Timber Opportunities for Mississippi

If you have purchased lumber in the past year, you are aware of the sky-high prices. What many may not be aware of is that the landowner who grew the timber and the loggers who harvest the timber did not see increased returns.

Some reasons for the drastic price increase are supply and demand, supply chain disruptions, workforce issues, and the need for additional manufacturing. *Forisk*, founded in 2004, analyzes forest supplies, wood demand and timber pricing to develop forecasts and



strategic guidance for clients. They give some good news that Mississippi has five confirmed new mill openings, four lumber mills with a combined estimated output of 890 million board feet and a pellet mill with a capacity of 771 million tons. These additional facilities will help meet the demand for lumber, and the pellet mill will assist with the huge need for manufacturing that utilizes wood residuals.

Mississippi has nearly 20 million acres of sustainable forests to accommodate many more mills. Additional pellet, OSB, CLT, paper, and containerboard mills are needed. We also welcome innovative manufacturing to utilize wood fiber. According to the June 2021 *Forisk Market Bulletin*, "Pulp and paper mills continue to evolve. Markets for pulpwood are strong for mills producing containerboard products. Other markets are losing mills, but the US South has the largest share of pulping capacity at 55 percent and has been the

steadiest region, shedding only five percent over the past 12 years."

Workforce is critical to every industry in the state. Our office is actively working with public and private sectors for ag and timber related workforce development and training. There are hundreds of job opportunities for truck drivers with Commercial Drivers Licenses (CDL). Training and certification for the CDL, is offered through the community colleges. Once you have the CDL, there are trucking companies offering starting salaries at \$60-70,000 per year. We are actively promoting CDL classes. Let us know if we may be of assistance to your company.

Mississippi Loggers Association (MLA) is a TeamSafe Entry Level Driving Theory (ELDT) training provider. MLA is also an educa-

tional sponsor for TeamSafe trucking safety online training. ELDT is a new requirement that will be implemented by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMSCA) in February 2022. This training must be completed by all new CDL applicants to start the process of obtaining a CDL.

MLA is eager to help with this new training requirement. MLA plans to partner with community colleges across the state to implement the TeamSafe ELDT Training. For more information, contact David Livingston at dllivingston.mla@gmail.com.

In addition to manufacturing and workforce, Mississippi needs to implement a serious, well thought out freight plan for moving forestry and agriculture products. The plan must include every available logistical aspect including rail (short line and Class 1), trucking, river ports, Tombigbee Waterway Ports, ocean-going ports, roadways and timber bridg-

es. It should also include criteria found in the Safer Routes legislation before Congress.

The Safer Routes Bill allows Harvest Permit holders the ability to use the federal interstate system as opposed to being required to run the U.S. two lane highways (through many small towns) that parallel these interstates. Studies in all states and regions show that it is much safer to have log, grain and chicken trucks on the interstate.

Forestry and agriculture drive the Mississippi economy. MSU's 2020 Ag, Forestry, and Natural Resources overview shows the added value of forestry and agriculture production to be \$16.17 billion, and 17.5 percent of all value-added jobs in the state.

With a proper freight plan those numbers will increase. It is essential that forestry products be economically and efficiently traded worldwide. Plans should incorporate hub areas for transloading and economic development to include manufacturing and distribution facilities. Improvement in freight transport options throughout the state will expand markets for our timber and agriculture commodities.

Mississippi has excellent transportation assets; they need to be optimized for the people of Mississippi to reap the rewards.

MDAC opened a Gulf Coast office to focus on international trade. Training for companies and individuals wanting to explore international trade will be provided. I look forward to working with all parties to develop trade opportunities for the state and our timber industry.

USDA Invests \$55.2 million in Grants to Increase Capacity and Expand Access in Meat and Poultry Inspection Operations

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) today announced \$55.2 million in competitive grant funding available through the new Meat and Poultry Inspection Readiness Grant (MPIRG) program. The new program is funded by the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021.

"We are building capacity and increasing economic opportunity for small and mid-sized meat and poultry processors and producers across the country," Secretary Tom Vilsack said. "Through MPIRG, meat and poultry slaughter and processing facilities can cover the costs for necessary improvements to achieve a Federal Grant of Inspection under the Federal Meat Inspection Act or the Poultry Products Inspection Act, or to operate under a state's Cooperative Interstate Shipment program."

USDA encourages grant applications that focus on improving meat and poultry slaughter and processing capacity and efficiency; developing new and expanding existing markets; increasing capacity and better meeting consumer and producer demand; maintaining strong inspection and food safety standards; obtaining a larger commercial presence; and increasing access to slaughter or processing facilities for smaller farms and ranches, new and beginning farmers and ranchers, socially disadvantaged producers, and veteran producers. Eligible meat and poultry slaughter and processing facilities include commercial

businesses, cooperatives, and tribal enterprises.

MPIRG's **Planning for a Federal Grant of Inspection (PFGI) project** is for processing facilities currently in operation and are working toward Federal inspection. Applicants can be located anywhere in the states and territories. Whereas, MPIRG's **Cooperative Interstate Shipment (CIS) Compliance project** is only for processing facilities located in states with a Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) CIS program. These states currently include Indiana, Iowa, Maine, Missouri, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Vermont and Wisconsin. Applicants must be working toward CIS program compliance requirements to operate a state-inspected facility or make a good faith effort toward doing so.

Applications must be submitted electronically through www.grants.gov by 11:59 p.m. Eastern Time on Monday, August 2, 2021. Any grant application submitted after the due date will not be considered unless the applicant provides documentation that prevented their timely submission of the grant application. AMS offers webinars for applicants to help walk them through the Request for Application. Additionally, grants management specialists are standing by to answer

This announcement is part of the Build Back Better initiative, a commitment to invest more than \$4 billion to strengthen the food system, support food production, improved processing, investments in distribution and aggregation, and market opportunities. Fruit-Filled Summer Desserts!

Single Crust Peach Pie

- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 6 fresh peaches, pitted, skinned, & sliced
- 1 recipe pastry for a 9-inch single crust pie

Cream sugar and butter (or margarine) together. Add flour and nutmeg; mix until mealy. Spread 1/2 of mixture in pie crust. Arrange peaches on top of crumb mixture. Sprinkle remaining crumb mixture on top of peaches. Bake at 450° for 10 minutes. Reduce heat to 350°, and continue baking for 40 minutes, or until golden brown. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

Homemade Cherry Crisp

- 1 can (21 oz.) cherry pie filling
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/3 cup cold butter, cubed
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- Vanilla ice cream

Combine the pie filling and lemon juice in an ungreased microwave-safe dish; set aside. In a small

bowl, combine flour, brown sugar, cinnamon and all-spice; cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Add walnuts. Sprinkle over filling. Microwave, uncovered, on high until bubbly, 3-4 minutes. Serve warm with ice cream. *Source: TasteofHome.com.*

Caramelized Pear Tarts

- 1 frozen puff pastry sheet (17 1/4-oz. package), thawed
- 2 firm-ripe pears, peeled, halved lengthwise and cored
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup chilled heavy cream
- 1/2 cup caramel sauce
- Powdered sugar for dusting, optional

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Use a floured rolling pin to roll out pastry to a 12-inch square on a lightly floured surface. Brush off excess flour and cut out 4 (5-inch) rounds by tracing around an inverted plate or bowl with tip of a small sharp knife. Prick pastry rounds all over with a fork and transfer to baking sheet. Bake at 425° until rounds are puffed and golden, 12-15 minutes, and then cool on baking sheet on a rack. While the pastry bakes, toss pear halves in a bowl with the lemon juice. In a separate bowl, beat cream and granulated sugar with a whisk or an electric mixer until it just holds soft peaks. Put each pastry round on a small plate

and dust lightly with confectioner's sugar if desired. Spoon some caramel sauce onto center of each round and top with a pear half, cut-side down. Serve with whipped cream on the side. *Source: FarmFlavor.com.*

Grilled Angel Food Cake with Strawberries

- 2 cups sliced fresh strawberries
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted
- 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 8 slices angel food cake

Vanilla ice cream and blueberry syrup (for toppings)
In a small bowl, toss strawberries with sugar. In another bowl, mix butter and vinegar; brush over cut sides of cake. On a greased rack, grill cake, uncovered, over medium heat until golden brown, 1-2 minutes on each side. Serve cake with strawberries and, if desired, ice cream and blueberry syrup. *Source: TasteofHome.com.*





Modern Timber Bridge: An Alternative for Mississippi

When one hears about bridge outages, postings, and closures, as long as they are in a different city or county, the problems associated therewith are abstract and distant. But, when a bridge is out on your way to work or school, the problem then becomes very personal. Needed are safe, rapid, cost effective and reliable transportation solutions.

Safety is one of the most critical factors with respect to highway and road bridges and timber's record therein is excellent. Safe for vehicles. Safe for pedestrians. Safe for the environment. Engineering solutions are straightforward, well tested, and highly reliable. At one time, the U.S. had 22,000 miles of timber trestles supporting its national railroad system.

Because most of the energy used to form timber comes from the sun (that is from photosynthesis in the forest), the overall cost of wood as a structural material is comparatively low. Like houses, we often choose to build with wood because it is readily available and more cost effective than other alternatives.

Timber bridges are modular and relatively light weight. As such, they can be prefabricated offsite, delivered, and installed quickly. Often, when well planned, the installations take only a week or two. This com-

pares very favorably with other types of bridge construction.

Because trees and wood products sequester carbon during their lifetimes, they provide critical balance to other greenhouse gas emitting structural products such as concrete and steel. Finally, because wood has been used for centuries, its performance has been long studied and is highly predictable.

Contemporary timber bridges are largely invisible, that is, bridge users rarely are aware when a bridge is made from timber. Apart from timber guard posts and rails, there are often few outward clues. Gone are the days of plank wear surfaces. Contemporary timber bridges are typically paved or covered with road gravel. Because they blend in well with their natural environment, visually, they often seem to fade into the scenery.

In sum, timber bridges provide safe, efficient, cost effective, and very long-lasting transportation solutions. With centuries of development and in-service success, the future of timber bridges at the national level is assured. As states become increasingly conscious and accountable of taxpayer resources, timber-related transportation solutions will remain important critical infrastructure.

Ryegrass and Fall Forage Seed Supplies Expected to be Tight Due to Logistic Challenges

The past year has brought about several record-breaking shortages and delays for consumers. We've seen worker shortages in our meat packing plants and restaurants, delays within our petroleum industry and now it appears we will experience backlogs on fall forage seed supplies.

Farmers across our state and the southeast rely on seed produced by the Willamette Valley in Oregon for fall planting purposes, especially our ryegrass supply. However, due to logistical issues and worker shortages, Mississippians should plan to adapt our fall planting plans in response to expected logistical challenges.

During the COVID pandemic, a large percentage of commercial truck drivers went into retirement and are yet to be replaced. This, coupled with the worker shortage brought on by government payouts and lack of incentive to work has presented a major problem to the transportation of goods and ag commodities.

Record numbers of cargo ships, a shortage of intermodal rail cars, and slower transportation of shipping containers and truck trailers by rail are resulting in congestion and backlog as companies struggle to provide enough workers for the loading and unloading of freight. This in turn, is causing unprecedented delays in seed shipments from the west to other parts of the nation. As a result, this fall it is expected to take an additional four to six weeks than normal to receive goods in Mississippi once ordered from Oregon.

To add to these shipping challenges, grass seed farmers across Willamette Valley's 360,000 acres have also had to grapple with an unforgiving drought this past season. Though a vital component of



Oregon's annual revenue, grass seed crops are not looking promising this year.

Therefore, in addition to delays and shortages we should expect an increase in seed prices as shipments come in over the next several months. I encourage all Mississippi farmers, especially our livestock producers, to act quickly and purchase fall forage seed now from their local stores. In the meantime, co-op and feed stores across the state should go ahead and order seed now, as soon as possible, and take delivery as early and as soon as seed can arrive from Oregon. Farmers should take delivery of seed immediately upon arrival at their local seed store to free up as much local warehouse

space as possible.

The good news is I've confirmed that the largest, most well-established forage seed company in Mississippi is shipping seed from Oregon as soon as it is ready to ship to meet the needs of our livestock producers.

We have faced these kinds of challenges since the pandemic began, and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce has met these challenges head-on. We will continue to work for the people of Mississippi and our great state's largest industry.

Mississippi farmers, producers and even hunters should make plans and act earlier than usual for the fruitful fall planting season we want later this year.

High Construction Costs Not Reflected in Timber Prices

Although construction costs are through the roof timber prices have not kept pace, and Mississippi forest landowners are waiting for improved markets.

Shaun Tanger, a forestry economics specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said the recent increase in construction costs is a demand-side phenomena.

"The thing driving the costs of construction materials is an economy flush in newly printed money and low interest rates," Tanger said.

Tanger said he learned from his grandfather, who owned an apartment rental business for about 50 years, that "when money is cheap, people build."

"Combine this current access to cheap money with the ability of many new workers to work remotely -- meaning they can live in a different location from the office -- and you have rapid increases in construction in medium-sized cities when comparing to larger cities like New York and Los Angeles," Tanger said.

Compounding the issue was the fact that many mills were unprepared when COVID-19 struck, and some cut back or closed for a time, often months, due to government mandates.

"Lumber production was constrained right at the same time that interest rates cratered," he said. "Since people were working from home, it allowed many to live elsewhere. You had a perfect storm of people looking for new homes, others engaging in remodeling at their existing homes, and a decrease in production capacity for the products that those groups were using."

John Auel, MSU Extension Service forester and coordinator of the Professional Logging Manager Program, said severance tax records show about 1 million more tons of wood were harvested in 2020 than in 2019.

"In that sense, conditions are very good for timber," Auel said. "Growth

far exceeds harvest across all products, which means we have ample supply. But that is also part of the issue with prices."

As always happens with supply and demand, large supplies put downward pressure on prices, keeping timber values down. Auel said he does not expect to see timber prices rise much in the near future.

"The silver lining, in my opinion, is the interest in expanding existing mills and building new ones in the state, as has been announced recently," Auel said. "We have the ability to sustainably harvest more timber to meet the increased demand. Increased competition will have a positive impact on stumpage values as well."

But this economic perspective does not explain what is happening now, Tanger said.

"Mills are back at capacity and generating as much lumber as they ever have in the Southeast, but they just can't meet the demand, so prices skyrocket," Tanger said. "Rising prices are the signal that things are scarce relative to demand, and they sort those scarcer goods to those willing to pay higher prices."

With timber prices low in recent years, there is a lot of standing timber in the state.

"We are still growing wood faster than we are harvesting it, even with the increased production of lumber, and other wood products add to that the glut left over from the recession, and it's a wood mills' -- buyers' -- market," Tanger said.

Marc Measells, MSU Extension forestry economist, said timber prices have not been good in recent years, and in the last few weeks have fallen about 45% from their peak.

"Current statewide stumpage prices for mixed hardwood sawtimber have continued to decline since a peak in 2016 and hardwood pulpwood prices have declined since 2019," Measells said. "Pine sawtimber, chip-n-saw and pulpwood stumpage prices all increased to end 2020 and through the first quarter of 2021."

Prices for the second quarter of 2021 will be published in early July.
