A New Year's Day Tradition: Prosperity on the Southerner's Plate

We've all heard the old saying, "You are what you eat." But what about when the thought goes as far as what you eat can determine your destiny in the new year? Interesting, huh?

During the fall-winter holiday season, every family has their traditions that they adhere to every year—carving pumpkins and enjoying hayrides around Thanksgiving and hanging stockings on the mantelpiece and shopping for real Mississippi Christmas trees after



Thanksgiving. Finally, in honor of the approaching year, people purchase fireworks, blast their shotguns (where allowed), watch the ball drop in Times Square on TV, and attend New Year's Eve parties in excitement of the clock striking midnight.

Perhaps, people imagine New Year's Day as another chance at getting something right, like hitting the reset button on life. Well, one thing is for certain—New Year's Day leads to a special Southern tradition that is dear to many. This tradition is cooking and eating food that sets the stage for the new year. That's right—leafy greens for money that folds, peas and beans for coins or wealth, pork for prosperity, and cornbread for gold. Southerners can make their year "luckier" by adding a treat like a surprise loaf cake and, as some believe, by hanging greens by the door to fend off those evil spirits lurking in the new year.

Green and flat like paper money, greens symbolize money. Many people in the South will be eating

some type of green, leafy vegetable on January 1. As far as greens are concerned, any kind will serve this purpose. People will have free rein to explore their options—kale, spinach, collard greens, boy choy, mustard greens, turnip greens, Swiss chard, and more.

Peas are coinlike, a reminder of wealth. Each pea represents a day of good luck, so the more peas a person loads on their plate, the better off they'll be. The concept of eating black-eyed peas for good luck is believed to have originated during the Civil War when Union soldiers left behind only this bean after disrupting the Confederate Army's food supply. Another origin story is that recently emancipated slaves in America celebrated gaining their freedom in 1863 with what was one of the very few foods they had access to—black-eyed peas. Some origin stories go all the way back to Ancient Egypt with peas being symbolic of humility, because it was available to even the poorest slaves at the time. A fourth history of black-eyed peas is that,

in the Talmud, the book of Jewish law written around 500 A.D., it was customary for Jewish people to eat black-eyed peas in celebration of their Jewish New Year. Despite which origin story you find most interesting or believable, one thing is constant across all of them—the representation of prosperity.

Historically restricted to the elite, pork is symbolic of humble success. Pigs are known for using their snout to root forward instead of digging backward like many other animals. After a year like 2020, who wouldn't want forward momentum?

Cornbread is doubly symbolic of gold. It is similar to gold in color, and the corn kernels used to make it are representative of coins. This staple food popularly accompanies peas and greens well on New Year's Day.

What to avoid? Well, there is a common belief that eating lobster on this day symbolizes bad luck, because, unlike the beloved pig, lobsters move backward. After a year like 2020, there is likely no

reason anyone would want to risk any setbacks in their lives in the new year, so this may be one 24-hour period people want to refrain from eating lobster. (Recommendation: Opt in for some delicious Mississippi Delta-raised catfish instead.)

This collection of inexpensive Southern food-eating traditions has many origin stories. On the first day of 2021, many people will gather over hot and delicious home-cooked meals in hopes of some type of defined fulfillment or wealth. What menu items people choose to load onto their plates will vary. Besides, dish options are limitless but include Hoppin' John soup, pulled pork, skillet buttermilk cornbread, turnip greens, and bacon. One of the most popular plate options is a meal with fried hog jowl (cut from a pig's cheek) or fried pork chops with sides of black-eyed peas and greens. And of course, people won't forget the cornbread.

No matter what 2021 brings, indulging in this tradition is a great way for families all over the South—and beyond—to bond with those they love as they partake of hearty meals from recipes passed down from several generations. Everyone is encouraged to kick the new year off with meats, eggs, dairy, and produce from our hard-working Mississippi farmers who go above and beyond every day to make sure our #1 industry excels at feeding families all over. USACE Releases Final Supplement No. 2 to the 1982 Yazoo Area Pump Project

Commissioner Andy Gipson applauds the efforts of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to re-evaluate the Yazoo Area Pump Project, which was vetoed by the EPA in 2008. On December 11, 2020, the USACE released its Final Supplement No. 2 to the 1982 Yazoo Area Pump Project. Findings of the study included reduction of average

annual flood damages to urban and agricultural areas through a combination of structural and nonstructural flood damage reduction features, minimization of adverse impacts through project design, and a net gain in environmental value to the entire Yazoo Backwater Area. Additionally, mitigation will be used to compensate for any unavoidable losses to environmental resources from the construction, operation and maintenance of the Proposed Plan. The Proposed Plan represents a balanced approach to ad-

dress flood damage reduction and environmental issues using new environmental data.

In a letter submitted by EPA Region 4 Administrator Mary Walker to the USACE on November 30, 2020, Administrator Walker stated that the EPA reviewed Draft Supplement No. 2 and fully supports the purpose of the Yazoo Area Pump Project. Additionally, Administrator Walker stated that the proposed project is not subject to the EPA's 2008 veto. This new support from the EPA is essential in completing the Yazoo

Area Pump Project.

The Yazoo Backwater Area of Mississippi has experienced significant flooding nine out of the past 10 years, which has devastated local economies and natural resources. As a result of this "new normal," the USACE completed Supplement No. 2 using new and current environmental data to re-evaluate the recommended plan to complete the Yazoo Area Pump Project. The next phase of implementation for the project is pre-construction engineering and design. New Year's Day Southern Style Recipes!

Classic Southern Buttermilk Cornbread

- 2 cups white or yellow cornmeal
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/4 cups buttermilk
- 1 large egg
- 3 tablespoons melted shortening plus more for the skillet

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F. Position the rack in the center of the oven. Put about one tablespoon of shortening in a 9-to-10-inch cast iron skillet and place the skillet in the oven. In a large bowl, combine the cornmeal, flour, baking powder, soda and salt. Whisk to blend thoroughly. In another bowl, whisk together the buttermilk, egg and shortening. Add the buttermilk mixture to the dry mixture and stir just until blended. Carefully remove the hot cast iron pan from the oven and set it on a metal rack. Pour the batter into the sizzling shortening in the hot skillet. Return the skillet to the oven, reduce the temperature to 375 degrees F, and bake for about 20 to 24 minutes, until golden brown. Cut the cornbread into wedges and serve hot. *Source: thespruce.com*

Southern-Style Collard Greens

- 12 hickory-smoked bacon slices, finely chopped
- 2 medium-size sweet onion, finely chopped
- 3/4 pound smoked ham, chopped
- 6 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 3 32-ounce containers chicken broth
- 3 1-pound packages fresh collard greens, washed & trimmed
- 1/3 cup apple cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 teaspoon pepper

Cook bacon in a 10-quart stockpot over medium heat for 10 to 12 minutes, or until it is almost crisp. Add onion and sauté 8 minutes; add ham and garlic, and sauté one minute. Stir in broth and remaining ingredients. Cook two hours or to desired degree of tenderness. *Source: www.southernliving.com*

New Year's Day Black-Eyed Peas

- 1 pound dried black-eyed peas
- 1/2 pound bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- Salt to taste

Fresh thyme leaves and additional cooked and crumbled bacon, optional

Rinse and sort black-eyed peas. Place peas and bacon in a Dutch oven; add water to cover. Bring to a boil; boil 2 minutes. Remove from heat; let soak, covered, 1 hour. Do not drain. In a cast-iron or other heavy skillet, heat butter over medium-high heat. Add onion; cook and stir until tender. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Stir in thyme. Stir into pea mixture. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer, covered, until peas are tender, stirring occasionally, 30-40 minutes. Sprinkle with salt to taste. If desired, garnish with fresh thyme leaves and additional crumbled bacon.

Baked Ham with Pineapple

- 1 fully cooked bone-in ham (6 to 8 pounds)
- Whole cloves
- 1 can (20 ounces) sliced pineapple

Place ham in roasting pan. Score the surface with shallow diagonal cuts, making diamond shapes; insert cloves into diamonds. Cover and bake at 325° for 1-1/2 hours. Drain pineapple, reserving 1/4 cup of the juice. Combine brown sugar and reserved pineapple juice; pour over ham. Arrange pineapple slices and cherries on ham. Bake, uncovered, 30-45 minutes longer or until a thermometer reads 140° and the ham is heated through. *Source: www.tasteofhome.com*







Animals Need Protection When Temperatures Drop

Although many pets and livestock grow heavy winter coats and have thick foot padding, they still need human protection when temperatures drop.

Here are some tips that pet owners and livestock producers can follow to keep their animals healthy and comfortable in extremely cold weather.

Dogs and cats, particularly those that live inside but often venture outdoors, are vulnerable when weather turns cold. They often need additional food and fresh water to maintain their body heat. Most large dogs can tolerate extremely cold temperatures if already acclimated to outside weather. Smaller-sized pets cannot.

Dogs that are kept outdoors should have a solid, protected doghouse or other shelter that keeps out wind, rain, snow and cold. The shelter should face south and have insulation, a blanket or hay for warmth. Keep bowls in an area that prevents water or food from freezing.

Protect your pet's paws from salt. The salt and other chemicals used to melt snow and ice can irritate the pads of your pet's feet. Wipe all paws with a damp towel before your pet licks them and irritates his/her mouth.

Keep pets off icy surfaces to prevent injuries from slipping. As sure-footed as they are, dogs can slip on icy steps and tear or strain ligaments or aggravate hip problems. They could even break a bone. If you would not feel safe walking in an area, the dog shouldn't be doing it either.

Antifreeze and ice-melting chemicals often have a sweet taste. When these products accumulate in puddles on garage floors and sidewalks, the smell and taste often cause dogs and cats to lick these products.

Antifreeze ingestion is one of the most common and lethal poisonings seen in pets during winter. As little as one teaspoon is often fatal to dogs and cats that ingest this poison. Symptoms of antifreeze ingestion include drunkenness, listlessness, frequent urination and vomiting. If an owner suspects a pet has consumed antifreeze, take the pet to a veterinarian immediately for emergency treatment.

Animals that stay outdoors, such as horses, cows, goats and sheep, require additional feed, fresh water and adequate shelter to keep warm and maintain good health. At a minimum, producers should install a windbreak to prevent additional body heat loss.

As temperatures begin to fall in the winter months, livestock require additional energy to stay warm. This additional energy requirement usu-



ally calls for changes or alterations in feeding practices. This means that when the temperature drops below the critical temperature, the animals need to be fed better. It will be helpful to monitor weather forecasts to determine cold periods in advance and be able to increase the forage and additional supplements for the animals diet. Range meal, molasses tub products and protein blocks can help meet their energy requirements in extreme temperatures. Use caution when providing supplemental feed products to horses, and use products that are labeled for those animals.

Horses will better withstand winter weather if owners make sure their animals are prepared. The big thing is having the horse come into the winter months in tip-top shape. Horses should be up-to-date on vaccinations and on a good worming program throughout the winter months.


Regularly check horses feet, especially when the ground is muddy, because horses tend to get foot infections during wet months. While not all horses will need to be blanketed, blankets will help horses keep warm and dry, especially if there is any rain or snow. If you've body-clipped your horses, keep them blanketed throughout the winter. Horses that get blanketed can be susceptible to diseases and funguses that grow under the blanket, so remove the blanket regularly.

If horses spend a great deal of time in their stalls, make sure the area is safe, clean and free of mold and leaks. Buy quality hay and grain, and keep it covered. Feed your horses more forage, unlimited amounts if possible during extreme cold. This will help your horses create heat and regulate their body temperatures.

Extremely cold temperatures have a greater effect on livestock than humans, primarily because these animals live outdoors. Provide a healthy environment for your animals and use common sense to meet their needs during cold weather.
