Raised Beds Benefit Flowers, Vegetables

Many people are interested in having home vegetable and flower gardens, but many urban homes have small lots. Home gardeners in this situation may not think they have enough room. Others, especially inexperienced gardeners, may be discouraged by the amount of time and work required to build a new garden bed.

A good solution to this problem is to grow vegetables and flowers in compact, raised beds. By using an intensively cultivated area, you need less time and space to produce vegetables that taste great and flowers that feed the soul.

A raised bed is exactly what the name suggests -- a landscape or garden bed that is higher than the surrounding grade. Raised beds offer many advantages for gardening in Mississippi:

Research suggests plant growth is enhanced, primarily due to the much improved drainage of the raised bed compared to in-ground gardening.

They aid gardeners who have sore backs and achy knees by bringing the garden up a little closer, which I particularly appreciate.

Growing in raised beds allows the gardener to reach into the bed from both sides.

The first planning step is deciding where to put your garden. Most vegetables prefer full sun all day, but they can get by with at least six hours of sun. If all-day sun is not possible, select a site that receives morning rather than afternoon sun.

Another very important factor to consider is how close your bed is to the water faucet. Successful gardens must have easy access to irrigation.

And don't forget to call 811 and have any underground utilities located. This really is a must for any garden and landscape project.

You can raise the planting bed by



simply piling up growing mix and making walkways on either side. But using hardscape materials to build sides will keep your garden looking tidy.

The choice of materials is the gar-

den's decision. If you don't want to use treated lumber, then cedar and redwood have natural resistance to decay. These woods are more expensive but will last much longer than untreated pine. Other options include using block, recycled concrete or recycled plastic boards.

The construction parameters of raised beds are quite simple. You can make the raised bed as long as you want, but don't make it over 4 feet wide. This width allows you to reach plants in the middle from either side without walking in the bed.

Your new raised bed is really just a large container, so use a growing mix made for containers. And because the raised bed is contained with side walls, no one walks through it to compact the growing mix. That means the soil will stay light and fluffy and ready for any season.

To calculate the volume of grow-

ing mix you need for your raised bed, just multiply the length by width by depth, using feet for all the dimensions.

Bagged, premixed potting soil or soilless mixes are readily available from garden supply stores. This is a quick way to fill your bed, but it is the most expensive. So here's an alternative mix recipe that will give the same great results: use equal volumes of peat moss, compost and pine bark. To make measuring easier, remember that a 5-gallon bucket hold two-thirds of a cubic foot.

Constructing raised beds and growing vegetables and flowers in them is one way to help new and old gardeners have greater success in the garden and landscape.

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Commissioner's Policy Corner

USDA Pandemic Assistance for Producers

On March 24, 2021, USDA announced its Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative. The initiative establishes new programs and efforts to bring financial assistance to farmers, ranchers and producers who felt the impact of COVID-19 market disruptions. Below are the four parts of the initiative.

Part 1: Investing \$6 Billion to Expand Help & Assistance to More Producers

Part 1 includes assistance for:

- Dairy farmers through the Dairy Donation Program or other means;
- Euthanized livestock and poultry;
- Biofuels;
- Specialty crops, beginning farmers, local, urban and organic farms;
- Costs for organic certification or to continue or add conservation activities;
- Other possible expansion and corrections to CFAP that were not part of the announcement such as to support dairy or other livestock producers;
- Timber harvesting and hauling;
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other protective measures for food and farm workers and specialty crop and seafood producers, processors and distributors;
- Improving the resilience of the food supply chain, including assistance to meat and poultry operations to facilitate interstate shipment;
- Developing infrastructure to support donation and distribution of perishable commodities, including food donation and distribution through farm-to-school, restaurants or other community organizations; and
- Reducing food waste.

Part 2: Adding \$500 Million of New Funding to Existing Programs

Part 2 includes:

- \$100 million in additional funding for the Specialty Crop Block

Grant Program, administered by the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS), which enhances the competitiveness of fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops.

- \$75 million in additional funding for the Farmers Opportunities Training and Outreach program, administered by the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) and the Office of Partnerships and Public Engagement, which encourages and assists socially disadvantaged, veteran, and beginning farmers and ranchers in the ownership and operation of farms and ranches.
- \$100 million in additional funding for the Local Agricultural Marketing Program, administered by the AMS and Rural Development, which supports the development, coordination and expansion of direct producer-to-consumer marketing, local and regional food markets and enterprises and value-added agricultural products.

- \$75 million in additional funding for the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program, administered by the NIFA, which provides funding opportunities to conduct and evaluate projects providing incentives to increase the purchase of fruits and vegetables by low-income consumers.
- \$20 million for the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service to improve and maintain animal disease prevention and response capacity, including the National Animal Health Laboratory Network.
- \$20 million for the Agricultural Research Service to work collaboratively with Texas A&M on the critical intersection between responsive agriculture, food production, and human nutrition and health.

- \$28 million for NIFA to provide grants to state departments of agriculture to expand or sustain existing farm stress assistance programs.
- Approximately \$80 million in

additional payments to domestic users of upland and extra-long staple cotton based on a formula set in the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 that USDA plans to deliver through the Economic Adjustment Assistance for Textile Mills program.

Part 3: Carrying Out Formula Payments under CFAP 1, CFAP 2, CFAP AA

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, enacted December 2020 requires FSA to make certain payments to producers according to a mandated formula. USDA is now expediting these provisions because there is no discretion involved in interpreting such directives, they are self-enacting.

- An increase in CFAP 1 payment rates for cattle. Cattle producers with approved CFAP 1 applications will automatically receive these payments beginning in April. Information on the additional payment rates for cattle can be found on farmers.gov/cfap. Eligible producers do not need to submit new applications, since payments are based on previously approved CFAP 1 applications.
- Additional CFAP assistance of \$20 per acre for producers of eligible crops identified as CFAP 2 flat-rate or price-trigger crops beginning in April. This includes alfalfa, corn, cotton, hemp, peanuts, rice, sorghum, soybeans, sugar beets and wheat, among other crops. FSA will automatically issue payments to eligible price trigger and flat-rate crop producers based on the eligible acres included on their CFAP 2 applications. Eligible producers do not need to submit a new CFAP 2 application. For a list of all eligible row-crops, visit farmers.gov/cfap.

- USDA will finalize routine decisions and minor formula adjustments on applications and begin processing payments for certain applications filed as part of the CFAP Additional Assistance program in

the following categories:

- Applications filed for pullets and turfgrass sod;
- A formula correction for row-crop producer applications to allow producers with a non-Actual Production History (APH) insurance policy to use 100% of the 2019 Agriculture Risk Coverage-County Option (ARC-CO) benchmark yield in the calculation;
- Sales commodity applications revised to include insurance indemnities, Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program payments, and Wildfire and Hurricane Indemnity Program Plus payments, as required by statute; and
- Additional payments for swine producers and contract growers under CFAP Additional Assistance remain on hold and are likely to require modifications to the regulation as part of the broader evaluation and future assistance; however, FSA will continue to accept applications from interested producers.

Part 4: Reopening CFAP 2 Sign-Up to Improve Access & Outreach to Underserved Producers

As noted above, USDA will re-open sign-up for CFAP 2 for at least 60 days beginning on April 5, 2021.

Use Fresh Herbs in Your Springtime Recipes!



Fresh Cucumber Salad

3 medium cucumbers, sliced
1 cup sugar
3/4 cup water
1/2 cup white vinegar
3 tablespoons minced fresh dill or parsley

Place cucumbers in a 1 1/2 or 2-quart glass container. In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, shake remaining ingredients until combined. Pour over cucumbers. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Serve with a slotted spoon.

Cilantro Lime Shrimp

1/3 cup chopped fresh cilantro
1 1/2 teaspoons grated lime zest
1/3 cup lime juice
1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and minced
2 tablespoons olive oil
3 garlic cloves, minced
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon ground cumin
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1-pound uncooked shrimp (16-20 per pound), peeled & deveined
Lime slices

Mix first nine ingredients; toss with shrimp. Let stand 15 minutes. Thread shrimp and lime slices onto four metal or soaked wooden skewers. Grill, covered, over medium heat until shrimp turn pink, 2-4 minutes per side.

Cheese and Fresh Herb Quiche

1 sheet refrigerated pie crust
1/2 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese
1/2 cup shredded Gruyere or additional Swiss cheese
1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese
5 large eggs
1 cup half-and-half cream
1 tablespoon minced fresh basil
1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley
2 teaspoons minced fresh dill

Preheat oven to 400°. Unroll crust into a 9-inch pie plate, flute edge. Sprinkle cheeses into crust. In a large bowl, whisk eggs and cream until blended. Stir in herbs; pour over top. Bake on a lower oven rack 25-30 minutes or until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Let stand 10 minutes before cutting.

Minty Watermelon-Cucumber Salad

8 cups cubed seedless watermelon
2 English cucumbers, halved lengthwise and sliced
6 green onions, chopped
1/4 cup minced fresh mint
1/4 cup balsamic vinegar
1/4 cup olive oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper

In a large bowl, combine watermelon, cucumbers, green onions, and mint. In a small bowl, whisk remaining ingredients. Pour over salad and toss to coat. Serve immediately or refrigerate, covered up to two hours before serving.



Mississippi Horse Rescue Earns Top Honors in Forever Foundation Equine Excellence Awards

On March 2, 2021, the Forever Foundation named Mississippi Horse Rescue as a finalist in the Equine Excellence Awards. Our professional paid trainers conduct hands-on clinics for volunteers and adopters giving our horses the consistency and reinforcement they need to become safe riding partners.

Lynda Koch has been training horses for over 10 years and knows the importance of making sure the owner of the horse is also trained using natural horsemanship techniques. "The Forever Foundation's training program teaches volunteers and adopters how to communicate with the horses and establish a partnership," says Lynda Koch. "Horses want and need a leader to feel safe and that's the basis of natural horsemanship methods."



Commissioner Andy Gipson Announces Next Wild Hog Control Program Application Period

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson announced that the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) will begin accepting a new round of applications for its Wild Hog Control Program (WHCP) on Wednesday, April 7. The application period will close on Wednesday, April 21. All Mississippi counties are eligible for the application period. In Mississippi alone, wild hogs cause more than \$60 million in damages annually.

Through the WHCP, MDAC provides "smart" wild hog traps to landowners and managers for the control of wild hogs on private agricultural and forestry lands in Mississippi. MDAC will provide the training necessary to use the "smart" traps and technical guidance regarding the most effective methods to trap and control wild

hogs on private lands.

"The Wild Hog Control Program has been a great success so far. Working with farmers and land-owners, we have captured wild hogs on 21 properties in 11 counties to date," said Commissioner Gipson. "This program provides a great opportunity for farmers and land-owners to gain access to the latest technology used to trap wild hogs. It also provides a great opportunity

for the Department of Agriculture and Commerce to teach farmers and landowners how to trap wild hogs and use that knowledge for future control efforts on their lands.”

Applications must be completed and submitted online at www.mdac.ms.gov/whcp. Submitted applications will be evaluated based on the number of acres available for trapping, historical agricultural losses caused by wild hogs on the property and current trapping efforts on the property. A cooperative application is encouraged for small acreage (i.e., adjoining land managers of small parcels should work together to submit one application). Traps will be available for one-month intervals, dependent upon use and success. One trap per 1,000 acres is recommended, depending on landscape and land use.


