Dixie Round-Up Generates Scholarship Money for 4-H'ers

Since the age of 7, Smith County 4-H'er Chase Boone has been showing mostly Simmental cattle in the Dixie National Junior Round-Up each year.

He is now a high school senior who will soon be moving on to college but not before a final appearance in one of his favorite livestock show events. He ended up exhibiting two supreme champion livestock -- the supreme beef female and the supreme beef bull -- and was named one of six premier exhibitors.

It was a successful send-off, if

not a bittersweet one.

"I'm going to miss being actively involved in the show ring and being on the end of a halter leading into the ring," Boone said. "It's going to be a transition period because I've done it for so long and so many times."

Champion animals are featured in the Round-Up's final event: the Dixie National Sale of Junior Champions. Held February 9 at the Mississippi Trade Mart, the sale featured a record 48 champion market animals, including eight steers, 16 hogs, 10 lambs, 12 goats, and for the first time, two hair sheep. The shows featured 1,257 4-H and FFA members showing 2,153 animals. For photos of the 2023 Sale of Junior Champions see pages 22-29.

The Sale of Junior Champions Promotion Committee awarded 25 \$1,500 scholarships to exhibitors who are high school seniors but did not qualify an animal in the sale, six \$2,000 scholarships to premier exhibitors and eight \$1,500 scholarships to owners of supreme champion livestock. In total, the committee awarded \$61,500 in scholarships.

For his efforts, Boone took

home two scholarships worth \$1,500 apiece and a \$2,000 scholarship for being a premier exhibitor.

MSU Extension 4-H livestock specialist Dean Jousan said the 54th edition of the sale was another massive success.

"The 2023 sale generated \$456,285 that many of the exhibitors will direct toward their college funds or for purchase of a new project animal for the next show season," Jousan said, "and each of them earned every penny. None of these youth started with a champion market animal. They put in a year's worth of care, training and practice with their animals to advance to this event."

Boone is one of the exhibitors whose future aspirations are closer to reality with the help of the scholarships he won. He plans to attend Jones College next fall and has narrowed down his university destinations to two, including MSU. He wants to pursue a career in agricultural business as a loan officer for a land bank.

For now, he holds many fond memories of his livestock-show-

ing days.

"I enjoy the friendships that can be made at every level, whether it's a local jackpot show, Dixie Nationals or a national show," Boone said. "I've built connections to people who led me down the right path to a

promising future."

The sale began in 1970 to encourage young people to pursue livestock projects. Since then, it has generated nearly \$9 million through livestock sales and awarded \$1.1 million in scholarships to Mississippi students.

Sandwiches: The Best Thing Since Sliced Bread!!



Hot Ham & Cheese Sandwich

2 slices whole grain bread
Butter
2 slices Swiss cheese
2 thin slices deli ham
Mayonnaise
Whole grain mustard

Preheat a skillet over medium-high heat. Spread one side of each slice of bread with butter. Place one slice, butter-side down in the hot skillet. Top with Swiss cheese and ham. Spread the unbuttered side of the second slice of bread with mayonnaise and mustard; place it, butter-side up on top of the sandwich. Cook until the sandwich is golden brown and the cheese is melted, about 3 minutes per side. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

The Elvis Presley Sandwich

2 slices white bread
2 tablespoons butter
1 small ripe banana
Creamy peanut butter

Place 2 pieces of white bread in the toaster on a light setting. Heat skillet over medium heat with 2 tablespoons butter. While the bread is toasting, in a small bowl, using a fork mash the ripe banana until it reaches a smooth consistency. Take both pieces of the toasted bread and spread creamy peanut butter, topping 1 side with the mashed banana. Place 1 slice of bread on top of the other forming a sandwich. Place sandwich in hot skillet browning each side, about 2 minutes per side. Take out of skillet and serve. *Source: FoodNetwork.com.*

Bacon & Swiss Chicken Sandwich

1/4 cup mayonnaise
1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
1 tablespoon honey
4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves
1/2 teaspoon Montreal steak seasoning
4 slices Swiss cheese
4 whole wheat hamburger buns, split
2 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
Lettuce leaves and tomato slices (toppings, optional)

In a small bowl, mix mayonnaise, mustard and honey. Pound chicken with a meat mallet to 1/2 inch thickness. Sprinkle chicken with steak seasoning. Grill chicken, covered, over medium heat until a thermometer reads 165°, 4-6 minutes on each side. Top with cheese during the last 1 minute of cooking. Grill buns over medium heat, cut side down, until toasted. Serve chicken on buns with bacon, mayonnaise mixture and desired toppings. *Source: TasteofHome.com.*

Sloppy Joes


1/4 cup chopped onion
1/4 cup chopped green bell pepper
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1 teaspoon prepared yellow mustard
3/4 cup ketchup
3 teaspoons brown sugar
Salt and pepper

In a skillet over medium heat, brown the ground beef, onion and green pepper; drain off liquids. Stir in the garlic powder, mustard, ketchup and brown sugar; mix thoroughly. Reduce heat, and simmer for 30 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, then serve on hamburger buns. *Source: AllRecipes.com.*

Classic BLT Sandwich

12 slices of bacon
8 slices white bread
8 leaves iceberg lettuce, fresh and full
8 slices of tomatoes
Mayonnaise

Cook bacon until crispy, then drain on paper towels. Toast bread. Spread mayo on each slice of toasted bread. Add 1 slice of lettuce to 4 pieces of mayo-spread toast. Add 2 slices of tomato on top of lettuce. Arrange 3 slices of bacon evenly on top of tomato. Add 1 slice of lettuce on top of bacon. Place remaining 4 pieces of mayo-spread toast on top to finish the sandwiches. *Source: Food.com.*



Pulled-Pork BBQ Sandwich

1 boneless pork roast
Salt
2/3 cup cider vinegar
1 1/2 cups barbecue sauce, plus more for serving
6 hamburger buns
2 cups prepared coleslaw

Trim excess fat from pork roast. Sprinkle with salt. Place in slow cooker and pour vinegar over roast. Cover and cook on low until roast is fork-tender and pulls apart easily, 8-10 hours. Remove roast from cooker and shred meat into small pieces. Discard cooking liquid. Return pork to slow cooker and stir in barbecue sauce. Continue to cook until warmed through, about 30 minutes. Spoon coleslaw onto bottom half of hamburger buns. Layer with pork, then top with the other half of the bun. Serve immediately with barbecue sauce. *Source: MyRecipes.com.*

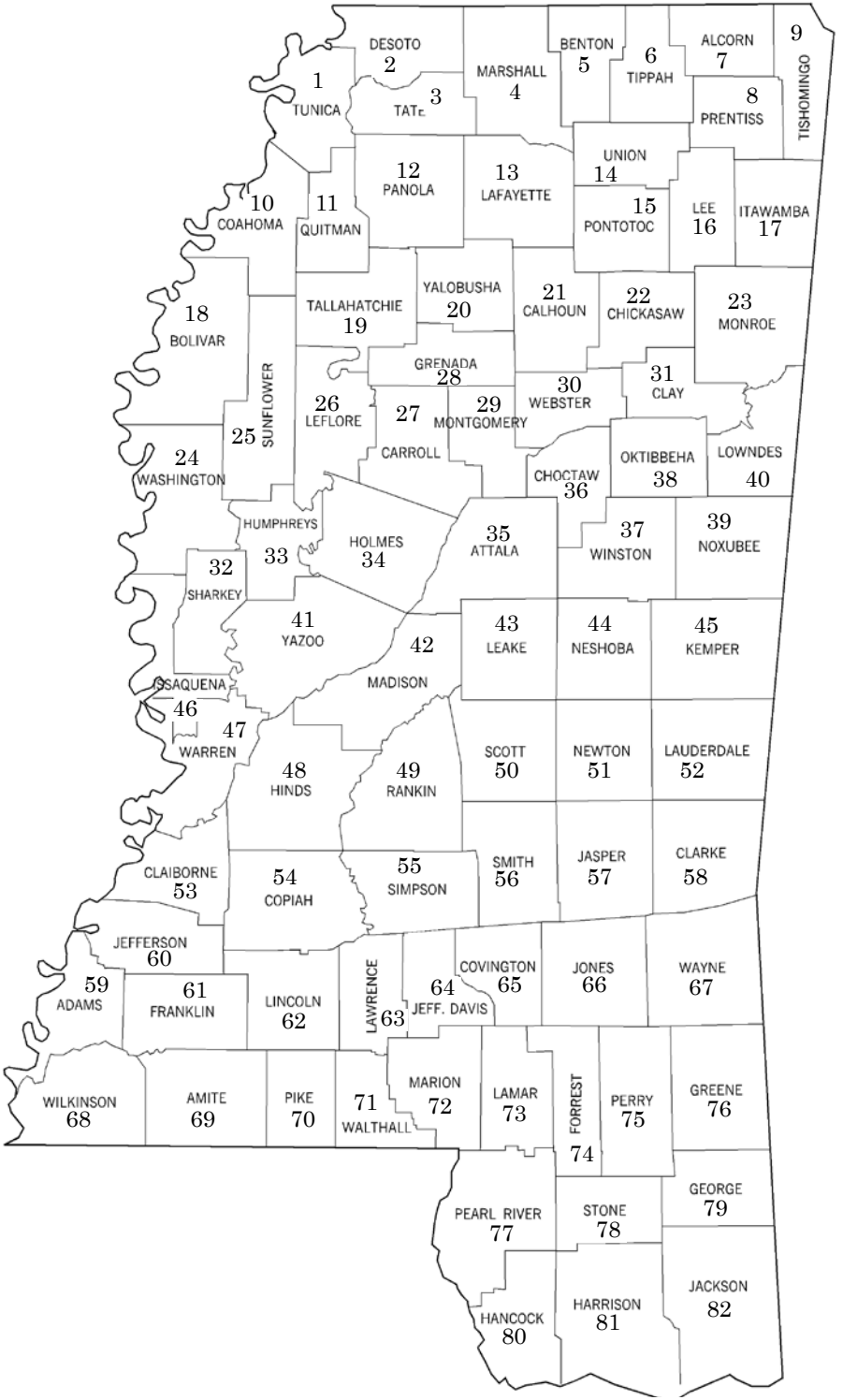

USDA to survey farmers' planting intentions for 2023

Jackson, MS – As the 2023 crop production season begins, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will contact producers nationwide to determine their plans for the upcoming growing season.

"Each year, the agriculture industry anticipates USDA's Prospective Plantings report, which provides the first survey-based estimates of U.S. farmers' planting intentions for the year," said NASS's Mississippi State Statistician Esmerelda Dickson. "The March Agricultural Survey provides the factual data that underpins these projections, making it one of the most important surveys we conduct each year."

NASS will mail the survey to 1,451 Mississippi producers on February 17, asking producers to provide information about the types of crops they intend to plant in 2023, how many acres they intend to plant, and the amounts of grain and oilseed they store on their farms. Producers can respond online at agcounts.usda.gov or by mail. Those who do not respond by February 27 may be emailed a reminder or contacted for an interview.

In accordance with federal law, NASS keeps responses confidential and publishes data in aggregate form only, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

The data will be published in the Prospective Plantings and quarterly Grain Stocks reports on March 31, 2023. These and all NASS reports are available online at www.nass.usda.gov/Publications. For more information, call the NASS Delta Regional Field Office at (800) 327-2970.





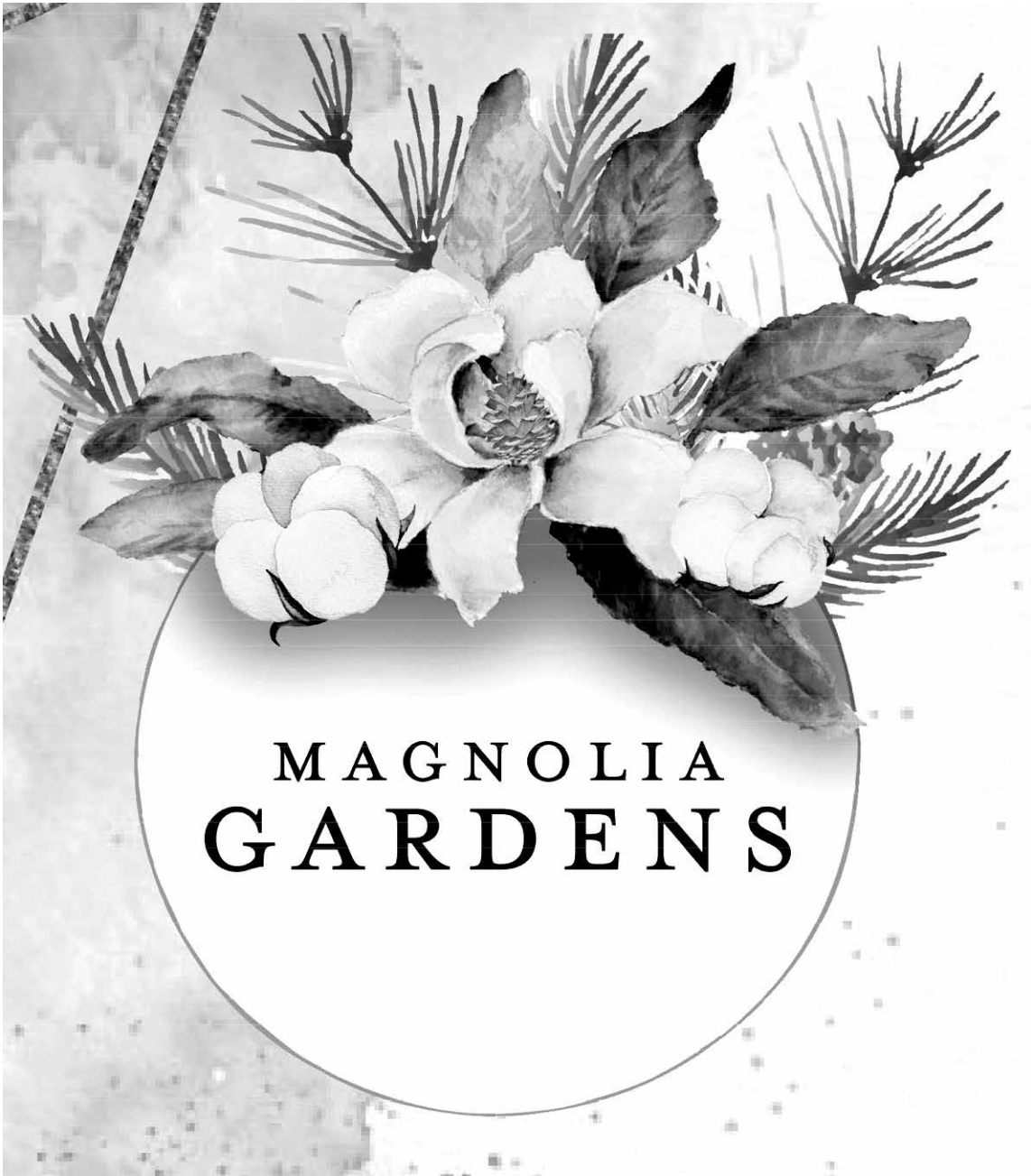
Magnolia Gardens

Think Twice Before Buying Livestock Online

The Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft Bureau (MALTB) is warning residents about online scams involving the purchasing of horses. MALTB has received several calls from the public that have purchased horses coming from out of state that have been scammed.

In these instances, all communication between the buyer and seller is done over the phone. The buyer purchases the horse strictly on pictures the seller sends to them. The buyer sends money prior to the delivery of the horse, but once the horse has been delivered, it is not the horse that was advertised. When the buyer reaches out to the seller to discuss the issue, the seller does not return any phone calls or text messages.

MALTB Director, Dean Barnard, highly advises not to purchase livestock online. "I strongly suggest that buyers see the animals in person. If you are purchasing an animal out of state, hire an equine broker to represent you and inspect the animal prior to purchase. Ensure animals have

a certificate of veterinarian inspection. We all know the internet is a great place to buy almost anything, but it is not where you go to buy livestock out of state without doing your homework. Bottom line, if the situation feels like a scam, it probably is," said Barnard.

The Mississippi Agricultural and Livestock Theft Bureau, a division of the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, enforces state laws pertaining to the theft of cattle, horses, swine, poultry, fish, farm equipment, chemicals, timber and all other farm or agriculture-related crimes.
