Dairy Has Many Health Benefits

June is National Dairy Month and a great time to think about the many health benefits of dairy. Milk and dairy products are a primary source of calcium in our diet and provide many health benefits for people of all ages. We most often associate milk with improved bone health. While milk certainly is important to bone health, the benefits of milk go well beyond our bones. Calcium is also needed for heart muscles to contract, nerves to work properly, and for blood to clot. Consider the following benefits of dairy foods:

Bone Health: Calcium and vitamin D are essential to bone health. Adequate calcium helps build bone mass



in children and adolescents, and it helps slow bone loss associated with aging. Vitamin D is necessary for calcium to be absorbed in the gut. Both calcium and vitamin D are considered “nutrients of concern” by the Dietary Guidelines for Americans because they are frequently under consumed in the American diet. Milk naturally contains calcium, is fortified with vitamin D, and is a convenient and economical source for both nutrients.

Chronic Disease: Scientific studies link consumption of dairy foods to a lower risk of several chronic

health problems. Consumption of dairy products, especially milk, is associated with a lower prevalence of metabolic syndrome. Metabolic syndrome is a cluster of conditions including abdominal obesity, insulin resistance, elevated blood glucose, abnormal blood lipids such as triglycerides and cholesterol, and high blood pressure. Metabolic syndrome increases a person’s risk for type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. Dairy foods, and particularly yogurt, are associated with a reduced risk of type 2 diabetes in adults. The intake of the recommended servings

of dairy are also linked to a reduced rate of overweight and obesity in children.

Probiotics: Consumer interest in probiotics has been growing. Probiotics are living microorganisms known to have health benefits. Probiotics we consume contribute to the trillions of microorganisms, also known as “good bacteria,” that make up the microbiome of our gut and are considered essential to our health and immune system. Examples of dairy products that contain probiotics are aged cheeses, such as cheddar or gouda; kefir, a probiotic milk drink; and yogurt. The refrigeration of dairy products helps maintain these probiotics.

Protein: Dietary protein is essential for growth in children; for repairing and maintaining body tissues; building enzymes, hormones, and antibodies; and maintaining acid-base and fluid balances. Milk contains two types of high-quality proteins, whey and casein. The whey and casein proteins in milk contain all the essential amino acids in enough amounts to support the many roles that proteins play in our bodies. The combination of high-quality protein, fluid, and carbohydrate in milk also makes it an effective recovery drink for athletes after strenuous workouts.

In addition, milk has been shown to be a more effective rehydration drink than sports drinks post-exercise.

Nutrient Synergy: In the nutrition world, there is a term called nutrient synergy. Nutrient synergy refers to the increased health benefit when nutrients are combined as compared to the impact of individual nutrients. Nutrients work synergistically to improve each other’s absorption and the physiological impact they have on our body. In other words, nutrients work best together, not in isolation. Although milk and dairy products are most commonly recognized for the calcium and vitamin D they contain to support bone health, dairy products also contain protein, manganese, zinc, vitamin K, phosphorus, and magnesium. All these nutrients work together to maintain bone and overall health.

We know that milk and dairy products are an important part of our daily diet. But, how much milk should we drink? Children between 1 and 2 years of age should consume 2 to 3 cups of whole milk each day. Children aged 2 and above, and adults should consume 2 to 3 cups of skim or low-fat milk each day. As we enter the summer season, think of the many ways you can incorporate dairy foods into your daily diet.

U.S. Supreme Court Rules Against EPA's WOTUS Rule

On May 25, 2023, a great victory was won for farmers, ranchers and landowners across America and here in Mississippi. On that day the U.S. Supreme Court unanimously ruled that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) had overstepped its bounds, and that its interpretation of its powers went too far under the federal Clean Water Act. This ruling limited the scope of the term "wetlands" in response to Sackett v. U.S.

Environmental Protection Agency in which the Supreme Court sided with an Idaho couple who argued that their land was not subject to the Clean Water Act. This news is welcomed by all of us as farmers, the stewards of the land and the original conservationists.

The battle over the definition of "Waters of the United States" (WOTUS) within the Clean Water Act has been ongoing for many years. Some of the prior interpretations applied by the EPA could have subjected all creeks and ditches to possible EPA regulation. Most recently, in 2015,

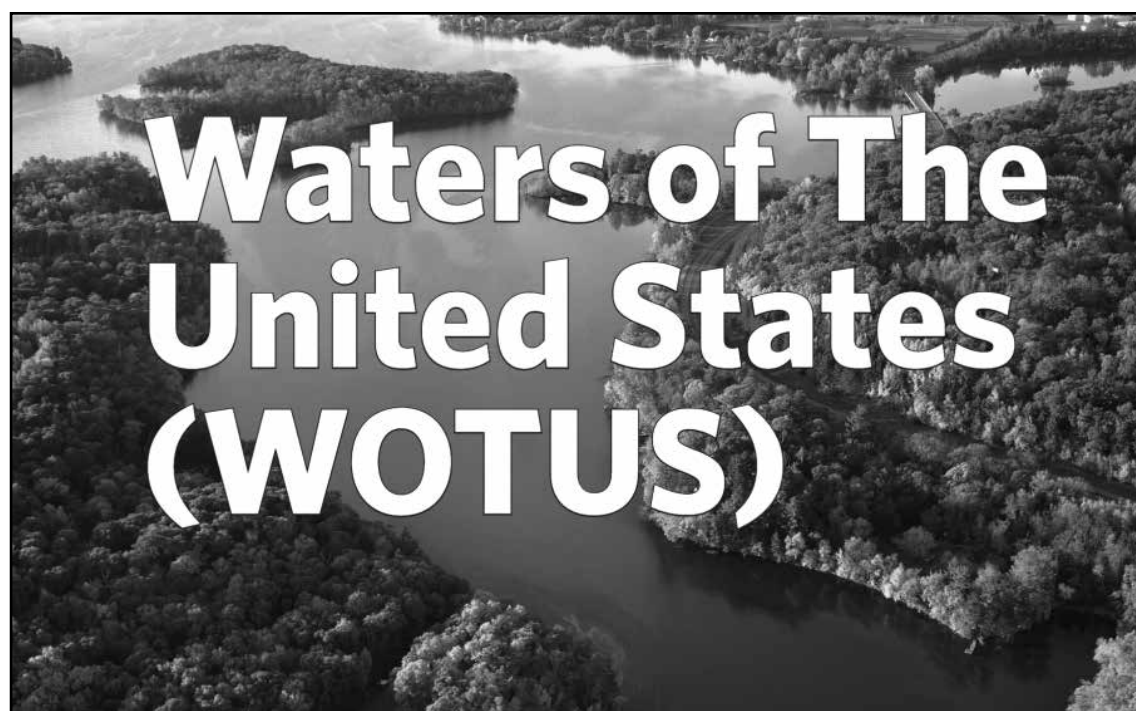
the Obama Administration finalized a new and controversial WOTUS definition which was immediately challenged in the courts. That left the pre-2015 WOTUS rule in effect in 28 states, and the 2015 WOTUS rule was in effect in 22 states until April 2020. In 2020, the Trump Administration repealed and replaced the 2015 rule and released its definition of WOTUS within the Navigable Waters Protection Rule (NWPR). NWPR was supported by most agricultural organizations and stakeholders and was viewed as clear, understandable, implementable, and clarified

federal authority under the Clean Water Act. Then again in 2023, the Biden Administration adopted a new "Revised Definition of 'Waters of the United States'" rule. The adoption of this new rule replaced the Navigable Waters Protection Rule (NWPR) and was viewed as premature by many since Sackett v. EPA was still pending in the court system.

As a result of the current Supreme Court ruling that limits EPA's regulatory authority, agricultural organizations such as the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture and the American Farm Bureau Federation have called on the EPA and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to issue a revised version of the WOTUS rule. I too join in that request. Mississippi's farmers, ranchers, and landowners want to protect our natural resources; however, we need regulations based in common sense that are clear, easily interpreted, and do not overreach regulatory authority. Wetlands should not include every creek on the farm and every wet spot in the pasture.

Strawberry Milk Punch

- 1 gallon milk
- 1/2 gallon strawberry ice cream, softened
- 1 quart frozen strawberries, softened
- 1 cup sugar (or to desired sweetness)
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract (or to desired taste)

Mix softened strawberries and sugar together in punch bowl. Add softened ice cream, stir well. Add chilled milk and flavoring. Red food coloring may be added if desired. Serve at once

Cheddar Cornbread Squares

- 1 package corn muffin mix, plus ingredients to make mix
- 1 small onion, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup red pepper, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup green pepper, thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon oregano
- 1 1/2 cups shredded reduced-fat mild cheddar cheese, divided
- Nonstick cooking spray

Preheat oven to 400° F. Prepare corn muffin mix batter as directed on package. Spray an 8-inch square or round pan with nonstick cooking spray. Pour batter into pan; bake 15 minutes, or until lightly browned. Do not remove cornbread from the pan. While bread is baking, heat a skillet with nonstick cooking spray.

Add onion and peppers; sauté until soft. Stir in oregano; set aside. Sprinkle one cup of the cheese over baked bread; top with vegetable mixture and remaining 1/2 cup of cheese. Bake five minutes or until cheese is melted. Cut into 2-inch squares to serve.

Marvelicious Mac and Cheese

- 2 1/2 cups fat free milk
- 2 cups uncooked elbow macaroni (about 7 ounces)
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
- 2 cups shredded reduced fat sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup shredded reduced fat sharp cheddar cheese (optional topping)

Preheat oven to 375°. Cook macaroni according to package directions. Meanwhile, heat milk and butter in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Gradually whisk in flour, salt and dry mustard and simmer for 1 minute, whisking occasionally. Remove from heat; stir in 2 cups of cheese until melted. Add drained macaroni to saucepan and toss with cheese sauce. Transfer mixture to an 8- or 9-inch square baking dish and top with remaining 1/2 cup shredded cheese. Bake uncovered in oven until hot and bubbly, about 20 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

Chocolate Brownie Lovers Ice Cream

- 1/2 cup milk chocolate chips
- 1 (14-ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 1/2 cup cocoa powder
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream, plus 1 tablespoon
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups brownie pieces, chopped

Place chocolate chips and 1 tablespoon heavy whipping cream in a large microwave-safe bowl and heat for 30-45 seconds, or until chips are melted. Remove from microwave and whisk together until smooth. Whisk in sweetened condensed milk, stirring until well combined. Gradually whisk in heavy whipping cream, milk and vanilla extract. Pour mixture into freezer canister of ice cream maker according to your ice maker's instructions. Before transferring out of freezer canister, stir in 1 1/2 cups brownie pieces. Transfer the ice cream to a freezer-safe container with lid, top with remaining brownie pieces. Cover, place in freezer and allow it to harden for at least 4 hours or overnight. 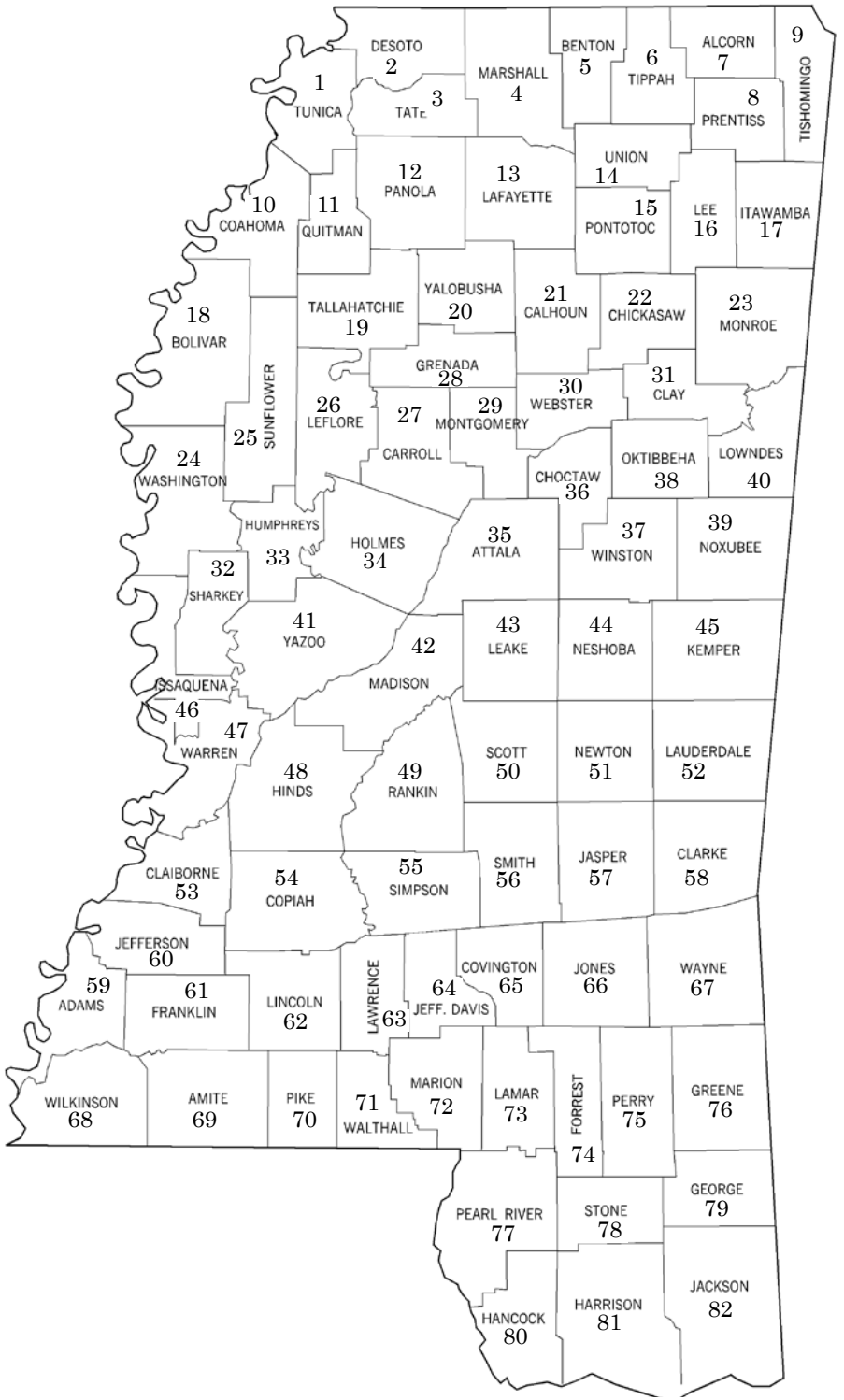



Hay 101: Tuning the Hay Harvest and Curing Process

Excellent quality hay has a high nutritive value and animal intake. Hay quality can differ widely with single species grown in the same location due to management. The nutritive value of the final product depends on many factors in the hay production system such as maturity, curing, and storage. Following good hay making practices ensures higher hay quality, which lowers the amount of nutrients needed for supplementation and translates into lower feed costs.

Of all the factors affecting hay quality, the stage of maturity is the most important and the one in which the greatest progress can be made. As plants mature from a vegetative (lush growth) to a reproductive stage (seed head), they become higher in fiber and lignin content. This lowers the protein content, digestibility, and forage intake by the livestock. Commonly grown forages in Mississippi should be cut at the right stage.

For example, bermudagrass should be cut when height is 15 to 18 inches (four to five weeks), small grains (oats and wheat) at the boot stage (stage before seed emergence), summer annuals (sudangrass, sorghum hybrids, pearl millet) at 40 inches, and tall fescue at four to six weeks interval. Making cuts at the correct growth stage promote growth when temperature and soil moisture might be favorable for plant growth and could increase total yield per acre if optimum soil nutrients are available.

Hay made from the best adapted species and fertilized properly can still result in suboptimal forage if not properly handled and cured. The curing process involves different stages such as mowing, tedding, raking, and baling. One common question asked is at what time of the day should I cut my hay? Hay should be cut when sugar and starch or total nonstructural carbohydrates (TNC) are highest in the plant. Plants have lower TNC in the morning because plants use carbohydrates for respiration during the night. TNC concentration increases throughout the day and usually reaches peak by 6:00 p.m.

It is recommended to cut hay in early to mid-afternoon because cutting hay too late in the day will not allow the hay drying substantially and losing TNC to respiration at night. TNC losses can also be affected by forage moisture and air temperature. When mowing hay, set the mower to make the swath as wide as possible. This exposes more of the forage to the drying effects of the sun and wind. Conditioning (crushing the stems) at the time of mowing will



improve curing by allowing the stems to dry at nearly the same rates as the leaves. Conditioning has been shown to decrease the drying time of large stemmed plants by almost one day, resulting in less leaf and nutrient loss.

Hay tedding is only valuable for turning the swath and allowing the forage that was on the bottom or in clumps to come to the top and dry better, resulting in a more uniform drying pattern. Tedding should usually be done the morning after the hay has been cut and after the dew is off. Producers should be cautious on tedding hay that is too dry or tedding too often because this can create leaf chattering and cause losses in forage quality and yield.

Raking will allow for increased drying before the hay is baled. It is important to rake in a way that will minimize leaf loss. Raking when the hay is slightly brittle and not covered with dew will reduce leaf loss. It is important to set the rake at an optimum speed that will minimize forage losses.

Baling is the final step in hay curing. Optimum moisture for baling can range from 15% to 20% depending on the type of forage species and the type and size of bale being made. Baling at moisture levels lower than 15% will result in greater harvesting losses because leaf losses increase as moisture content decreases. On the other hand, storing hay at moisture levels greater than 20% can result in molding and heating, which translate into hay discoloration and greater dry matter and nutrient losses.

Although there are electronic moisture meters that can be used in the windrow, they are more accurate on determining moisture content when the hay is baled. An experienced hay producer might be able to take a handful of hay from the underside of the windrow and twist it to determine if the hay is dry enough. If the stems are brittle and free of moisture, the hay should be in good condition for baling.

All bales made at moisture content above 15% will undergo some

increase in temperature in the first two to three weeks post-baling. This change in temperature is known as “sweating” or “going through sweat,” and this is due to the final stage of plant and microbial respiration. This increase in temperature can cause spontaneous combustion if bales are stored too tight or in close environments. When storing hay in a barn or outdoors, do not stack more than five tiers high before the hay has gone through the sweating process. After the sweat when temperatures lower, more tiers can be added to the stack without fire danger.

Fire danger usually increases when bales reach temperatures above 150° F. Heating bales must be moved to prevent the stack or barn from burning. Check the bale moisture content by using a hay moisture probe to determine the potential for greater respiration. To measure the bale temperature, use a thermometer that can be pushed at least 12 inches into the bales, check the temperature from at least 20 different bales. Monitor the hay stack daily until the sweat period is over.

Hay production can be a complicated process. Yet producing high-quality hay should be a goal of each hay producer. Cutting hay at proper stage of maturity and moisture content and providing proper fertilization will allow livestock producers to get higher-quality hay and reduce possible supplementation.

Don't Guess, Hay Test! Know what you are feeding and supplement with protein or energy when necessary. A successful hay production and utilization depends on the integration of harvest management, hay preservation, and quality analysis. Always remember that haymaking is an art and understanding the science behind it can help hay producers to make a cost-effective and nutritional livestock feed.

Tips for Growing Tasty Tomatoes

There's nothing as divine as a homegrown tomato. I'm a sucker for a tomato sandwich or a BLT during summer. When making a sandwich, I must have homegrown tomatoes from either the farmers market or from friends who grow tomatoes. There's something about a fresh garden tomato that takes it to the next level!

Tomatoes are a popular plant to grow here in Mississippi. If you haven't already planted tomatoes, it's not too late! Tomatoes love the heat, making them a perfect plant for summer months. For a fall crop of tomatoes, start the seeds in June and set out plants in July or early August. Here are a few tips to grow tasty tomatoes this summer:

When buying tomatoes, inspect them to ensure they are healthy. Check the leaves to make sure there are no diseases or insects invading them. Buy tomato plants that are small, stocky, and healthy-looking. It's best to avoid overgrown plants.

The planting site is important to the success of your tomatoes!! Find a spot that receives direct sunlight and does not hold water. When planting seedlings, make sure to bury them deeply in the soil. Keep in mind that this planting method is only true for tomatoes.

Tomatoes need water to succeed, typically an inch to inch and a half of water per week. If you see the leaves drooping, give them a generous watering to perk them back up!

As your plants grow, install a wooden stake system to provide support for them. This is to keep the plants off the ground and growing in an upright position. Installing a staking system isn't that hard!

Be vigilant about checking for insects and diseases that may take over your crop. There are four common ones found in tomatoes:

Buckeye Rot: Buckeye rot develops when humidity is high and temperatures are hot. It's commonly found on low-hanging fruits that are close to infected soils. Brown, oily circles on the tomatoes are true signs



of buckeye rot.

Early Blight: Early blight develops when humidity is high and temperatures are mild. The disease affects the stems, leaves, and fruit. Symptoms first show up on the leaves of the plant. Look for circular or elongated, brown lesions with rings. The lesions grow over time and the area around the lesions appear yellow.

Southern Blight: Southern blight develops in high temperatures and moist conditions. Look for black and brown lesions on the stems of the plant near the soil line. You may also notice a white fungal and round, tan or brown bumps on the stems. If your plants are wilting, it's a good idea to check for these characteristics.

Bacterial Wilt: Bacteria wilt develops when soil temperatures and moisture levels are high. If you notice your plants wilting or dying without any other symptoms, bacterial wilt may be the culprit. The stem towards the bottom of the plant may have brown lesions and the inside of the stem may be wet and hollow. It's important to note that it is difficult to manage this pathogen.
