Welcome to the 161st Mississippi State Fair – COVID Style

For the past 160 years, the Mississippi State Fair, located in the capital city of Jackson, has been the designated site for adventure, entertainment, competition and feasting. Surrounded by 105-acres of open space, livestock barns, and exhibit buildings, the mile-long midway has overflowed with breathtaking rides, curious displays, tasty treats and a multitude of other attractions. In this 161st year of the State Fair, expect more of the same, but presented just a little bit differently.

"This year, many of us are finding ourselves facing extra challenges, many stemming from the COVID-19



pandemic," said Andy Gipson, Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce. Adding, "In these unprecedented times, it was especially important that we carry on the long-standing tradition of bringing the Mississippi State Fairgrounds to life for 12 days of fun-filled family entertainment; our staff has taken extra precautions to keep our visitors safe."

Opening day is Wednesday, October 7, 2020 and with a hospitable scissor snip of ribbon at 5:00 p.m. at gate 1 on Amite and Jefferson Streets, Commissioner Gipson will officially welcome one and all to the 2020 Mississippi State Fair. The fair runs through Sunday, October 18, with a regular gate admission of \$5.00; children under the age of six get in free. For a complete fair guide listing, see pages 12 through 14.

"This year we must take extra precautions due to COVID-19; the staff at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds has been working tirelessly to ensure our guests are protected," said Michael Lasseter, Acting Director. Some of these precautions include hand sanitizer stations throughout

the grounds and encouraging social distancing of six feet. The entire complex has limited the number of guests, and each indoor building has posted building limits. There will be an increase of cleaning high-touch surfaces. In addition, all participants will be required to wear face coverings upon entry, and staff will wear face coverings when greeting the public. Added Lasseter. "Please bring your family and come to enjoy this wonderful event."

The largest buffet in the state can be found stretching the length of the midway, but grazing would not be complete without a stop at the Biscuit Booth. Good, old fashioned and free, these fluffy biscuits are baked by the employees of the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce.

New to the fair this year is the Timberworks Lumberjack Show. Enjoy axe throwing, underhand and chopping, log rolling, cross cut sawing, hot sawing and chainsaw carving! One of the newest attractions is the Ag Expo in the brand-new Mississippi Trade Mart. The walk-through exhibit will teach fairgoers

about the importance and diversity of agriculture – our state's largest industry. While there, you can shop a variety of wonderful Genuine MS® items at our first ever Genuine MS® store.

Don't forget the pig races, petting zoo, fetch-n-fish, Great American Thrill Show, antique tractor show, and the 4-H and FFA livestock shows. Do not miss the Horse, Mule and Pony Pull, the Fiddle Contest and the Pretty Cow Contest. Drop by Commissioner Gipson's Genuine MS® truck (located next to the biscuit booth) for a free picture.

MDAC Accepting Wild Hog Control Program Applications

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) will begin accepting applications on September 28 for its Wild Hog Control Program (WHCP). The application period will close on October 12. Through the WHCP, MDAC will provide "smart" wild hog traps to landowners and managers for the control of wild hogs on private agricultural and forestry lands in Mississippi.

Traps will be deployed in concentrated focal areas across the state. Focal areas will be determined by MDAC through the application process. MDAC will provide the training necessary to use the "smart" traps and technical guidance regarding the most effective methods to trap and control wild hogs on private lands.

Submitted applications will be evaluated based on the number of acres available for trapping, historical agricultural losses caused by wild hogs on the property, and current trapping efforts on the property. A cooperative application is encouraged for small acreage (i.e., adjoining land managers of small parcels should work together to submit one application). Traps will be available for one-month intervals, dependent upon use and success. One trap per

1,000 acres is recommended, depending on landscape and land use.

The WHCP is the result of legislation passed during the 2020 Legislative Session. The legislation authorized Agriculture and Commerce Commissioner Andy Gipson to operate programs to fight nuisance wildlife species on private agricultural and forestry lands. In Mississippi alone, wild hogs cause more than \$60 million in damages annually. The WHCP will provide the equipment and technical guidance needed to control wild hogs across the state. The Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation provided key support to the program with the acquisition of additional traps that will be deployed to help control wild hogs on private lands.

Fair-Favorite Corn Dogs

1 package (8-1/2 ounces) cornbread/muffin mix
2/3 cup all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon ground mustard
1/2 teaspoon onion powder
1/2 teaspoon chili powder
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1/8 teaspoon ground cumin
1 large egg
1 cup 2% milk
10 hot dogs
10 wooden skewers
Oil for deep-fat frying

In a large bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. In another bowl, whisk milk and egg; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Let stand for 15 minutes. Insert skewers into hot dogs; dip into batter. In an electric skillet or deep-fat fryer, heat oil to 375°. Fry corn dogs, a few at a time, until golden brown, 2-3 minutes, turning occasionally. Drain on paper towels. **TIPS:** Don't forget to let the batter stand before coating the hot dogs. It thickens up a bit and clings better after 15 minutes. Make sure the oil temperature returns to 375° between batches.

Deep-Fried Cookies

18 Oreo cookies
Oil for deep-fat frying

1 cup biscuit/baking mix
1 large egg
1/2 cup 2% milk
Confectioners' sugar

On each of eighteen 4-in. wooden skewers, thread one cookie, inserting pointed end of skewer into filling. Freeze until firm, about 1 hour. In a deep cast-iron skillet or deep fryer, heat oil to 375°. Place biscuit mix in a shallow bowl. In another bowl, combine egg and milk; whisk into biscuit mix just until moistened. Holding skewer, dip cookie into biscuit mixture to coat both sides; shake off excess. Fry cookies, a few at a time, until golden brown, 1-2 minutes on each side. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar before serving.

Fair Style Grilled Corn on the Cob

4 large ears of corn in husks soaked in water for 1 hour
Melted butter
Salt

Soak the corn in the husks in water for 1 hour. Start the grill and get it hot. Place the unhusked corn on the grill. Let it grill for 20 minutes turning half way through. Pull the husks back and place corn back on grill to get a little char on the corn. Brush with

melted butter and sprinkle with salt.

Funnel Cakes

2 large eggs, room temperature
1 cup 2% milk
1 cup water
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
3 cups all-purpose flour
1/4 cup sugar
3 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
Oil for deep-fat frying
Confectioners' sugar

In a large bowl, beat eggs. Add milk, water and vanilla until well blended. In another bowl, whisk flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; beat into egg mixture until smooth. In a deep cast-iron or electric skillet, heat oil to 375°. Cover the bottom of a funnel spout with your finger; ladle 1/2 cup batter into the funnel. Holding the funnel several inches above the oil, release your finger and move the funnel in a spiral motion until all the batter is released, scraping with a rubber spatula if needed. Fry until golden brown, 2 minutes on each side. Drain on paper towels. Dust with confectioners' sugar; serve warm.

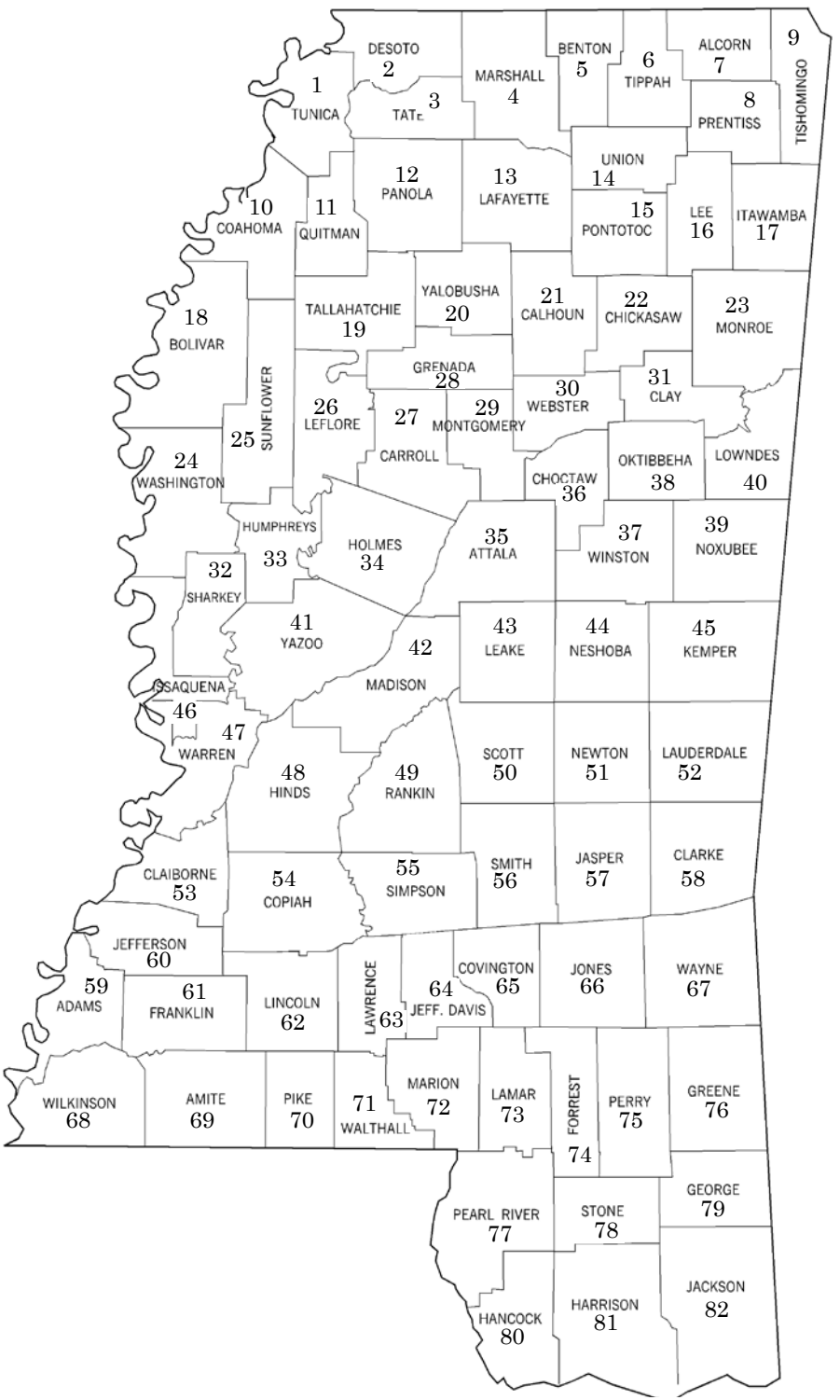

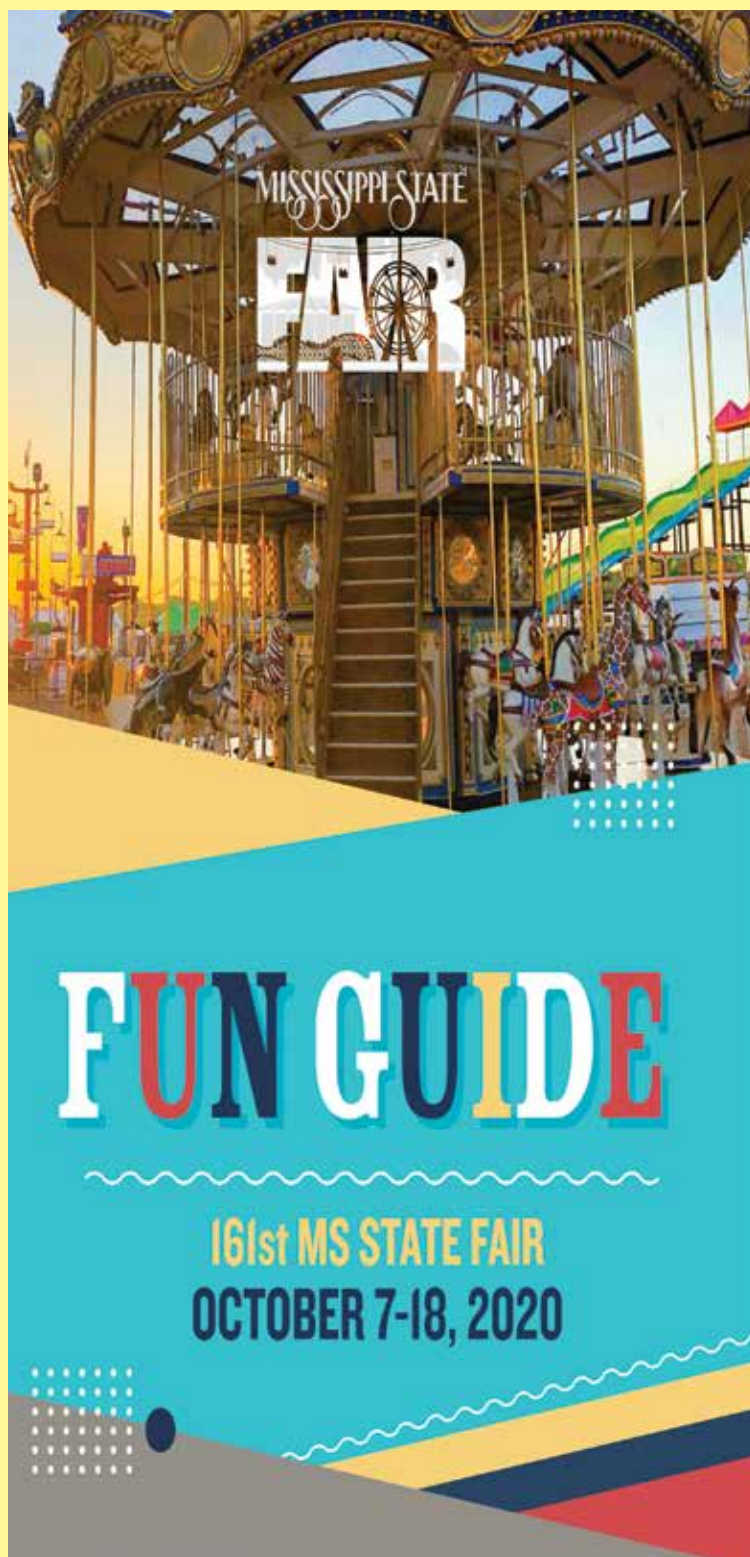

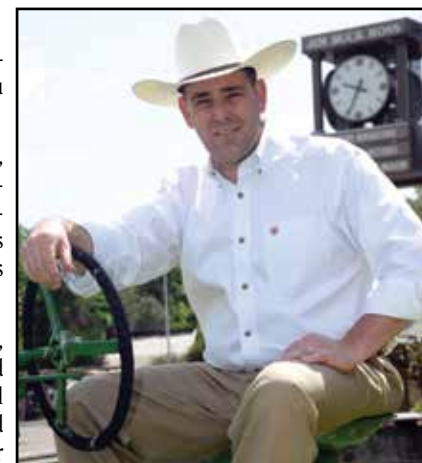

Fall Driving Requires Extra Caution for Farm Vehicles

Fall brings a surge in the number of farm machines travelling on the state's roads, and drivers everywhere need to be cautious when near them.

State laws allow farm vehicles on roadways but place limits on driving them on roadways during daytime hours. This authorization is necessary to allow farm vehicles to reach all parts of the often very large farms to which they belong.

Drivers must remember they share the road with these large, often unwieldy vehicles. Most importantly, drivers must stay alert and allow time to act safely when approaching one.

Alex Deason, an agent in Sunflower County with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said spring and fall are busy times for farm equipment, but fall tends to be busier.

"Most of the slow-moving equipment is moved first thing in the morning to allow for a day full of operations, but once a farm or tract of land has been covered, farm managers may choose to move to another location midday," Deason said.

While it is legal and necessary for farm vehicles to use roads, the large machines can block a driver's view of traffic. Deason said it is even harder for the operator to keep attention on the road, look for obstacles in front and keep an eye on what is behind.

"Operators are required to always use warning lights and display slow-moving vehicle placards," Deason said. "Avoid peak traffic times such as when people are going to or from work and school or lunch, and when able, the farm vehicle should slow down and move to the shoulder to allow traffic to pass safely."

Meeting a farm vehicle head-on is easiest because there is generally

time to slow down and for both vehicles to move close to the shoulder. Deason said most fatalities occur when a distracted driver collides with slow-moving machinery from behind.

"Never overtake farm equipment at highway speeds," he said. "Always slow down to safer speeds. Don't assume when passing a piece of equipment that it is alone. There could easily be a pickup, combine and two tractors with grain carts in succession moving to the next field."

Fall also sees more trailers towed behind vehicles on the roads, including hunters towing off-road vehicles and farmers moving equipment.

Leslie Woolington, Extension risk management and loss control agent, said trailers present a unique danger when they are used improperly or not well maintained.

"If you pull a trailer, it's your responsibility to ensure its safety for you and others on the road," Woolington said. "Trailers have the potential of becoming unguided missiles if they are not properly hooked up or cared for."

She said those planning to tow

a trailer should inspect the tow vehicle for loose bolts, deformation and damaged. Also ensure the ball on the tow vehicle matches the coupler size on the trailer. Use a trailer coupler connection with a pin to ensure it cannot disengage from the ball. If there is a trailer coupler with a tension bolt, ensure it is properly adjusted.

"Connect the trailer electrical plug and breakaway cable to the tow vehicle and ensure all are working correctly," Woolington said. "For a bumper-pull trailer, cross the safety chains underneath the coupler with enough slack to permit turning, but not dragging the ground. This will help to hold the tongue up if the trailer comes loose."

Once the trailer is safe and attached correctly, make sure the load is ready for transport, she said. Tie down or tarp the load, and make sure the trailer deck is free of any loose tools or debris mud.

"During long hauls, stop periodically to do a quick walkaround ensuring trailer is still in good shape and the load is secured," she said.

Mississippi Cut Flower Growers' Cooperative, A Blooming Business

Strolling through the Mississippi Farmers Market, Jackson, a bride-to-be, noticed tables displaying containers of beautiful floral arrangements one Saturday in August. Drawing closer to the Mississippi Cut Flower Growers' booth, the young woman was amazed at the variety of locally grown cut flowers. There she met Donna Yowell, owner of a Flower Cottage Farm in Bolton, along with other cut flower growers. Before she left that day, not only had she found new friends, she found a flower source for her September 12th wedding at the Ecoshed in Jackson.

Cut flower growers are not a new endeavor within our state. However, what is original is the Mississippi Cut Flower Growers' Cooperative (MCFGCC). Recently formed and registered with the Secretary of State's office, this membership-based organization was Donna's vision. She has an extensive background in horticulture: florist, landscaper, educator, executive director of the Mississippi Urban Forest Council, and now manager of MCFGCC.

As a florist, Donna realized that the majority of her cut flowers were imported, mostly from South America. She paid higher shipping costs, and the flowers were not as fresh. With her background and horticulture experiences, she knew many of those flowers could grow in her garden. Donna planted different varieties of perennials and annuals along with herbs and some foliage. The harvest was plentiful and produced high-quality cut flowers.

Donna saw there was a need for this agribusiness throughout Mississippi. As she shared what she was doing, the interest from others began to grow. One of the best ways to meet this need, was to provide educational workshops and network

with like-minded people. Workshops started about two years ago. But this year, because of Covid, Tulip Tuesday Zoom classes are offered every two weeks to people across the state. Various topics are covered, and guest speakers include local and national experts, fellow flower farmers, and seed company representatives. Individuals learn about soil preparation, natural fertilizers, planting recommendations, pest management, and the importance of pollination. The classes are the who, what, when, where, and how for flower growers.

The training aspect of this project is in partnership with the USDA Natural Resource Conversation Service. NRCS helps farmers across the state learn about new farming opportunities and offers many resources in developing a sustainable farm business.

Throughout the state, there are a few flower farmers; more have evolved since this project began and others are adding diversity to their current crops. The sizes vary from a small area around someone's home to acres planted with flowers, fruits, and vegetables. Some generate year-round production using high tunnels. The possibilities for cut flowers are endless!

Direct sales from individual farms, farmer's markets, and front porch deliveries are just a few ways to purchase cut flowers. Some growers are suppliers for local florists and stores. Visit the Mississippi Department of Agriculture's new GenuineMS.com website for locations of flower farms.
