

Flash Floods Pose Hazards For Ag Commodity Production

Portions of central Mississippi and the lower Mississippi Delta saw more than 1 foot of rain between Aug. 21 and 25, and flash flooding will affect some agricultural commodities in these areas.

Torrential downpours dropped 8-13 inches of rain in much of Leake, Neshoba, Scott, Kemper, Hinds and Newton counties, as well as parts of surrounding counties, prompting road closures and evacuations.

The Clarion Ledger reported

that the Pearl River Valley Water Supply District increased the discharge from Barnett Reservoir to 45,000 cubic feet per second on August 25 in anticipation of incoming water. The National Weather Service forecasts the Pearl River will crest at 36 feet by August 30 and threaten low-lying areas in Jackson and Rankin counties.

Numerous row-crop fields were saturated, and preliminary reports suggest that the crops most compromised will be early-planted cotton and soybeans that were nearly ready for harvest before the weather deteriorated.

Brian Pieralisi, cotton specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, spoke with growers ranging from the south Delta to the Black Prairie regions of the state. He said there were fields where cotton bolls were beginning to open when the storm arrived.

"No one is picking cotton yet, but we are close. We will have defoliation applications going out when this weather system clears," he said. "We can expect hard-locked bolls, some boll rot and sprouting seeds in the bur. Seeds will sprout in open bolls when the lint stays damp for several days in a row."

Pieralisi said the severity of damage on early cotton will hinge on how long it takes to get hot, sunny conditions for consecutive days.

"If the sprout dries up while it's still very small, it's not much of an issue," he said. "If the current wet pattern persists, that

will only get worse."

MSU Extension soybean specialist Trent Irby said most soybeans in the affected areas were still growing before the flooding.

"The impacts on soybean will depend on the stage of development of the crop," Irby said. "This is one of those 'it depends' type of scenarios. Those acres that are ready or close to ready for harvest could absolutely be compromised with potential for seed sprouting in the pod and reduction in quality, and some later planted soybean acres that are less developed may come out of this round of weather with

little to no impact to the quality of the seed."

Field damage will be a future problem resulting from the storm system. Phillip Vandevere, MSU Extension agent in Yazoo County, said that, while rainwater is exiting fields, soggy soils will not support farm machinery until fields receive a break from the precipitation.

"Once we do get sun and start getting into the field, the crop itself will be dry, but the ground won't be," he said. "Growers will have to rut some of their fields up to get their crop out. It will be costly to go back and fix the fields and repair farm roads."

While there were still numerous full corn fields in his area, Vandevere said the crop was at an advanced enough stage to withstand major damage.

"One good thing about the corn is, unless we get to where stalks start falling and lodging, the kernels are pretty hardy," he said. "I haven't seen any stalks falling so far."

Reports on poultry houses affected by the rains are still being gathered, but the Peco poultry processing facility in Sebastopol was closed due to flooding on August 24.

Commissioner's Policy Corner

Commissioner Andy Gipson Addresses Elected and Federal Officials Flood Panel and Stresses the Urgent Need to Finish the Yazoo Backwater Area Pump Project

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson addressed a panel of elected and federal officials who met to discuss flooding in the South Mississippi Delta. The panel included Senator Roger Wicker; Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith; Congressman Bennie Thompson; Chair of the White House's Council for Environmental Quality Brenda Mallory; federal officials from the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, EPA, FEMA, and the U.S. Department of Interior; a host of state legislators; and city and county officials. Commissioner Gipson stressed the urgency to finish the pumps and gave the following remarks.

I would like to thank Senator Wicker and our congressional delegation for inviting me here today to address an urgent need facing Mississippi's South Delta Region. I would also like to thank Chair Brenda Mallory, Chair of the White House's Council for Environmental Quality, and other federal officials for being here today in Vicksburg, Mississippi, to listen to our concerns with flooding. According to its website, the mission of the Council for Environmental Quality is to "improve, preserve, and protect America's public health and environment." We strongly believe there is no better way to protect the public health and environment of the South Delta

than to finish the pumps.

One major issue that I want to bring to attention that is specific to Mississippi is the Yazoo Backwater Area Project. The Yazoo Backwater Area Project was authorized by the Flood Control Act of 1941 and was designed to alleviate backwater flooding in the Mississippi South Delta Region and protect the livelihood of area residents. The South Delta is comprised of Humphreys, Issaguena, Sharkey, Warren, and Yazoo counties. Agriculture is a primary source of employment within these counties and associated local communities. The only component of the Yazoo Backwater Project that has not been completed is the pump station that was part of the original design. The pump station would prevent flooding of nearly 200,000 acres. The EPA vetoed the Yazoo Area Pump Project in 2008, even though it was a federally-authorized U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) Civil Works project. In November 2021, the EPA announced that it would allow the 2008 veto to stand.

The Yazoo Backwater Area of Mississippi has experienced significant flooding nine out of the past 11 years, which has devastated local economies and natural resources. This area also experienced minor flooding in the past two years, both in 2021 and 2022. If the pump station was in place, much of this man-made devastation could have been prevented. During 2019, over 550,000 acres flooded in the Yazoo

Backwater Area, of which more than 225,000 acres were agricultural cropland. Most of this cropland was not planted that year due to the flood. Within the flooded region, 687 homes were affected by the floodwaters, with at least 252 categorized as having major damage or destroyed. The economic and environmental impact to the South Delta was devastating. The estimated economic impact to crops alone was \$617 million. In 2020, approximately 490,000 acres flooded in the area once again. Of those acres, 196,000 acres were cropland. The backwater floods of 2019 and 2020 are the two highest backwater flood events since the completion of the Yazoo Backwater Levee and Drainage Structures in 1978. Much of the devastation that South Delta residents face now can be prevented if construction of the Yazoo Backwater Area Pump Project is completed.

As a result of frequent and historical flooding in the Yazoo Backwater, the Corps conducted a study in 2020 using new and current environmental data to re-evaluate the recommended plan to complete the Yazoo Area Pump Project. Findings of the study recommended a new plan that would reduce average annual flood damages to urban and agricultural areas through a combination of structural and nonstructural flood damage reduction features, minimize adverse impacts through project design, and provide a net gain in environmental value to the entire

Yazoo Backwater Area. The study also recommended that the location of the pump station be moved approximately eight miles northeast of the original location. Additionally, mitigation was recommended to compensate for any unavoidable losses to environmental resources from the construction, operation, and maintenance of the project. The new plan represented a balanced approach to address flood damage reduction and environmental issues using the new environmental data.

Mississippians in the South Delta, farmers, state and local leaders, the EPA and the Corps were united in a plan, and in agreement on a solution reached in 2020 to finish the pumps. We have strong confidence in the research of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and we believe the pumps provide the long-term solution necessary to alleviate the perpetual flooding in the South Delta.

For the aforementioned reasons, I want to reiterate to all of those present and to all of those who will listen in Washington, D.C., the urgent need to finish the pumps. If the goal of the federal government is to improve, preserve, and protect America's public health and environment, we ask that you reconsider and complete the pumps as designed.

Mozzarella Sticks

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 large eggs

1 tablespoon water

1 cup dry bread crumbs

2-1/2 teaspoons Italian seasoning

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1/8 teaspoon pepper

12 sticks string cheese

Cooking spray

1 cup marinara or spaghetti sauce, heated

Place flour in a shallow bowl. In another shallow bowl, beat eggs and water. In a third shallow bowl, combine the bread crumbs, Italian seasoning, garlic powder and pepper. Coat cheese sticks with flour, then dip in egg mixture and coat with bread crumb mixture. Repeat egg and bread crumb coatings. Cover and freeze for at least 2 hours or overnight. Place on a parchment-lined baking sheet; spray with cooking spray. Bake, uncovered, at 400° for 6-8 minutes or until heated through. Allow to stand for 3-5 minutes before serving. Serve with marinara or spaghetti sauce for dipping.

Marinated Sausage Kabobs

1/4 cup olive oil

1 tablespoon white vinegar

1/2 teaspoon minced garlic

1/2 teaspoon dried basil

1/2 teaspoon dried oregano

8 ounces cheddar cheese, cut into 3/4-in. cubes

1 can (6 ounces) pitted ripe olives, drained

8 ounces hard salami, cut into 3/4-in. cubes

1 medium sweet red pepper, cut into 3/4-inch pieces

1 medium green pepper, cut into 3/4-inch pieces

In a large shallow dish, combine the first 5 ingredients; add remaining ingredients. Stir to coat; refrigerate at least 4 hours. Drain, discarding marinade. For kabobs, thread cheese, olives, salami and peppers

Ham-Cheddar Cheese Ball

1/2 pound thinly sliced deli ham

1/2 medium onion, cut into wedges

2 cups finely shredded cheddar cheese

2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, cubed

1 cup chopped pecans

onto toothpicks.

1 slice Swiss cheese

Optional: Assorted crackers and assorted fresh vegetables

Place ham and onion in a food processor; pulse until finely chopped. Add cheddar cheese; pulse until blended. Add cream cheese; process until smooth. Shape cheese mixture into a football; press pecans into cheese mixture. Cover and refrigerate at least 1 hour. Cut Swiss cheese into strips; arrange over top for laces. Serve with crackers and vegetables.

Zesty Nacho Dip

2 pounds ground beef

2 pounds process cheese Velveeta, cubed

1 can (14-1/2 ounces) stewed tomatoes, cut up

 $2\ {\rm cans}\ (4\ {\rm ounces}\ {\rm each})\ {\rm chopped}\ {\rm green}\ {\rm chiles}$

3 teaspoons chili powder

3 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce Tortilla chips

In a Dutch oven, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink; drain. Add the cheese, tomatoes,

chiles, chili powder and Worcestershire sauce. Cook, uncovered, until cheese is melted, 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve warm, with chips.

Bacon Cream Cheese Pinwheels

3 ounces cream cheese, softened

2 tablespoons finely chopped onion

1 teaspoon 2% milk

1 tube (8 ounces) refrigerated crescent rolls

5 bacon strips, cooked and finely chopped

Preheat oven to 375°. In a small bowl, mix cream cheese, onion and milk until blended. On a lightly floured surface, unroll crescent dough into one long rectangle; press perforations to seal. Spread with cream cheese mixture; sprinkle with bacon. Roll up jelly-roll style, starting with a long side; pinch seam to seal. Using a serrated knife, cut roll crosswise into twenty-four (1/2-inch) slices. Place on ungreased baking sheets, cut side down. Bake 12-15 minutes or until golden brown. Refrigerate leftovers.





Don't Become a Victim of Timber Theft

For years, landowners and timber buyers bought and sold timber with only a handshake. Those days are over. One of the most dangerous things you can do as a landowner is sell your timber on a handshake, even to someone you have known and done business with for years.

The best way to prevent misunderstandings is to have a contract. This way everyone knows his or her responsibilities and what to expect. A well written contract will save the buyer and seller time and money.

The contract needs to express expectations, wishes and responsibilities of each person involved. Contracts state what each person can and cannot do and serves to resolve any disputes. Contracts should identify parties involved and include the complete name and address of each person in the contract, such as the landowner, buyer and the party responsible for cutting and hauling the timber. The date and place, including the city and county, the agreement was signed should be included as well. Another provision that can prevent problems is one that provides for or against assigning the contract to a third person.

Contracts need to have the exact amount to be paid and terms of payment. For a pay-as-cut sale, it is important for the contract to provide clear and concise instructions to the



buyer as to how he or she is to pay and how he or she is to provide verification of timber quantity cut and paid for.

Contracts should address care of property and/or improvements. Detail each item of property that is subject to damage, such as fences, roads and bridges, and include property conditions before and after the end of timber harvest. Contracts should state where and which entrances and exits the buyer and logger can access, and if gates are in place, who is responsible for opening and closing of gates. The party responsible for paying for any road construction and/or repairs should also be addressed in the contract.

Contracts should include the length of the agreement as well as beginning and ending dates. Wet season logging should also be addressed. Contracts should have the signatures of everyone involved, dates the contract was signed and a notarization of the agreement.

The suggestions in this article do not cover all situations. Each timber sale agreement is different.
