Changes in Beef Industry Go Beyond the Numbers

Mississippi's beef cattle herd size and farm inventory have not changed much in the last three years, but changes are taking place elsewhere in the industry.

The most recent count from the MSU Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine lists 920,000 head of cattle on 15,980 farms as of 2020. In 2018, the state had a head count of 930,000 on about the same number of farms.

However, consumer behavior and strategies for raising beef cattle are moving in new directions, said Daniel Rivera, a Mississippi State University Extension beef cattle nutritionist and researcher with the Mississippi Agricultural and

Forestry Experiment Station.

The COVID-19 pandemic forced Rivera to deliver educational programming in a virtual format instead of the traditional Extension field days and short courses. Rivera had already seen a rising number of younger producers entering the industry, and they had no trouble with the transition to video conferencing.

"When we had to go virtual, the younger producers were Johnny-on-the-spot, and that opened our eyes to the opportunity we have to engage with a diverse range of ranchers," Rivera said. "A lot of them are looking at different ways to market their animals and are better versed in what younger gen-

erations want to see in their beef."

One of these demands, he says, is for locally produced, locally finished beef.

"National data suggest more millennial consumers want to know where their meat comes from," Rivera said. "A lot of smaller slaughter plants are scheduled out several months ahead to meet this demand. It's a limited market because only so many people have enough disposable income, but we still have some room to grow."

A stable market is key to keeping younger producers in beef cattle production. Disruptions in the supply chain due to COVID-19 caused market instability, but conditions have steadied since. The statewide average price for 500- to

600-pound steers was about \$145 per hundredweight during the first three weeks of April 2021. This price is up 17% compared with the same period a year ago, when cattle markets were disrupted by the pandemic.

"The number of beef cattle and calves in Mississippi and nationally has been steady to slightly lower over the past year," said Extension agricultural economist Josh Maples. "Market prices the past few years have hovered just above break-even levels for many producers, which prevented heavy liquidation but also didn't encourage many producers to expand."

Restaurant demand remains an important factor as the U.S. and world continue to emerge from

pandemic restrictions.

"Demand for steaks is influenced by travel and dining at sit-down restaurants," Maples said. "As we approach the warmer months, ground beef demand usually picks up as the primary grilling season begins."

At MSU research facilities on campus and across the state, recent beef cattle studies have included fattening cattle without a conventional stable, costs incurred by fattening beyond standard market weight, and using hay analysis to determine appropriate amounts needed to supplement cattle.

In 2020, the state's beef cattle industry had a \$261 million value of production, which was a \$12 million increase over the previous year.

Buy 'Local' Opportunities Growing in Mississippi

The COVID-19 pandemic interrupted many aspects of our lives over the past year. The pandemic even impacted how we go about purchasing our food. The closure of restaurants, schools, and other food-service providers, disrupted the food supply chain for a time. While there was not a food shortage, foods that were being consumed outside of the home, such as in local restaurants, had to be prepared at home.

Consumers had a difficult time finding meat and other products in grocery stores as a result of the supply chain disruptions. Many consumers turned to purchasing food products direct from local farmers. The demand for 'local' grew exponentially – local meat, local produce. This demand led to a backlog at local meat processing facilities. Farmers were put on waiting lists of up to nine months to a year to get livestock slaughtered.

This hindered the farmers' ability to sell products to consumers because they couldn't get their animals processed in a timely manner leaving them with less supply to fill the growing demand. Again, not because of a food shortage, but due to supply chain disruptions. It quickly became evident that a critical need in the state was the need to expand livestock processing capabilities.

To address this critical need, the Mississippi Land, Water, and Timber Resources Board accepted applications from entities across the state through the Mississippi Land, Water, and Timber Resource's Finan-

cial Assistance program, which is administered jointly by the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) and the Mississippi Development Authority. With a priority to increase the processing capacity of USDA-inspected facilities, the Board provided funding to seven processors to expand their facilities and production capacity.

- Attala Frozen Foods in Attala County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$611,110 to expand its USDA-inspected processing facility. The grant allows for the building construction and the purchase of equipment.

- Homestead Farm and Packing in George County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$49,700 to purchase new equipment to increase the processing capacity of their USDA-inspected processing facility.

- Pitcock Processing, Inc. in Panola County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$494,745.80 and a loan in the amount of \$329,897.20 to construct a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchase equipment.

- Cutting Edge Meat Co. in Greene County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$350,000 to assist with the cost of constructing a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchasing equipment.

- A Cut Above Meat Processing and Market, LLC in Hancock County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$529,560 and a loan in the amount of \$353,040 to construct a new USDA-inspected processing facility and purchase new equipment.

- Blue Sky RE, LLC in Rankin County, was awarded a grant in the

amount of \$304,385 to purchase a USDA-inspected mobile processing unit and modular cut and wrap facility.

- Juniper Creek Farms, LLC in Pearl River County, was awarded a grant in the amount of \$70,000 to construct an on-farm USDA-inspected poultry processing facility.

Through the expansion of currently operating USDA-inspected facilities and the construction of new USDA-inspected processing facilities, Mississippi will be on track to more than double the livestock processing capacity in the state. The number of USDA-inspected facilities that provide slaughtering and processing services to the public will double. The mobile processing unit, the first of its kind in Mississippi, will bring the slaughtering component straight to the farm.

This increased number of facilities will provide additional opportunities for farmers and will potentially decrease the number of miles they have to transport cattle. The fewer miles traveled means fewer expenses and less stress on the animals. And ultimately, the expansion of livestock processing in the state will make it easier for consumers to find locally grown and produced meats – a win, win for our farmers and consumers.

The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce has been instrumental in creating additional opportunities to connect farmers and consumers making it easier for consumers to find local farm products, while creating new marketing opportunities for producers. The Mississippi Farm Marketplace, an online marketing platform, was cre-

ated during the pandemic to connect farmers and consumers looking for local agriculture products. The Farm Marketplace, found at MSFarmMarketplace.com, features local produce, meats, honey, as well as a variety of other items.

As the demand for local products increased over the past year, MDAC has gotten Genuine MS® products in front of consumers through pop-up stores at the Mississippi State Fair, the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo, and the Mississippi Farmers Market. Roast Beef Cheddar Pockets

1 package (16 to 17 ounces) refrigerated fully-cooked boneless pot roast with gravy
1 8-ounce package refrigerated crescent rolls
1 cup shredded sharp Cheddar cheese, divided
1/3 cup finely chopped sweet onion (optional)
1/4 cup dairy sour cream
Fresh chives

Heat oven to 375° F. Remove pot roast from package, eliminating as much gravy as possible; reserve gravy for another use. Cut pot roast into fine shreds. Unroll crescent dough onto ungreased baking sheet. Separate into 4 rectangles; press diagonal seams to seal. Pull sides of rectangles slightly to enlarge. Combine beef, 3/4 cup cheese and onion, if desired, in a large bowl; mix well. Divide beef mixture into fourths; press mixture to compact and place lengthwise in center of rectangles. Fold the long sides of each rectangle over filling, pressing at top to seal. Press ends to seal. Sprinkle pockets evenly with remaining 1/4 cup cheese. Bake in oven 13 to 16 minutes or until golden brown. Serve with sour cream. Garnish with chives.

Easy Roast Beef Potluck Rolls

1 pound Ground Beef (93% lean or leaner)
2 teaspoons chile powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 can (11 ounces) corn, drained

1 cup prepared chunky salsa
8 taco shells

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add Ground Beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into small crumbles and stirring occasionally. Pour off drippings, as necessary; season with chile powder and salt, as desired. Stir in corn and salsa; heat through. Serve in taco shells with toppings, as desired.

Classic Beef Sloppy Joes

1 pound Ground Beef (93% lean or leaner)
1 cup minced sweet onion
1 cup minced green bell pepper
1 can (14-1/2 ounces) unsalted tomato sauce
1/4 cup barbecue sauce
1/4 cup ketchup
1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
2 teaspoons packed brown sugar
1 teaspoon dry mustard
4 whole wheat hamburger buns or 8 slider buns
Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add onion, cook 3 to 5 minutes until golden brown. Add Ground Beef and bell pepper; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking beef into 1/2-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Stir in tomato sauce, barbecue sauce, ketchup, Worcestershire sauce, brown sugar and mustard; increase heat to medium-high. Bring to a boil; cook 5 to 10 minutes or until sauce is

thickened, stirring occasionally. Season with salt, as desired. Divide beef mixture evenly among buns. Top with pickles, coleslaw and cheese, if desired. Close sandwiches.

Beef Chili

1 pound Ground Beef (96% lean)
1 can (15 ounces) reduced-sodium black beans, rinsed and drained
1 can (14-1/2 ounces) unsalted beef broth
1 can (14-1/2 ounces) unsalted diced tomatoes
1 can (4 ounces) diced green chilies or sliced jalapeño peppers
2 tablespoons chili powder

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium heat until hot. Add Ground Beef; cook 8 to 10 minutes, breaking into 3/4-inch crumbles and stirring occasionally. Pour off drippings. Stir in beans, broth, tomatoes, green chilies and chili powder; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 20 minutes to develop flavors, stirring occasionally. Garnish with Toppings, as desired.

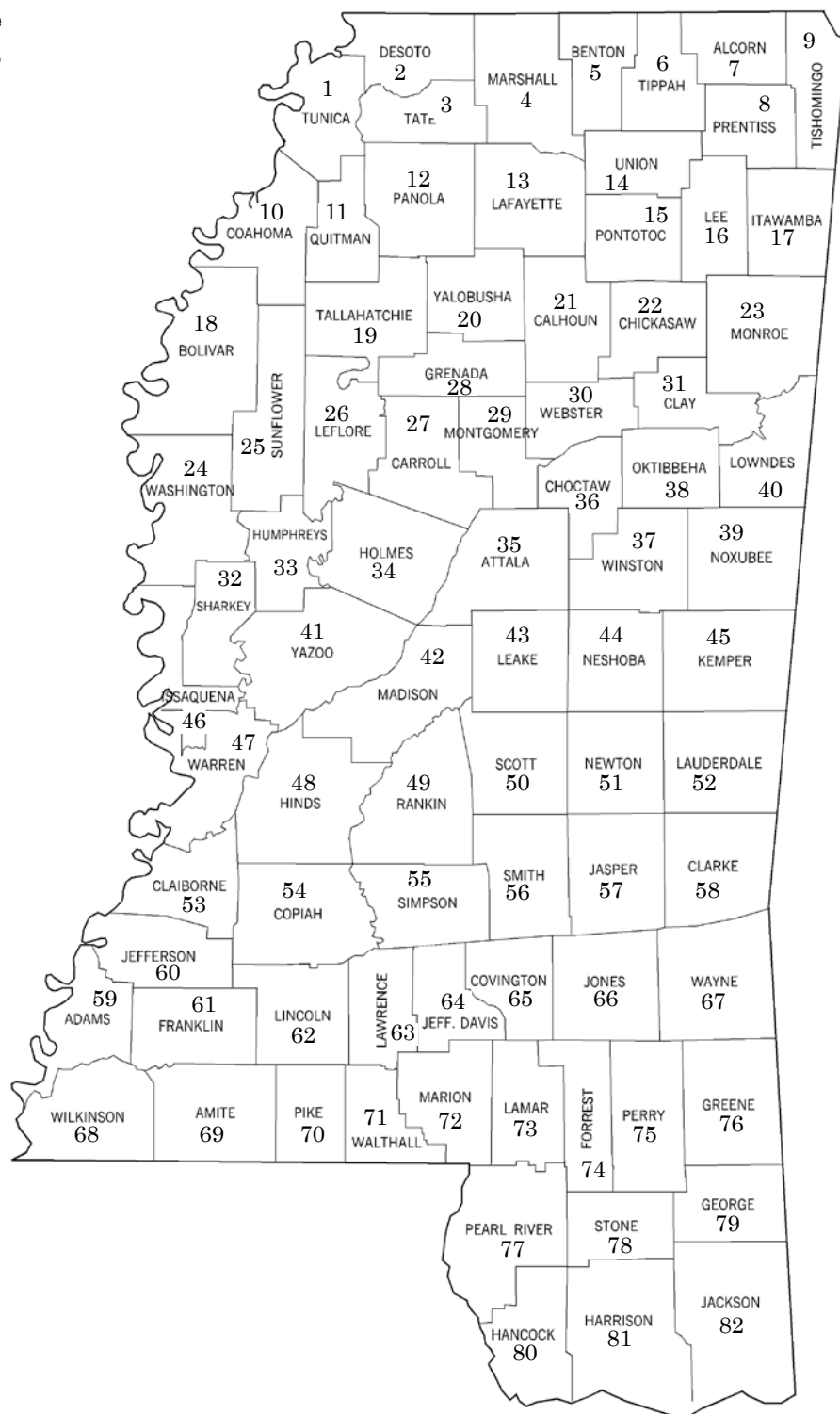

Cogongrass Control

Cogongrass ranks as the world's seventh worst noxious weed and has been detected in 66 of Mississippi 82 counties. Cogongrass quickly invades areas of low management like abandoned fields, highway rights of way, utility rights of way, and commercial forest plantations by means of seed disbursement and movement of rhizomes


The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC)/Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) continues to assist landowners in combating this noxious weed through its Control Demonstration Program. Through this program, MDAC provides herbicide to landowners in Mississippi at no charge. MDAC also provides treatment guidelines and spray options on how and when to apply the herbicide. MDAC staff participates in local meetings, training landowners and the general public on the identification of Cogongrass.

Landowners detecting Cogongrass on their property can apply to participate by submitting an application to BPI. The application can be found on the MDAC website at http://www.mdac.ms.gov/wp-content/uploads/bpi_plant_cogongrass.pdf, at your local Mississippi State University Extension Service office or your local USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service office.



Plan Well Before Starting Backyard Chicken Flock

Backyard chicken flocks continue to grow in popularity as Mississippians embrace the ability to produce some of their own food and enjoy the quirky personalities of the birds.

Tom Tabler, poultry specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said those considering starting a backyard flock need to make clear-headed plans before bringing home darling little chicks.

"Raising chickens is not as easy as you may have been led to believe. It takes work," Tabler said. "There's a reason you didn't have chickens before now. Make sure that you have the time and money to devote to them before you start."

Even before choosing a breed of chicken, there are decisions to be made. If the homeowner intends to sell meat or eggs, there are regulatory steps that include registering the flock with the Mississippi Board of Animal Health. Be sure to observe all city or county ordinances that may be in place limiting the size of the flock and the presence of roosters.

"Then you should talk to neighbors about your intention to establish a backyard flock, and determine the time commitment required to properly care for the birds," he said. "Who will care for the birds on a daily basis, and who will step in when you are out of town?"

In mid-2020, Joel Misita of Natchez started raising chickens when he, his son Joseph and two of Joseph's fellow Boy Scouts designed and constructed an elaborate coop to house 11 chickens given to them by a friend.

"Having chickens is very fun and fascinating, but it is one more thing to have to take care of and do while trying to raise a family and live life," Misita said.

The family now has 25 birds of a few different varieties, and they raise them for eggs. The coop they built is mobile, designed to be moved to a new location every few days to offer the chickens fresh foraging options.

"We get the byproduct of eggs, but raising chickens is interesting and a very whole experience," Misita said.

There is a lot to learn about how to care for birds and keep them healthy, what to do if they

are sick, where to purchase feed, what kind of space each bird needs, and how to keep them warm in the winter and cool in the summer.

Preparing the housing structure is the next big step. Housing can be as simple as a wire frame with a roof or as elaborate as a decorated chicken mansion. Determine what meets individual demands, and run electricity and water to the structure if needed.

Selecting a breed is another important consideration.

"Are you interested in helping preserve a breed from going extinct, or are you raising chickens for eggs or meat or both?" he asked. "Certain breeds are more friendly to people than other birds, some breeds are good foragers, and others are better suited to hot, humid weather."

Select a breed that meets personal goals, and avoid selecting a bird based on looks, simple availability or what kind a friend has.

Shelter is incredibly important. Chickens make easy targets for a variety of predators, plus they need cover from the sun and elements.

"Chickens have a wide range of natural predators: the aerial variety, such as hawks and owls, to the ground type, such as rats, raccoons, opossums, skunks, foxes and coyotes," Tabler said. "Many of these wild predators can threaten backyard flocks in town where you also have to protect the birds from pets such as dogs and cats."

Some chicken owners are able to allow their birds to run free during the day. But at night, all birds need covered protection that is sealed to keep predators

out. Tabler said the safest way to keep chickens is keep them in a structure that has both a nesting and nighttime shelter and a covered outdoor run.

Biosecurity is a critical part of raising chickens. Tabler said those with small backyard flocks must make protecting the health of their birds a high priority.

"Biosecurity practices and protocols are designed to prevent the spread of disease and maintain healthy flocks," Tabler said. "The primary components of biosecurity for backyard flocks are isolation, traffic control and sanitation."

Isolate birds from visitors and other birds. Prevent disease from spreading by cleaning shoes, tools, equipment and housing for the chickens. Avoid sharing items with another chicken owner, as this can spread disease from an infected flock.

Owners should also know the warning signs of infectious disease, such as coughing, sneezing, lethargy, watery eyes, nasal discharge, and decreased food and water intake.

"Flocks affected with a disease such as avian influenza, infectious laryngotracheitis, virulent Newcastle disease or fowl typhoid must be reported to the Mississippi Board of Animal Health," Tabler said. "A local veterinarian or the MSU Poultry Research and Diagnostic Laboratory at Pearl can help diagnose sick chickens."
