Pecan Yield Decent Despite Weather Challenges

Despite weather challenges combined with a decreased production year for most pecan varieties, Mississippi's 2020 crop will be decent.

"Overall, yield around the state was impacted by various environmental factors, like frost, excessive early spring rains and tropical winds and moisture," said Eric Stafne, fruit and nut specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "There will be pecans available, but they may not be as plentiful as in recent

years."

The Delta, a main area of production, saw early ripening of pecans this year, which helped mitigate damage from Hurricane Delta, Stafne said.

Max Draughn, president of the Mississippi Pecan Growers Association said yields will vary depending on where orchards are located because of numerous issues impacting different parts of the state where pecans are grown.

"The northern part of the state got a late freeze that got a lot of their blooms," said Draughn, who owns and operates Bass Pecan Company in Raymond. "Growers in the southern part of the state got winds and storms from various hurricanes that knocked a lot of nuts on the ground. Some of those nuts will be okay because they were filled out, but some nuts were not ready for harvest. They'll lose those."

Growers in the central part of

the state, including Draughn, expect a decent yield.

"It is a down year for pecans," Draughn said, explaining that pecans produce in alternating years.

Mississippi Pecan History

Pecans are well adapted and widely grown throughout Mississippi. Where the proper varieties have been chosen, good success can be expected near the Gulf Coast and the Delta, but other areas of the state can support pecan production, as well.

Historically, numerous varieties originated in Jackson County, many of which have no commercial viability today. In the 1920s and 1930s, the five most prominent varieties in the southeast were Alley, Pabst, Schley, Success and Stuart, all originating in Jackson County. Of the historical

varieties, only Stuart, Schley, Success and Desirable continue to be of commercial importance today.

Nearly 75 percent of pecan production in Mississippi is from improved variety trees. The remaining trees are native or seedling; some of these are in orchards and some in natural groves along the river bottoms in the Delta area. Several hurricanes, including Camille and Katrina, devastated pecan orchards in the six counties near the Gulf of Mexico. Many orchards were entirely destroyed and others severely damaged.

In general, Mississippi growers produce, harvest and market two million to four million pounds of

had disease problems."

Market prices are down due to inventory in cold storage and decreased sales to Mississippi's regular buyers. Most of Mississippi's crop is sold to out-of-state and overseas buyers, including China.

"We have a good number of pecans in cold storage, and China is not buying because of increased tariffs," Draughn said. "Growers may not be able to sell their native varieties to the wholesale market, but they will be able to sell their improved varieties. The prices will just be down."

Many growers will sell more of their pecans direct to the consumer this year, Draughn said.

pecans per year, including improved varieties and natives, from more than 14,000 acres. In the 1930s, production ranged between five million and six million pounds annually. During the 1960s, the average annual production of pecans ranged from 15 million to 20 million pounds, with the largest harvest during that decade coming in at 30 million pounds. As a state, average yields may be as low as 200 pounds per acre, but intensive and standard orchards in a good year can produce 1,000 pounds or more per acre.

MS Agriculture Stabilization Act Application Period Remains Open

Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson is encouraging farmers to continue to apply for the Mississippi Agriculture Stabilization Act (MASA) through Monday, November 16. MASA provides roughly \$13 million

to assist Mississippi producers who have incurred expenses as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. MASA is comprised of three separate funds: the Mississippi Supplemental CFAP Grant Program (\$9.5 million), the Poultry Farmer Stabilization Grant Fund (\$3 million), and the Sweet Potato Farm Sustainment Grant Program (\$500,000).

USACE Releases Draft Supplement for Yazoo Area Pump Project

On October 16, 2020, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) released its Draft Supplement No. 2 to the 1982 Yazoo Area Pump Project Final Environmental Impact Statement. The new proposed plan recommends the completion of the Yazoo Area Pump Project and a revised mitigation plan. Commis-

sioner Gipson is encouraging the public to submit comments to the USACE Vicksburg District regarding the draft supplement. The Draft Supplement No. 2 is in response to historical flooding that continues in the Yazoo Backwater Area of Mississippi and the Environmental Protection Agency's 2008 veto of the Yazoo Backwater Area Pump Project. This area has experienced significant flooding nine out of the last ten years. Public comments can be sub-

The deadline to submit comments is November 30, 2020. EPA Announces 2020 Dicamba Registration Decision

On October 27, 2020, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Administrator Andrew Wheeler announced that EPA is approving new five-year registrations for two dicamba products and extending the registration of an additional dicamba product. All three registrations include new control measures to

ensure these products can be used effectively while protecting the environment, including non-target plants, animals, and other crops not tolerant to dicamba. This registration decision was informed by input from state regulators, grower groups, academic researchers, pesticide manufacturers, and others. EPA reviewed substantial amounts of new information and conducted assessments based on the best available science, including making

Effect Determinations under the Endangered Species Act.

New registration approvals are for over-the-top dicamba products XtendiMax with VaporGrip Technology and Engenia Herbicide. The extended registration is for an additional over-the-top dicamba product, Tavium Plus VaporGrip Technology. The registrations are only for dicamba-tolerant cotton and soybeans and will expire in 2025.

Registration features important

control measures to manage off-site movement of dicamba. These measures include:

- Requiring an approved pH-buffering agent (also called a Volatility Reduction Agent or VRA) be tank mixed with OTT dicamba products prior to all applications to control volatility.
- Requiring a downwind buffer of 240 feet and 310 feet in areas where listed species are located.
- Prohibiting OTT application of dicamba on soybeans after June 30 and cotton after July 30.
- Simplifying the label and use directions so that growers can more easily determine when and how to properly apply dicamba.

Pecans – Nature’s Health Snack

Maple Bacon Pecan Brittle

- 1 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 6 tablespoons light corn syrup
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup
- 1 cup pecans
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3/4 cup crumbled, cooked maple bacon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

Bring sugar, water, corn syrup and maple syrup to a boil in a large skillet over medium-high heat, stirring constantly. Heat to 250° or until a small amount of syrup dropped into cold water forms a rigid ball. Stir pecans and vanilla into syrup mixture until mixture begins to turn brown; add bacon. Cook until bacon mixture turns light brown, 1-3 minutes. Remove from heat and stir baking soda into bacon mixture. Pour brittle out onto a sheet of parchment paper set on a heat-proof surface and cool brittle to room temperature before breaking into pieces, at least 30 minutes. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

Apple Pecan Cobbler

- 4 cups thinly sliced apples
- 1/2 cup sugar & 1 cup sugar, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 1/3 cup butter, melted
- 1/4 cup chopped pecans

Generously grease baking dish. Arrange apple slices in an even layer in the baking dish. In a small bowl, mix together 1/2 cup sugar, cinnamon and 1/2 cup pecans. Sprinkle mixture over apples. In a medium bowl, mix together flour, 1 cup sugar, baking powder and salt. In a separate bowl whisk together egg, evaporated milk and melted butter. Pour milk mixture into flour mixture all at once and stir until smooth. Pour mixture over apples and sprinkle top with 1/4 cup pecans. Bake at 325° for 55 minutes. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

Pecan Sandies

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup cake flour
- 1/2 cup finely chopped pecans

In a bowl, cream butter and sugar; stir in vanilla. Add flour; mix on low until well blended. Stir in pecans; mix well. Chill for 30 minutes. Roll into 1-inch balls;

place on a greased baking sheet. Bake at 350° for 15-18 minutes or until bottom edges are golden brown. Cool on a wire rack. Yield: about 1-1/2 dozen. *Source: tasteofhome.com*

Southern Pecan Pie

- 1/2 (15-ounce) package refrigerated piecrusts
- 4 large eggs
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1/2 cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1/4 cup firmly packed light brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup pecans, coarsely chopped

Unfold 1 piecrust, and roll to press out fold lines. Fit into a 9-inch pie plate according to package directions; fold edges under, and crimp. Whisk together eggs and next 6 ingredients in a saucepan over low heat until well blended. Pour into piecrust; sprinkle with pecans. Bake at 350° on lower rack 30 minutes or until pie is set. *Source: Southernliving.com.*





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Plan Now for Safe Holiday Gatherings

It should come as no surprise that 2020 holiday gatherings will have a new element of health safety that impacts every part of the festivities and requires planning.

Dr. Emily Landrum, a family physician in Starkville, recently hosted a baby shower that successfully gathered friends to celebrate in an environment that protected health.

"You have to make a plan, re-evaluate the plan and then adjust it as needed," Landrum said of the process. "When assessing the type of gathering you want to have, it's important to consider those who will be in attendance and just accept that things need to be different for a bit."

Landrum suggested determining who may have high-risk conditions or work in a higher risk setting and asking them what they are comfortable with. Do not pressure anyone to participate in events they find troubling.

For the baby shower for her best friend Audrey, Landrum decided to host an outdoor, drive-by party. She used e-invitations, which allowed for easy communication and updates as plans were formed and changed.

"We created a sign-up so people could select their own individual time slot to sit down with Audrey at a distance, give their gift and hang out," Landrum said. "All the hosts signed up for what items they would bring, just like at any other shower."

When the big day turned out rainy, Landrum put in place her backup plan and set up a tent in the front yard. She kept the front door propped open for ventilation and provided restroom access with limited touch areas. Snacks were spaced out on the table under the tent with serving tools that prevented touch, and individual canned or bottled drinks were available.

"My take-aways are wear your mask, keep your distance and stay hygienic," Landrum said. "Have your event outside. Stagger guests' arrival time to limit exposure, and have a back-up plan for weather or if a guest or host has an exposure."

David Buys, health specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said this event perfectly demonstrated safe practices

and can serve as a guide when planning holiday events.

"Casual, hasty plans of getting a turkey and a few friends together should now be replaced by thoughtful preparations that create safe environments for gatherings," Buys said.

COVID-19 is not expected to disappear anytime soon, Buys said, so plans should be made now for the upcoming holidays.

"As cooler weather sets in, we anticipate folks spending even more time indoors, and COVID is more likely to be transmitted among people in those settings," he said. "We continue to be concerned about the burden of COVID on the health care system. Additionally, we cannot let up our focus on preventing chronic disease or other infectious disease like flu, as those also weigh on our health care infrastructure."

Buys offered a few tips to help resolve the competing demands of holding holiday get-togethers while ensuring health safety. Remaining flexible is a key to success.

"Those who routinely live together are safe to move about their homes without a mask, but regardless of your kinship, if you are not living in the same home, it is essential that you take all precautions, such as using face covering when indoors and maintaining at least 6 feet outdoors," Buys said.

Consider outdoor holiday gatherings this year. Outdoor events can use a tent for shelter, but it is easier to socially distance in an open area.

Additionally, being outdoors means guests are breathing fresh air.

If guests cannot participate in an outdoor event, Landrum suggested delivering a holiday meal to family members who are part of an at-risk group, and then setting up a video chat to let them participate during the meal.

Some people consider getting a COVID test and self-quarantining before gatherings. Buys said this approach would be effective only if everyone tests negative and then truly self-quarantines leading up to the event.

"As the holidays approach, we are going to want try to find ways to rationalize holding our traditions and large family gatherings, but we need to stay the course with wearing face coverings, practicing social distancing and engaging in other safety measures, as COVID is not going to take a break from infecting people," he said.

Despite the party atmosphere of the holidays, Buys said masks are important. Wear face coverings if the gathering is indoors or if it is outdoors but people are not staying at least 6 feet apart. Consider limiting the size of gatherings to reduce the concentration of people in the same space.

Always make sure sanitizing equipment is readily available. Sanitize hands frequently, avoid touching the face, use single-serving foods and disposable utensils when possible, and sanitize high-touch areas often.

Careful Prep Can Result in Healthy, Safe Holiday Meal

A few, simple preparations can mean the difference between achieving a healthy success or suffering a major disaster during the traditional biggest meal of the year.

Courtney Crist, assistant professor of food safety with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said one common mistake in food preparation happens at the very beginning. She recommended not washing the turkey before cooking it.

"It is virtually impossible to wash bacteria off the turkey, and liquids that splash during washing could transfer bacteria onto surfaces in your kitchen, other foods and utensils," Crist said. "Proper cooking will kill bacteria."

Thaw the bird in the refrigerator, under cold water or in the microwave, but never thaw it at room temperature.

"Bacteria grow rapidly in the temperature danger zone between 40 and 140 degrees," she said. "Thaw the bird according to the instructions on the label or by U.S. Department of Agriculture guidelines."

And never rely on looks to determine when the turkey is done.

"All whole birds and poultry products should be cooked to a minimum of 165 degrees, and your bird is not safe to eat until it reaches this temperature," Crist said. "Rather than rely on the pop-up thermometer that often comes inserted in the bird, use a probe thermometer to measure doneness and safety at the thickest part of the breast, the innermost part of the wing and the innermost part of the thigh."

The main dish is not the only item that must be handled and prepared correctly. Crist said clean hands are a must. Hands should be washed frequently with soap and water, especially after handling time raw meat and poultry.

Another important element of a



safe meal is avoiding cross contamination.

"Always separate raw meat and poultry from ready-to-eat foods, and use separate cutting boards, plates and utensils when preparing and serving food," Crist said. "Keep hot foods hot with chafing dishes, slow cookers or warming trays, and keep cold foods cold by nesting them in bowls of ice or only serving small portions at a time, keeping the rest under refrigeration."

"Throw away perishable foods that have been left out at room temperature for more than two hours," she said.

Natasha Haynes, host of the MSU Extension Service video series The Food Factor, said another way to make the Thanksgiving meal a resounding success is to keep it healthy.

"The average person will eat about 4,500 calories on Thanksgiving Day," Haynes said. "With so many delicious foods available, it's easy to get carried away and over-eat, so portion control is very important."

The cooks can help reduce the calorie count by making small changes to their recipes to make the dishes healthier.

There is typically enough stress on Thanksgiving Day just getting the meal on the table at the right time, so reduce anxiety by testing the changes to favorite recipes ahead of time to make sure they produce the desired texture and flavor.
