Farming Never Stops When You Are Feeding the World

When you get praise from the White House for doing your job, it is worth taking notice. "We are all thankful for all the healthcare workers who are on the front lines battling COVID-19, but," Vice President Mike Pence said, "those who have continued to work to feed their fellow Americans also deserve our praise."

Mississippi has 30,000 people working in the poultry and egg industries and they haven't missed a day making sure Americans don't have to worry about the food supply even during a pandemic.



"Some of the most important people are in food supply. I mean from the farmers and the ranchers to our processors to our distributors to our truckers to our grocers - Americans are keeping food on the table for our fellow Americans," the Vice President said in a recent daily briefing on the battle against the virus. "To all the hard-working people working in food supply today, thank you. Thank you for what you're doing

to keep those grocery store shelves stocked. Thank you for showing up for work every day and working hard to keep that food supply rolling in America."

A reliable food supply is more appreciated today. Mississippi's poultry growers and egg farmers have been raising birds and collecting eggs. Truck drivers have been delivering feed from the feed mill and baby chicks from the hatchery. Plant

workers have been working in processing plants to fill trucks headed to grocery stores. Growers are raising birds. The loss of so many restaurants as a customer has been a financial blow to the poultry industry, but everyone along the chain is working to keep Americans fed.

Life is different at processing plants and on the farm since the coronavirus hit in the United States, but the supply chain is working. Companies are checking every employee's temperature before they enter the plants, just one of many steps to keep workers safe. They have increased cleaning and sanitation frequencies and intensities for equipment and common areas at processing facilities. "It is sanitation on steroids right now," said Mike Brown, the president of the National Chicken Council. Companies are also practicing social distancing in common areas, such as break rooms and cafeterias, but also on production lines where possible. They are also staggering breaks, staggering start/stop times of shifts, creating additional break areas including outdoor areas, installing plastic dividers between workstations, and in-

creasing the space between workers on the production floor.

Down on the farm, as one poultry grower said, "We've been pretty well functioning as usual." Social distancing has long been a way of life for poultry growers who for years have done all they can to keep viruses and other pathogens out of their chicken houses to ensure their birds remain healthy. Poultry growers call this "biosecurity." It is why poultry growers don't wear their "street clothes" into their chicken houses, and why they dip their boots into a disinfectant footbath before going into a poultry house. Biosecurity is why visitors to a farm (and they are few) must wear protective suits, like those that health care workers wear, when they go in a poultry house. When you've got 20,000 birds per house, you take safety precautions.

Mississippians who work in the poultry industry from the farm to grocery delivery have been doing what they always do - produce good food safely, and now we all have the opportunity to show some appreciation for it.

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Commissioner's Policy Corner

Commissioner Gipson Urges Grocery Retailers to Discontinue Limiting Milk Purchases

Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson sent a letter to grocery retailers across the state urging them to discontinue imposing limits on the quantity of milk that consumers are allowed to purchase. The letter was written in response to dairy farmers having to dump their milk due to an oversupply.

At the onset of the COVID-19 crisis as consumers began making preparations for staying at home by stocking up on groceries, many stores began limiting the amount of milk that shoppers were allowed to purchase. Although this increased the demand for milk at the time,

the supply of milk remained strong with no shortage. The purchasing limitation, coupled with the impact from the loss of markets for milk due to school and restaurant closures, has led to an oversupply of milk. Milk processors are not capable of processing the excess supply leading many farmers with no choice but to dump their milk.

"I have reached out to the managers of grocery retailers across the state urging them to support our dairy industry by removing limitations on how much milk shoppers can purchase. There is no shortage of milk. Given the oversupply the industry is facing, there is no reason as to why families can't have access to the dairy products that they want. This is one measure that we can take to help decrease the over-

supply that is causing our farmers to have to dump their milk," said Commissioner Gipson.

In addition to urging food retailers to stop limiting milk purchases by shoppers, Commissioner Gipson has also spoken by phone to milk processors in the state on behalf of the dairy farmers in Mississippi to discuss the dumping of their milk.

"Our dairy farmers are some of the hardest working farmers. Cows continue to produce, even in times of oversupply, and unlike many other agricultural commodities, milk is highly perishable and can't be frozen or stored. Our dairy industry has faced many challenges over the years, and now having to dump milk can be devastating for our state's 65 dairy farms. It is imperative that we do our part to sup-

port the dairy industry. I also encourage consumers to support our family dairies by purchasing more milk and dairy products when they shop," said Commissioner Gipson.

Egg-squisite Dishes

Sausage & Egg Casserole

- 1 pound pork sausage
- 6 eggs
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground mustard
- 6 slices white bread, cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

In a skillet, brown and crumble sausage; drain and set aside. In a large bowl, beat eggs; add milk, salt and mustard. Stir in bread cubes, cheese and sausage. Pour into a greased baking dish. Cover and refrigerate for 8 hours or overnight. Remove from the refrigerator 30 minutes before baking. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 40 minutes. *Source: TasteofHome.com.*

Mama's Fried Chicken

- 1 whole chicken, cut into pieces
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 2 cups buttermilk
- Self-rising flour
- Vegetable oil
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika

Sprinkle chicken with salt and pepper. Place chicken in a shallow dish or zip-top plastic bag and add buttermilk. Cover or seal, and chill at least 2 hours. Remove chicken from buttermilk, discarding but-

termilk. Dredge chicken in flour. Pour 1 1/2 inches of oil in a deep skillet; heat to 360°. Add chicken, a few pieces at a time; cover and cook 6 minutes. Uncover chicken and cook 9 minutes. Turn chicken; cover and cook 6 minutes. Uncover and cook 5-9 minutes, turning chicken the last 3 minutes for even browning, if necessary. Drain on paper towels. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Egg Salad Sandwiches

- 5 hard-cooked eggs, grated
- 1 tablespoon onion, grated
- 2 tablespoons celery, finely chopped
- 2 tablespoons sweet pickle relish
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon sour cream
- 3/4 teaspoon dried salad seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon sugar
- 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
- Sliced bread

Mix hard-cooked eggs, onion, celery, sweet pickle relish, mayonnaise, sour cream, dried salad seasoning, Dijon mustard, salt, sugar and pepper in a bowl until blended. Cover and chill 3 hours. Evenly spread egg mixture on 1 side of bread slice. Create sandwiches by topping with remaining slices. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Old-Fashioned Egg Custard Pie

- 1/2 pkg. refrigerated piecrusts
- All-purpose flour (for work surface)
- Cooking spray
- 4 large eggs, beaten
- 2 cups half-and-half
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg, divided

Roll piecrust into a 12-inch circle on a lightly floured surface. Fit piecrust inside pie dish lightly sprayed with cooking spray; crimp edges. Transfer to a baking sheet; bake at 400° for 10 minutes. Remove parchment paper and pie weights. Return piecrust to oven; bake 3 minutes. Let cool slightly, about 10 minutes. Whisk together eggs, half-and-half, sugar, salt and 1/8 teaspoon of the nutmeg in a large measuring cup. Pour mixture into cooled piecrust. Reduce temperature to 325° and continue baking until golden, set around the edges, and slightly jiggle in the middle, 50-55 minutes. Let cool completely, about 30 minutes. Sprinkle with remaining 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg. Chill until cold, then serve. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*



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State's Poultry Industry Hurt by Easter Tornadoes

Tornadoes and damaging storms that swept through the state Easter Sunday afternoon and evening, killing 11 Mississippians also caused devastating losses to growers in the poultry industry.

Tom Tabler, poultry specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said the most significant damage to the state's poultry industry occurred in the Covington County area near Collins, Mississippi. Poultry was worth an estimated \$2.7 billion to the state in 2019.

Early indications are that at least 90 poultry houses were damaged or destroyed, along with an additional six breeder houses. Other houses are operating on generators for power. Reports continued to come in through the day Monday as roads were cleared of trees, and damage estimates may rise.

"Sanderson Farms' growers suffered the most losses, with at least 60 broiler houses and six breeder houses destroyed in the Collins area," Tabler said. "They also had breeder houses destroyed at some of their other locations."

Wayne Farms' growers have about 20 houses with some damage in the Laurel/Soso area. Many of these houses did not have birds in them when they were hit. Growers for Peco Foods at Bay Springs had heavy losses, with 11 houses that are either down or damaged. By noon Monday, officials had not been able to confirm other damage.

Facilities associated with Tyson Foods, located mostly around Carthage, Forest and Magee, seem to have experienced no damage from the Easter storms. Mar-Jac, with facilities mostly in the Waynesboro area, also seems to have suffered no

poultry losses, but a broiler manager lost his personal house to the storms.

"Although some houses were between flocks and empty, many of these houses had chickens in them," Tabler said. "Some would have been chicks just a few days old, while others would have been flocks nearly ready for harvest."

The Mississippi Board of Animal Health is involved with the live animals. When possible, chickens are moved to other houses.

Mary Beck, head of the MSU Department of Poultry Science, commented on the devastating effects the tornados had to the poultry industry in Mississippi, particularly to Peco, Wayne and Sanderson Farms.

"As always when disaster strikes this industry that is so important to this state, Mississippi State University and the poultry science department Extension team are here to help in any way we can," Beck said. "We are available by phone, text, email and videoconferencing to answer questions or provide expertise

on topics ranging from bird welfare to grower safety."

No dollar figure has been assigned yet to the losses, but Tabler provided some specifics to help grasp the magnitude of the losses.

"A new broiler house today is 46 feet wide by 500 feet long or sometimes longer," Tabler said. "Depending on the features built into the house, they may cost \$300,000 to \$325,000 per house and raise about 25,000 chickens."

James Henderson is the head of the MSU Coastal Research and Extension Center in Biloxi, which includes 21 county Extension offices in southeast Mississippi where the poultry industry was hardest hit.

"The poultry industry and contract growers in South Mississippi took a big hit Easter Sunday with the tornado damage, but Extension agents in every county and the state specialists at MSU are ready to help and provide guidance as farmers, timberland owners, and food and fiber industry producers work to move forward on the path to recovery," Henderson said.

Storm Recovery Requires Extra Care During Pandemic

Social distancing guidelines already urged by federal and state health agencies should be followed closely to prevent exposure to COVID-19 during post-storm cleanup.

A severe weather outbreak April 12, 2020, caused widespread damage across the Southeast, but south Mississippi was hit particularly hard after a series of tornadoes left 11 deaths, several injuries and property destruction in its wake.

The state remains under a shelter-in-place order to prevent the spread of the coronavirus, but power outages and structure damage are forcing some to seek temporary shelter elsewhere while first responders and volunteers are aiding in the cleanup.

"Storm victims and those assisting them are right to be concerned about exposure to the coronavirus. Physical distancing and sanitation measures must be followed even more carefully in these conditions," said Mississippi State University Extension health specialist David Buys. "Remember to have a face covering, utilize phone or any other type of distance messaging, wash your hands as frequently as possible, and don't touch your face, nose, or eyes with gloved or bare hands."

Some displaced residents may need to go to a public shelter until they identify longer-term temporary housing.

"Wear nitrile or rubber or work gloves and change them often if dealing with a number of people in a community setting," said MSU Extension governmental training officer Tom Ball. "Encourage those who go to shelters to bring face coverings and gloves and maintain at least a 6-foot-square distance to make it harder to share the virus if someone has it already, and don't drink or eat after others."

Food safety is also a major consideration after any disaster. Courtney Crist, assistant Extension professor in food safety, said food in the freezer that still contains ice crystals and feels as cold as if refrigerated can be safely refrozen or cooked, but all perishable foods left in the refrigerator when the power has been off for more than four hours must be thrown out. These include meat, poultry, fish, eggs and leftovers. The food safety rule is "When in doubt, throw it out."

"In the event that the power goes out, keep the refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible to maintain the cold temperature," Crist said. "If it is half full, a freezer

will keep the temperature for about 24 hours if the door remains closed. Buy dry or block ice to keep the refrigerator as cold as possible if the power is going to be out for a prolonged period of time. Fifty pounds of dry ice should keep an 18-cubic-foot, fully stocked freezer cold for two days."

In many of the affected communities, cleanup crews have already begun debris removal. Remind family and friends who have property damage to be wary if approached by contractors offering their services unsolicited.

"Always verify the credibility of anyone you don't know who might try to scam or overcharge you to make a quick buck," said Becky Smith, Extension family financial management specialist. "Many well-established insurance companies and faith-based volunteer groups have good intentions, but you have to watch out for opportunists."

Financial donations are always more helpful to disaster victims than material ones, and that is especially true during the current public health crisis.

"In between donation and receipt, material items may come in contact with someone who has COVID-19, and the virus can live for hours to days on some surfaces," Buys said. "Storm victims can use financial assistance to purchase routinely donated items such as clothing and canned goods."
