## 2022 National Ag Day March 22, 2022

The Agriculture Council of America (ACA) will host National Agriculture Day on March 22, 2022. This will mark the 49th anniversary of National Ag Day which is celebrated in classrooms and communities across the country. The theme for National Ag Day 2022 is "Growing a Climate for Tomorrow."

On March 22, 2022, the ACA will host a virtual Ag Day event and events in Washington, DC. Additionally, the ACA will bring approximately 100 college stu-

dents to Washington "virtually" to deliver the message of Ag Day to the Hill. A core leadership team of college students will attend events in DC. Another exciting feature of Ag Day 2022 is the Celebration of Modern Agriculture on the Mall, March 21-22, 2022

These events honor National Agriculture Day and mark a nationwide effort to tell the true story of American agriculture and remind citizens that agriculture is a part of all of us. Many agricultural associations, corporations, students and government organizations involved in agriculture are expected to participate.

National Ag Day is organized by the Agriculture Council of America. The ACA is a nonprofit organization composed of leaders in the agricultural, food and fiber community, dedicating its efforts to increasing the public's awareness of agriculture's role in mod-

ern society.

The National Ag Day program encourages every American to:

- Understand how food and fiber products are produced
- Appreciate the role agriculture plays in providing safe, abundant and affordable products
- Value the essential role of agriculture in maintaining a strong economy
- Acknowledge and consider career opportunities in the agriculture, food and fiber industry

In addition to the events on March 22, the ACA will once again feature the Ag Day Essay Contest. The winning essay will be presented on National Ag Day.

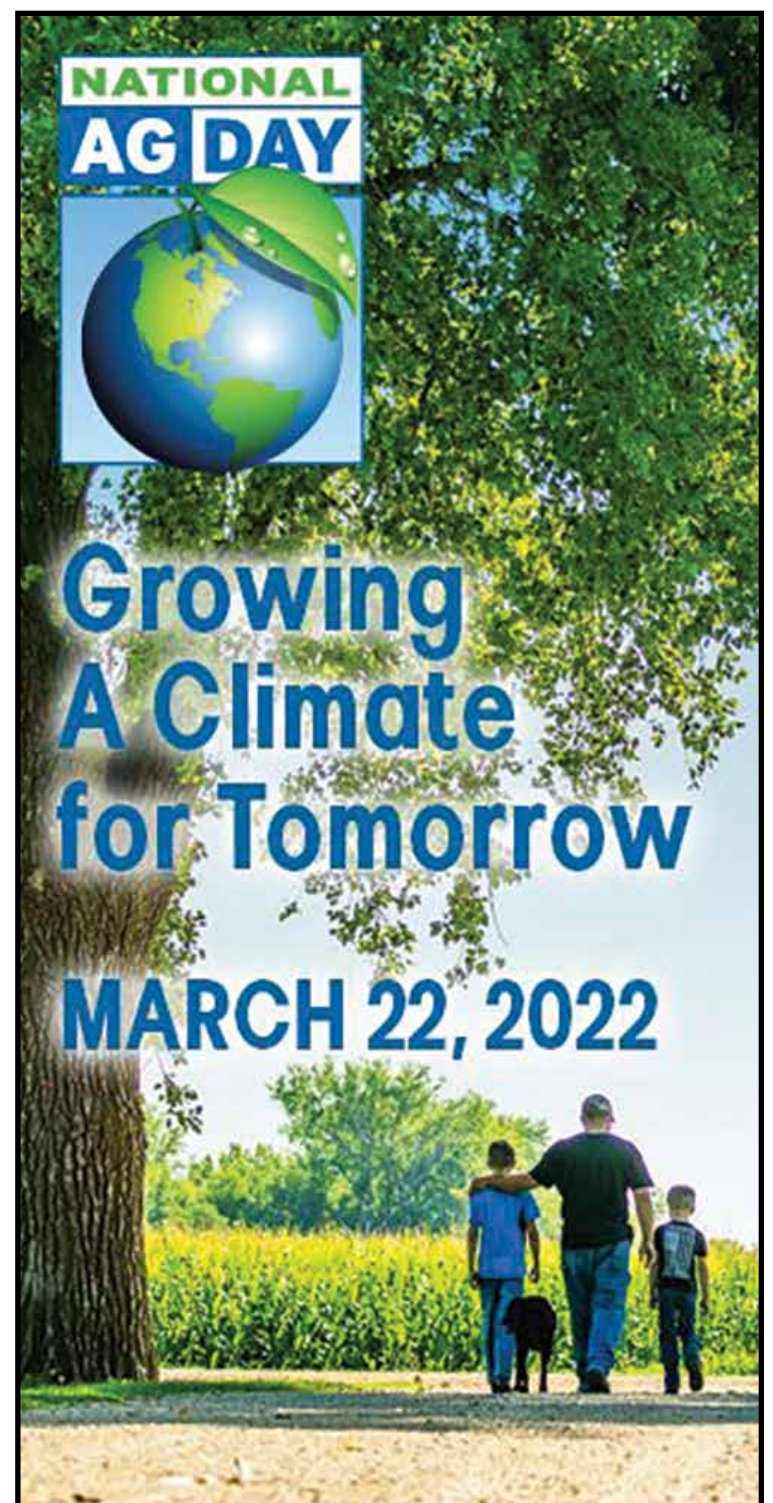
### Why Celebrate Agriculture?

*2022 Dixie National Rodeo...A Year for the Record Books*

Last year’s 2021 Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo was certainly one for the history books. We experienced a hundred-year ice storm leaving us with no water on the Mississippi State Fairgrounds and thousands of livestock and visitors that needed water. All of this occurred in the midst of continued COVID restrictions. That year, the City of Jackson didn’t grant the routine permit for our annual Dixie National Parade, but we still found a way to honor our friend and beloved Dixie National Rodeo icon, the late Lecile Harris, with a Memorial Processional.

This year, the 2022 Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo will be one for the record books. We could not have asked for a better Dixie National this year. Maybe it was the mild weather, people’s desire to get back to normal and attend events, or maybe it had something to do with the latest Yellowstone/1883 craze, but whatever the case, we experienced increased crowds and an overall increased enthusiasm for the Dixie National and the many

events surrounding it. This year 1,538 4-H and FFA youth exhibited 2,262 head of livestock during the Dixie National Junior Livestock Round-up. Forty-six of the animals were sold during the Sale of Junior Champions grossing a total of \$448,500. This set a new record sale total over the 53-year history of the Sale. Additionally, the Sale of Champions Promotion Committee awarded 39 scholarships totaling \$61,500, bringing the total scholarship money awarded since 1993 to nearly \$1.1 million. The open livestock shows were also a success this year. A record number of participants from across the U.S. showed over 1,100 head of livestock.

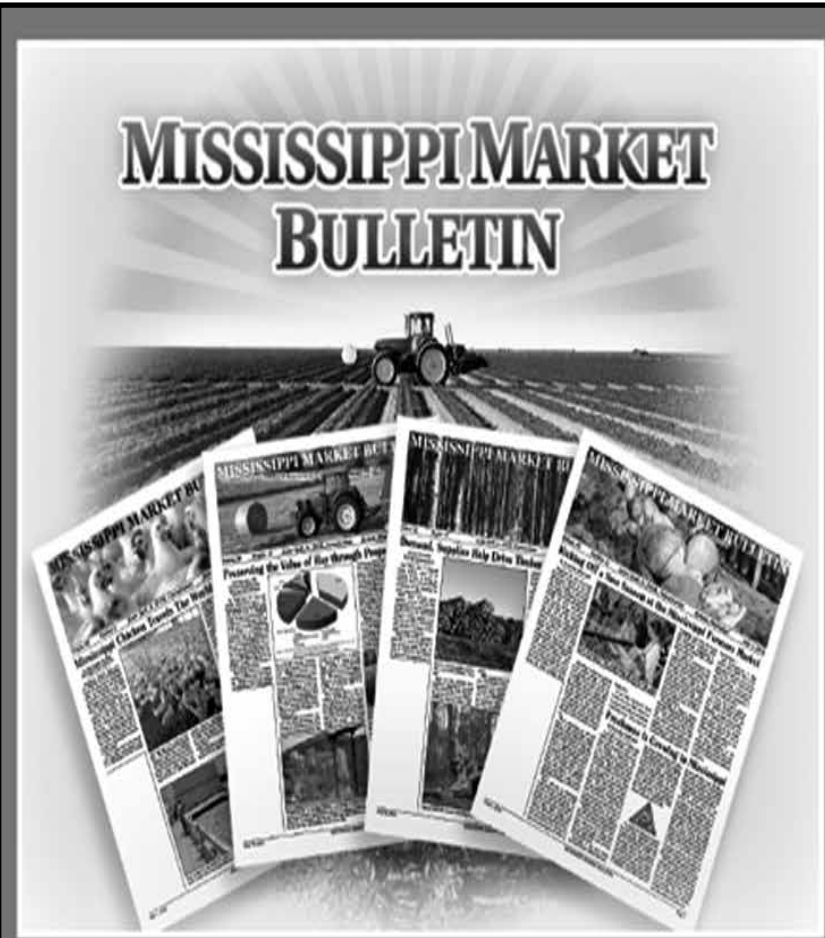
This year’s Dixie National Rodeo also brought in more fans than the past, leading to record ticket sales. During the Rodeo, close to 800 cowboys and cowgirls traveled from across the U.S. and Canada vying for the more than \$200,000 purse that was up for grabs. The fierce rodeo competitions and the fun-filled family entertainment is why the Dixie National Rodeo was named a Top 5 Medium Indoor Rodeo of the Year by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association. The Dixie

National Parade was also bigger than ever, with spectators lining the streets by the thousands. This year during the Dixie National, we also announced the completion of a project that we had been working on for a year – a new water well to serve the entire State Fairgrounds. This kind of project typically takes two to three years from concept to completion, but less than a year after approval we opened the twelve-inch valve on our new fully-operational deep well water system supplying fresh well water across the Fairgrounds including the Livestock Barns, Trade Mart, Coliseum, Kirk Fordice Equine Center and the Mississippi Farmers Market. We drilled the well, made improvements and additions to our water distribution system, put in a water treatment process and pressurized tank, and added additional and expanded electrical infrastructure which will include a backup generator. As a result, this year’s Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo had more reliable water with greater pressure than the same event one year ago. According to our well operator, we pumped an estimated half a million gallons of fresh water in a period of ten days dur-

ing the Rodeo. I am proud of the success of the 2022 Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo. None of this would have been possible without the support of our many sponsors including our Title Sponsor Southern Ag Credit, Harper Morgan Rodeo, and our loyal fan base and supporters. Coordination of an event of this magnitude and caliber takes much planning and work. The Mississippi State Fairgrounds staff, led by Director Michael Lasseter, is to be commended for working the long hours it takes to ensure all of the details came together. I want to thank everyone who made this year’s record breaking Dixie National a success.

# From Our Kitchen To Yours

## Springtime Salads

### Sweet Southern Egg Salad

3 tablespoons non-fat plain yogurt  
3 tablespoons low-fat mayonnaise  
2 teaspoons mustard  
1/4 teaspoon freshly ground pepper  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
8 hard-boiled eggs  
1/2 cup thinly sliced celery  
1/4 cup sweet gherkin pickles  
3 tablespoons chopped sweet onion

Combine yogurt, mayonnaise, mustard, pepper and salt in a medium bowl. Halve eggs and discard 4 of the yolks (or save for another use). Add whites and the remaining 4 yolks to the bowl and mash to desired consistency. Gently stir in celery, gherkins and onion. Refrigerate until ready to serve. *Source: EatingWell.com.*

### Loaded Garden Salad

2 cups chopped romaine lettuce  
1 small bell pepper, diced  
1 avocado, diced  
1 cup sliced button mushrooms  
1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved  
1/2 cup alfalfa sprouts  
1 clove garlic, minced  
1/8 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup reduced-fat sour cream  
1/3 cup buttermilk  
1 tablespoon chopped fresh chives  
1 tablespoon chopped fresh dill

Toss lettuce, bell pepper, avocado, mushrooms, tomatoes and sprouts in a large bowl. Mash garlic and salt together with a fork in a small bowl to make a coarse paste. Stir in sour cream, buttermilk, chives and dill until combined. Drizzle the dressing over the salad; gently toss to coat. *Source: EatingWell.com.*

### Spring Salad with Berries & Bacon

2 tablespoons red wine vinegar  
1 tablespoon finely chopped shallot  
1 1/2 teaspoons honey  
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard  
3 cups sliced strawberries, divided  
3/4 teaspoon kosher salt, divided  
1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil  
5 cups baby spring mix  
1 (4 oz.) feta cheese block, crumbled  
1 medium shallot, thinly sliced lengthwise  
1 cup yellow cherry tomatoes, halved  
8 bacon slices, cooked and coarsely chopped

Place red wine vinegar, finely chopped shallot, honey, Dijon mustard, 1 cup of the strawberries, and 1/4 tea-

spoon of the kosher salt in a blender. Process until smooth, about 30 seconds. With blender running, gradually drizzle in oil, processing until mixture is smooth and combined, about 30 seconds. Arrange spring mix on a large platter. Top with feta, sliced shallot, tomatoes, bacon, and remaining 2 cups strawberries and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Drizzle vinaigrette over salad and serve immediately. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

### Strawberry Spinach Salad

1 small Vidalia onion, chopped (1/2 cup)  
1/2 cup light olive oil  
3 tablespoons white balsamic vinegar  
1 tablespoon plus 2 tsp. granulated sugar  
1 tablespoon mayonnaise  
1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard  
1/4 teaspoon kosher salt  
1 (10 oz.) pkg. fresh spinach  
2 1/2 cups fresh strawberries, stemmed and halved  
4 ounces blue cheese, crumbled  
1 cup chopped candied pecans

Process onion, oil, vinegar, sugar, mayonnaise, mustard and salt in a blender until creamy and smooth, about 50 seconds. Arrange spinach, strawberries, blue cheese, and pecans on a large platter. Drizzle with dressing. *Source: SouthernLiving.com.*

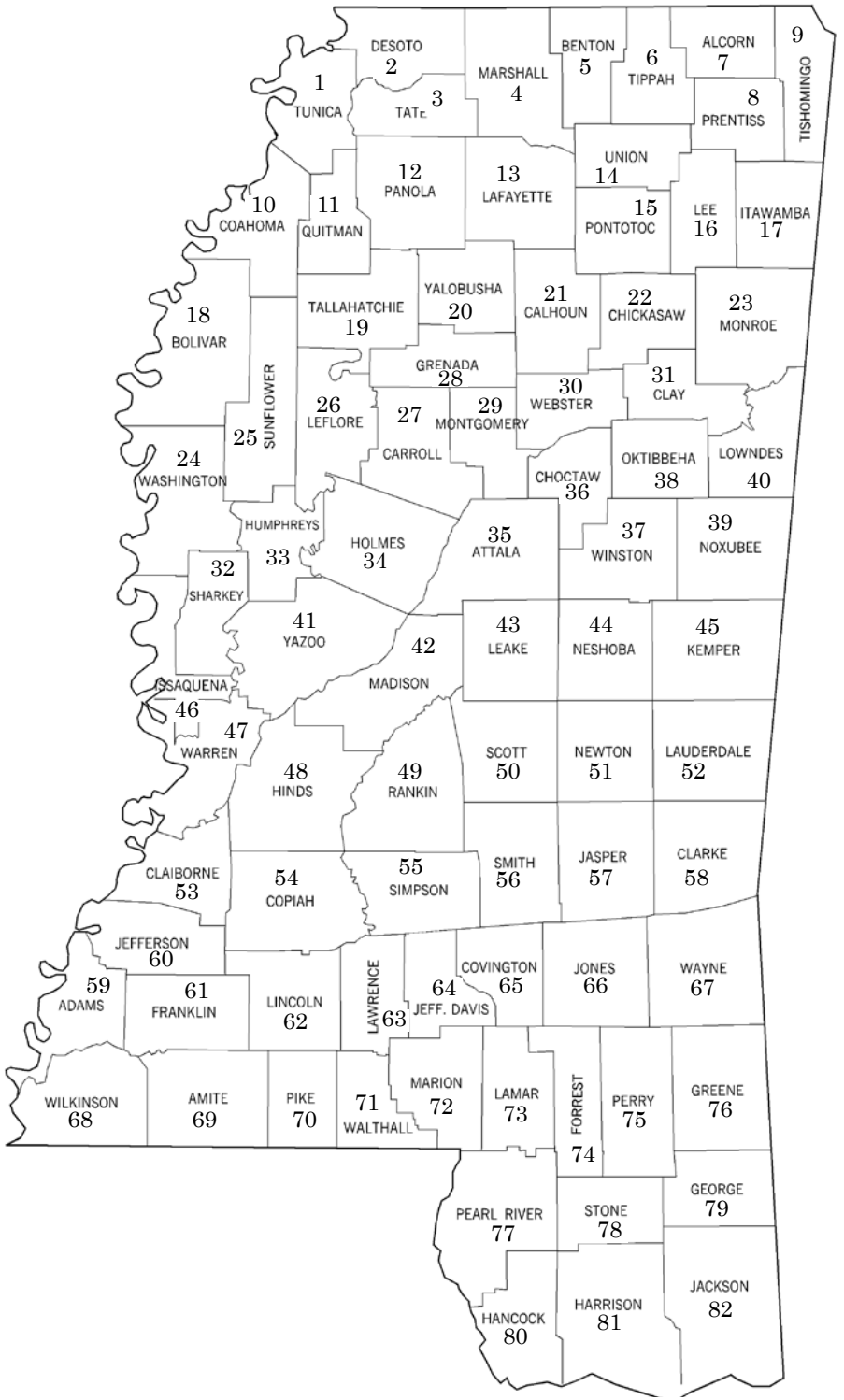

## Preventing Annual Weed Germination by Using Pre-emerge Herbicides

In pastures and hayfields, weeds can reduce the quantity of forage production and affect stand longevity. Producers need to develop an early plan of attack by evaluating their pastures and hayfields and determining the weeds species that affect productivity and nutrient use.

Two types of herbicides can be used as tools to control some weeds in pasture and hayfields. These two methods include pre-emerge and post-emerge herbicides. Pre-emerge herbicides are products that are applied before different weed species start to germinate. Post-emerge herbicides are those products that are used to control weeds after they have germinated and are actively growing. There are several annual weed species (grassy and broadleaf types) in pastures and hayfields that can be difficult to control with post-emerge herbicides and they include barnyard grass, crabgrass, seedling Johnsongrass, annual foxtail (green and yellow), dandelions, plantain, pigweed, wood sorrel.

Due to the mode of action of these herbicides, application timing is the most important aspect of successful weed prevention. If the weed has already sprouted and it is visible, pre-emergent herbicides will not solve the weed problem. For best results, these herbicides should be applied when soil temperatures are 50°F or above for at least 36 to 72 hours which ideally is two weeks before seed germination might start.

The ideal window to apply pre-emerge herbicides across most of the southern US will be March 10 to April 15, which the exception of the coastal areas with earlier warm temperatures where applications can be made from January 1 to March 15. The upper areas across AL, MS, GA, SC could have an application win-



dow between April 1 and May 5 due to colder temperatures.

Two main pre-emerge herbicides are labeled for use in pasture and hay fields in Mississippi. These products include Prowl H2O (Pendimethalin) and Rezilon (Indaziflam). These products are to be used on well-established pastures and hayfields (grasses that have gone through at least one mowing or cutting) and not in the establishment of new forages.

Most pre-emerge herbicides will not prevent the germination of the seed but instead help control it, so it does not sprout (no radicle and root development). These are used to control annual grasses and small-seeded broadleaf weeds (spiny amaranth, bitterweed, and spurge).

Prowl H2O can be applied at a rate of 1.1 to 4.2 quarts per acre in 20 to 40 gallons of water. It is not recommended to apply to warm-season grasses after spring green-up before first cutting. Do not apply more than 4.2 quarts per acre per year and there is a 30-day application interval if sequential applications are to be used. Prowl H2O is NOT labeled for use on tall fescue or other cool-season hay and pasture grasses. There are no grazing or haying restrictions when the application of Prowl to forage grasses.

Rezilon should be applied at a rate of 3 to 5 ounces per acre in more than 15 gallons of water per acre. Do not exceed more than 5 ounces per

acre in a single application. Do not apply more than 6 ounces of Rezilon per acre per year and sequential applications must be done 60 days apart. Do not seed any cool-season grasses in areas treated with Rezilon before a soil bioassay is done 18 months after the application. There are no grazing restrictions associated with Rezilon, but there is a 40-day haying restriction.

Pre-emerge herbicides can be a useful tool for weed management in pastures and hayfields. They should be used where appropriate and when cost-effective. While pre-emergent weed control for pastures and hayfields can be effective in preventing certain weeds from impacting forage production, these chemicals will not kill all weeds.

Weeds seed populations present at the time of herbicide application may be controlled, but if there is poor soil fertility and the forage stand is not vigorous to reduce competition, new weed seedlings will soon emerge and occupy the bare areas that remain in the pasture or hayfield. Producers should know and adhere to any grazing or haying restrictions. Different products vary in their restriction guidelines. Many products that have no grazing restrictions for beef cattle will have grazing restrictions for dairy cattle. Most will also have a withdrawal period before slaughter.

It is always important to read the product label.
