## The 56th Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo

If the past year taught us anything, it certainly taught us to truly care for the things and people we take for granted every day.

However, throughout the challenges and changing times, agriculture never stopped. Businesses altered how they operate, daily tasks became virtual exchanges and whole cities locked down, yet agriculture never stopped.

Our farmers never stopped growing crops, our ranchers never stopped raising livestock and your Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce (MDAC) never



stopped working for its citizens. Now, MDAC is looking toward the future with hopeful anticipation as we celebrate our steadfast agriculture community in one of the largest livestock events east of the Mississippi.

The 56th Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo is officially underway at the Mississippi State Fairgrounds. Events, such as the Open Livestock Exhibitions and Horse Shows, are the perfect outing that the whole family can enjoy.

“For well over 50 years now, the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo has been a cherished tradition for competitors, families and spectators, not only from Mississippi, but across the nation,” says Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce Andy Gipson. “This year will include all the usual fan-favorites, such as the Dixie Queen pageant and the Junior Sale of Champions, as well as the first-ever Dixie National Expo in the new Trade Mart, which features numerous agricultural and

vendor booths, including MDAC’s Genuine MS® store.”

The Dixie National Junior Livestock Exhibitions kick off on Friday, February 5, when FFA and 4-H students from across the state compete for that coveted chance to show at the Junior Sale of Champions on Thursday, February 11. A complete schedule of events can be found on pages 12 and 13.

In addition to the horse shows, livestock exhibitions and agriculture expo, the annual Dixie National Rodeo begins Thursday, February 11, and runs through Wednesday, February 17. Each Rodeo, a combination of thrilling competitions and impressive feats of showmanship, will be followed by special entertainers. This year’s concert lineup includes the Oak Ridge Boys Elvira40, Parker McCollum, Moe Bandy, John Conlee, Sawyer Brown, Justin Moore and Riley Green. Tickets for the Dixie National Rodeo can be purchased online at Ticketmaster.com or at the Mississippi Coliseum Box Office.

able to spread out. So come out and enjoy the Dixie National Rodeo, the greatest show on dirt!”

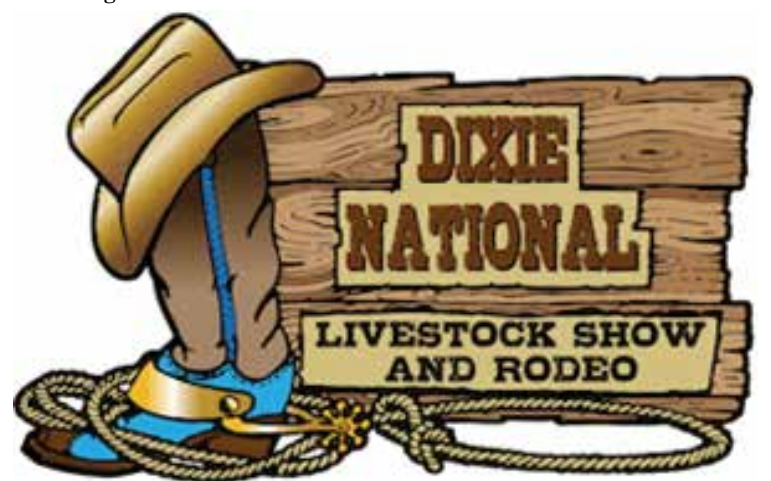
Other events include the Legislative Livestock Showdown, Equestrians with Disabilities Horse Show, Dixie National Afterparty, Antique Tractor Show and of course, the beloved Dixie National Parade. For 50 years, this procession of horse-drawn carriages, decorative floats, horse clubs, marching groups and more have entertained thousands of spectators and families. Per usual, the Dixie National Wagon Train, will finish out the parade caravan in the true, old-fashioned cowboy style of horses, mules and wagons.

This year’s parade will be held on Saturday, February 13, at 10:30 a.m. and is themed ‘Remembering Lecile’ to honor the late Lecile Harris, professional rodeo clown and longtime entertainer of the Dixie National Rodeo. Spectators can find the best viewing on High and West Streets near the State Capitol.

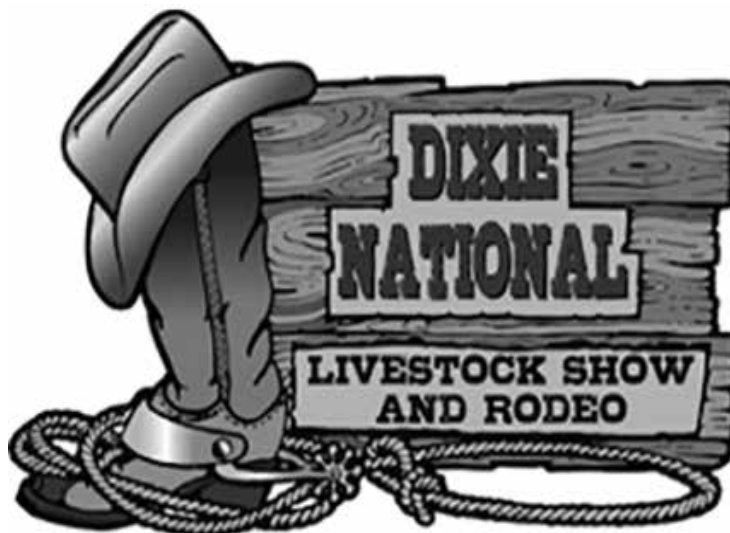
## The Dixie National 2021!

This month we are again looking forward to hosting the Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo! 2021 marks the 56th Annual Dixie National, an event that has become one of Mississippi's and the South's premier agricultural and livestock events. Each February, cowboys, cowgirls, 4-H and FFA members, rodeo queens and spectators travel from around the world to the Mississippi State Fairgrounds to experience one of the largest livestock shows and the largest rodeo east of the Mississippi River.

The Dixie National Livestock Show and Rodeo is a "Genuine Mississippi" event that generates millions of dollars for Mississippi's economy each year. From the agricultural exposition and livestock shows to the renowned rodeo entertainment, this event continues to flourish as a tradition treasured by so many. This year, the Dixie National also stands as a reminder that even through the difficult days we have experienced during COVID-19, Mississippi's agriculture and livestock industry never stops. Our livestock families and rodeo fans look forward to this event, and this year we expect many more nationwide entries in our livestock open shows. This is an opportunity for the Dixie National to grow.

The Dixie National Junior



Round-Up and Open Livestock shows are the heartbeat of the Dixie National and provide Mississippi's youth and open show exhibitors the opportunity to compete on one of the biggest agricultural stages in the country. Last year, the Junior Livestock shows alone included more than 1,600 4-H and FFA members and more than 2,200 head of livestock. The pinnacle of the junior livestock show circuit in Mississippi is the annual Dixie National Junior Sale of Champions. Proceeds from this sale benefit participants in the form of scholarships and last year, over \$400,000 in scholarships were awarded to 31 students.

With this year's rodeo, things will be different as we will not be joined by long-time professional rodeo clown, Lecile Harris who

passed away after completing the last performance of the 2020 Dixie National. Lecile was a staple of the Dixie National for more than 40 years and will be honored during a portion of the Rodeo performances, as well as the Dixie National Parade on Saturday, February 13th. We will forever remember the joy Lecile brought us with his humor and easygoing candor. In his honor and to help with the current shortage of blood supplies, we are pleased to host the first Dixie National blood drive at the Farmers Market, the Saturday of the Parade.

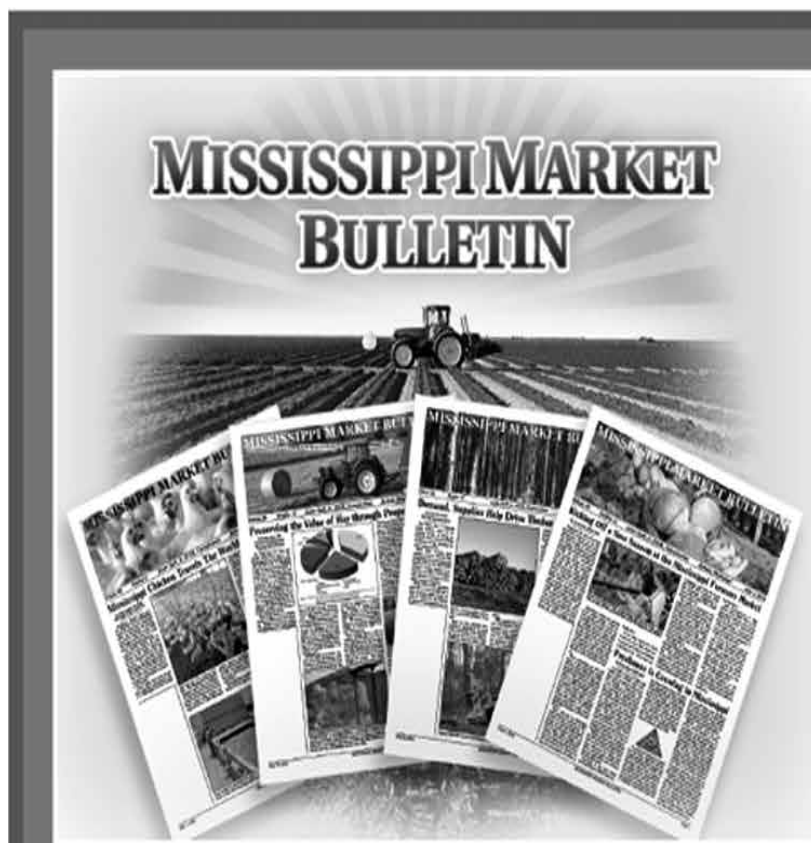
We also understand that for many people, this year's rodeo will not be possible to attend due to the ongoing risk of COVID-19. We respect that decision. But I want you to know that we will have a safe and socially distant rodeo program.

## A Cowpoke's Feast!

### “BBB” – Biscuits with Beans & Burgers

- 2 pounds lean hamburger
- 2 (2 lb.) cans baked beans
- 1 cup favorite BBQ sauce
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 1/2 cup mustard
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- Bisquick mix for 1 dozen biscuits

Heat Dutch oven to 325° for frying. Brown the hamburger in the Dutch oven. Stir in the baked beans, BBQ sauce, ketchup, mustard and onion. Cover and bake on low heat for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, prepare the Bisquick mix according to package directions for one dozen biscuits. Stir the burgers and beans thoroughly. Cover the top of the bean mixture with the biscuits, completely covering the top. Sprinkle the cheese over the biscuit topping. Bake covered for 30 minutes, until the biscuits are done. *Source: BestCampRecipes.com.*

### Over the Fire Scalloped Potatoes

- 8 large baking potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 bunch green onions, sliced
- 1 (10 oz.) can condensed cream of mushroom soup

- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- Black pepper to taste
- Garlic salt to taste
- 1/2 cup crumbled crisply cooked bacon (optional)
- 1/2 cup sautéed mushrooms (optional)
- 1/2 cup butter

Preheat grill for medium heat. Prepare 8 pieces of aluminum foil with vegetable cooking spray. Combine potatoes, green onion, soup, cheese, (and bacon and mushrooms, if using) in a bowl. Season to taste with garlic salt and pepper. Evenly divide the potato mixture among the squares of aluminum foil; dot with butter. Fold mixture into foil packets, sealing well. Cook foil packets on the grill for 12-20 minutes, until the potatoes have cooked. *Source: CampRecipes.com.*

### Cast-Iron Texas Hash

- 4 cups frozen hash brown cubes
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 4 strips of bacon, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 3/4 cup prepared salsa
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese
- sour cream and cilantro (optional)

Place hash browns into a microwaveable bowl with the water, cover tightly and microwave on high for 3 minutes. Drain well. Heat a large cast iron skillet over medium heat. Place bacon and oil in skillet and cook until bacon is crisp, 4-5 minutes. Add garlic and cumin and stir until fragrant. Add the hash browns and salt and cayenne pepper and continue to cook and stir over high heat until they begin to crisp. Stir in the salsa, then sprinkle cheese on top and broil 3-4 minutes until bubbly. Garnish with sour cream and cilantro if desired. *Source: RecipeLion.com.*

### Easy Baked Apples

- Whole apples (1 per person)
- Butter or margarine
- Cinnamon and/or cinnamon sticks
- Sugar, brown sugar, or Splenda
- Aluminum foil

Slice the top of the apples and core out the center; leave the skins on. Mix butter or margarine with the cinnamon, sugar, brown sugar, or Splenda until creamed together. Place the butter mixture inside the cored out area of the apple. Insert a cinnamon stick into core too if you desire. Wrap in double thickness of foil squares. “Bake” in the coals or in a Dutch oven about 30 minutes. Check one apple after 20 minutes by squeezing it for softness (be sure to use a heat proof mitt). Serve in the foil with a spoon. *Source: camprecipes.com.*

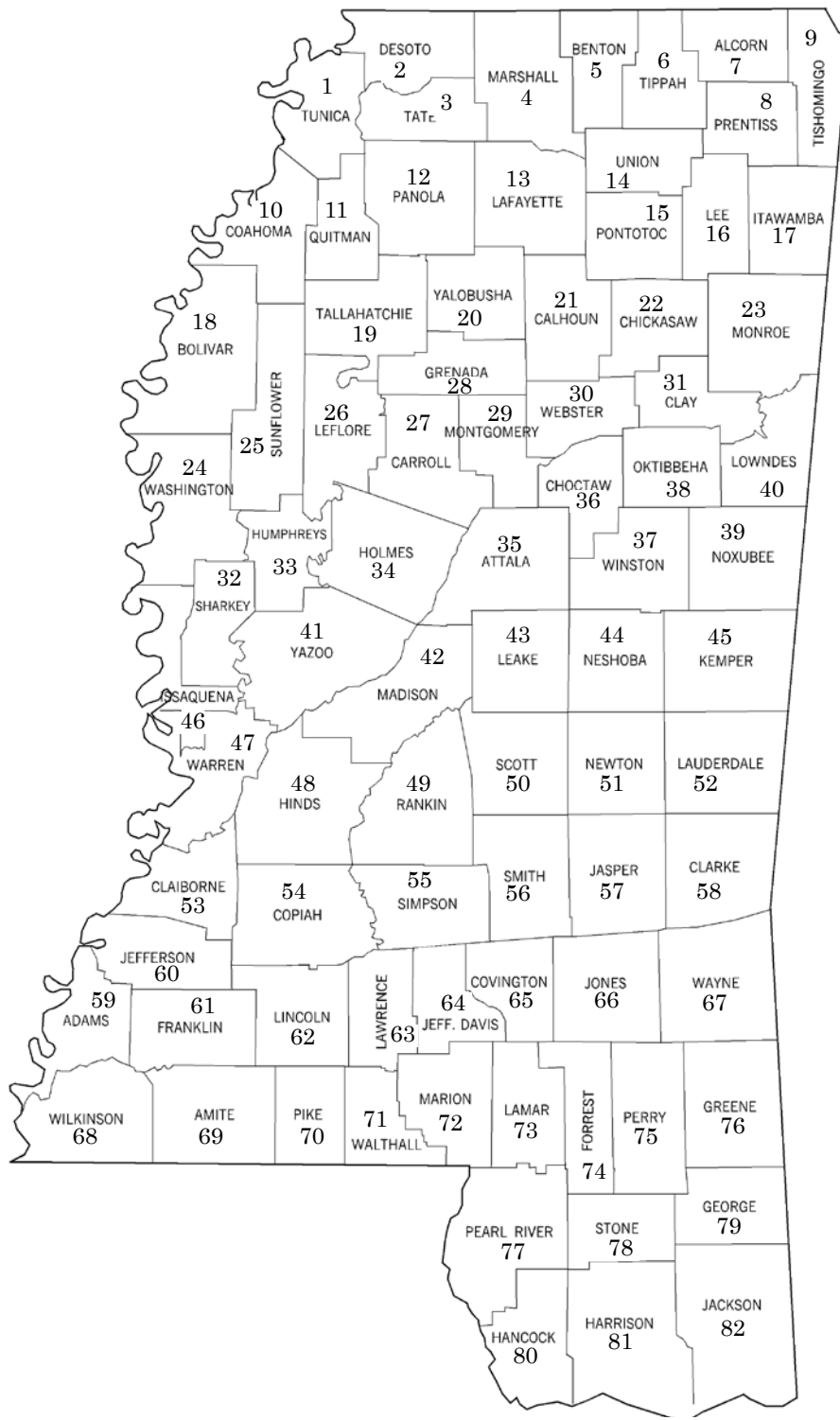

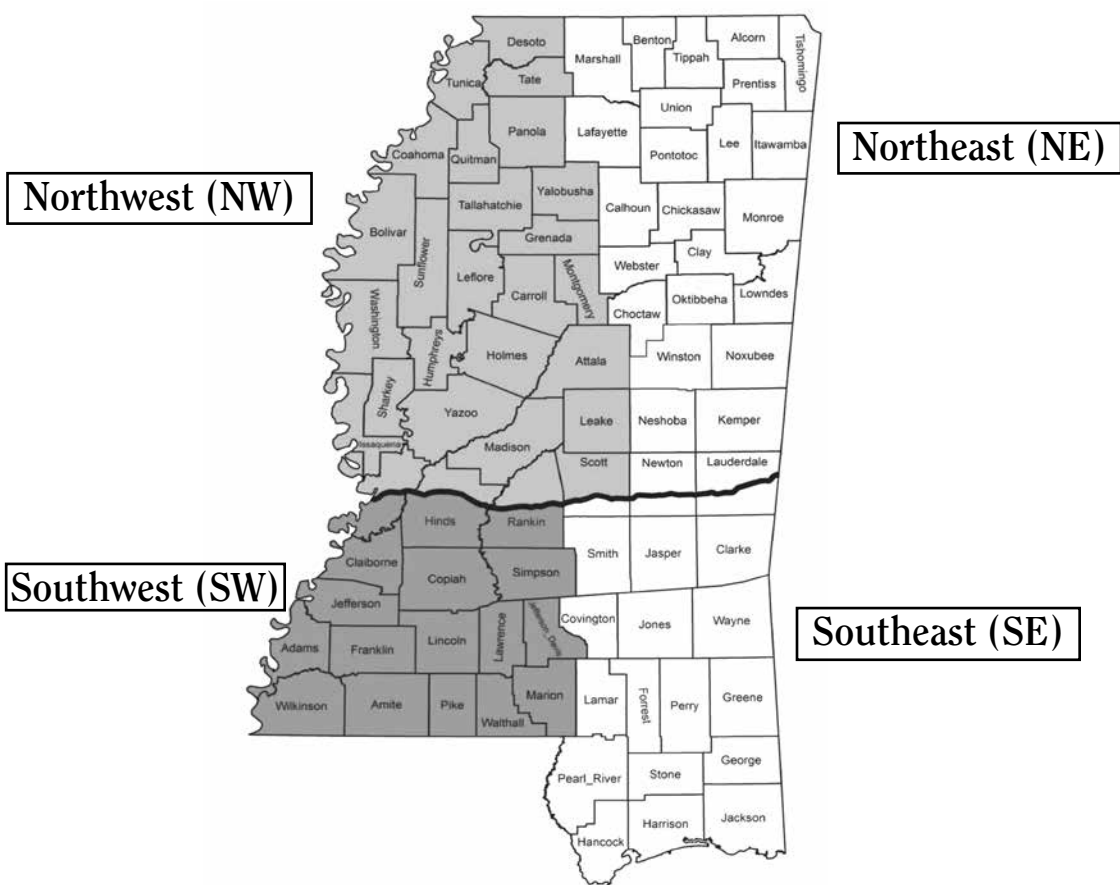

**WILD HOGS: How to Kill Them**



- 1 Identify where the hog damage is.
- 2 Put up game/trail cameras in the damaged area.
- 3 Examine the photos to see where hogs are coming from and how many there are.
- 4 Choose the right trap size and design.
- 5 Build a trap with the gate facing the hogs' trail.
- 6 Bait the trap with corn or other feed.
- 7 Let the wild hogs feed inside the trap for a few days—until they feel comfortable consistently entering the trap.
- 8 Monitor the cameras to ensure all the hogs are inside the trap, and drop the trapdoor.
- 9 Use your .22- or larger-caliber rifle to euthanize the hogs humanely. Wear rubber or latex gloves when handling hogs.
- 10 Continue to monitor for pig activity or damage in the area.

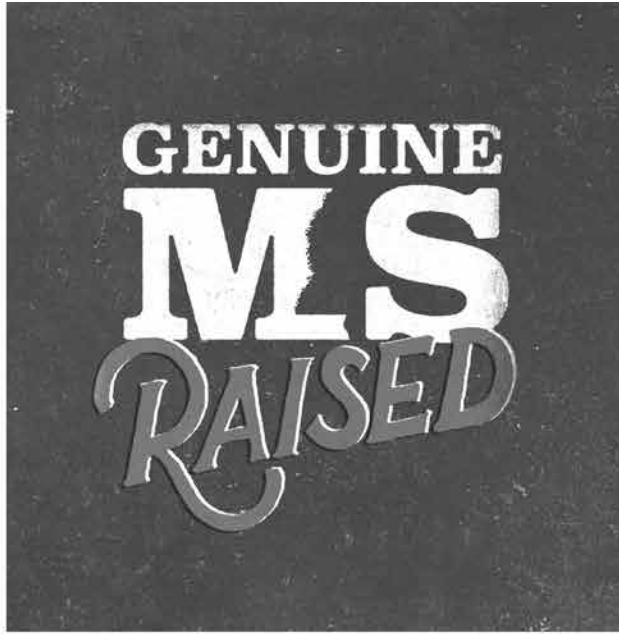

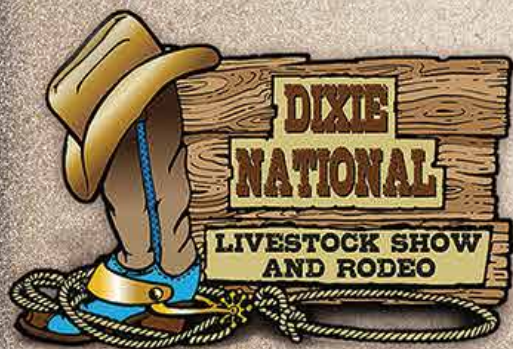
