High Costs and Low Prices Stress State Dairy Industry

High input costs and low milk prices have made it hard to be a dairy farmer anywhere in the U.S., but Mississippi producers have it harder than most.

Amanda Stone, dairy specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said the number of dairy farms in the state continues to dwindle.

"Today, Mississippi has 55 dairy farms with an average herd size of 145, for a total of about 8,000 dairy cows in the state," Stone said. "That number has declined drastically in recent years. Just six years ago, there

were 87 dairies in the state."

Aside from problems associated with the high cost of maintaining a dairy herd and low market prices for milk, another issue is the aging population of dairy farmers.

"Children of dairy farmers are not always ready or willing to take over the farm, likely in part to them seeing how hard a life it is," she said. "Many of our dairies simply go out of business upon the retirement of the dairy farmer."

Another significant problem in the industry is receiving a lot more attention in recent years than ever before.

"Mental health struggles and suicide are big issues in the dairy industry as a result of its tumultuous state over the last several years," Stone said.

Heat is an enemy of milk production, and Mississippi's long, hot summers make dairies difficult to maintain. A lot of work goes into keeping dairy cows comfortable so they continue to produce milk despite the heat.

Mississippi does have some advantages: a long growing season for

forage, excellent access to water and good grazing land for cattle. Not all parts of the country have these features

Mississippi's dairy industry pro-

duces a state average 6.2 gallons of milk per cow per day. That amount puts the state No. 42 nationally, a low ranking that has not changed much over the years, despite percow production rising.

"Milk production per cow continues to increase everywhere as genetics, nutrition and management improve," Stone said.

Josh Maples, Extension agricultural economist, said that at the national level, the U.S. Department of Agriculture projects the 2022 allmilk price will average \$25.75 per hundredweight, up from the 2021 average of \$18.53.

"Even with stronger milk prices, higher input costs are a major headwind to dairy producers in Mississippi," Maples said. "For example, MSU agricultural economists estimate that forage production will be approximately 50% more expensive in 2022 than 2021.

"So, while producers may earn higher milk prices than in recent years, it is much more costly to produce milk," he said.

MSU scientists continue to support the dairy industry with research into pressing topics.

Stone and MSU graduate student Kevin Braman are working to understand how sprinkler systems affect milk production and behavior in a pasture-based herd. Past research from Stone's lab has shown positive results with the pasture-based sprinkler system.

Another project Stone is conducting with graduate student Michelle Fenstermaker is an effort to better understand how the mental health of dairy farmers, such as their anxiety, depression and compassion fatigue, affects their ability to perceive pain in their animals.

"The results of this research and follow-up papers and workshops will highlight ways for dairy producers to improve their mental health, which, in turn, can improve their animals' welfare," Stone said.

Beason Family Farm is a name that has grown in Mississippi, in grocery stores, farmers markets, coffee shops and restaurants. Shelby's dream started as a young boy in 4-H, showing dairy cattle. 2012, the dream came true. With six jersey cows and a new facility they started supplying Williams Brothers General Store. The herd grew to twenty in the second year and to thirty in the third year, and they are currently milking fifty jersey cows. They produce and hand bottle approximately two-thousand gallons of milk a week that is delivered across the state.

The Beasons have a small store

front on the farm for the locals to buy their ice cream. You can choose from vanilla, chocolate, strawberry, or lemon. They open the doors shortly after the a.m. milking and close the doors around 8:00 p.m. They also sell their whole milk, chocolate milk and buttermilk there as well. The most impressive part is that the store is run on an honorary system.

"One of the most rewarding things about this business is knowing the customer and receiving that 'thank you' for providing such a nutritious product", says Shelby Beason. The Beason's are proud members of the Genuine MS® program and hope to have their milk in the Genuine MS® store very soon.

Conflict Abroad Impacting U.S. Agriculture

Since late February, we have been watching as the Russian invasion of the Ukraine plays out. We have seen the devastating scenes of separated families with little to no belongings seeking refuge in other countries and cities marked by near-total destruction. Although we may seem worlds apart, we are feeling the impacts of this war right here at home in America – pressures of greater inflation, trade disruptions, and market volatility.

This evil invasion by Russia of Ukraine - the breadbasket of Europe - is not only killing Ukrainian civilians but will contribute to more death around the globe as those in poverty lose access to food or the food becomes unaffordable. While Ukrainian farmers are fighting the Russian invaders, they are not harvesting wheat and barley; they are not planting corn and sunflowers, and people around the world will go hungry. Grain crops remain in storage in the Ukraine because they can't be exported due to port disruptions. The Ukrainian farmers that are able to plant some of their crops do not have access to adequate fuel, fertilizer, and seeds.

Ukraine and Russia are both major exporters of wheat and corn; their combined exports account for 30 percent of global wheat exports and 20 percent of global corn exports. Ukraine is the largest producer of sunflowers and largest ex-



porter of sunflower-seed oil in the world, accounting for 80 percent of the world's supply. Russia and Ukraine combined exported 102 million tons of wheat and coarse grains for the 2021-2022 season, during the same season the U.S. exported 94 million tons. The European Union imports 60 percent of its corn from the Ukraine, which could turn to the U.S. to fill those gaps.

We're blessed in the United States to be net exporters of food. We have plenty of food in Mississippi. But even so, Mississippians and all Americans are experiencing increased food prices due to inflation. In February, world food prices hit a record high, increasing more than 20 percent from February 2021 to February 2022. Food prices will continue to climb as agricultural input costs, including fuel and fertilizer, increases as a result of infla-

tion, greater demand, and the lack of Russian and Ukrainian exports due to sanctions and port closures.

The war in the Ukraine is also causing volatility in the commodity markets. The Chicago Board of Trade has seen extreme volatility in grain futures markets with wheat futures hitting 14-year highs, corn growing to a nine-year high, and cooking oils climbing to new highs with fears of global shortages.

As farmers know well, higher commodity market does not translate into greater profits. Farmers are feeling the impact of rising input costs as they begin to plant this year's crops. Russia and Ukraine are top suppliers of fertilizer products, agricultural minerals, and fossil fuels. This creates additional pressure and increased costs on agricultural inputs which have already increased substantially for the 2022 growing season prior to

the Russian invasion. Even before the Russia-Ukraine conflict, fertilizer costs had nearly doubled over the past year. Increased fuel costs will impact farm production as well as transportation of raw and processed agricultural products, further driving up food costs. Russia is one of the top oil exporters globally, so that any interruption in exports will further increase the price leading to higher prices at the pump.

Farmers are no strangers to facing adversity. Rather, farmers are accustomed to taking risks each year whether they are risks associated with markets, weather or which crops to plant. This year farmers are facing additional challenges, many of which are being exasperated by the Russia-Ukraine conflict. We need Washington to pursue policies to make America energy independent again, address inflation, and retreat from environmental regulations and decisions that only increase costs to farmers while lowering food productivity during this global crisis.

Buttermilk Banana Bread Muffins

- 1 cup mashed ripe banana
- 1/3 cup buttermilk
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 large egg
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 1/8 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup ground flaxseed meal
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 350°. Combine first four ingredients in a large bowl; beat with a mixer at medium speed. Beat in sugar. Combine flour and next four ingredients (flaxseed through cinnamon). Add flour mixture to banana mixture; mix just until blended. Spoon batter into a 12-count muffin tin filled with nonstick paper liners. Sprinkle each muffin with 1 teaspoon walnuts and bake at 350° for 20-25 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Remove from oven; cool 5 minutes in pan. Remove muffins to wire rack and cool completely.

Grilled Cheese **Harvest Sandwich**

- 2 slices multigrain bread
- 2 slices white Cheddar cheese
- 2 slices yellow Cheddar cheese
- 2 slices Black Forest ham, thinly sliced
- 10-12 apple slices, very thinly sliced (about 1/4 of a medium apple)
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard, divided
- 1 tablespoon butter, softened

Heat a nonstick or cast-iron skillet over medium heat. Spread Dijon mustard evenly on each slice of bread, then place 2 slices of white Cheddar on one slice. Place ham on top of cheese, distributing evenly. Add apple slices on top of ham layer, then finish with yellow Cheddar and remaining slice of bread. Spread top of bread with softened butter and place that side down in heated pan. Cook for approximately 4 minutes (if necessary, turn the heat down so the bread doesn't burn). While sandwich is cooking, spread remaining softened butter on top of bread. Flip sandwich over and cook another 3-4 minutes or until lightly browned.

Chocolate Brownie Lovers Ice Cream

- 1/2 cup milk chocolate chips
- 1 (14-ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 1/2 cup cocoa powder
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream, plus 1 tablespoon
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups brownie pieces, chopped

Place chocolate chips and 1 tablespoon heavy whipping cream in a large microwave-safe bowl and heat for 30-45 seconds, or until chips are melted. Remove from microwave and whisk together until smooth. Whisk in sweetened condensed milk, stirring until well combined. Gradually whisk in heavy whipping cream, milk and vanilla extract. Pour mixture into freezer canister of ice cream maker according to your ice maker's instructions. Before transferring out of freezer canister, stir in 1 1/2 cups brownie pieces. Transfer the ice cream to a freezer-safe container with lid, top with remaining brownie pieces. Cover. place in freezer and allow it to harden for at least 4 hours or overnight.




Magnolia Gardens



All livestock brands which are registered within the state **must be re-registered by June 30, 2022**, in order to be a valid brand. Anyone who has not received a Livestock Brand renewal notice should call Brandie Bairfield, the State Brands Registrar, at 601-359-1121 or 1-800-678-2660.

The registration fee for a five year period is \$5.00.

Mississippi Code 69-29-105 outlines the process for registering or transferring a livestock brand and the penalty for branding livestock with a brand which has not been registered.



Sarah and Katie help with the milk and cheese processing while Travis and Daniel help with engineering or electrical issues. The farm pasteurizes and bottles non-homogenized milk and other fresh, wholesome dairy products like creams, cheesecakes, and creole cream cheese to sell at their on-farm store and across Louisiana and Mississippi.

Havens Down Home Creamery in Lucedale is owned and operated by Preston and Kristen Havens, who raise all Jersey or Jersey Holstein. Havens Down Home Creamery products include cream line milk, cream, chocolate milk, buttermilk, ice cream, cheese and beef--all sold on the farm.

Middleton Farms in Moss Point



is owned and operated by thirdgeneration dairy farmers Shane and Kerra Middleton. Middleton Farms teaches visitors about farming and dairy foods. The farm offers a milking demonstration, as well as opportunities to bottle feed calves and learn how milking has evolved over

Southern Cultured Creamery in Pontotoc is owned and operated by first-generation dairy farmers Jake and Kaitlyn Anderson and Kaitlyn's father, Scott Hardin. The creamery currently offers delicious cream top milk and chocolate milk, but yogurt smoothies and a selection of cheeses will soon be on the menu.

Beason Family Farm in Philadelphia is owned and operated by thirdgeneration dairy farmer Shelby Beason and his wife Marlo. Beason Family Farm is a beef, hay and dairy operation.
