

Early Soybean Crop Looks Good As It Nears Harvest

Mississippi's 2.3 million acre soybean crop is looking strong late in its growing season, thanks to somewhat earlier planting dates and almost ideal conditions through the end of July.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture estimates 79% of the crop is in good or excellent condition. They estimate more than 93% of the crop is blooming, and 3% is coloring as it nears harvest.

Trent Irby, soybean specialist with the Mississippi State University Extension Service, said harvest should begin in early August, although the majority won't be harvested until early September.

"We're a little ahead of schedule because we got a few more acres planted earlier than we do on average," Irby said. "The optimal planting window is in April, and soybeans respond to an early planting date. After a certain point, your yield potential declines regardless of what you do for the crop."

Somewhat unusual weather patterns for much of this year provided an April that was warm enough and dry enough to allow many soybean acres to be planted. Some soybeans were even planted in March as soon as the corn crop was in the ground.

"Even though we want early planting, soybeans are sometimes planted later in the planting window for a variety of reasons," Irby said. "You can still plant the crop all the way out through June and be successful, but yield potential is affected by a delay in planting."

Recent hot and dry conditions have challenged the crop a bit, but

the biggest adversity so far came in June with hail damage in many acres across multiple counties scattered over 10 days.

"There will be some level of yield loss due to the damage that the hail inflicted, depending on the

growth stage of the soybean at the time of the hail event," Irby said.

Disease and insect pressures have been normal, with growers able to manage them without trouble.

More than half the soybean crop is irrigated. Well-timed rains across most of the growing area mean irrigated acres required less water and dryland acreage got good moisture.

Will Maples, Extension agricultural economist, said overall input prices are down slightly this year from previous years, but supply is expected to be tight.

"The USDA-National Agricultural Statistics Service Acreage Report shocked the soybean market at the end of June with a 4 million acre reduction in plantings," Maples said. "This means the supply picture will be much tighter

than previously thought."

Since the end of June, the November soybean futures contract has been up by over a dollar, at \$13.98 a bushel on July 27.

"But even though the supply side is looking tighter, soybeans are suffering from weak demand, with exports currently projected to be down over 6% from last year," he said. "It will be interesting to see how this dynamic plays out into harvest. Any decrease in the yield outlook and strengthening of exports will be a perfect storm for soybean prices to rally higher."

The Time is Now to Strengthen Mississippi's Food Supply Chain

Rebuilding Mississippi's Agriculture Infrastructure through the S.A.F.E Plan

Growing up on our small farm, I remember days that started out with bright sunshine, not a cloud in the sky. And I remember that sometimes before the day's work was done, I could look across the pasture and see dark storm clouds suddenly appear on the horizon. The time to prepare, to tend to the livestock and to seek shelter was before that thunderstorm or tornado rolled across our farm.

Today, looking across the global landscape, I see storm clouds on the horizon that are threatening our food security, not only in Mississippi but across America. Fluctuating weather patterns, the global pandemic scare, an international supply chain crisis, record inflation, the Russia/Ukraine war, the Mississippi River's successive flooding and going dry, radical federal and international environmental regulations, and increasing foreign control of our farmland are all converging to create global food supply challenges worldwide, for our farmers, and ranchers, and ultimately, for all consumers.

While the storm is coming, the time to prepare is now. That is why I have announced the Mississippi Strategic Agriculture Facilities Expansion (S.A.F.E.)

Plan. The Mississippi S.A.F.E. Plan is a generational plan to rebuild Mississippi's agriculture and food supply chain infrastructure to strengthen our food security, at the same time as expanding local market opportunities for agricultural products, increasing capacity for value-added processing, and spurring economic develop for rural Mississippi.

Today, Mississippi agriculture is strong with a record value of production in 2022 of \$9.72 billion dollars. In Mississippi alone, agriculture and food has a \$29.72 billion direct economic output. What we are missing is statewide food processing and value-added infrastructure - the capacity to process and store food locally for extended periods. The S.A.F.E. Plan encompasses a statewide approach to rebuilding Mississippi's agriculture infrastructure at the regional and local levels with three focal areas:

1) The S.A.F.E. Plan will create strategically placed local food hubs in the three regions of the state. These food hubs will provide a centralized location for farmers to bring food products for public sale, wholesale and retail, and for aggregation, packaging, storage, cold storage and distribution in preparation for being sold into commerce through markets such as retail, food service, and direct to con-

sumer sales.

- 2) The S.A.F.E. Plan will provide infrastructure funds to counties for the expansion of local farmers market facilities in each county, and upgrades to our 56 existing county agri-centers and multipurpose centers. This includes development of cold storage, transportation, packing, and storage infrastructure at farmers markets and the roll out of mobile farmers markets to address food deserts in urban areas. The S.A.F.E. Plan would upgrade Mississippi's agri-center/ multipurpose facilities including replacing our State Fairgrounds livestock facilities to enhance and expand ag-related events and to allow for these facilities to serve a role in food supply aggregation and storage.
- 3) The Mississippi S.A.F.E. Plan would make infrastructure funds available to producers, cooperatives and private and public sectors to strengthen our State's middle food supply chain. Funds would be invested for value-added processing equipment onfarm, distribution, wholesale or retail locations.

If implemented wisely, the S.A.F.E. Plan will double our agriculture value and transform Mississippi into a key food supply and distribution hub for the entire Southeastern United States. It will strategically modernize cold storage and infra-

structure capacity at our key transportation hubs and by partnering with private industry, it will pay for itself. In Mississippi, access to local healthy foods would be readily available year-round regardless of the global challenges ahead. This S.A.F.E. Plan represents an investment not just in agriculture, but an investment in our State and the future and wellbeing of our people.

In the Bible, Joseph had the vision to plan today for coming food scarcity challenges in Egypt, and many people were saved. Mississippi can do the same in modern times. On behalf of Mississippi families, I urge our Mississippi Legislature and legislative leaders to get behind the S.A.F.E. Plan, support it, and fund it as a top priority in 2024. Catch the vision of Joseph. The most important infrastructure we can invest in is Mississippi's agriculture and food supply infrastructure, because every single Mississippian deserves reliable access to food on a daily basis.

From Our Kitchen To Yours



Wholesome Soy Berry Pancakes

1 1/2 cups white whole-wheat flour

1/2 cup oatmeal, quick cooking

2 tablespoons baking powder

1 1/2 cups vanilla or plain soymilk

4 eggs

2 tablespoons brown sugar, packed

2 tablespoons soybean oil

4 cups fresh blueberries, divided

Maple syrup (optional)

Combine flour, oatmeal and baking powder in medium bowl. Whisk soymilk, eggs, brown sugar and soybean oil in large bowl until blended. Add flour mixture to soymilk; stir just until blended. Stir in two cups blueberries. Heat a large skillet over medium heat; brush lightly with soybean oil. Pour 1/4 cup batter into hot skillet; cook until bubbles begin to burst. Turn and continue cooking for one to two minutes or until golden. Repeat with remaining batter. Serve topped with remaining berries and maple syrup, if desired.

Black Soybean Tempeh Tacos

8 ounces tempeh 2 tablespoons taco seasoning 15 oz. can black soybeans 6 tortillas fresh cilantro, for garnish avocado and tomato, for garnish

In a small bowl, combine taco seasoning with 2-3 tablespoons water and stir. Crumble tempeh and add to the seasoning mix. Stir to combine and set aside to marinate for a few minutes. In a pan over medium heat, sauté seasoned tempeh for 8-10 minutes. Add black soybeans (rinsed and drained) and cook about 3 minutes or until heated through. Prepare your toppings. (Tomato, avocado, etc.) Assemble tacos: Warm the tortillas if desired, add the tempeh mixture, and any toppings.

Soy Nutty-Fruity Clusters

1 tablespoon soybean oil

1 cup soy nuts, roasted, salted

1 cup assorted dried fruit, chopped

1/4 cup brown rice syrup

1/4 cup light brown sugar, packed

1/4 teaspoon salt

Foil-line 11 x 17-inch pan; grease with soybean oil. Combine soynuts and dried fruit. Spread onto prepared pan in single layer. Stir brown rice syrup, brown sugar and salt in small saucepan until blended. Bring to boil over medium high heat, stirring constantly. Boil until candy thermometer reaches 270°F, about 3 to 4 min-

utes. Immediately pour over soynuts and fruit. Quickly and carefully stir until coated. While hot, separate into clusters. Cool completely.

Soy-Silken Dark Chocolate Pudding

1 12.3-ounce package silken tofu, drained

2/3 cup dark unsweetened cocoa powder

1 cup powdered sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Whipped topping (optional)

Place tofu, cocoa powder, powdered sugar and vanilla in a food processor. Puree for one minute, scraping down sides as needed, or until very smooth. Spoon into individual parfait cups or place in a decorative serving dish. Refrigerate and serve topped with whipped cream, if desired.

Go Green Soy Smoothie

1 1/2 cup Vanilla Soymilk

1 Ripe pear, cored and chopped

2 cups Baby spinach, packed

Puree all ingredients in blender until smooth. Serve immediately.



Commissioner Andy Gipson Announces Launch of Wild Hog Control Program Youth Trapping Corps

Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson recently announced the launch of the Wild Hog Control Program (WHCP) Youth Trapping Corps. The Youth Trapping Corps is an expansion of WHCP and is designed to educate and professionally develop student members of FFA.

This new program is a partner-ship among the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC), the Mississippi FFA Association and Wildlife Dominion Management, LLC. Commissioner Gipson was joined by Umesh Sanjanwala, State Director for U.S. Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith; Jack Robertson, Co-Owner of Wildlife Dominion Management, LLC; Kramer Sowell, Agriculture Teacher at Brandon High School; and Don Brazil, CEO of the Foundation for Mississippi Wildlife, Fisheries & Parks.

"Last year at this time, I announced our partnership with Mississippi FFA to expand our Wild Hog Control Program to include a youth education and professional development component, the Youth Trapping Corps. Today, I am proud to report this program has been fully funded through a federal grant, and the Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce is working with 25 schools across the state to implement the Youth Trapping Corps," said Commissioner Gipson. "This funding opportunity was made possible



by U.S. Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith. I appreciate Senator Hyde-Smith's efforts in securing the funds needed to get this program off the ground. Her continued support of agriculture and Mississippi's youth will help ensure the success of the Youth Trapping Corps."

This first-of-its-kind program will provide FFA students around the state the opportunity to offer wild hog trapping services while gaining valuable skills and work-based learning experiences. Under the WHCP umbrella, FFA members will be trained on how to trap wild hogs, how to interact with landowners and land managers, how to develop a business plan, and how to interact with agriculture and natural resources professionals. Under the guidance of MDAC and their respective teachers. FFA members will work with local private land managers to trap wild hogs where needed.

The grant funding will be used by teachers to purchase the most effective wild hog trapping equipment and associated supplies to be used by their students. Additionally, funding can be used by teachers to purchase equipment and supplies that will allow their students to build their own traps. This will provide students with hands-on training related to welding and fabrication. These hands-on skills will be valuable to students when they pursue employment and careers in the future.

"The Wild Hog Control Program is MDAC's response to the threat of the invasive non-native feral hogs. Through this new partnership with FFA, now the Wild Hog Control Program is also part of the solution to address Mississippi's workforce development needs," said Commissioner Gipson.

Southern Magnolias Add Evergreen Charm, Beauty

It's no wonder Mississippi is called the Magnolia State. The Southern magnolia is an iconic symbol in our landscape and across the Southeast.

I have many great childhood memories of my sister and me climbing and playing in my grandparents' large magnolia tree in their front yard. Its numerous, small-diameter branches made it a great tree to climb.

The Southern magnolia is a beautiful, classic evergreen magnolia with large, thick, glossy leaves. The individual oblong leaves are 5 to 8 inches long and feel leathery. The bottoms of the leaves are covered with a rusty brown fuzz.

Magnolia leaves can be chopped with a mower and blown back under the branches to recycle nutrients. The incredibly tough, two-toned leaves are long-lasting accents that provide earthy and bold color to many floral arrangements.

The rich, rusty brown color on the back of the leaves makes them especially fitting for fall and winter color schemes in floral arrangements and wreaths. They also look excellent displayed alone in a vase.

Nothing describes the Southern magnolia better than its scientific name, Magnolia grandiflora. The flowers certainly are grand.

Magnolia trees display their creamy white flowers in late spring through summer, and you certainly can't miss the cup-shaped blooms that reach up to 8 inches in diameter. Flower petals are thick and waxy and have a lemony fragrance.

After bloom, the flowers are replaced with cone-like seed pods.

When these pods ripen, the large, red seeds are pushed out and add to the beauty of this tree. These woody, brown pods with bright red seeds also can be used in dried floral arrangements

The Southern magnolia can grow at a moderate rate to a height of 80 feet or more with a 30- to 40-foot spread. These trees form a dense, dark green pyramidal shape in the landscape.

Southern magnolia is native to the bottomlands and moist, wooded areas of the central and southeastern coastal plains. They prefer rich soil with partial shade and, in nature, are usually understory trees. The Southern magnolia tolerates high moisture levels but not overly wet or swampy soils and prolonged flooding.

When grown as an ornamental, it is best to maintain the heavy-leaved limbs of the magnolia almost to the ground. Doing so will provide a place for the dropped leaves and seed pods to hide out of the way of mowing.

If you live in the South and your landscape doesn't include a Southern magnolia, you're missing out on one of the oldest and most beautiful blooming evergreen trees in existence.
