Ag Industry Posted 2020 Estimated Value of \$7.35B

Mississippi farmers generated an estimated agricultural value of \$7.35 billion in 2020, a 5% increase from 2019 that saw soybeans top forestry for the No. 2 spot behind poultry.

The predicted total ag value exceeds 2019's production value of \$7.01 billion, marking the ninth consecutive year that agriculture topped \$7 billion in the state.

Keith Coble, head of the Mississippi State University Department of Agricultural Economics, said the year did not start out looking good.

"We did some midyear analysis on June 1, and the economic picture for farm products looked pretty bleak," Coble said. "We went through unprecedented losses early to midyear, but markets have generally improved

in the latter portion of the year."

Josh Maples, an agricultural economist with the MSU Extension Service, said poultry took a hit from COVID-19-related issues and dropped 16% in value. But row crops were strong, posting a combined \$2.6 billion estimated value.

"This was a turbulent year for all agricultural producers due to the market upheaval caused by the pandemic," he said. "Poultry production was especially impacted during the spring by demand disruptions. Row crop markets also faced low prices and uncertainty early in the year before stronger prices in the fall helped boost the value of production."

Although rebounding markets and prices helped the year end stronger than expected for some commodities, higher than normal government payments of an estimated \$930 million helped make up some of the gap caused by early market devastation. In 2019, Mississippi growers received \$599 million in various forms of government payments.

Josh Maples said coronavirus response programs made up a significant portion of the government payments.

"The Coronavirus Food Assistance Programs 1 and 2 were the primary relief programs for farmers who faced price declines and additional marketing costs due to COVID-19," Josh Maples said. "The other programs included the traditional farm bill programs like Agriculture Risk Coverage, Price Loss Coverage and conservation programs."

At an estimated value of \$2.16 billion, poultry continues to be the state's major ag commodity, despite declining from the \$2.57 billion value it posted in 2019.

"The estimated 2020 Mississippi broiler value of production is \$1.9 billion, which is down 19.5% due primarily to inventory disruptions during the spring and weaker prices," Josh Maples said. "The number of broiler chicks hatched in Mississippi

from April to June was 12% lower in 2020 than in 2019, and prices during these months were exceptionally low."

While broilers were down, eggs were up 21%. Eggs make up about one-tenth of the overall value of poultry to Mississippi. Eggs increased to an estimated value of \$260 million.

"This increase is driven by stronger prices, especially during the spring months," Josh Maples said. "Eggs faced significant production challenges during the COVID-19 shutdowns while also experiencing a sharp demand increase due to grocery store demand. Sharply higher prices were the result of supply challenges at the same time as a demand increase."

A large part of the supply challenge centered on the different demands of grocery stores and restaurants, as well as the supply chains that exist to meet each of these demands.

"Managing these issues improved, and egg prices were much lower in May and June than in March and April," he said.

Forestry holds the No. 2 ag spot most years, but COVID-19 caused many sawmills to scale back production or temporarily close. When

mills were not in operation, timber was not being cut and sold, so forestry declined an estimated 2.6% to an overall value of \$1.12 billion.

That decline opened the door for soybeans to surge into second place overall with an estimated production value of \$1.21 billion in 2020. Soybeans helped propel row crops to an overall increase of an estimated 21% over 2019 values.

Will Maples, an Extension row crop economist, said the crop's value grew an estimated 67% over 2019 based mostly on an improved soybean market. Soybeans also reclaimed acreage lost the previous year.

"In 2019, suppressed prices due to the U.S.-China trade war and the loss of exports led to Mississippi growers planting the lowest number of soybean acres since 2005," he said. "A main reason we saw a big increase in acres in 2020 was because we followed a year of record low acres."

Market factors also helped the increase. Soybean exports to China increased in the fall of 2020, which led to a jump in prices that translated into an overall value increase.

Despite a decline of more than 9% from 2019 levels, cotton comes in as the No. 4 agricultural commodity with an estimated value of \$491 mil-

lion for cotton lint and cottonseed.

"Cotton prices were not great at planting, and that led to lower acres," Will Maples said. "Worldwide supply chain disruptions this spring and demand concerns due to the COVID-19 pandemic and shutdowns suppressed cotton prices at planting, which led to lower acres."

"As the year progressed, though, cotton prices recovered as economies opened back up, and that led to farmers receiving higher returns than were expected this spring," he said.

While the pandemic put a new twist into ag markets, weather is always a factor. Will Maples said the wet spring prevented many producers from getting corn planted, which resulted in lower acreage. Corn's value was down 10% to an estimated \$387 million.

Rice was up 44% to an estimated value of \$138 million. Peanuts posted a 34% estimated increase to \$19 million. But, given the small amount of peanut acreage planted annually in Mississippi, Will Maples said a small change adds up to a big percentage shift.

Cattle and calves experienced slight growth in 2020 with an estimated value of \$261 million, up about 5% from 2019 levels. Milk declined 1% and hogs 7% in 2020 to estimated values of \$24 million and \$38 million, respectively.

Catfish also faced a turbulent year due to restaurant demand disruptions among other factors. Its value of production stayed flat in 2020, with an estimated value of \$226 million.

Specialty crops remained at 2019 levels and together brought an estimated \$106 million in production value to Mississippi. Sweet potatoes posted an estimated 1.8% increase for a 2020 value of \$96.7 million.

Other crops and their estimated values are hay, up 3% to \$140 million, and wheat, down 17% to an estimated \$4 million.

Commissioner's Policy Corner

Mississippi Agriculture Remains Strong in 2020

The year 2020 will certainly be a year that will not be forgotten. Our usual way of life became anything but normal due to the COVID-19 pandemic; however, one thing remained the same – our farmers never stopped farming. They continued working to provide the food, fiber and fuel that we need to survive.

Despite the challenges felt by many in 2020, including our farmers and ranchers, Mississippi agriculture remains strong overall. According to Mississippi State University, the value of agriculture production in Mississippi was estimated to be at \$7.35 billion. This is up from \$7.01 billion in 2019 and marks nine consecutive years of production over \$7 billion.

Agriculture, the largest industry in our state, is a vital part of Mississippi's economy. The COVID-19 shutdowns reminded all Americans how important and essential agriculture is to our daily lives in providing food, fiber and shelter. During the onset of the pandemic, consumers demonstrated a renewed interest in purchasing and eating local products. Many consumers even began gardening for the first time. Farmers markets saw many

new faces shopping weekly buying produce, meats and dairy products from local farmers. In order to connect consumers to the local farm products they so desire, the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) developed the Mississippi Farm Marketplace, an online platform where farmers list their farm products for sale to the public.

The increased demand for local products significantly impacted local meat processors and livestock producers. The growing demand for local meats led to processors becoming backlogged and producers being put on waiting lists to get livestock processed. Some producers were put on waiting lists that stretched as far as nine months. The Mississippi Land, Water and Timber (LWT) Resources Board made it a priority to increase the processing capacity of USDA-inspected meats in the state. Through the LWT program, grants and grant/loan combinations were made available to existing USDA-inspected processing plants for expansion and towards the development of new plants, which can potentially double the amount of USDA-inspected meat processed in the state.

As with most other businesses, farmers found themselves faced with additional expenses as a result of the pandemic – extra costs to feed and

care for livestock, rising input costs, added expenses for PPE to keep employees safe. To assist farmers who incurred additional operating expenses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Mississippi Agriculture Stabilization Act (MASA) provided assistance to Mississippi producers from CARES Act funds. MASA had three separate funds within it: Poultry Farmer Stabilization Grant Fund; Sweet Potato Farm Sustainment Grant Program Fund; and Mississippi Supplemental CFAP Grant Program Fund. Through MASA, \$7,697,012 was distributed by MDAC directly to farmers as a reimbursement for expenses incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce is continuing efforts to expand international trade and potential new markets for agriculture products including timber and forestry. While the pandemic kept the Department from traveling internationally for global trade activities, MDAC offered virtual trade missions through the Southern US Trade Association, which allowed companies to continue promoting their products in overseas markets. As we move ahead, we look forward to the export growth resulting from efforts including the signing of Letters of Intent with Taiwan to purchase Mississippi soybeans and corn

and trade missions with China, India and Vietnam to promote Southern Yellow Pine logs from Mississippi.

Mississippi's food supply is abundant, plentiful and safe. We have our farmers and ranchers to thank for that. As we move into 2021, I encourage you to support our local farmers and ranchers. Shop at a local farmers market in your area; search the Mississippi Farm Marketplace (MSFarmMarketplace.com) for locally produced agriculture products; and visit GenuineMS.com for all things grown, raised, crafted and made right here in the great State of Mississippi. And, the next time that you have the opportunity, stop and thank a farmer for continuing to keep us clothed and fed.

MDAC Accepting Second Round of Applications for its Wild Hog Control Program

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson announced that the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) began accepting a second round of applications for its Wild Hog Control Program (WHCP) on Wednesday, January 6. The application period will close on Wednesday, January 20. Eligible counties for the application period will be Adams, Amite, Claiborne, Copiah, Franklin, Jefferson, Lincoln, Pike and Wilkinson.

Through the WHCP, MDAC provides "smart" wild hog traps to landowners and managers for the control of wild hogs on private agricultural and forestry lands in Mississippi. MDAC will provide the training necessary to use the "smart" traps and technical guidance regarding the most effective methods to trap and control wild hogs on private lands. During this upcoming trapping effort, MDAC will partner with USDA APHIS Wildlife Services to expand wild hog disease surveillance into Southwest Mississippi.

"We are excited to begin working with Wildlife Services to monitor wild hog diseases that can impact



agriculture," said Commissioner Gipson. "Southwest Mississippi has a rich history of livestock production, and diseases carried by wild hogs pose a great threat to cattle herds. At this time, Wildlife Services has limited resources to expand its disease surveillance efforts into the southwest portion of the state. With our agency's equipment and relationship with landowners and farmers in the region, we can help track deadly diseases that can impact our livestock industry. This will be a great opportunity for a state agency, federal agency and farmers to work together."

Applications must be completed

and submitted online at www.mdac.ms.gov/whcp. Submitted applications will be evaluated based on the number of acres available for trapping, historical agricultural losses caused by wild hogs on the property and current trapping efforts on the property. A cooperative application is encouraged for small acreage (i.e., adjoining land managers of small parcels should work together to submit one application). Traps will be available for one-month intervals, dependent upon use and success. One trap per 1,000 acres is recommended, depending on landscape and land use.

The WHCP is the result of legis-

lation passed during the 2020 Legislative Session. The legislation authorized Commissioner Gipson to operate programs to fight nuisance wildlife species on private agricultural and forestry lands. In Mississippi alone, wild hogs cause more than \$60 million in damages annually. The WHCP provides the equipment and technical guidance needed to control wild hogs across the state. The Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation provided key support to the program with the acquisition of additional traps that are deployed to help control wild hogs on private lands.

The first round of WHCP trapping efforts has been a success with properties in 12 counties participating and more than 200 wild hogs captured to date. The WHCP has provided a great avenue for MDAC to expand working relationships with farmers, ranchers and other land managers across the state.

Wintertime Soups!!

Cheesy Potato Soup

- 4 slices bacon
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 (14 1/2 oz.) cans chicken or vegetable broth
- 2 cups milk
- 2 cups instant mashed potatoes
- 1 1/2 cups shredded cheese, such as cheddar
- 1/3 cup sour cream
- Additional cooked bacon (optional)
- Additional cheese (optional)

In pot, cook bacon over medium-high heat until crisp, 6-8 minutes; drain on paper towel. Crumble and reserve. Place the bacon drippings in pot, add onion, salt, pepper; cook, stirring occasionally until tender. Add broth. Increase heat to high; bring to boil, scraping up browned bits from bottom. Reduce heat to medium; stir in milk, dry potato mix and bacon. Simmer 5 minutes; remove from heat. Stir in cheese and sour cream. Garnish with bacon and cheese, if desired. *Source: Food.com.*

Chunky Vegetable Beef Soup

- 2 pounds ground chuck
- 1 small sweet onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon table salt

- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 3 (14 oz.) cans reduced-sodium beef broth
- 3 (29 oz.) cans mixed vegetables with potatoes, drained and rinsed
- 3 (14 1/2 oz.) cans diced new potatoes, drained and rinsed
- 1 (15 oz.) can sweet peas with mushrooms and pearl onions, drained and rinsed
- 2 (26 oz.) jars tomato, herbs and spices pasta sauce
- 1 (14 1/2 oz.) can diced tomatoes with sweet onion

Brown ground chuck and onion, in batches, in a large Dutch oven over medium-high, stirring 5-8 minutes or until meat crumbles and is no longer pink. Drain well and return to Dutch oven. Stir in salt, black pepper and beef broth; bring to a boil. Stir in mixed vegetables and next 4 ingredients. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat and simmer at least 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Baked Potato & Broccoli Soup

- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 (14 1/4 oz.) cans low-sodium fat-free chicken broth, divided
- 3 cups peeled, cubed potato
- 2 cups broccoli florets, chopped
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 1/4 cups 2% reduced-fat milk
- 1 (8 oz.) block 2% reduced-fat sharp Cheddar cheese,

- shredded
- 7 teaspoons shredded 2% reduced-fat sharp Cheddar cheese
- 7 teaspoons fully cooked bacon pieces
- 7 teaspoons chopped green onions

Whisk together flour and 1/3 cup chicken broth until smooth. Combine remaining chicken broth and next 3 ingredients in a Dutch oven. Bring to a boil; cover, reduce heat and simmer 8 minutes or until potatoes are tender. Gradually stir in flour mixture. Cook, stirring often, 5 minutes. Stir in milk and 8 ounces shredded cheese. Cook mixture over medium-low heat, stirring constantly, until cheese melts. Top each serving of soup with 1 teaspoon cheese, 1 teaspoon bacon pieces, and 1 teaspoon chopped green onions. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

Tortilla Soup

- 2 (14-19 oz.) cans chicken noodle soup
- 1 cup frozen corn kernels
- 1 teaspoon hot sauce
- 2 cups tortilla chips
- 1 avocado, cut into pieces

In a medium saucepan, bring the soup to a simmer. Add the corn and hot sauce and cook, stirring occasionally, just until heated through, 2-3 minutes. Ladle into bowls and serve with tortilla chips and avocado. Makes 4 servings. *Source: MyRecipes.com.*



Commissioner Andy Gipson Announces Successful Payout of MASA Funds to Mississippi Agriculture Producers

Mississippi Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson announced the successful payout of \$7,697,012 to Mississippi agriculture producers through funds provided by the Mississippi Agriculture Stabilization Act (MASA) under the CARES Act.

"I am proud to announce that the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce has been able to directly distribute over \$7.6 million to our agriculture producers across the state who have struggled during the pandemic this year," said Commissioner Gipson. "I want to thank Governor Tate Reeves, Lieutenant Governor Delbert Hosemann, House Speaker Philip Gunn, State Senate Agriculture Chairman Chuck Younger and House of Representatives Agriculture Chairman Bill Pigott for their work on this endeavor."

MASA went into law on October 9, 2020, through Senate Bills 3058 and 3061, to aid producers in Mississippi. The self-

certified application program for assistance due to the negative effects of the COVID-19 pandemic included three separate funds within it: the Poultry Farmer Stabilization Grant Fund, the Sweet Potato Farm Sustainment Grant Program Fund and the Mississippi Supplemental CFAP Grant Program Fund. MASA Funds reimbursed agricultural producers for expenses incurred due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I am proud that our state was able to provide this assistance to our agricultural producers at a time when they needed it the most," said Governor Reeves. "I commend Commissioner Gipson for his leadership in getting the funds dispersed to our farmers and ranchers in a timely manner."

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce distributed 330 direct MASA fund payments to Mississippi farmers, ranchers and agriculture producers, exhausting all funds within two of the allotted grant programs. All unexpended funds were transferred to the Unem-

ployment Compensation Fund.

"Our farmers are the lifeblood of Mississippi, and of much of the Nation. They were hit hard by the pandemic," said Lt. Governor Hosemann. "The Agriculture Stabilization Act created and funded by the Legislature gave hundreds of our farmers a boost of almost \$7.7 million during a very difficult time. We are grateful to the Department for administering and marketing this important program."

"We realize this past year has been a trying time for all Mississippians, including our farmers," said House Speaker Gunn. "I'm glad we were able to quickly pass this legislation out of the House and provide our state's agricultural producers the help they needed through the Mississippi Agriculture Stabilization Act."

Mississippi Timber Price Report Regions





Poultry Demand Strong, Egg Value Skyrockets

Despite multiple challenges in 2020, Mississippi's poultry industry retained its first-place position among the state's agricultural commodities. It topped the list with an estimated total production value of \$2.16 billion.

That figure is down 16.1% from 2019. Final figures will be available in April.

"Production disruptions from COVID-19 and severe weather impacts coupled with weaker prices drove broiler values down this year, but chickens and eggs saw an increase in value," said Josh Maples, an agricultural economist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service.

Three industry segments make up the overall value of poultry: broilers, chickens and eggs. Broilers are worth an estimated \$1.9 billion, down 19.5% from 2019. Estimated value for chickens that produce table eggs stands at about \$2 million, a 2.6% increase over 2019. Production challenges and consumer demand for eggs pushed their value up 21% from the previous year to \$260 million.

"Eggs are particularly interesting because of the grocery store versus restaurant supply chain dynamic," Maples said. "Most eggs that go to restaurants are in liquid form, while grocery stores sell mostly shell, or table, eggs. Specific supply chains have formed for each of these channels."

The Food and Drug Administration impose different safety rules for these egg types.

"When restaurants closed or business slowed because of COVID-19 protocols, there was a reduction in demand for liquid eggs and a large increase in demand for table eggs. The specific supply chains couldn't immediately shift from liquid to shell. The result of supply challenges at the same time as an increase in demand for table eggs was sharply higher prices," he said.

When COVID-19 cases surged in the spring, processing plants were faced with a decreased workforce because they had workers out sick and others afraid to go to work for fear of becoming sick. This scenario forced broiler integrators to increase downtime between flocks and place fewer birds per house.

On top of that situation, Mississippi producers were slammed with several severe weather events in April, damaging or destroying well over 100 poultry houses, said Tom

Tabler, Extension poultry specialist.

But, Tabler said, the industry fared well overall and has heeded the lessons from the COVID-19 situation.

"While the farm side of the industry remains pretty much unchanged, COVID-19 is changing the processing side of the industry," he said. "Look for these changes to continue well into the future, particularly in the area of increased automation."

Tabler said the challenge at times has been keeping a healthy workforce.

"Look for the industry to be more flexible at changing their product mix on short notice. Many shelter-in-place orders across the country early in the year meant a quick shift from food service and fast food products to more grocery store and fix-at-home products. The industry will be better prepared for scenarios such as this in the future," Tabler said.

One thing COVID-19 did not affect was demand.

"Demand is strong, and broiler production continues to rebound, particularly since June as the industry learns to adjust to new health and safety protocols," Tabler said. "We're seeing an especially high demand for poultry products on the export side despite the pandemic, and that's good news for the poultry industry."

Many export markets around the world need an alternative protein to pork after losing much of the pig

population to African Swine Fever, Tabler said.

Tabler said he expects demand in 2021 to stay strong, but the industry should remain cautious. Lingering COVID-19 issues coupled with higher prices for lumber and steel and producers' increasing difficulty in securing property insurance will likely keep production modest. Grain prices also are a concern.

"We'll still be dealing with COVID-19, and we want to protect the health of everyone in the industry," Tabler said. "I am always concerned about weather. Not only have we had a rough time with severe weather this year, but corn and soybean prices steadily increased in the last few weeks, which will be a concern going in to 2021."

Demand for grain in overseas markets is another factor driving grain prices upward. China is importing grain while it rebuilds its swine herd that was devastated by African Swine Fever. Dry weather in Ukraine and Brazil reduced their corn and soybean crop yields.

"Poultry companies will closely monitor the grain futures markets as we enter 2021, as feed is approximately 70% of the cost to bring poultry to market," he said.

"Don't look for huge increases in production in 2021. My guess is that 2020 - 2021 may very well be the slowest period for broiler production growth in the state since 2012 - 2013, when we saw record high grain prices," Tabler said.

Mississippi Forestry Industry Weathers Setbacks

Mississippi's timber industry was not excused from market volatility due to COVID-19 this year, but its final value should land just short of where it was at the end of 2019.

Forestry dropped from the second to the third largest agricultural commodity in the state -- behind poultry and soybeans -- with an estimated value of \$1.12 billion in 2020 compared to \$1.15 billion a year ago. The estimated value of timber production is estimated by monthly severance taxes from the Mississippi Department of Revenue.

Before the pandemic, the year began with high housing starts and demand for wood products. Mills across the Southeast responded to expected reduced demand at the onset of COVID-19 in a variety of ways, but many scaled back production or temporarily closed.

"One of the things that drove prices up for finished products was the temporary supply gap we created by the mills that closed," said Shaun Tanger, forestry economics specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service. "While some closed, there were other mills that kept going 100% and were working overtime. I know of a mill in the Carolinas that was down for six months."

"The decision to stay open or closed depended on two things: if it was part of a large corporation or an independent local mill; and how much risk upper management was willing to take," he added.

There are nearly 70 mills statewide from small, independent local facilities to sites affiliated with large corporations.

"Local mills come in and out of business based on demand," said John Auel, MSU Extension professor of forestry. "If they don't have the capital investment that a large mill does, it's easier for them to mothball their operation to ride out a lull because they don't impact markets as much as larger ones."

Plunging prices in March and April were quickly made up as manufacturers worked to replenish the scarce supply of paper products on grocery store shelves, namely toilet paper and paper towels.

Timber prices, however, will likely not recover to pre-COVID levels until 2021. Hardwood pulpwood, for example, had a statewide stumpage price of \$3.87 per ton in the third quarter of 2020 compared to \$6.24 a year before.

"We expect to see a buildup of pulpwood hardwood on the stump," Tanger said. "Our oversupply of standing timber is keeping stumpage

prices lower."

Sawtimber prices reflect the rate of new home building. Third quarter stumpage prices this year for pine, oak and mixed hardwood sawtimber were down from that timeframe in 2019. The largest price gap between the two quarters was for oak sawtimber, which was \$35.35 per ton in third quarter 2020, down from \$44.60 per ton in third quarter 2019.

April saw a second setback as Easter Sunday tornadoes plowed through several areas of south Mississippi. More than 13,000 acres of forestland took a hit from the storms. The estimated damage was \$15 million.

"The impact of the storms on the overall value was minimal, but to the affected landowners, an event like this is devastating," Auel said. "The end product prices would have suffered more if damage occurred to a mill."

A positive industry development is the construction of new mills and expansion of existing ones.

Enviva's pellet mill in Lucedale is scheduled to launch in early 2021 and create 130 jobs. Mission Forest Products is bringing a new pine sawmill to Corinth with production likely beginning in 2022. Vicksburg Forest Products announced plans to double capacity, and Alternative Energy Development is expanding its Hazlehurst-based pellet mill.

"There is reason for landowners to be optimistic about the future. We have mills coming in to pick up the slack from others that have closed," Auel said. "The energy sector is a great benefit to us. The more pellet mills we can put in to feed overseas markets, the better off everybody is going to be in Mississippi. We have the luxury of two deep-water ports in the Mississippi River and the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, so we are uniquely positioned with those avenues to fill that market."

As the new and expanded mills come online, quantities will begin moving more quickly, but landowners are mostly playing the long game in the interim.

"We're still a decade or more away from prices like we had in the early 2000s and certainly the mid-2000s, but we should be patient and optimistic that the market is at least going to stay the same," Tanger said. "If you look at timberland as an investment, you can still sell now and come out really well. It's not like anybody is trapped in forestry. If they're looking to cash in, land prices are really good for timberland right now. People want that property for hunting and fishing, so you are not being held captive by your land."
