using a wooden spoon or your hands to break up chicken and mix it thoroughly into the sauce. Cut biscuits in half horizontally. Place about 1/4 cup pulled chicken on bottom of each biscuit and cover with top half of biscuit. *Source: Honey.com.*

Crustless Lemon-Honey Cheesecake

- 1 1/2 cups plain 2% greek yogurt
- 1 cup non-fat cream cheese
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup plus 1 teaspoon honey
- 3 egg whites
- 1/4 cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1/4 cup lemon juice

Whisk together yogurt and cream cheese in a bowl. Add remaining ingredients and mix until all ingredients are incorporated. Pour mixture into a greased circle pan. Bake at 350° for 40 minutes. Remove from oven. Chill in fridge overnight, or for at least 8 hours. After chilled, cut into 8 slices and serve. *Source: Honey.com.*



Effective April 1, 2020

Every bull that is sold, exchanged, leased or transferred in ownership shall be accompanied by either:

1. Valid negative Trich test result within 90 days, or
2. Signed Virgin bull statement for bulls less than 18 months of age that have never been with breeding females. Bull age will be determined as no more than one permanent incisor tooth visible

Bulls coming into a stockyard without Virgin Bull Statement or valid negative Trich test must be consigned to slaughter

Bulls can be purchased from the slaughter pen and be Trich tested by the stockyard veterinarian the day of the sale and quarantined pending a negative test



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MDAC Releases New Guidance Regarding Pesticide Applicator Certification and Licenses in Light of COVID-19

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson announced that the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) is releasing new guidance regarding the testing, certification and licensure of all pesticide operators and applicators regulated in Mississippi in light of the COVID-19 emergency. In order to comply with mandates to not hold gatherings of no more than 10 people and to practice social distancing, this guidance was put into place to protect the public's health and safety.

"At this critical time when our farmers are getting ready to plant their crops, it is vital that we make available all resources to them so they can continue providing our food and fiber without disruption. We appreciate the Mississippi State University Extension Service for working with us," said Commissioner Gipson.

MDAC is issuing the following guidance to address the need for the use of pesticides for food production; food cultivation, including farming, livestock, aquaculture, and horticulture; and the reduction of household pests.

Commercial and Licensed Pesticide Applicators:

- For all license holders (*persons who advertise or receive fees for: Wood Destroying Insect Control, General Pest and Rodent Control, Horticultural Pest and Weed Control,*



Orchard Pest Control, Domestic Animal Pest Control, Fumigation Pest Control, Agricultural Pest and Weed Control, Aquatic Weed Control, and Right-of-Way) whose certification expires in 2020, MDAC will extend certification for 1 year.

- For example, if your license expires April 11, 2020, you will receive a revised license with an expiration date of April 11, 2021.

- Commercial certification (*persons who use or supervise the use of a restricted use pesticides that cannot charge a fee or advertise for performing applications*) will be extended for 1 year.

- New Licensed and Commercial applicators will be reviewed and tested on a case-by-case basis.

Private Applicators:

- For all private applicators (*persons who use or supervise the use of*

pesticide which is classified for restricted use for purposes of producing any agricultural commodity on their own or leased property) whose certification expires in 2020, MDAC will extend their certification period for 1 year.

- Training for new private applicator certification will be handled by Mississippi State University Extension Service (MSU-ES) through your local county extension office. Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson encourages the public to consider local farmers as a source of produce, meats, dairy, honey, eggs and other food products.

"The good news during the COVID-19 emergency is that our food supply is plentiful, and our food supply chain remains operational. You can thank a farmer for that. So, while it is taking longer than normal for some grocery stores to get their shelves re-stocked, there are plenty of farmers willing to sell direct to consumers. Mississippians who don't already routinely buy direct farm-to-table meat and produce might want to give locally-grown and raised products a try," said

Commissioner Gipson.

He continued, "Several farmers markets across the state are open with growers ready to sell. Some farmers that sell to restaurants are finding themselves with an extra supply and are finding ways to sell direct to consumers as restaurants are being significantly impacted at this time. The food is healthy, delicious, local and affordable and these markets are taking steps to comply with CDC recommendations. If you need to leave the house and shop for food, add farmers markets or other participating farms to your list of potential suppliers," said Commissioner Gipson.

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) has developed a list of farmers markets that are currently open to assist consumers in sourcing local

produce, meats, dairy, honey and other agriculture products. Many of the markets are implementing ways for shoppers to pre-order and have curbside pick-up.

The list of markets with location and contact information can be found at mdac.ms.gov/COVID19 and will be updated as necessary. Additional markets will be re-opening as the season progresses and produce availability increases. Commissioner Gipson also encourages the public to utilize GenuineMS.com as an online source to locate farmers that sell direct to the public.

Consult Official Sources on Coronaviruses in Animals

Pets and other domestic animals are not considered at risk for contracting COVID-19, and the Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine recommends that animal owners consult the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) to get the facts.

Dr. Kent Hoblet, dean of the college, encouraged animal owners to consider AVMA guidelines as their primary resource on vaccines and animal illnesses related to COVID-19 and refrain from sharing misinformation circulating through social media and other unofficial sources.

One common falsehood involves COVID-19 -- one of many types of coronaviruses -- infecting animals.

"No animals in the United States have been identified with COVID-19," Hoblet said. "A canine respiratory coronavirus and a canine enteric coronavirus do exist and may cause illness in pets, but they are not related to the current human coronavirus infections."

Another misconception involves a cattle vaccine for COVID-19, Hoblet said. While there is a vaccine for use in cattle with bovine coronavirus, the components are not related to the virus currently affecting humans.


USDA Seeks Applications for Grants to Help Repair Housing in Rural Communities
